May 28, 1946: Yankee Stadium hosts its first night game, as a crowd of 49,917 watches the Yankees lose to Washington, 2-1.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

May 29, 2009: Mariano Rivera records the save in the Yankees' 3-1 win at Cleveland, marking his 58th career save of an Andy Pettitte win. The pair surpasses Bob Welch and Dennis Eckersley (57) for the most win/save instances for any pitcher/reliever duo in Major League history.

SATURDAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

May 30, 1956: Batting against Pedro Ramos in Game 2 of a doubleheader vs. Washington, Mickey Mantle nearly hits a home run out of Yankee Stadium, as the ball strikes the upper deck frieze in right field.

May 30, 1938: A franchise-record crowd of 81,841 attends a doubleheader sweep of the Boston Red Sox.

AT A GLANCE: Today the Yankees begin a seven-game, two-city road trip with the first of four games in Oakland (today-Sunday)...also play three games in Seattle (Mon.-Wed.)...went 3-3 on their recent homestand, sweeping three games vs. Kansas City after being swept in three games vs. Texas.

- ▶ Regardless of tonight's result, will finish today's play with at least a share of the AL East lead for the third straight day (5/26-present)...have a 1.5-game lead over Tampa Bay, their largest lead since 5/16 (+2.0G)...have had at least a share of first place for 30 of the past 35 days, including sole possession for 24-of-35 days...held at least a share of the AL East lead for 28 consecutive days (4/23-5/21), their longest run in first place since sitting atop the division for the final 114 days of the 2012 season (6/11-10/3/12).
- ▶ Their current three-game winning streak is their longest since winning three straight from 5/1-3 at Boston...are seeking to tie their season-long four-game winning streak from 4/21-24.
- ▶ Are 4-10 in their last 14G after going 18-6 in the previous 24G from 4/17-5/11...are 22-16 in their last 38G (since 4/17), the third-best mark in the AL in that span (MIN, 25-12; HOU, 26-13)...are 1-7 in their last 8G on the road after going 11-3 over 14 road contests from 4/17-5/11.
- ▶ Are 7-5 in their last 12 series since 4/17.
- ▶ Today marks the 12th of 24 straight games outside the AL East (4-7 so far) and the first of 10 straight vs. the AL West (0-3 in 2015)...are in the midst of playing 40-of-43G against non-AL East teams...are 9-9 in non-divisional games this season.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: On Wednesday, the Yankees finished a sweep over the Royals with a 4-2 win...**RHP Michael Pineda** permitted only a solo HR over 6.2IP to earn his team-leading sixth win (6H, 1ER, 1BB, 8K, 1WP)...**DH Alex Rodriguez** (2-for-4, 1R, 1HR, 3RBI) hit a three-run HR in the third inning to reach 1,995 career RBI, passing Lou Gehrig (1,993RBI) for the all-time AL RBI record...marked his 665th career HR...**C Brian McCann** (1-for-2, 2BB) tied the game with a solo HR in the second...**RF Carlos Beltran** (2-for-3) extended his hitting streak to 15 games...**LHP Andrew Miller** (1.0IP) recorded his first save since 5/8 with a perfect ninth...**RHP Dellin Betances** (1.0IP, 1H, 1R/OER, 1BB, 3K) struck out three batters but allowed an unearned run in the eighth.

FOUR SCORE: Yankees pitchers allowed just 4R in the three-game series against the Royals after allowing 30 runs in the previous 3G...marked their fewest runs allowed in a series of at least 3G since allowing 4R in a three-game sweep at Houston from 9/27-29/13.

CHIEFS OF STAFF: Yankees pitchers have held opponents to 1ER-or-fewer in three straight games for the first time since 5/14-17/14 (3G)...the club's last longer streak was 4G from 9/18-21/03 (included one 5.0IP game)...according to Fangraphs, lead the AL with a 6.7 WAR and rank third in the Majors behind the Nationals (7.8) and Dodgers (6.7).

- ▶ **RHP Michael Pineda** ranks fourth among qualified AL starters and sixth in the Majors with a 2.53 FIP...ranks third in the AL and fourth in the Majors with 2.0 WAR.
- ▶ **RHP Dellin Betances** leads all Major League relievers with 1.3 WAR (next-highest: Drew Storen-1.0).
- ▶ **Yankees pitchers** are third in the AL and sixth in the Majors with 401K and third in the AL with a 3.16 K/BB ratio.

DEALIN' BETANCES: **RHP Dellin Betances** has recorded his last six outs via strikeout...has pitched 26.0IP in 2015 without allowing an earned run (9H, 3R/OER, 11BB/1IBB, 41K), the most IP in 2015 by any Major League pitcher who has not allowed an earned run...his 23 consecutive appearances without an earned run to begin a season are a club record and one of just eight such season-opening streaks of at least that length in the Majors since the inception of earned runs (1912 in NL, 1913 in AL)...is tied for the third-longest single-season streak without an earned run in Yankees history: Mariano Rivera-28 in 1999, Boone Logan-25 in 2010, Steve Farr-23 in 1991.

