OAKLAND ATHLETICS (17-31) VS. DETROIT TIGERS (27-20)

ABOUT THE A'S: Had their season-best three-game winning streak snapped yesterday...have split the first two games of this series and have not won a series since taking two of three at Texas May 1-3...have lost 15 of the last 20 games and are now 9-23 (.281) over the last 32 games (beginning April 23) after starting the year 8-8...are 17-31 (.354) overall, which is the worst record in the American League and second worst in the majors (Milwaukee, 16-31)...it matches the third worst record after 48 games in Oakland history and is the worst since the 2005 club also started the year 17-31...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 19th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by a season-high tying $13\frac{1}{2}$ games...it marks the second time in Oakland history the A's have trailed by more than 13 games before the end of May...trailed by 14 games in 2001 from May 29-31... have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, seven days in fourth, one day tied for fourth and 19 days in fifth... the A's three-game winning streak from May 23-25 was their first winning streak longer than two games since Aug. 7-9, 2014 when they also won three straight...split the four-game series at Tampa Bay over the weekend, snapping a five-series losing streak.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have gone four consecutive games without allowing an earned run for the first time since Aug. 9-13, 1928 (Ehmke, Quinn, Earnshaw, Grove)...starters have allowed one run in 28.0 innings over the last four games and are 4-7 with a 2.31 ERA (22 er in 85.2 ip) over the last 14 games...have a 3.28 ERA (104 er in 285.1 ip) for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...are tied with Pittsburgh and Washington for the fewest home runs in the majors (19)...rank second in the AL in innings pitched (285.1).

PITCHING: The A's have not allowed an earned run in three of the last four games (2 er in 36.0 ip, 0.50 ERA) and now have a 2.66 ERA (36 er in 122.0 ip) over the last 14 games...have a 3.72 ERA for the season, which ranks fifth in the American League...have two shutouts in the last four games and seven for the season, which is the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors (San Francisco, 8)...rank fourth in the AL in strikeouts (365) but have the second most walks (149)...are tied for second in fewest home runs (38) and tied for third in pickoffs (4).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed at least one error in 20 of the last 23 games (29 errors total) and have 50 errors for the season, which is 10 more than any other team (Milwaukee and Texas, 40)...the errors have led to 30 unearned runs, which is the most in the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's were shutout for the fifth time yesterday, which is tied with Tampa Bay for the most in the American League...went 0-for-11 with runners in scoring position last night, marking the third time this year they have gone hitless with 10 or more at bats with RISP...are 18-for-130 (.138) with RISP over the last 13 games and have scored just 37 runs over that span (2.85 per game)...are hitting .174 (32-for-184) with RISP over the last 20 games after hitting .310 with RISP over the first 28 contests...rank second in the AL in stolen base percentage (29-for-35, 82.9%) and third in triples (12).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's were shutout 1-0 last night, which was their first 1-0 loss to Detroit since July 16, 1976 at Tiger Stadium (Fidrych 11-inning complete game)...are now 2-14 (.125) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the majors...also lead the majors in one-run losses and are tied for fourth in one-run games...are 0-9 in one-run games at home, which is the longest such losing streak in Athletics history (dating back to 1901)...lost the final two one-run home games of 2014 and have not won a one-run game at home since Sept. 6, 2014 (4-3 vs. Houston)...are 3-20 (.130) in games decided by two runs or fewer and have the most losses and worst record in the majors in those games... are 0-6 in extra inning games and the six-game extra inning losing streak matches the longest such streak by an A's team over the last 20 years (May 18-July 5, 2011 and May 21-July 25, 1999)...are tied with Pittsburgh for the Major League lead in extra inning losses and have the second most extra inning games in the American League (Seattle, 7)...are 0-9 in games decided in the last at bat...also lost their final last at bat game of 2014 and the 10-game losing streak in games decided in the last at bat matches the longest such streak in Oakland history (May 14-July 17, 1989)...are the only team without a last at bat win and are tied with Pittsburgh and Seattle for the most losses.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-1 on this seven-game homestand against Detroit (1-1) and New York-AL (four games)...have yet to win a home series this year (five losses, one split)...went 1-5 on the last homestand against Boston (1-2) and Chicago-AL (0-3), the A's second consecutive 1-5 homestand...have lost 13 of their last 16 home games and are 6-15 (.286) at home for the season, which is the worst home record in the majors...it matches the 1994 A's for the worst record after 21 home games in Oakland history...a loss today would give the A's their worst record after 22 home games in Oakland history...have finished with a losing record on all three homestands...the last time the A's had three straight losing homestands in one season was in 2005...finished with a losing record on each of the final two homestands of 2014 and the streak of five consecutive losing homestands matches the longest in Oakland history (last four of 1978, first of 1979)...went 3-4 on the last road trip to Houston (1-2) and Tampa Bay (2-2)...have lost nine of the last 12 road games and are 11-16 (.407) for the season.

