OAKLAND ATHLETICS (18-32) VS. NEW YORK YANKEES (25-23)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won four of the last six games after losing 14 of the previous 16 contests...are now 10-24 (.294) over the last 34 games (beginning April 23) after starting the year 8-8...are 18-32 (.360) overall, which is the worst record in the American League and second worst in the majors (Milwaukee, 16-32)...it matches the 2005 A's for the third worst record after 50 games in Oakland history...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 21st consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 13 games...since divisional play began, the A's three largest deficits at the end of May are 14 in 2001, 13 in 1979 and 11½ in 2005...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, seven days in fourth, one day tied for fourth and 21 days in fifth...the A's three-game winning streak from May 23-25 was their first winning streak longer than two games since Aug. 7-9, 2014 when they also won three straight...split the four-game series at Tampa Bay over the weekend, snapping a five-series losing streak...have not won a series since May 1-3 at Texas.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's snapped a 12-game losing streak in one-run games at home with the 5-4 win last night...that was the longest such streak in Athletics history (dating back to 1901)...it was their first one-run win at home since Sept. 6, 2014 (4-3 vs. Houston)...are 1-10 in one-run games in Oakland and 3-15 (.167) overall, which is the worst record in the majors...also lead the majors in one-run losses and rank fourth in one-run games...are 4-21 (.160) in games decided by two runs or fewer...are 0-6 in extra inning games and the six-game extra inning losing streak matches the longest such streak by an A's team over the last 20 years (May 18-July 5, 2011 and May 21-July 25, 1999)...are tied with Pittsburgh for the Major League lead in extra inning losses and have the second most extra inning games in the American League (Seattle, 7)...are 0-9 in games decided in the last at bat...also lost their final last at bat game of 2014 and the 10-game losing streak in games decided in the last at bat matches the longest such streak in Oakland history (May 14-July 17, 1989)...are the only team without a last at bat win and are tied with Pittsburgh and Seattle for the most losses.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's win last night was just their second of the season in a game started by a left-handed pitcher...are 2-10 when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 16-22 when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is the worst in the majors...are batting .220 (96-for-436) against lefties compared to .267 (349-for-1309) with 38 of their 44 home runs off righties...the mark against lefties is third lowest in the American League and the mark against righties is third highest.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers had their streak of five consecutive games without an earned run end last night...it was the longest such streak by an A's team since at least 1914...are 3-1 with a 0.74 ERA (3 er in 36.2 ip) over the last six games and 4-7 with a 2.39 ERA (25 er in 94.1 ip) over the last 16 contests...have a 3.28 ERA (107 er in 294.0 ip) for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...have allowed 20 home runs, which is second fewest in the majors (Washington, 19)...rank third in the AL in innings pitched (294.0).

PITCHING: The A's have a 1.50 ERA (9 er in 54.0 ip) over their last six games and a 2.77 ERA (43 er in 140.0 ip) over the last 16 contests...have two shutouts in the last six games and seven for the season, which is the most in the American League and tied for second most in the majors (San Francisco, 8)...rank fourth in the AL in strikeouts (383) but have the second most walks (157)...are second in fewest home runs (40) and rank third in pickoffs (5).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed at least one error in 21 of the last 25 games (30 errors total) and have 51 errors for the season, which is nine more than any other team (Texas, 42)...the errors have led to 30 unearned runs, which is the most in the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's went 3-for-9 with runners in scoring position yesterday to snap a 0-for-25 streak with RISP...are 9-for-71 (.127) with RISP over the last seven games and 21-for-149 (.141) over the last 15 games...during the 15-game stretch the A's had an 0-for-14 game, two 0-for-11 games and one 0-for-10 game...have scored 44 runs over that span (2.93 per game)...are hitting .172 (35-for-203) with RISP over the last 22 games after hitting .310 with RISP over the first 28 contests...were shutout for the

fifth time Tuesday, which is second most in the American League (Tampa Bay, 6)...rank second in the AL in stolen base percentage (29-for-35, 82.9%) and tied for second in triples (14).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-2 on this seven-game homestand against Detroit (1-2) and New York-AL (1-0)...have not won back-to-back home games this year...have yet to win a home series this year (six losses, one split) and also lost their final home series of 2014...the eight consecutive home series without a win matches the longest such streak in Oakland history (May 13-June 29, 1977 and June 1-July 15, 1979)...last won a home series when they took two of three from Philadelphia Sept. 19-21, 2014...went 1-5 on the last homestand against Boston (1-2) and Chicago-AL (0-3), the A's second consecutive 1-5 homestand...have lost 14 of their last 18 home games and are 7-16 (.304) at home for the season, which is the second worst home record in the majors (Texas, 6-14)...it matched the 1994 A's for the second worst record after 23 home games in Oakland history (lost game 24 in 1994)...have finished with a losing record on all three homestands...the last time the A's had three straight losing homestands in one season was in 2005...have not had four straight losing homestands in one season since 1979 (May 15-July 15)...finished with a losing record on each of the final two homestands of 2014 and the streak of five consecutive losing homestands matches the longest in Oakland history (last four of 1978, first of 1979)...went 3-4 on the last road trip to Houston (1-2) and Tampa Bay (2-2)...have lost nine of the last 12 road games and are 11-16 (.407) for the season...leave Monday for a six-game road trip to Detroit (three games) and Boston (three games).

