### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (19-33) VS. NEW YORK YANKEES (26-24)

SUNDAY, MAY 31, 2015 – O.CO COLISEUM – 1:05 P.M. PDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have won two of the first three games of this series and have not won a series since taking two of three at Texas, May 1-3...have five losses and a split over the previous six series...have won five of the last eight games after losing 14 of the previous 16 contests...are 11-25 (.306) over the last 36 games (beginning April 23) after starting the year 8-8...are 19-33 (.365) overall, which is the worst record in the American League and second worst in the majors...it is the third worst record in Oakland history after 52 games...the 1994 club was 16-36 (lost game 53) and the 1979 club was 18-34 (lost game 53)...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 23rd consecutive day (beginning May 8) and trail first place Houston by 13 games, which is 1/2 game short of the season high of 13 1/2 (most recently May 27)...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, seven days in fourth, one day tied for fourth and 23 days in fifth...had their three-game winning streak snapped Tuesday, which was their longest winning streak since Aug. 7-9, 2014.

**IN MAY:** The A's are 10-19 (.345) in May, which is the worst record in the majors (Boston and Miami are 10-18)...the 19 losses are the A's most in a month since August, 2008 (10-20) and their most in May since 2005 (7-20)...have lost 20 games in a month 12 times in Oakland history...a win today would give the A's the sixth worst May in Oakland history, a loss would make it fifth worst...either way it would be their worst May since 2005 (7-20)...currently trail Houston by 13 games...since divisional play began in 1969, the A's three largest deficits at the end of May are 14 in 2001, 13 in 1979 and 11 1/2 in 2005...now have four consecutive months with a losing record after recording 14 straight months with a winning record...had just one off day in May and today will be the A's 30th game of the month...that matches the most in Oakland history in the month of May (1981, 1997)...the A's pitching staff has 223 strikeouts in May, which is tied for the second most in one month in Oakland history (Aug. 2007)...the record is 246 in Sept. 2013.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 3-3 on this seven-game homestand against Detroit (1-2) and New York-AL (2-1)...have finished with a losing record in each of the first three homestands, marking the first time the A's had three straight losing homestands in one season since 2005...have not had four straight losing homestands in one season since 1979 (May 15-July 15)...have a streak of five consecutive losing homestands dating back to last year, which matches the longest such streak in Oakland history (last four of 1978, first of 1979)...the A's last winning homestand was Aug. 19-24, 2014 when they went 3-2 against the Mets and Angels...have yet to win a home series this year (six losses, one split) and also lost their final home series of 2014...the eight consecutive home series without a win matches the longest such streak in Oakland history (May 13-June 29, 1977 and June 1-July 15, 1979)...last won a home series when they took two of three from Philadelphia Sept. 19-21, 2014...have lost 15 of their last 20 home games and are 8-17 (.320) at home for the season, which is the second worst home record in the majors (Milwaukee, 8-20)...it is the second worst record after 25 games in Oakland history to the 1994 A's who were 7-18 (lost game 26)...went 3-4 on the last road trip to Houston (1-2) and Tampa Bay (2-2)...have lost nine of the last 12 road games and are 11-16 (.407) for the season...leave tomorrow for a six-game road trip to Detroit (three games) and Boston (three games)...have finished with a .500 record or worse on each of their last 10 road trips dating back to last year, which is the A's longest such streak since a 12-trip streak from Aug. 6, 1996-Aug. 31, 1997...last had a winning road trip June 3-11, 2014 (5-4).

**NIGHT AND DAY:** The A's have won three of their last four day games after losing 13 of the first 14...are now 4-14 (.222) during the day compared to 15-19 (.441) at night...are tied with Cincinnati for the worst record in day games in the majors and are tied for the second most losses (White Sox, 15)...are batting .240 (146-for-609) with 65 runs scored during the day (3.61 per game) compared to .266 (321-for-1208) with 154 runs at night (4.53 per game).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 4-2 with a 1.42 ERA (8 er in 50.2 ip) over the last eight games and 5-8 with a 2.49 ERA (30 er in 108.1 ip) over the last 18 contests...have a 3.27 ERA (112 er in 308.0 ip) for the season, which is second lowest in the American League (Tampa Bay, 3.21)...have allowed 22 home runs, which is the fewest in the AL and third fewest in the majors...rank second in the AL in innings pitched (308.0).

**PITCHING:** The A's have a 1.88 ERA (15 er in 72.0 ip) over their last eight games and a 2.79 ERA (49 er in 158.0 ip) over the last 18 contests...have two shutouts in the last eight games and seven for the season, which is the most in the American League and tied for second most in the majors (San Francisco, 9)...rank fourth in the AL in strikeouts (395) but have issued the third most walks (160)...have allowed the second fewest home runs (42) and are tied for third in pickoffs (5).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed 52 errors, which is eight more than any other team (Milwaukee, 44)...the errors have led to 31 unearned runs, which is three more than any other team (Washington, 28).