IN MAY: The A's are 8-17 (.333) in May, which is the worst record in the American League and tied for second worst in the majors...the 17 losses are the A's most in May since 2009 when they went 11-18...that was also the last time the A's lost more than 17 games in any month...have clinched a losing record in May, their fourth consecutive month under .500 dating back to last August...prior to that, had 14 straight months with a winning record

NIGHT AND DAY: Have won each of their last three day games after losing 13 of the first 14 day games...are now 4-13 (.235) during the day compared to 13-18 (.419) at night...have the second worst record in day games in the majors (Cincinnati, 3-13) and are tied for the most losses... are batting .241 (140-for-580) with 63 runs scored during the day (3.71 per game) compared to .263 (290-for-1104) with 140 runs at night (4.52 per game).

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 1-10 when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 16-21 when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is the worst in the majors...are batting .212 (83-for-392) against lefties compared to .269 (347-for-1292) with 38 of their 42 home runs off righties...the mark against lefties is second lowest in the American League (Boston, .208) and the mark against righties is third highest.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have nine players on the disabled list (Crisp, Davis, Griffin, Ladendorf, Mujica, O'Flaherty, Parker, Pomeranz, Thompson)...Griffin, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...have had at least seven players on the DL all year and have used it a total of 15 times...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. TIGERS: The A's have split the first two games of 2015 after losing the season series last year, 5-2...split four games in Oakland but were swept in a three-game series at Detroit...over the previous six seasons, the A's have won one season series, lost three and split two...are 22-26 against the Tigers since the start of the 2009 season...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 246-241 against the Tigers...that includes 138-108 in Oakland, 106-131 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...all-time, the A's are 914-994 against the Tigers.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Josh Reddick is batting .423 (22-for-52) at home, which is the best home batting average in the majors...**Stephen Vogt** has hit safely in each of his last eight regular season games against Detroit (12-for-29, .414) and is a .353 (12-for-34) career hitter against the Tigers.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1956** Art Ditmar scatters 10-hits and shuts out the Tigers 5-0 in the second game of a doubleheader...in **1984** Rickey Henderson is 3 for 3 with three stolen bases in the A's 7-1 win over New York...in **1985** Dwayne Murphy leads off the bottom of the 10th inning with a home run to lift the A's to a 2-1 win over the New York Yankees.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Scott Kazmir (2-3, 3.09 ERA)

MONTH BY MONTH: Is 0-3 with a 5.14 ERA (16 er in 28.0 ip) and .291 (32-for-110) opponents batting average in five starts in May after going 2-0 with a 0.99 ERA and .158 opponents average in four starts in April...posted the fourth lowest April ERA in the American League...is now 2-5 with a 3.86 ERA (25 er in 58.1 ip) in 10 starts in May in his two seasons with the A's comapred to 6-0 with a 1.64 ERA in 10 starts in April.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-1 with a 1.85 ERA (5 er in 24.1 ip) and no home runs in four starts in Oakland compared to 1-2 with a 4.06 ERA (14 er in 31.0 ip) and six home runs in five starts on the road...has the seventh lowest home ERA in the American League...tossed 7.0 shutout innings in each of his first two starts at home to become the second A's pitcher since 1914 on an Opening Day roster to start the season by tossing seven or more innings and not allowing a run in his first two home starts (Tommy Milone, 2012).

