OAKLAND ATHLETICS (17-32) VS. NEW YORK YANKEES (25-22)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two straight after winning a season-high three consecutive games...have lost 16 of the last 21 games and are now 9-24 (.272) over the last 33 games (beginning April 23) after starting the year 8-8...are 17-32 (.347) overall, which is the worst record in the American League and second worst in the majors (Milwaukee, 16-32)...it matches the second worst record after 49 games in Oakland history and is the worst since the 2005 club also started the year 17-32...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 20th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by a season-high tying 13½ games...it marks the second time in Oakland history the A's have trailed by more than 13 games before the end of May...trailed by 14 games in 2001 from May 29-31...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, seven days in fourth, one day tied for fourth and 20 days in fifth...the A's three-game winning streak from May 23-25 was their first winning streak longer than two games since Aug. 7-9, 2014 when they also won three straight...split the four-game series at Tampa Bay over the weekend, snapping a five-series losing streak...have not won a series since May 1-3 at Texas.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's lost each of the final two games of the Detroit series by one run and are now 0-10 in one-run games in Oakland...have a 12-game losing streak in one-run games at home dating back to last year, which is the longest such streak in Athletics history (dating back to 1901)...have not won a one-run game at home since Sept. 6, 2014 (4-3 vs. Houston)...are 2-15 (.118) in one-run games overall, which is the worst record in the majors...also lead the majors in one-run losses and are tied for fourth in one-run games...are 3-21 (.125) in games decided by two runs or fewer and have the most losses and worst record in the majors in those games...are 0-6 in extra inning games and the six-game extra inning losing streak matches the longest such streak by an A's team over the last 20 years (May 18-July 5, 2011 and May 21-July 25, 1999)...are tied with Pittsburgh for the Major League lead in extra inning losses and have the second most extra inning games in the American League (Seattle, 7)...are 0-9 in games decided in the last at bat...also lost their final last at bat game of 2014 and the 10-game losing streak in games decided in the last at bat matches the longest such streak in Oakland history (May 14-July 17, 1989)...are the only team without a last at bat win and are tied with Pittsburgh and Seattle for the most losses.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have not allowed an earned run in the last five games (31.0 ip, 1 r), which is the longest such streak by an A's team since at least 1914...are 4-7 with a 2.23 ERA (22 er in 88.2 ip) over the last 15 games and have a 3.25 ERA (104 er in 288.1 ip) for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...are tied with Washington for the fewest home runs in the majors (19)...rank fourth in the AL in innings pitched (288.1).

PITCHING: The A's have not allowed an earned run in three of the last five games (5 er in 45.0 ip, 1.00 ERA) and now have a 2.68 ERA (39 er in 131.0 ip) over the last 15 games...have two shutouts in the last five games and seven for the season, which is the most in the American League and tied for second most in the majors (San Francisco, 8)...rank fourth in the AL in strikeouts (377) but have the second most walks (154)...are tied for second in fewest home runs (39) and rank third in pickoffs (5).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed at least one error in 20 of the last 24 games (29 errors total) and have 50 errors for the season, which is nine more than any other team (Texas, 41)...the errors have led to 30 unearned runs, which is the most in the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's are 0 for their last 25 with runners in scoring position, 6-for-62 (.097) over the last six games and 18-for-140 (.129) over the last 14 games...during the 14-game stretch the A's had an 0-for-14 game, two 0-for-11 games and one 0-for-10 game...have scored 39 runs over that span (2.79 per game)...are hitting .165 (32-for-194) with RISP over the last 21 games after hitting .310 with RISP over the first 28 contests...were shutout for the fifth time Tuesday, which is second most in the American League (Tampa Bay, 6)...rank second in the AL in stolen base percentage (29-for-35, 82.9%) and tied for second in triples (14).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-2 on this seven-game homestand against Detroit (1-2) and New York-AL (four games)...have yet to win a home series this year (six losses, one split)...went 1-5 on the last homes-

