RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers lost the series opener to the Athletics 4-0 on Monday afternoon at O.co Coliseum. Tyler Collins had a pair of hits to lead the Detroit offense, while Nick Castellanos and Anthony Gose each added one hit in the loss. Shane Greene started for the Tigers and took the loss after allowing four runs on eight hits with four strikeouts in 5.2 innings. The Tigers and Athletics play game two of their three-game series tonight. Following the series at Oakland, the Tigers remain on the road for a four-game set vs. the Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim.

HARDY CONTINIES STREAM: Blains 11.

HARDY CONTINUES STREAK: Blaine Hardy extended his streak of not allowing an earned run to 16 straight outings on Monday as he worked 1.1 shutout innings with one walk allowed. During the streak, which spans 14.1 innings, Hardy has given up just eight hits, while walking six and striking out 13. The streak is the longest in a single season by a Tigers reliever since Joaquin Benoit also had 16 consecutive appearances without allowing an earned run from June 27-August 5, 2013. Hardy has made 19 appearances this season and has a 2-0 record with a 2.89 ERA (18.2IP/6ER).

MACHADO MAKES MAJOR LEAGUE DEBUT: Dixon Machado made his major league

MACHADO MAKES MAJOR LEAGUE DEBUT: Dixon Machado made his major league debut on Monday, getting the start at shortstop and going 0x3. Machado became the second Tigers player to make his major league debut this season, joining reliever Angel Nesbitt.

MIGGY'S HITTING STREAK: Miguel Cabrera enters tonight's game on a 12-game hitting streak. Over his 12-game streak, Cabrera is hitting .419 (19x46) with 10 runs scored, three doubles, one triple, five home runs and 11 RBI. Cabrera's hitting streak is the longest by a Tigers player this season and is the second-longest active hitting streak in the American League.

WHAT'S GOOD FOR THE GOSE IS GOOD FOR THE TIGERS: Anthony Gose extended his hitting streak to five games by going 1x4 in yesterday's loss. Over his last five games, Gose is batting .450 (9x20) with a run scored, three doubles and three RBI. In 35 games this season, Gose is batting .333 (45x135) with 19 runs scored, 10 doubles, three triples, one home run and 11 RBI.

MIGGY ON THE MARK AGAINST OAKLAND: Miguel Cabrera has compiled impressive numbers in his career against the Athletics. Cabrera is hitting .337 (67x199) with 40 runs scored, 14 doubles, 17 home runs and 54 RBI in 55 career games vs. Oakland. Cabrera leads all active players with a .438 on-base percentage and a .663 slugging percentage vs Oakland and ranks third with a .337 batting average. Cabrera has hit safely in 15 of his last 18 games vs. the Athletics.

ON THE ROAD: The Tigers are 0-1 on their current seven-game road trip. The Tigers are 12-8 on the road this season and have won five of their last nine games away from Comerica Park. Detroit's .600 road winning percentage ranks third in the American League, while their 12 road wins ranks tied for fourth.

GO WEST, YOUNG MAN: The Tigers are currently in a stretch of 14 consecutive games against teams from the American League West. Detroit is 2-3 in the current stretch, going 2-2 vs. Houston and 0-1 vs. Oakland. The Tigers posted an 18-16 record against AL West foes in 2014.

REPLAY RUNDOWN: The Tigers have been involved in 20 instant replay challenges so far this season. Detroit has challenged eight plays with four calls being overturned and four plays standing as called. Opponents have made 11 challenges with six plays standing as called and five calls being overturned. There has been one crew chief initiated review with that play being overturned. NOTES ON THE SKIPPER: Brad Ausmus is in his second season at the helm for the Tigers after being named the 37th manager in Tigers history on November 3, 2013. -Led the Tigers to a 90-72 record and a postseason berth in his first year as manager, joining Hughie Jennings (1907), Mickey Cochrane (1934) and Jim Leyland (2006) in accomplishing the feat.

-Became the 14th manager in Tigers history to have also played at the major league level for Detroit, joining Alan Trammell, Dick Tracewski, Billy Martin, Bob Swift, Billy Hitchcock, Fred Hutchinson, Mickey Cochrane, Del Baker, Bucky Harris, George Moriarty, Ty Cobb, Hughie Jennings and Bobby Lowe.

-Managed Team Israel in the 2013 World Baseball Classic.

-Spent 18 seasons as a catcher at the major league level with the Padres (1993-96), Tigers (1996, 1999-2000), Astros (1997-98, 2001-07) and Dodgers (2009-10) ... made eight postseason appearances as a player, including two trips to the National Laegue Championship Series and one to the World Series.

-Ranks second all-time among catchers with 12,839 putouts, while he is ninth with 1,766 games started and 15,082.2 innings played.

THE PRICE IS RIGHT: Now in his seventh full season in the major leagues and his first full season with the Tigers, Price will make his 10th start of the 2015 season tonight at the Athletics.