WITH RUNNERS ON BASE: Has allowed a .271 (32-for-118) batting average with the bases empty compared to .172 (15-for-87) with runners on base...the mark with runners on base is the lowest among American League pitchers with enough innings to qualify for the ERA title...opponents are 8-for-43 (.186) with runners in scoring position, including 1-for-18 (.056) with RISP and two outs...last year, he held the opposition to a .081 batting average with runners in scoring position and two outs, which was the lowest mark by a Major Leaguer with 162 or more innings pitched since Bobby Bolin had a .079 average with San Francisco in 1965...opponents are now 6-for-80 (.075) off him with RISP and two outs over the last two years.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: Is 0-2 with a 5.60 ERA (11 er in 17.2 ip) in three starts against American League Central teams compared to 2-1 with a 1.91 ERA (8 er in 37.2 ip) in six starts against everyone else.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Four of the six home runs he has allowed this year have been solo shots...all six have come with no outs...has allowed a .325 (27-for-83) batting average with no outs, .219 (14-for-64) with one out and .103 (6-for-58) with two outs...opponents are batting .145 (16-for-110) with two strikes...has issued 20 of his 22 walks to right-handed hitters... the 22 walks are tied for fifth most in the American League...has yielded a .370 (20-for-54) average and four of his five home runs to batters leading off an inning...has a .685 opponents slugging percentage against batters leading off an inning...the slugging percentage leading off an inning is the highest in the AL among qualifiers for the ERA title and the batting average is second highest.

THIS AND THAT: Is scheduled to make the 250th start of his career to-day...the A's are 3-6 (.333) in his starting assignments...has received just eight runs of support over his last seven starts (42.1 ip, 1.70 RSA) after getting 18 runs of support in his first two starts...started the season by tossing six or more innings and allowing two runs or fewer in each of his first four starts...that matched the longest season-opening streak by an A's pitcher on the Opening Day roster since at least 1914 (fifth time, last: Jesse Chavez, 2014)...struck out 10 batters in his first start and eight in his second start to become the only A's pitcher on an Opening Day roster since at least 1914 to strike out eight or more batters in each of his first two starts of the season.

2015 START-BY-START: He combined with Otero and Alvarez on a threehit shutout in the A's 10-0 win over Texas April 8...tossed seven innings and allowed just one hit while striking out 10...it was his 23rd career 10-strikeout game, his second with the A's...became just the fifth pitcher in Oakland history to strikeout 10 while allowing one hit or fewer, the first since Barry Zito on Aug. 4, 2001 vs. Detroit (10 so, 1 h)...allowed only two base runners as far as second base...was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-1 win at Houston April 13...retired each of the first nine batters to extend his season-opening scoreless streak to 10.0 innings...had a 4-0 lead when Altuve led off the fourth inning with a home run...that was the only run he would allow and the A's added with four runs in the fifth...had a no decision in the A's 4-2 loss at Kansas City April 19...shutout the Royals on two hits over the first four innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a run to score on a ground out in the fifth inning...had a 2-1 lead entering the bottom of the eighth and walked Orlando to start the inning...retired the next batter and was relieved by O'Flaherty who allowed Orlando to score plus two runs of his own for the blown save and loss...had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 5-4, 11 inning loss to Houston April 24 in Oakland...tossed 7.0 shutout innings and allowed just five hits while walking three...did not allow a runner past second base...Keuchel shutout the A's on two hits in nine innings of work and the game was scoreless going into extra innings...both teams scored twice in the 10th inning before the Astros outscored the A's 3-2 in the 11th...had his third straight no decision in the A's 7-5 win at Texas May 1 ... allowed leadoff home runs to Blanks in the second inning and Fielder in the fourth inning...Smolinski added a