tand against Boston (1-2) and Chicago-AL (0-3), the A's second consecutive 1-5 homestand...have lost 14 of their last 17 home games and are 6-16 (.273) at home for the season, which is the worst home record in the majors and the worst home record after 22 games in Oakland history...have finished with a losing record on all three homestands...the last time the A's had three straight losing homestands in one season was in 2005...have not had four straight losing homestands in one season since 1979 (May 15-July 15)...finished with a losing record on each of the final two homestands of 2014 and the streak of five consecutive losing homestands matches the longest in Oakland history (last four of 1978, first of 1979)...went 3-4 on the last road trip to Houston (1-2) and Tampa Bay (2-2)...have lost nine of the last 12 road games and are 11-16 (.407) for the season.

IN MAY: The A's are 8-18 (.308) in May, which is tied with Miami for the worst record in the majors...the 18 losses are the A's most in any month since they went 11-18 in May of 2009...have not lost more than 18 games in a month since August of 2008 (10-20) and have not more in May since 2005 (7-20)...have clinched a losing record in May, their fourth consecutive month under .500 dating back to last August...prior to that, had 14 straight months with a winning record

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's have won three of their last four day games after losing 13 of the first 14...are now 4-14 (.222) during the day compared to 13-18 (.419) at night...have the second worst record in day games in the majors (Cincinnati, 3-14) and are tied for the most losses...are batting .240 (146-for-609) with 65 runs scored during the day (3.61 per game) compared to .263 (290-for-1104) with 140 runs at night (4.52 per game).

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 1-10 when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 16-22 when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is the worst in the majors...are batting .217 (88-for-406) against lefties compared to .266 (348-for-1307) with 38 of their 42 home runs off righties...the mark against lefties is second lowest in the American League (Boston, .208) and the mark against righties is third highest.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 1-17 when they are outthomered, 2-13 in the final game of a series and 2-20 when scoring fewer than four runs...have allowed 40 runs in the seventh inning, which is five more than any other team (Miami, 35)...have a 6.06 ERA (33 er in 49.0 ip) and .296 (60-for-203) opponents batting average in the seventh inning...have used 15 relievers, which is one more than the season total for 2013 and 2014.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have nine players on the disabled list (Crisp, Davis, Griffin, Ladendorf, Mujica, O'Flaherty, Parker, Pomeranz, Thompson)...Griffin, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...have had at least nine players on the DL each of the previous eight days and at least seven all year...have used the DL a total of 15 times...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. YANKEES: The A's won the season series last year, 4-2...won two of three in both Oakland and New York...have won each of the previous two season series against New York and are 9-3 over that stretch...have won 14 of their last 19 games against the Yankees, including nine of the last 10 in Oakland...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 235-269 against the Yankees...that includes 129-122 in Oakland and 106-147 in New York...all-time, the A's are 776-1135 against the Yankees/Orioles.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Burns is tied for the lead among American League rookies in multi-hit games (8)...**Josh Reddick** is batting .407 (22-for-54) at home, which is the best home batting average in the majors.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1972** George Hendrick hits his first Major League home run, a walk-off shot in the A's 5-4 win over Chicago...in **1980** Dwayne Murphy and Wayne Gross both steal home in the first inning of a 6-3 win over Kansas City at the Coliseum...the A's stole seven bases in the game...in **1996** Mark McGwire hits the 9000th home run in the history of the Athletics franchise in the A's 6-2 win over Boston.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (2-2, 6.04 ERA)

FOR OPENERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville last Saturday for his second stint with the A's this year and tossed 6.0 shutout innings for the win that day at Tampa Bay...was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 1-2 with an 8.27 ERA in four starts before he was optioned to Nashville April 26...went 2-1 with a 1.85 ERA in four starts with the Sounds...was acquired from Toronto Nov., 28, 2014 with pitcher Sean Nolin, infielder Brett Lawrie and minor league infielder Franklin Barreto for Josh Donaldson...made his Major League debut with the Blue Jays last year in just his second professional season and compiled a 3.86 ERA in five relief appearances.

