TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

May 30, 1956: Batting against Pedro Ramos in Game 2 of a doubleheader vs. Washington, Mickey Mantle nearly hits a home run out of Yankee Stadium, as the ball strikes the upper deck frieze in right field.

May 30, 1938: A franchise-record crowd of 81,841 attends a doubleheader sweep of the Boston Red Sox.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

May 31, 1948: A Memorial Day crowd of 62,626 at Yankee Stadium watches starter Spec Shea allow just two singles to Washington. Four Yankees have three hits apiece (Berra, Keller, Brown and McQuinn) as the Yankees win, 10-0.

MONDAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

June 1, 1958: In a 10-4 Yankees win over the Red Sox at Fenway Park, Andy Carey goes 5-for-5 with 2HR, 3R and 4RBI. He is one of eight Yankees all time to go 5-for-5 with multiple homers in a game.

June 1, 1925: Lou Gehrig begins his record streak of 2,130 consecutive games played, pinch-hitting for "Pee Wee" Wanninger in a 5-3 loss to Washington at Yankee Stadium.

AT A GLANCE: Tonight the Yankees play the third game of a seven-game, two-city road trip, with the third of four games in Oakland (0-2 so far)...also play three games in Seattle (Mon.-Wed.)...went 3-3 on their recent homestand, sweeping three games vs. Kansas City after being swept in three games vs. Texas.

- ▶ **Have owned at least a share of the AL East lead for four straight days** (5/26-present)...have a 1.0-game lead over Tampa Bay...have had at least a share of first place for 32 of the past 37 days, including sole possession for 26-of-37 days...held at least a share of the AL East lead for 28 consecutive days (4/23-5/21), their longest run in first place since sitting atop the division for the final 114 days of the 2012 season (6/11-10/3/12).
- ▶ Had a three-game winning streak snapped with Thursday's loss...was the Yankees' longest since winning three straight from 5/1-3 at Boston.
- ▶ Are 4-12 in their last 16G after going 18-6 in the previous 24G from 4/17-5/11...are still 22-18 in their last 40G...are 1-9 in their last 10G on the road after going 11-3 over 14 road contests from 4/17-5/11.
- ▶ Tonight marks the 14th of 24 straight games outside the AL East (4-9 so far) and the third of 10 straight vs. the AL West (0-5 in 2015)...are in the midst of playing **40-of-43G against non-AL East teams**...are 9-11 in non-divisional games this season.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: On Friday, the Yankees lost the second game of their road trip, 6-2, at Oakland...**LHP Chris Capuano** pitched a season-high 5.1IP but took his third straight loss (6H, 4R/3ER, 2BB, 4K)...**C Brian McCann** (1-for-4) homered for the fourth straight game, the longest streak by a Yankee since Alex Rodriguez homered in four straight from 5/16-19/09...**LF Brett Gardner** (1-for-3, 1RBI, 1BB) has 5RBI in his last 5G...**RHP Esmil Rogers** (1.2IP, 1H) struck out three batters over 1.2 scoreless innings in relief.

7-8-9: Yankee outfielders are batting .284 (166-for-585) this season, their highest combined mark since 2000 (.289)...rank second in the AL and fourth in MLB this season...also have a .776 OPS, their highest single-season mark since 2011 (.818).

CHIEFS OF STAFF: Yankees pitchers lead the AL with a 6.7 WAR and rank fifth in the Majors, according to Fangraphs.

- ▶ **RHP Michael Pineda ranks fourth among qualified AL starters and fifth in the Majors with a 2.52 FIP**...ranks fourth in the AL and fifth in the Majors with 2.0 WAR.
- ▶ **RHP Dellin Betances leads all Major League relievers with 1.3 WAR** (next-highest: Drew Storen-1.0).
- ▶ **Yankees pitchers** are third in the AL and tied for fourth in the Majors with 414K and third in the AL with a 3.14 K/BB ratio.
- ▶ **Yankees pitchers** allowed just 4R/3ER in the three-game series against the Royals (5/25-27) after allowing 30 runs in the previous 3G (5/22-24)...marked their fewest runs allowed in a series of at least 3G since allowing 4R in a three-game sweep at Houston from 9/27-29/13...held opponents to 1ER-or-fewer in three straight games for the first time since 5/14-17/14 (3G).

