### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (17-30) VS. DETROIT TIGERS (26-20)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have put together three consecutive wins for the first time this year...it is the A's first winning streak longer than two games since Aug. 7-9, 2014 when they also won three straight...have not won more than three straight since July 3-8, 2014 when they had a six-game winning streak...the current winning streak follows a stretch where the A's lost four straight, eight of nine and 14 of 16...are now 9-22 (.290) over the last 31 games (beginning April 23) after starting the year 8-8...are 17-30 (.362) overall, which is the worst record in the American League and second worst in the majors (Milwaukee, 16-30)...it matches the third worst record after 47 games in Oakland history and is the worst since the 2005 club also started the year 17-30 (lost game 48)...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 18th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 12½ games...this marks the fourth time in Oakland history the A's have trailed by at least 12½ games before the end of May (also 2005, 2001 and 1979)...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, seven days in fourth, one day tied for fourth and 18 days in fifth...split the four-game series at Tampa Bay over the weekend, snapping a five-series losing streak.

**STARTING PITCHING:** Jesse Hahn tossed the A's first complete game of the season yesterday, a four-hit shutout...A's starting pitchers have not allowed a run over the last three games, matching the longest such streak in Oakland history (13th time)...it is the longest single season streak since Aug. 24-26, 2005...starters currently have a 20.2-inning scoreless streak...are now 4-6 with a 2.55 ERA (22 er in 77.2 ip) over the last 13 games...have a 3.38 ERA (104 er in 277.1 ip) for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...lead the AL and are tied for second in the majors in fewest home runs (19)...rank third in the AL in innings pitched (277.1)

**PITCHING:** The A's have two shutouts in the last three games and seven for the season, which is the most in the American League and second most in the majors (San Francisco, 8)...now have a 2.87 ERA (36 er in 113.0 ip) over the last 13 games after posting a 5.21 ERA over the previous 20 contests...for the season, rank fourth in the American League in strikeouts (361) but are tied for the third most walks (145)...are tied for second in fewest home runs (38) and tied for third in pickoffs (4).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's committed three errors yesterday, marking the third time in Oakland history the A's committed three or more errors and shutout the opponent (Sept. 12, 2005 vs. Cleveland and Aug. 24, 2010 vs. Cleveland)...it was the A's fifth game of three or more errors this year and Oakland now has 49 errors for the season, which is nine more than any other team (Milwaukee, 40)...have committed at least one error in 19 of the last 22 games (28 errors total)...the errors have led to 29 unearned runs, which is the most in the majors...did not commit an error a week ago tonight, snapping a streak of 15 consecutive games with an error...that was third longest streak in Oakland history and was the longest since the 1982 club had a 17-game streak from May 6-23.

**LEFT AND RIGHT:** The A's are 1-9 when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 16-21 when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is the worst in the majors...are batting .212 (77-for-364) against lefties compared to .269 (346-for-1285) with 38 of their 42 home runs off righties...the mark against lefties is second lowest in the American League (Boston, .208) and the mark against righties is third highest.

**OFFENSE:** The A's have scored 37 runs over the last 12 games (3.08 per game) and are 18-for-119 (.151) with runners in scoring position over that stretch...are batting .239 (158-for-660) over the last 19 games, including .185 (32-for-173) with RISP...hit .310 with RISP over the first 28 games...rank second in the American League in stolen base percentage (29-for-35, 82.9%) and third in triples (12)...have been shutout four times, which is second most in the AL.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 1-0 on this seven-game homestand against Detroit (1-0) and New York-AL (four games)...have not won consecutive home games this year and have yet to win a home series (five losses, one split)...went 1-5 on the last homestand against Boston (1-2) and Chicago-AL (0-3), the A's second consecutive 1-5 homestand...have

lost 12 of their last 15 home games and are 6-14 (.300) at home for the season, which is the worst home record in the majors...it is the second worst record after 20 home games in Oakland history...the 1994 club was 5-15 (won game 21)...have finished with a losing record on all three homestands...the last time the A's had three straight losing homestands in one season was in 2005...finished with a losing record on each of the final two homestands of 2014 and the streak of five consecutive losing homestands matches the longest in Oakland history (last four of 1978, first of 1979)...went 3-4 on the last road trip to Houston (1-2) and Tampa Bay (2-2)...have lost nine of the last 12 road games and are 11-16 (.407) for the season.

**IN MAY:** The A's are 8-16 (.333) in May, which is the worst record in the American League and tied for third worst in the majors...have clinched a losing record in May, their fourth consecutive month under .500 dating back to last August...prior to that, had 14 straight months with a winning record...the 16 losses match the A's most in May over the last six years (2012).