THIS AND THAT: Opponents are 4-for-21 (.190) when leading off an inning...has allowed a .378 (17-for-45) batting average and all three of his home runs with runners on base, .217 (10-for-46) with the bases empty...the opponents two through six hitters in the order are batting a combined .393 (22-for-56), the rest of the order is hitting .143 (5-for-35)...the A's are 3-2 (.600) in his starting assignments...has tossed fewer than five innings in three of his five starts, which are the first starts of his career.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-1 loss to Texas April 9 in Oakland, his first Major League start...allowed three runs in the first, a two-run home run to Moreland in the third and a three-run home run to Choo in the fourth...the two home runs were the first of his career...surrendered just five home runs in 207.0 minor league innings...yielded eight runs in 3.1 innings to become the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to allow eight or more runs in his A's debut (last: Clayton Mortensen, 8 on Aug. 8, 2009 at Kansas City).

SECOND START: He combined with O'Flaherty, Otero, Abad and Clippard on an eight-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win at Houston April 14...it was his first Major League win...tossed 5.1 innings and allowed four of the hits...allowed four runners into scoring position and retired the side in order just once (fifth inning).

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-3 win at Los Angeles April 20...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed two in the bottom of the first on a two-run single by Freese...the A's then scored three runs in the third to take a 4-2 lead but he allowed a Pujols RBI single in the bottom of the third...had a 5-3 lead when he walked the first two batters in the fourth inning...was relieved by Otero who stranded both runners and tossed 4.0 scoreless innings for the win.

FOURTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-3 loss to Houston on April 25 in Oakland...allowed a RBI double to Lowrie in the first inning and a three-run home run to Altuve in the third...also yielded a RBI single to Lowrie in the fifth and was relieved by Bassitt with runners on first and third and two outs in the sixth...Bassitt allowed one of the runners to score on a wild pitch.

LAST START: He combined with Scribner and Clippard on a six-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win at Tampa Bay last Saturday...tossed a career-high six innings and allowed three of the hits...struck out a career-high six...retired 12 of the first 13 batters he faced...allowed only two runners to advance into scoring position.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 3-1 with a 0.36 ERA in six spring training starts...had the lowest ERA in the majors and the lowest ERA by a Cactus League qualifier since at least 2006...allowed just one earned run all spring...tied for second in the Cactus League in wins and tied for fifth in innings pitched (25.1)...held the opposition to a .141 (12-for-85) batting average...surrendered just one home run in 25.1 innings...did not allow an earned run over his final 20.1 spring innings...it was his first Major League Spring Training.

2014 RECAP: Was named a *Baseball America* Minor League Baseball First Team All-Star after combining for a 14-6 record and a 1.83 ERA in 27 starts with Single-A Lansing, Single-A Dunedin, Double-A New Hampshire and Triple-A Buffalo...then made his Major League debut with Toronto in September in just his second professional season...was recalled from Triple-A Buffalo Sept. 2 and had no decisions and a 3.86 ERA in five relief appearances...allowed a .222 batting average and did not walk a batter in 4.2 innings...yielded a .200 (2-for-10) average against right-handed hitters, .250 (2-for-8) against lefthanders...stranded his only inherited runner but first batters faced were 2-for-5 (.400)...was named the A's sixth best prospect by *Baseball America* following the trade.

WITH TORONTO: Made his debut Sept. 5 at Boston and allowed a single to the only batter he faced, Yoenis Céspedes...he later scored...struck out Nelson Cruz to end the seventh inning in his second outing Sept. 16 at Baltimore for his first strikeout...did not allow a run over his final two appearances (3.0 ip).