IN MAY: The A's are 9-18 (.333) in May, which is tied for the second worst record in the majors (Miami, 8-18)...the 18 losses are the A's most in any month since they went 11-18 in May of 2009...have not lost more than 18 games in a month since August of 2008 (10-20) and have not more in May since 2005 (7-20)...have clinched a losing record in May, their fourth consecutive month under .500 dating back to last August...prior to that, had 14 straight months with a winning record

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's have won three of their last four day games after losing 13 of the first 14...are now 4-14 (.222) during the day compared to 14-18 (.438) at night...have the second worst record in day games in the majors (Cincinnati, 3-14) and are tied for the most losses...are batting .240 (146-for-609) with 65 runs scored during the day (3.61 per game) compared to .263 (299-for-1136) with 145 runs at night (4.53 per game).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have nine players on the disabled list (Crisp, Davis, Griffin, Ladendorf, Mujica, O'Flaherty, Parker, Pomeranz, Thompson)...Griffin, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...O'Flaherty is on a rehab assignment...have had at least nine players on the DL each of the last nine days (today is day 10) and at least seven players on the DL all year...have used the DL a total of 15 times...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. YANKEES: The A's won the first meeting of 2015 last night after winning the season series last year, 4-2...won two of three in both Oakland and New York...have won each of the previous two season series against New York and are 9-3 over that stretch...have won 15 of their last 20 games against the Yankees, including 10 of the last 11 in Oakland...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 236-269 against the Yankees...that includes 130-122 in Oakland and 106-147 in New York...all-time, the A's are 777-1135 against the Yankees/Orioles.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Burns leads American League rookies in multi-hit games (9) and is tied for second in stolen bases (7)...**Ben Zobrist** walked with the bases loaded last night to give the A's the lead and five of his nine RBI have put the A's ahead.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1909** Frank Baker hits the first home run at Shibe Park...in **1990** Ricky Henderson breaks Ty Cobb's American League stolen base record with his 893rd career steal...in **2000** Randy Velarde turns the 10th regular season unassisted triple play in major league history but the A's lose at New York, 4-1.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (5-2, 1.77 ERA)

EARNED RUN AVERAGE: Tossed 5.0 scoreless innings in his last start to lower his ERA to an American League leading 1.77...the ERA is third lowest by an A's pitcher after 10 starts in the designated hitter era (1.41 by Mike Norris in 1980, 1.74 by Dan Haren in 2007)...has allowed one earned run or fewer in seven of his 10 starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Has the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the American League (.248) and the second fewest home runs per nine innings (0.27)...also ranks fifth in opponents batting average (.202) and on-base percentage (.264), tied for fifth in wins (5), eighth in innings pitched (66.0) and ninth in strikeouts (61)...is also tied for fifth in wild pitches (5).

MONTH BY MONTH: Is 2-2 with a 1.52 ERA (5 er in 29.2 ip) in five starts in May after going 3-0 with a 1.98 ERA in five starts in April...his May ERA is third lowest in the American League...tied for third in the American League in wins in April and ranked ninth in ERA...has finished a month with an ERA under 2.00 twice in his career (this April and 1.03 in July, 2014).

INNING BY INNING: Has allowed 11 of his 14 runs over the first three innings of a game...has a 3.30 ERA (11 er in 30.0 ip) in innings one through three and a 0.50 ERA (2 er in 36.0 ip) from the fourth inning on...has a 3.45 career ERA (61 er in 159.0 ip) in innings 1-3, 2.18 (46 er in 190.0 ip) from the fourth inning on.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-1 with a 1.19 ERA (4 er in 30.1 ip) and .155 (16-for-103) opponents batting average in four starts at home compared to 3-1 with a 2.27 ERA (9 er in 35.2 ip) and .237 (32-for-135) opponents average in five starts on the road...has the second lowest home ERA in the American League and the sixth lowest road ERA...has walked three batters in 30.1 innings at home compared to 15 in 35.2 innings on the road.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 3-1 with a 0.92 ERA (4 er in 39.0 ip) in six starts on four days rest compared to 2-1 with a 3.00 ERA (9 er in 27.0 ip) in four starts on five days rest or more.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held the opposition to a .179 (15-for-84) batting average with runners on base, which is third lowest in the American League among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title...opponents are batting .262 (22-for-84) with two home runs the first time through the lineup, .169 (26-for-154) with no home runs after that