- ▶ Morales' infield single snapped an 0-for-29 stretch over his last 33 batters faced since 5/4 (included 2BB/1BB and 1SF).
- ▶ Has fanned 30 of his last 59 batters faced and 33 of his last 64.
- ▶ His 41K are the most strikeouts by a pitcher prior to allowing his first earned run of the season in Yankees history (since the AL's inception of earned runs in 1913).

NUMBER WATCH: With his three-run HR on Wednesday, **DH Alex Rodriguez** reached 1,995 career RBI, passing Lou Gehrig (1,993) for the all-time American League record...also moved into third place on the all-time Major League RBI list according to Elias, which is the official statistic of MLB (please note that the stats found on MLB.com and baseball-reference.com are NOT official stats)...please also note that RBI only became an official statistic in 1920...is 1RBI shy of tying Barry Bonds (1,996) for second place in MLB history.

- ▶ Has 1,946 career runs scored, three shy of tying Stan Musial (1,949R) for eighth place on MLB's all-time list.
- ▶ Batted .455 (10-for-22) with 6R, 1 double, 1HR, 4RBI and 3BB on the six-game homestand to raise his season BA from .246 to .276, highest since 4/20 (.286)...has hit safely in 11 consecutive starts and is batting .355 (16-for-45) in his last 13G overall since 5/13.

POWERING UP: Yankees batters hit 2HR on Wednesday, bringing their season total to 60HR in 47G, second-most in the AL and third in the Majors (HOU-66, LAD-62)...did not hit their 60th HR of 2014 until their 75th game (6/23/14).

- ▶ Hit 13HR on the six-game homestand, accounting for 28 of their 38 runs (73.7%)...have scored 102 of their 217 runs on HR this season (47.0%).
- ▶ Have homered in 33 of 47 games this season, and are tied for fourth in the Majors with 16 multi-HR games.
- ▶ Are third in the AL and fourth in the Majors with 150 extra-base hits and rank fourth in the Majors with a .172 ISO.
- ▶ Rank third in the AL and sixth in MLB with a .418 slugging pct. (in 2014, had a .380 SLG, 10th-AL/17th-MLB)...are slugging an AL-best .427 vs. right-handers, third in the Majors.
- ▶ Since 4/26, the Yankees have recorded an RBI on each of their last 119 runs over the last 28-plus games.

MAC ATTACK: **C Brian McCann** has homered and reached base safely three times in two consecutive games for the second time in his career (also 8/29-30/10)...in his last 5G, is 5-for-15 (.333) with 4R, 1 double, 2HR, 8RBI and 6BB...had just 5BB in his first 33G of 2015...has reached safely in 11 of his last 21PA.

- ▶ Ranks third among MLB catchers with 29RBI in 2015.

BELTRAN'S STREAK HITS 15: **RF Carlos Beltran's** 15G hitting streak (since 5/8) equals the second-longest streak of his career, one shy of his career-best 16-game streak from 4/17-5/5/09 w/ the Mets...is the longest streak by a Yankee since Jacoby Ellsbury (17G) from 5/26-6/13/14.

- ▶ During the streak, is hitting .339 (19-for-56) with 7R, 4 doubles, 3HR, 9RBI and 2BB, raising his season BA over the span from .187 to a season-high .245.
- ▶ Is batting .316 (25-for-79) with 3HR and 11RBI in May after hitting just .162 (11-for-68) with 0HR and 7RBI in April.

THE SOUND OF THUNDER: **RHP Dellin Betances** and **LHP Andrew Miller** rank first and tied for second among Major League relievers in strikeouts with 41 and 34, respectively.

- ▶ Their combined numbers: 0.38 ERA, 47.1IP, 14H, 4R/2ER, 20BB/1IBB, 75K, 2HP...opponents are batting .090 (14-for-156) with 2 doubles and 1HR against them.

JUST HOW HE DREW IT UP: **LHP Andrew Miller** recorded his first save since 5/8 on Wednesday with a perfect ninth...is holding opponents to a .070 (5-for-71) batting average this season, lowest among AL relievers and second-lowest in the Majors (Brandon Cunniff-.044, 2-for-45).

- ▶ Is tied for fourth in the Majors with 14 saves, behind only Glen Perkins (18), Drew Storen (16) and Joakim Soria (15)...is the first pitcher in Yankees history to successfully convert his first 14 save chances with the club.
- ▶ Had a season-opening 17.2-inning scoreless streak from 4/8-5/16...his 17 consecutive scoreless appearances to begin a season were the second-most in Yankees history, two shy of LHP Lee Guetterman's club record (19) in 1989.
- ▶ Has multiple strikeouts in 11 of his 21 outings and ranks fifth among all MLB relievers (min. 0.93BF/team game) with 14.34 strikeouts per 9.0IP ratio (21.1IP, 34K).