MINORS: His 14 wins tied for third most in the all of the minor leagues and his 1.83 ERA ranked fourth among full season minor leaguers...ranked seventh in the minors in innings pitched (167.1)...led the Blue Jays farm system in ERA and wins and ranked fourth in strikeouts (115)...surrendered just two home runs, an average of 0.11 per nine innings...allowed a .232 opponents batting average, including .196 (66-for-335) against right-handed hitters compared to .272 (76-for-279) against left-handers...compiled a 1.41 ERA over the first five innings of a game, a 4.91 ERA in the sixth inning and a 0.79 ERA from the seventh inning on...did not allow an earned run in the second inning (27.0 ip)...his teams were 17-10 (.630) in his starting assignments...allowed four runs or fewer in all 27 of his starts, including two runs or fewer 23 times...walked two batters or fewer 25 times and tossed at least six innings in 21 of his starts.

RHP Sonny Gray (5-2, 1.77 ERA): Tossed 5.0 scoreless innings in his last start to lower his ERA to an American League leading 1.77...the ERA is third lowest by an A's pitcher after 10 starts in the designated hitter era (1.41 by Mike Norris in 1980, 1.74 by Dan Haren in 2007)...is 2-2 with a 1.52 ERA in five starts in May after going 3-0 with a 1.98 ERA in five starts in April...his May ERA is fourth lowest in the AL...has allowed 11 of his 14 runs over the first three innings of a game...has a 3.30 ERA in innings one through three and a 0.50 ERA from the fourth inning on...is 2-1 with a 1.19 ERA in four starts at home and has the second lowest home ERA in the AL...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 7-2 A's win at Tampa Bay last Sunday (5.0 ip, 4 h, 4 so)...was the losing pitcher in his only career start against New York, a 7-0 A's loss in Oakland last year on June 13 (6.0 ip, 7 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 7 so).

- The A's bullpen has posted a 3.66 ERA (24 er in 59.0 ip) over its last 19 games but has five losses and three blown saves over that stretch... compiled a 7.98 ERA over the previous 15 contests...now has a 4.66 ERA for the season, which is the highest in the American League and second highest in the majors.
- Has the most losses in the majors (13)...tied for the fewest saves (5), and has the third lowest save percentage (38.5%) in the majors...is tied for the second most blown saves (8) in the AL.
- Has allowed 33-of-87 (37.9%) inherited runners to score, which is the third highest percentage in the AL.
- First batters faced are hitting .271 (36-for-133), which is fourth highest in the AL...have the most first batter RBI in the majors (28) and rank third in home runs (7).
- Has allowed two runs or more in 26 of 50 games...the A's are 2-24 when the pen allows two runs or more, 14-8 when it allows one run or fewer (one complete game).

- Has pitched fewer than 1.0 innings in each of his last 13 outings (5.0 ip, 8 h, 6 r, 6 er, 2 bb, 4 so, 3 hr, 10.80 ERA), which is the longest such streak in Athletics history...the previous high was 12 by Mike Venafo (July 12-Sept. 22, 2002) and Jay Marshall (May 19-June 14, 2007).
- Has allowed 15 hits, 10 of which are for extra bases (five doubles, one triple, four home runs)...is tied for second among American League relievers in extra base hits, has the second highest opponents slugging percentage (.739) and is tied for third in home runs.
- Leads the majors in inherited runners (26) and is second in inherited runners scored (10).
- Faced three batters last Tuesday, ending his Athletics record-tying streak of five consecutive games facing just one batter (Mike Mohler, June 1-21, 1993; Buddy Groom, July 5-14, 1998).
- First batters faced are 8-for-19 (.421) with two doubles, a triple, three home runs and 11 RBI...the RBI are the most in the majors and the home runs are tied for the most.
- Has appeared in four career games against New York (3.0 ip, 1 h, 2 bb, 2 so).

Last Year: Posted a 1.57 ERA and allowed just 13.2% (5-of-38) of inherited runners to score in a career-high 69 appearances in his first full season in the majors... ranked third among AL relievers in pct. of inherited runners scored and fifth in ERA.

- Reinstated from the 15-day disabled list yesterday and made his season debut...did not pitch during the spring and was placed on the 15-day disabled list April 4 with a strained left rotator cuff.
- Is 1-1 with three saves all-time against the Yankees (12.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 11 so, 1 hr, 0.75 ERA).