sacrifice fly in the fourth and Kazmir left after six innings trailing 3-0...the Rangers built a 5-0 lead before the A's scored seven times in the eighth for the win...was the losing pitcher in the A's 13-0 loss at Minnesota May 6. allowed four runs in the third inning on a leadoff home run by Rosario, RBI singles by Hunter and Plouffe and a sacrifice fly by Escobar...yielded two more runs in the sixth inning on a two-run home run by Escobar...Gibson, Pressly and Graham combined to shutout the A's on six hits...had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 11-inning loss to Boston May 11....the A's scored a run in the third, but he allowed a run in the fourth on a Ortiz RBI single...the A's scored a run in the bottom of the fourth, but he allowed a RBI single to Betts in the fifth...left after six innings with a 3-2 lead, but Scribner allowed two runs in the seventh for the blown save...was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-3 loss to Chicago (AL) May 17 in Oakland...tossed a season-low 4.1 innings...allowed an unearned run in the first inning and then blanked the White Sox on two hits and a walk over the next three innings...had a 2-1 lead when he allowed four runs, three earned, in the fifth inning...Abreu opened the scoring with a RBI single, Beckham walked with the bases loaded and Ramirez drove in two with a single

LAST START: He extended his losing streak to three games in the A's 5-2 loss at Tampa Bay last Friday...it was the 250th appearance of his career...the A's scored a run in the fourth and he blanked the Rays on five hits and three walks over the first four innings...then allowed a three-run home run to Longoria in the fifth inning.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Kendall Graveman (2-2, 6.04 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville last Saturday for his second stint with the A's this year and combined with Scribner and Clippard on a six-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win at Tampa Bay that day (6.0 ip, 3 h, 2 bb, 6 so)...was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 1-2 with an 8.27 ERA in four starts before he was optioned to Nashville April 26...went 2-1 with a 1.85 ERA in four starts with the Sounds...allowed one home run in 24.1 innings...went 2-0 with a 0.93 ERA over his final three starts...with the A's, opponents are 4-for-21 (.190) when leading off an inning...has allowed a .378 (17-for-45) batting average and all three of his home runs with runners on base, .217 (10-for-46) with the bases empty...the opponents two through six hitters in the order are batting a combined .393 (22-for-56), the rest of the order is hitting .143 (5-for-35)...has never faced the Yankees in his career.

- The A's bullpen has posted a 3.57 ERA (21 er in 53.0 ip) over its last 18 games but has four losses and three blown saves over that stretch... compiled a 7.98 ERA over the previous 15 contests...now has a 4.67 ERA for the season, which is the highest in the American League and second highest in the majors.
- Is tied with Seattle for most losses in the majors (12)...tied for the fewest saves (5) and the lowest save percentage (38.5%) in the majors...is tied for the second bost most blown saves (8) in the AL.
- Has allowed 33-of-87 (37.9%) inherited runners to score, which is the third highest percentage in the AL.
- First batters faced are hitting .271 (35-for-129), which is fourth highest in the AL...have the most first batter RBI in the majors (28) and rank third in home runs (7).
- Has allowed two runs or more in 25 of 49 games...the A's are 2-23 when the pen allows two runs or more, 14-8 when it allows one run or fewer.

Inherited Runners/Scored: 26/10 First Hitters: 8-19, bb, hbp

- Has pitched fewer than 1.0 innings in each of his last 13 outings (5.0 ip, 8 h, 6 r, 6 er, 2 bb, 4 so, 3 hr, 10.80 ERA), which is the longest such streak in Athletics history...the previous high was 12 by Mike Venafro (July 12-Sept. 22, 2002) and Jay Marshall (May 19-June 14, 2007).
- Has allowed 15 hits, 10 of which are for extra bases (five doubles, one triple, four home runs)...is tied for the lead among American League relievers in extra base hits, has the second highest opponents slugging percentage (.739) and is tied for third in home runs.
- Leads the majors in inherited runners (26) and is tied for the lead in inherited runners scored (10).