ON THE COMEBACK TRAIL: In a rehab start with Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre on Wednesday, **RHP Masahiro Tanaka** took a no-decision after allowing 3ER in 3.0IP in a 9-6 win at Pawtucket (4H, 2BB, 4K, 1HR)...threw 62 pitches, 44 for strikes.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: LHP CC SABATHIA (2-6, 5.47 ERA)

LHP CC Sabathia is scheduled to make his 10th start of the season in tonight's road trip opener in Oakland...is pitching on regular four days' rest...has won each of his last two road starts, throwing 7.0IP in each...is ranked 24th all-time in wins (210) by a left-handed pitcher...has 199 wins as an AL pitcher...won the 2007 AL Cy Young Award with Cleveland after going 19-7 with a 3.21 ERA (241.0IP, 86ER) and 209K...made his Major League debut at 20 years old in 2001 and since then has a 210-125 (.627) career record with a 3.66 ERA (2,875.2IP, 1,170ER) and 2,484K in 432 starts, marking the most wins and strikeouts in the Majors over the stretch...spent 2001-08 with the Indians and was traded to the Brewers on 7/7/08...signed with the Yankees as a free agent on 12/18/08...is the longest-tenured Yankees pitcher, as only Alex Rodriguez (since 2004) and Brett Gardner (since 2008) pre-date his arrival in the Bronx.

2015: Has posted a 4.27 K/BB ratio (47K, 11BB), tied for 10th-lowest in the AL...his 1.82 BB/9.0IP ratio ranks eighth in the AL among starters...is tied for the AL lead with six losses...has allowed at least 6H in all nine starts and is tied for seventh in the AL with 66 hits allowed...has completed at least 6.0IP in six of his nine starts in 2015...left-handed batters are batting .146 (6-for-41) against him in 2015 and .152 (10-for-66) since the start of 2014.

LAST TIME OUT: Took his sixth loss in his shortest start of the season in the Yankees' 15-4 loss on Sat. vs. Texas (2.1IP, 7H, 6ER, 1BB, 4K, 1WP)...marked his shortest start since 6/21/09 at Florida (left after 1.1IP with left biceps tendinitis) and his shortest non-injury-shortened start since 6/21/06 vs. Chicago-NL w/ Cleveland (2.1IP, 9ER).

VS. OAKLAND: The Bay Area native (born in Vallejo, Calif.) is 8-10 with a 4.66 ERA (172.0IP, 89ER) in 27 career starts against the A's, one of two teams against which he is at least two games under .500 (1-8 vs. Yankees).
 † Is 5-3 with a 3.22 ERA (86.2IP, 31ER) in 12 starts vs. Oakland since joining the Yankees in 2009.
 † Compiled a streak of 10 consecutive quality starts against the A's from 7/23/09-5/3/13, one of just five streaks of that length (or longer) vs. Oakland in the last 37 seasons (since 1979)...had the streak snapped in his most recent start against the A's on 6/11/13 at Oakland (6.0IP, 8H, 6ER, 1BB, 3K, 1HR).
 † Is 4-6 with a 5.30 ERA (86.2IP, 51ER) in 14 career starts at the O.co Coliseum...is 3-2 with a 3.50 ERA (43.2IP, 17ER) in six starts here as a Yankee.

MOVING ON UP: His win on 5/16 at Kansas City was his 210th career victory, passing Vida Blue (209) and giving him sole possession of 24th place on MLB's all-time wins list...is one win shy of tying Billy Pierce for 23rd place...tied Johnny Murphy and George Pipgras for 18th on the Yankees' all-time wins list (93).

ROAD WARRIOR: Has thrown 7.0IP in each of his last two road starts and four of his six road starts in 2015...is tied for the Major League lead with four road starts of at least 7.0IP.
 † No Yankees pitcher has won three-or-more consecutive road starts while throwing at least 7.0IP in each since Sabathia did it over three starts from 5/26-6/12/12.
 † Since joining the Yankees in 2009, is 50-30 with a 3.80 ERA (648.2IP, 274ER) in 96 road starts...is fifth in the Majors in road wins in that span (see chart on right)...will be making his seventh road start (2-3, 3.48) but has started just three times at home (0-3, 11.77).

A LITTLE HELP, GUYS?: Received at least 4R of support in each of his two wins this season but has received 3R-or-fewer in each of his other 10 starts since 4/29/14, including one run or fewer in six of the 12.
 † Has received 1R-or-fewer in five of his nine starts this season.

OTHER STARTS: Allowed a season-low 1ER over 7.0IP to earn his second consecutive win on 5/16 vs. Kansas City...earned his first win of the season on 5/11 at Tampa Bay...his 6H were a season low and his 9K were his most since recording 9K on 4/11/14 vs. Boston...posted a quality start on 5/1 at Boston but did not earn the win in the Yankees' 3-2 victory...tossed his 38th career complete game (8.0IP) in a 2-1 loss on 4/20 at Detroit...threw just 98 pitches, marking the fewest pitches by a Yankees starter in a non-weather-shortened CG since he threw 97 pitches in a CG loss on 4/22/10 at Oakland...made his season debut in a 6-3 loss on 4/9 vs. Toronto...suffered the loss despite recording 8K and no walks, marking his fourth career loss in a start with 8K+ and OBB...was the fourth Yankee starter since 1914 to take a loss in such a start.