DEALIN' BETANCES: RHP Dellin Betances has recorded his last six outs via strikeout...has pitched 26.0IP in 2015 without allowing an earned run (9H, 3R/0ER, 11BB/1IBB, 41K), **the most IP in 2015 by any Major League pitcher who has not allowed an earned run...his 23 consecutive appearances without an earned run to begin a season are a club record** and one of just eight such season-opening streaks of at least that length in the Majors since the inception of earned runs (1912 in NL, 1913 in AL)...is tied for the third-longest **single-season streak without an earned run** in Yankees history: Mariano Rivera-28G in 1999, Boone Logan-25G in 2010, Steve Farr-23G in 1991.

- ▶ Has held opponents to streaks of **0-for-29** (5/4-5/27, 3BB/1IBB, 1SF, 14K) and **0-for-26** (4/17-5/1, 2BB, 14K) this season, the two longest hitless streaks of his career.
- ▶ Has fanned 30 of his last 59 batters faced and 33 of his last 64.
- ▶ His 41K are **the most strikeouts by a pitcher prior to allowing his first earned run of the season in Yankees history** (since the AL's inception of earned runs in 1913).
- ▶ At 4-0, is **tied for the Major League lead in relief wins** (Santiago Casilla-SF, Joaquin Benoit-SD, Michael Blazek-MIL, Keone Kela-TEX, David Robertson-CWS).

MAC ATTACK: C Brian McCann has homered in four straight games, the longest streak by a catcher in the Majors this season...is **one of two Yankees to homer in four straight games while playing catcher since 1957**, joining Mike Stanley (4 total HR in 4G from 7/20-25/93)...the only Yankee since at least 1914 with a longer streak is Bill Dickey (6 total HR in 5G from 6/20-25/37).

- ▶ During his seven-game hitting streak (since 5/20), is 9-for-23 (.391) with 6R, 1 double, 4HR, 11RBI and 6BB...has reached safely in 15 of his last 29PA.
- ▶ According to *Elias*, is the first Yankee with an RBI in seven consecutive games, *all as catcher*, since Yogi Berra had an 8G streak from 9/11-23/56...is the longest RBI streak by *any Yankee* since Alfonso Soriano's 7G streak from 9/1-7/13.
- ▶ From 5/25-28, joined Stanley (7/20-23/93) as the only two players in Yankees franchise history to *reach base safely three times with a homer in each of three straight games, all as a catcher*.
- ▶ Is tied with the Padres' Derek Norris for second among MLB catchers with 32RBI in 2015 (A's Stephen Vogt-35RBI).

HOT ROD: DH Alex Rodriguez is batting .414 (12-for-29) with 7R, 1 double, 1HR, 5RBI and 3BB during his season-long eight-game hitting streak (since 5/22), raising his season BA from .246 to .277, highest since 4/20 (.286)...marks his longest streak since a 13-game streak from 7/19-9/9/12.

- ▶ Has hit safely in 13 consecutive starts and is batting .346 (18-for-52) in his last 15G overall since 5/13.
- ▶ His sac fly on Thursday gave him 1,996 career RBI, **tying Barry Bonds for second place on baseball's all-time list** according to *Elias*, which is the official statistician of MLB (please note that the stats found on MLB.com and baseball-reference.com are NOT official stats)...**please also note that RBI only became an official statistic in 1920**...passed Lou Gehrig (1,993) for the all-time AL RBI record with a three-run HR on Wednesday.
- ▶ Has 1,947 career runs scored, two shy of tying Stan Musial (1,949R) for eighth place on MLB's all-time list.