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Have won each of their last three day games after losing 13 of the first 14 day games this year...are now 4-13 (.235) during the day compared to 13-17 (.433) at night...have the second worst record in day games in the majors (Cincinnati, 4-13) and are tied for the most losses...are batting .241 (140-for-580) with 63 runs scored during the day (3.71 per game) compared to .265 (283-for-1069) with 140 runs at night (4.67 per game).

**ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 2-13 (.133) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the majors...also lead the majors in one-run losses...are 3-19 (.136) in games decided by two runs or fewer and have the most losses and worst record in the majors in those games...are 0-6 in extra inning games and the six-game extra inning losing streak matches the longest such streak by an A's team over the last 20 years (May 18-July 5, 2011 and May 21-July 25, 1999)...are tied with Pittsburgh for the Major League lead in extra inning losses and are tied with Seattle for the American League lead in extra inning games...are 0-9 in games decided in the last at bat...also lost their final last at bat game of 2014 and the 10-game losing streak in games decided in the last at bat matches the longest such streak in Oakland history (May 14-July 17, 1989)...are the only team without a last at bat win and are tied with Pittsburgh and Seattle for the most losses.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have nine players on the disabled list (Crisp, Davis, Griffin, Ladendorf, Mujica, O'Flaherty, Parker, Pomeranz, Thompson)...Griffin, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...have had at least seven players on the DL all year and have used it a total of 15 times...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

**A's vs. TIGERS:** The A's won the first meeting of 2015 yesterday after losing the season series last year, 5-2...split four games in Oakland but were swept in a three-game series at Detroit...over the previous six seasons, the A's have won one season series, lost three and split two...are 22-25 against the Tigers since the start of the 2009 season...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 246-240 against the Tigers...that includes 138-107 in Oakland, 106-131 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...all-time, the A's are 914-993 against the Tigers.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Brett Lawrie** is batting .329 (27-for-82) in May after hitting .229 in April...**Josh Reddick** went 2-for-4 yesterday and is now batting .431 (22-for-51) at home, which is the best home batting average in the majors.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1954** Gus Zernial hits the last grand slam in Philadelphia A's history in a 6-5 win over Boston...in **1975** Gene Tenace has five RBI including the game winning RBI single in the bottom of the 11th inning of the A's 6-5 win over Baltimore...in **1989** Todd Burns, Rick Honeycutt and Eric Plunk combine to shutout the Yankees on one hit in a 4-0 victory at New York.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Chavez (1-4, 2.89 ERA)

**FIRST SEVEN, LAST THREE:** Is 0-2 with a 4.34 ERA (9 er in 18.2 ip) and .250 (18-for-72) opponents batting average over his last three starts... went 1-2 with a 1.80 ERA and .191 opponents batting average over his first seven games, including three starts.

**STARTING AND RELIEVING:** Began the season in the bullpen and did not allow a run in his four relief appearances (6.2 ip)...his first start came April 23 when Jesse Hahn missed a start due to a blister...remained in the rotation following the option of Kendall Graveman to Nashville April 26 and is 1-4 with a 3.41 ERA (14 er in 37.0 ip) in his six starting assignments...is now 9-12 with a 3.78 ERA (72 er in 171.1 ip) in 29 career starts, 9-15 with a 5.02 ERA in 204 relief appearances.

**INNING BY INNING:** Has not allowed a run in the first two innings (12.0 ip) and has a 1.32 ERA (2 er in 13.2 ip) from the sixth inning on...has yielded 13 of his 16 runs in the third through fifth innings (12 er in 18.0 ip, 6.00 ERA).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed just two home runs in 43.2 innings...has yielded seven of his nine extra base hits to lefties (five doubles, two home runs)...has issued 10 of his 13 walks to right-handed hitters... has walked just two batters leading off an inning...has a .132 (9-for-68) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .280 (26-for-93) after that.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 1-3 with a save, a 2.35 ERA (8 er in 30.2 ip) and .177 (20-for-113) opponents batting average in six games, four starts, on the road...has a 0-1 record, a 4.15 ERA (6 er in 13.0 ip) and .313 (15-for-48) opponents average in four games, two starts, at home.

**IN RELIEF:** Stranded his only inherited runner in his four relief appearances and first batters faced were 1-for-4 (.250)...last year, he allowed 3-of-7 (42.9%) inherited runners to score and first batters faced were 5-for-10 (.500) with a walk...recorded the save in his final relief appearance April 18 at Kansas City, tossing 3.2 scoreless innings...has two career saves, both at Kansas City and both at least 3.2 innings...struck out six, which matched the most by an A's pitcher in a game in which he recorded the save...the only other time it happened since the save became an official stat in 1969 was by Rollie Fingers on Sept. 1, 1972 against Detroit.