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 2-1 with a 0.69 ERA (2 er in 26.0 ip) and .163 (15-for-92) opponents batting average in four starts during the day compared to 3-1 with a 2.48 ERA (11 er in 40.0 ip) and .226 (33-for-146) opponents average in six starts at night...has the lowest day ERA in the majors.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 4-1 with a 1.50 ERA (8 er in 48.0 ip) in seven starts against American League West competition compared to 1-1 with a 2.50 ERA (5 er in 18.0 ip) in four starts against everyone else...is now 16-6 with a 2.11 ERA (46 er in 196.1 ip) in 29 career appearances against AL West teams compared to 8-9 with a 3.60 ERA (61 er in 152.2 ip) in 26 games against everyone else.

THIS AND THAT: Leads American League pitchers in putouts (11), is tied for second in total chances (23) and ranks third in assists (12)...has tossed at least seven innings in five of his 10 starts, allowed two runs or fewer eight times and walked two batters or fewer eight times...the A's are 5-5 (.500) in his starting assignments and are 29-24 (.547) in his career...struck out at least nine batters in three consecutive starts from May 3-13, which matches the longest such streak by an A's pitcher over the last 44 years (fourth time, last by Jeff Samardzija from Aug. 25-Sept. 5, 2014)...had a wild pitch in five consecutive games from April 22 to May 13, which is the longest such streak in Oakland history...it was the longest by an A's pitcher since Stu Flythe also had a five-game streak from July 1 to 31, 1936.

WINNING STREAK SNAPPED: Was charged with the loss May 13 against Boston, despite allowing just one run in seven innings...had started the season 4-0 for the first time in his career...the loss snapped a five-game winning streak dating back to Sept. 28, 2014...posted a 1.40 ERA and .194 opponents batting average during that streak, which spanned eight starts.

SCORELESS STREAK ENDS: Allowed a lead off home run to Ackley in the third inning April 11 against Seattle to snap his season-opening scoreless streak at 10.0 innings...it snapped an overall scoreless streak of 20.0 innings dating back to Sept. 23, 2014...that is a new career high, surpassing his previous best of 14.0 innings (twice, last: April 23-May 4, 2014).

20 CAREER WINS: His Opening Day win was the 20th victory of his career and it came in his 46th appearance...joins Tim Hudson (37 games), Vida Blue (39), A.J. Griffin (44) and Barry Zito (45) as the only pitchers in Oakland history to win 20 games in 46 or fewer career outings.

OPENING DAY STARTER: Made his second consecutive Opening Day start April 6 against Texas to become the first A's pitcher to start consecutive openers since Barry Zito in 2005 and 2006...tossed 8.0 shutout innings and allowed just one hit to become the first pitcher to toss eight or more innings and allow one hit or fewer in an opener since Bob Lemon one-hit the White Sox for Cleveland in 1953...it marked the third time in Oakland history the starting pitcher did not allow a run on Opening Day...he also did it last year and Tim Hudson did it in 2003...is now 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA in two career Opening Day starts (14.0 ip, 6 h, 4 bb, 10 so).