LAST TIME OUT: Price turned in his sixth quality start of the season on Thursday vs. Houston, but received a no decision. In 6.2 innings, Price allowed three runs, two earned, on five hits with one walk and a season-high 12 strikeouts.

ON THE ROAD: Price is making his fifth road start of the season tonight. In his first four road starts, Price has posted a 2-0 record with a 2.28 ERA (27.2IP/7ER), which ranks fourth in the American League. Price has made 99 appearances, including 95 starts, on the road in his career and has a 50-22 record with a 3.41 ERA (632.2IP/240ER). Since 2008, Price's 3.41 road ERA ranks second among American League pitchers (minimum 350.0 innings pitched), while his 50 road wins ranks sixth.

RECORD AT O.CO COLISEUM: Price has made five career starts at O.co Coliseum. In his five previous outings at the venue, Price has compiled a 1-2 record with a 3.74 ERA (33.2IP/14ER) and 31 strikeouts.

PRICE IN MAY: Price has made 31 career starts in the month of May and has posted a 12-8 record with a 3.31 ERA (206.2IP/76ER) and 195 strikeouts. Price has compiled a 1-0 record with a 3.14 ERA (28.2IP/10ER) in four May starts this season.

PRICE VS. THE AL WEST: Price is making his 37th career start against a team from the American League Western Division tonight. In his previous 36 starts vs. AL West teams, Price is 12-13 with a 3.74 ERA (240.1IP/100ER) and 243 strikeouts.

LOOKING AT THE AL LEADER BOARDS: Price enters today's game tied for the American League lead with one complete game, while he is 10th with 59.2 innings pitched and 2.0 walks allowed per nine innings.

IMPRESSIVE OPENING DAY START: Price turned in an excellent start on Opening Day vs. Minnesota, throwing 8.2 shutout innings with five hits allowed and five strikeouts. His 8.2 shutout innings were the most thrown by a Tigers pitcher on Opening Day since Mickey Lolich tossed a complete game shutout on April 6, 1970 at Washington. Also, according to the Elias Sports Bureau, Price became the second Tigers pitcher to not allow a run, walk or extra base hit in the season opener, joining Schoolboy Rowe in 1936. In his four career Opening Day starts, Price has a 2-1 record with a 2.48 ERA (29.0IP/8ER).

ALL-STAR SELECTION: Price was selected to the 2014 American League All-Star team by AL manager John Farrell. It marked the fourth career All-Star Game selection for Price.

DOUBLE-DIGIT K'S: Price turned in his first double-digit strikeout performance of the season on Thursday vs. Houston. He has 26 career starts with double-digit strikeouts and 23 games with 10-or-more strikeouts since 2011, which ranks third in the American League.

REACHING 200 STRIKEOUTS: Price finished the 2014 season with a career-high 271 strikeouts, which led the American League. Price reached 200 strikeouts in a season for the third time in his career and the first time since striking out 205 batters in

THROWING 200 INNINGS: Price threw an American League leading 248.1 innings last season. It marked the fourth time in Price's career that he has thrown 200.0-or-more innings in a season and the first time since throwing 211.0 innings in 2012.

PITCHING DEEP: Price led the major leagues with 17 starts of 8.0-or-more innings pitched last season, which was the most by any major league pitcher since Cliff Lee had 17 such starts in 2010. Since returning from the disabled list on July 2, 2013, Price leads the majors with eight complete games and has thrown at least 7.0 innings in 43 of 61 starts.

LIMITING LEFTHANDERS: Price has been tough on lefthanded hitters in his career. Lefties are hitting .214 (250x1167) vs. Price in his career, while righthanded hitters are batting .241 (880x3650). Price's .214 opponent batting average vs. lefthanded hitters is the third lowest among active starting pitchers, trailing only the Dodgers' Clayton Kershaw (.191) and the Angels' C.J. Wilson (.197). In nine starts this season, lefthanders are hitting .261 (18x69), while righties are batting .248 (41x165).

WELCOME TO DETROIT: Price was acquired by the Tigers from the Rays on July 31, 2014 in exchange for lefthanded pitcher Drew Smyly, outfielder Austin Jackson and infielder Willy Adames.

CY YOUNG AWARD WINNER: Price won the American League Cy Young Award in 2012. He became the first No. 1 overall pick to win the Cy Young Award. Only six pitchers have won the AL Cy Young and appeared in few career games than Price (125) at the time of their award: Barry Zito (2002, 84 career apps), Roger Clemens (1986, 69), Bret Saberhagen (1985, 70), Ron Guidry (1978, 83), Vida Blue (1971, 57) and Jim Lonborg (1967, 116).

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Price was acquired by the Tigers from Tampa Bay, in exchange for lefthanded pitcher Drew Smyly, outfielder Austin Jackson and infielder Willy Adames on July 31, 2014. Price was selected by the Rays in the first round (1st overall) of the June 2007 draft.