**IN APRIL:** Went 0-2 with a 2.55 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in six games, including two starts, this April...went 2-0 with a 1.89 ERA and .199 opponents batting average in six starts in April last year, all A's wins... ranked third in the AL in ERA in April, tied for third in strikeouts (41) and was fifth in opponents batting average...the strikeouts were the fourth best April total in Oakland history (58, Blue in 1971; 47, Rijo in 1986; 44, Zito in 2001)...is just the second Oakland pitcher to strike out 40 or more batters in any month over the last 12 years (Rich Harden, 42 in August of 2011 and June of 2008)...is 2-2 with a 2.10 ERA (13 er in 55.2 ip) in 12 games, eight starts, in April over the last two years...has a 2.68 (24 er in 80.2 ip) career ERA in April, which is his best for any month of the season.

**FIRST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-0 loss at Los Angeles (AL) April 23...tossed six innings and allowed just one hit...the hit was a two-run home run by Calhoun in the third inning and it scored Butera, who reached on an error...it was the Angels only hit of the game...Tropeano, Salas, Smith and Street combined to shutout the A's on eight hits.

**SECOND START:** He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 6-5 loss to Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland April 30...allowed a run in the third inning on Giavotella RBI single and three more in the fifth on a two-run single by Calhoun and a Freese RBI fielders choice...left after five innings trailing 4-0.

**THIRD START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 win at Minnesota May 5...it was his first win since July 23, 2014...the A's scored a run in the first inning and one more in the sixth and he shutout the Twins on three hits and a walk over the first seven innings...allowed his only run in the eighth inning on a Dozier RBI single.

**FOURTH START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-3 loss at Seattle May 10...did not allow a hit until Cruz singled with one out in the fourth... had a 1-0 lead at the time but Seager followed with a RBI double and Ackley added a two-run double one out later...also allowed a sacrifice fly to Cano in the fifth.

**FIFTH START:** He had a no decision in the A's 4-3 loss to Chicago (AL) May 16 in Oakland...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed his only runs in the third inning on a two-run single by Garcia...retired the side in order just one (fourth inning)...left after six innings with the scored tied 2-2.

**LAST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-0 loss at Tampa Bay last Thursday...DeJesus had a RBI double in the fourth and a solo home

run in the seventh...allowed a Guyer single following the DeJesus homer and was relieved by Mujica, who allowed Guyer to score...Colome and four Rays relievers combined to shutout the A's on six hits and two walks.

**2014 RECAP:** Began the season in the starting rotation but was moved to the bullpen following the acquisition of Jon Lester at the trading deadline...went 8-7 with a 3.44 ERA in his 21 starts and 0-1 with a 3.54 ERA in 11 relief appearances...was 8-8 with a 3.45 ERA in 32 games, 21 starts, overall...had career highs in every category except games pitched and his ERA was a career low...had just nine wins in 191 career appearances entering the season...his 146.0 innings were more than double his previous high (67.1 in 2009) as were his 136 strikeouts (55 in 2013)...was 4-1 with a 2.54 ERA and a .216 opponents batting average over his first nine starts through May 18...then went 4-6 with a 4.17 ERA and .280 opponents batting average over his final 12 starts...allowed a .149 batting average with runners in scoring position over his first 10 games through May 24, .354 after that.

**LHP Scott Kazmir (2-3, 3.09 ERA):** Is 0-3 with a 5.14 ERA and .291 opponents batting average in five starts in May after going 2-0 with a 0.99 ERA and .158 opponents average in four starts in April...is 1-1 with a 1.85 ERA and no home runs in four starts in Oakland compared to 1-2 with a 4.06 ERA and six home runs in five starts on the road...has the eighth lowest home ERA in the AL...has allowed a .271 batting average with the bases empty compared to .172 with runners on base...opponents are 8-for-43 (.186) with runners in scoring position, including 1-for-18 (.056) with RISP and two outs...four of the six home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 5-2 A's loss at Tampa Bay last Friday (5.2 ip, 8 h, 3 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 4 so)...is 5-5 with a 3.51 ERA in 15 career starts against Detroit...including 1-0 with a 1.26 ERA in two starts last year.

**Saves/Opportunities:** 5-for-13 (38.5%)

- The A's bullpen has posted a 3.63 ERA (21 er in 52.0 ip) over its last 17 games but has four losses and three blown saves over that stretch... compiled a 7.98 ERA over the previous 15 contests...now has a 4.70 ERA for the season, which is the highest in the American League and second highest in the majors.
- Is tied with Seattle for most losses in the majors (12)...tied for the fewest saves (5) and the lowest save percentage (38.5%) in the majors...is tied with Texas and Los Angeles for the most blown saves (8) in the AL.
- Has allowed 33-of-87 (37.9%) inherited runners to score, which is the third highest percentage in the AL.
- First batters faced are hitting .271 (35-for-129), which is third highest in the AL...have the most first batter RBI in the majors (28) and rank third in home runs (7).
- Has allowed two runs or more in 25 of 48 games...the A's are 2-23 when the pen allows two runs or more, 14-7 when it allows one run or fewer.