2015 START-BY-START: Combined with Evan Scribner on a one-hit shutout in the A's 8-0 win over Texas on Opening Day **April 6**...tossed eight innings and allowed the only hit on a Ryan Rua single to lead off the eighth inning...walked just one batter...it was the 13th time in Oakland history a pitcher tossed at least eight shutout innings while allowing one hit or fewer and one walk or fewer, the first since Dallas Braden's perfect game on May 9, 2010...had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 11-inning loss to Seattle **April 11** in Oakland...retired nine of the first 10 batters he faced with the one exception being a lead off home run to Ackley in the third...had a 2-1 lead when he was relieved with one out and a runner on first in eighth inning...the bullpen allowed that run to score plus two more for the blown save (Otero)...had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 6-4 loss at Kansas City **April 17**...allowed a career-high 11 hits in 6.0 innings...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed three runs in the third inning on two-out RBI singles by Hosmer, Gordon and Perez...left after six innings with the score tied 4-4...was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-2 win at Los Angeles **April 22**...allowed a run in the second inning...loaded the bases with one out in the third inning but then retired each of the final 14 batters he faced...was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-2 win over Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland **April 28**...allowed two runs in the first inning on a two-run single by Freese...retired 18 of the final 19 batters he faced, including 13 straight at one point...won his third consecutive start in the A's 7-1 win at Texas **May 3**...tossed 6.2 shutout innings and struck out 10 while walking a career-high seven batters...the seven walks matched the most by an A's pitcher since at least 1914 in a game with 10 or more strikeouts (Bobby Shantz, May 30, 1952 vs. New York, G#2)...they equaled the most in Oakland history by a pitcher who did not allow a run (Eric Plunk, July 26, 1986 vs. Toronto; Vida Blue, Sept. 15, 1973 vs. Texas)...it was his second career game with 10 or more strikeouts (12, Sept. 23, 2014 vs. Los Angeles-AL)...tossed a career-high 119 pitches...had a no decision in the A's 4-3 loss in 11 innings at Seattle **May 8**...it was the 50th start of his career...left after six innings with a 3-1 lead but the bullpen blew the save...was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-0 loss to Boston **May 13** in Oakland...tossed 7.0 innings and allowed just one run...retired each of the final 13 batters he faced...the A's were shutout on five hits by Miley, Tazawa and Uehara...was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-4 loss at Houston **May 19**...allowed a two-run home run to Carter in the second inning and a RBI single to Gattis in the fifth.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-2 win at Tampa Bay last Sunday...tossed 5.0 scoreless innings but left the game early with a right ankle contusion...allowed three hits to the first five batters he faced...then retired 12 of the final 13 batters he faced...was relieved by Otero to start the bottom of the sixth with the A's leading 5-0.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jesse Hahn (2-4, 3.69 ERA): Tossed his first career complete game in his last start, a four-hit shutout against Detroit last Monday (1 bb, 5 so)...became the first A's pitcher to toss a shutout in a game in which his team made at least three errors since Diego Segui did it for the Kansas City A's June 15, 1965 against California...is now 1-3 with a 4.42 ERA over his last six starts after going 1-1 with a 2.12 ERA over his first three starts...leads the majors in opponents reaching base on an error (9) and has the most unearned runs (7) in the American League...has allowed just two home runs in 53.2 innings for an average of 0.34 per nine innings...that ranks fourth lowest in the AL...is 1-1 with a 2.53 ERA and .195 opponents batting average in five starts at home compared to 1-3 with a 5.40 ERA and .289 opponents batting average in four starts on the road...has never faced the Yankees in his career.

- The A's bullpen has posted a 3.61 ERA (25 er in 62.1 ip) over its last 20 games...has a 2-5 record and is 2 for 5 in save chances over that stretch...compiled a 7.98 ERA over the previous 15 contests...now has a 4.62 ERA for the season, which is the highest in the American League and third highest in the majors.
- Has the most losses in the majors (13)...tied for the fewest saves in the AL, and has the second lowest save percentage...is tied for the second most most blown saves (8) in the AL.
- Has allowed 33-of-89 (37.1%) inherited runners to score, which is the third highest percentage in the AL.
- First batters faced are hitting .265 (36-for-136), which is third highest in the AL...have the most first batter RBI in the majors (28) and rank third in home runs (7).
- Has allowed two runs or more in 26 of 51 games...the A's are 2-24 when the pen allows two runs or more, 15-8 when it allows one run or fewer (one complete game).

- Has pitched fewer than 1.0 innings in each of his last 14 outings (5.2 ip, 8 h, 6 r, 6 er, 2 bb, 4 so, 3 hr, 9.53 ERA), which is the longest such streak in Athletics history...the previous high was 12 by Mike Venafro (July 12-Sept. 22, 2002) and Jay Marshall (May 19-June 14, 2007).
- Has allowed 15 hits, 10 of which are for extra bases (five doubles, one triple, four home runs)...is tied for second among American League relievers in extra base hits, has the second highest opponents slugging percentage (.708) and is tied for third in home runs.
- Leads the majors in inherited runners (28) and is second in inherited runners scored (10).
- Faced three batters last Tuesday, ending his Athletics record-tying streak of five consecutive games facing just one batter (Mike Mohler, June 1-21, 1993; Buddy Groom, July 5-14, 1998).
- First batters faced are 8-for-20 (.400) with two doubles, a triple, three home runs and 11 RBI...the RBI are the most in the majors and the home runs are tied for the most.
- Has appeared in five career games against New York (3.2 ip, 1 h, 2 bb, 2 so).

Last Year: Posted a 1.57 ERA and allowed just 13.2% (5-of-38) of inherited runners to score in a career-high 69 appearances in his first full season in the majors...ranked third among AL relievers in pct. of inherited runners scored and fifth in ERA.