POWERING UP: Yankees batters have homered in five straight games (10HR over the stretch) and seven of their last eight (15HR)...have hit 62HR in 49G, tied for second in the Majors (HOU-66, LAD-62)...did not hit their 62nd HR of 2014 until their 76th game (6/24/14).

- ▶ Have homered in 35 of 49 games this season, and are tied for fifth in the Majors with 16 multi-HR games.
- ▶ **Hit 13HR on their recent six-game homestand (5/22-27)**, accounting for 28 of their 38 runs (73.7%)...have scored 104 of their 223 runs on HR this season (46.6%).
- ▶ Are third in the AL and fourth in the Majors with 154 extra-base hits and rank fourth in the Majors with a .170 ISO.
- ▶ Rank third in the AL and sixth in MLB with a .414 slugging pct. (in 2014, had a .380 SLG, 10th-AL/17th-MLB)...are second in the AL with a .422 slugging pct. vs. right-handed pitchers.
- ▶ Since 4/26, the Yankees have recorded an RBI on each of their last 125 runs over the last 30-plus games.

ROSTER MOVE: The Yankees today placed **OF Slade Heathcott** on the 15-day disabled list (retroactive to 5/29) with a right quad strain...recalled **OF Ramon Flores** (#31) from Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre.

- ▶ Flores is seeking to make his Major League debut and would be the fifth Yankee this season to play in his first big league game, joining Heathcott, LHP Jacob Lindgren, RHP Branden Pinder and LHP Matt Tracy.

THE SOUND OF THUNDER: RHP Dellin Betances and LHP Andrew Miller rank first and third among Major League relievers in strikeouts with 41 and 34, respectively.

- ▶ Their combined numbers: 0.38 ERA, 47.1IP, 14H, 4R/2ER, 20BB/1IBB, 75K, 2HP...opponents are batting .090 (14-for-156) with 2 doubles and 1HR against them.

JUST HOW HE DREW IT UP: LHP Andrew Miller is holding opponents to a .070 (5-for-71) batting average this season, **lowest among Major League relievers**.

- ▶ Is **tied for sixth in the Majors with 14 saves**, but has just 1SV since 5/9...is the first pitcher in Yankees history to successfully convert his first 14 save chances with the club.
- ▶ Has multiple strikeouts in 11 of his 21 outings and ranks fifth among all MLB relievers (min. 0.93BF/team game) with 14.34 strikeouts per 9.0IP ratio (21.1IP, 34K).

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP NATHAN EOVALDI (4-1, 4.27 ERA)

RHP Nathan Eovaldi will make his 10th start of the season tonight...is pitching on regular four days' rest...was acquired by the Yankees from Miami with 1B/OF Garrett Jones and RHP Domingo German on 12/19/14 in exchange for RHP David Phelps and INF Martin Prado...was originally drafted by the Dodgers in the 11th round of the 2008 First-Year Player Draft and made his Major League debut with Los Angeles-NL on 8/6/11...was acquired by Miami along with RHP Scott McCough from Los Angeles-NL on 7/25/12 in exchange for INF Hanley Ramirez and LHP Randy Choate...is signed through the 2015 season.

LAST TIME OUT: Earned his fourth win in the Yankees' 14-1 win vs. Kansas City on Monday (7.0IP, 8H, 1ER, 1BB, 4K, 1HB, 1WP)...ended the Yankees' six-game losing streak...was spotted on a 11-0 lead through two innings and carried a shutout into the fifth inning before Jarrod Dyson's RBI single...Dyson also attempted the first steal against Eovaldi since 8/8/14 vs. Cincinnati (Hamilton CS)...received a career-high 14 runs of support.

- Marked his second start this season with an identical stat line of 7.0IP, 8H, 1R/1ER, 1BB, 4K (also 4/21 at Detroit)...no other pitcher has produced this exact stat line since the Mets' Jon Niese on 5/23/13 vs. the Yankees...Matt Cain is the only other pitcher over the last 102 seasons (since 1914) to record two starts in his career with this same stat line.

2015: Has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in six of his nine starts and at least 6H in each of his starts...his 65 hits allowed are 10th-most in the AL...his .352 BABIP is the third-highest in the American League and eighth-highest in the Majors...is one of four pitchers in the Majors (min. 40.0IP) who have winning records despite opponents hitting over .300 (4-1, .308)...has a 7.01 run support average, fifth-highest in the AL (MLB-low 2.70 RSA in 2014).

VS. OAKLAND: Is 0-1 with a 5.54 ERA (13.0IP, 8ER) in two career starts against the A's...did not record a decision in a home start vs. Oakland in the Marlins' 7-6, 14-inning loss on 6/28/14 (7.0IP, 8H, 5ER, 3BB, 3K).

- In his lone career start at the O.co Coliseum, took the loss despite producing a QS w/ the Dodgers on 6/20/12 (6.0IP, 7H, 3ER, 3BB, 2K).

SPLIT DECISION: Left-handed batters are hitting .371 (33-for-89) with a .440 OBP and .528 SLG, compared to .262 (32-for-122) with a .289 OBP and .402 SLG by right-handed batters.

RED LIGHT: Runners are 0-for-1 in steal attempts against him this season and have attempted just one steal in his last 18 starts since 8/13/14...has allowed only two stolen bases (on seven attempts) in 358.2IP since 2013, tied with Chris Tillman for the fewest stolen bases allowed among MLB pitchers with at least 300.0IP in that span...also ranks second with a 71.4 caught stealing pct. in that stretch.

- Held baserunners to one stolen base in five attempts in 2014, tied for the fewest stolen bases allowed among MLB pitchers with at least 30 starts...his 80.0 caught stealing pct. led all NL pitchers (min. five SB attempts) and was second in the Majors to Hisashi Iwakuma (0 SB, 8 CS).
- His eight career stolen bases allowed on 16 attempts are the fewest stolen bases allowed in the Majors (min. 75GS) since he entered the league in 2011 (see chart on right).
- Last stolen base *allowed*: Starling Marte (6/13/14 vs. Pittsburgh).

OTHER STARTS: Allowed a season-high 5ER in a ND on 5/19 at Washington...tossed a season-high 7.1IP, taking a shutout into the seventh, but came away with his first loss of the season after allowing 2R in both the seventh and eighth innings on 5/12 at Tampa Bay...earned his second straight win and his third of the season on 5/7 vs. Baltimore...allowed 2HR after permitting just 3HR over his previous eight starts dating back to 9/16/14...earned his second consecutive road win by limiting the Red Sox to 2ER over 6.2IP at Fenway Park on 5/2...his 111 pitches were his most since 8/31/14 w/ Miami at Atlanta (113)...allowed 1ER over 7.0IP to earn his first win as a Yankee on 4/21 at Detroit...recorded a season-high 9K in just 5.0IP on 4/15 at Baltimore...made his Yankees debut on 4/10 in the Yankees' 6-5, 19-inning loss vs. Boston.

HEAT SEEKER: Per Fangraphs' PITCHf/x data, his fastball has averaged 95.8 mph over his first nine starts, the third-highest velocity in the Majors (min. 40.0IP) behind Yordano Ventura (95.9) and Joe Kelly (95.9)...averaged 95.5 mph in 2014, fourth-highest in the Majors (min. 162.0IP) behind Garrett Richards (96.4), Ventura (96.0) and Wily Peralta (95.6).

SUNDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP ADAM WARREN (3-3, 3.91 ERA)

RHP Adam Warren is scheduled to make his 10th start of the season and 13th of his career on Sunday at Oakland...will pitch on regular four days' rest...has tossed the three longest starts of his career in his last three outings (all quality starts) but has gone 1-2 over that stretch...the Yankees are still 6-2 in his last eight starts...was selected by the Yankees in the fourth round of the 2009 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of North Carolina...made his Major League debut in 2012 and spent the past two seasons (2013-14) in the Yankees bullpen.