**OFFENSE:** The A's are 12-for-29 (.414) with runners in scoring position in the first three games of this series after going 18-for-140 (.129) over the previous 14 contests...are hitting .197 (44-for-223) with RISP over the last 24 games after hitting .310 with RISP over the first 28 contests...were shutout for the fifth time Tuesday, which is second most in the AL (Tampa Bay, 6)...rank second in the AL in stolen base percentage (29-for-35, 82.9%), tied for second in triples (14) and fourth in batting (.257).

**ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 3-15 (.167) in one-run games and 4-22 (.154) in games decided by two runs or fewer, both of which are the worst record in the majors...are fourth in the majors in most one-run games (18) and tied for fourth in most two-run games (26)...snapped a 12-game losing streak in one-run games at home on Thursday, which was the longest such streak in Athletics history (dating back to 1901)...are 1-10 in one-run games at home, 2-5 on the road...are 0-6 in extra inning games and are one of four teams without an extra inning win (Cleveland, New York-AL, Pittsburgh)...are tied with Pittsburgh for the Major League lead in extra inning losses and have the second most extra inning games in the American League...have a six-game extra inning losing streak, which matches the longest such streak by an A's team over the last 20 years (May 18-July 5, 2011 and May 21-July 25, 1999)...are 0-9 in games decided in the last at bat and are the only team without a last at bat win...also lost their final last at bat game of 2014 and the 10-game losing streak in games decided in the last at bat matches the longest such streak in Oakland history (May 14-July 17, 1989).

**LEFT AND RIGHT:** The A's have won each of the last two games started by a left-handed pitcher...are 3-10 when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 16-23 when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is the worst in the majors...are batting .222 (105-for-474) against lefties compared to .270 (362-for-1343) with 38 of their 45 home runs off righties...the mark against lefties is third lowest in the American League and the mark against righties is third highest.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have 10 players on the disabled list (Crisp, Davis, Doolittle, Griffin, Ladendorf, Mujica, O'Flaherty, Parker, Pomeranz, Thompson)...Griffin, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL and O'Flaherty is on a rehab assignment...today marks the 222nd consecutive day the A's have at least nine players on the DL...have had at least seven players on the DL all year...have used the DL a total of 16 times.

**A's vs. YANKEES:** The A's lead the season series 2-1...have won 15 of their last 22 games against the Yankees, including 11 of the last 13 in Oakland...won the season series last year, 4-2...won two of three in both Oakland and New York...have won each of the previous two season series against New York and are 11-4 over the last three years...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 237-270 against the Yankees...that includes 131-123 in Oakland and 106-147.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Billy Burns** leads American League rookies in multi-hit games (11), is tied for second in stolen bases (7) and ranks third in hits (33)...**Stephen Vogt** has reached base safely in all 24 of his home games.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1987** Mark McGwire homers twice in the A's 9-5 loss at New York...the two homers give McGwire 15 in May, an Oakland record for homers in one month...he would go on to hit what was then an Oakland record 49 home runs en route to Rookie of the Year honors...in **2006** Bobby Crosby hits a solo home run in the fourth inning of the A's 7-0 victory over Kansas City, the 6000<sup>th</sup> home run in Oakland history.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Chavez (1-5, 2.44 ERA)

**FIVE LOSSES:** Has been charged with five losses, which are tied for seventh most in the American League...has a 3.41 ERA (12 er in 31.2 ip) in those five games and has received no run support in four of those games...has received no run support in four of his seven starts and two runs of support in each of his other three starts...has a run support average of 1.20 (6 rs in 45.0 ip) in his starting assignments...has the lowest run support in the majors dating back to April 23, which was the date of his first start...Scott Kazmir is second lowest (1.42).

**FIRST SEVEN, LAST FOUR:** Is 0-3 with a 3.04 ERA (9 er in 26.2 ip) and .237 (23-for-97) opponents batting average over his last four starts...went 1-2 with a 1.80 ERA and .191 opponents batting average over his first seven games, including three starts.

**STARTING AND RELIEVING:** Is 1-5 despite a 2.80 ERA (14 er in 45.0 ip) in his seven starting assignments...began the season in the bullpen and did not allow a run in his four relief appearances (6.2 ip)...his first start came April 23 when Jesse Hahn missed a start due to a blister...remained in the rotation following the option of Kendall Graveman to Nashville April 26...is now 9-13 with a 3.61 ERA (72 er in 179.1 ip) in 30 career starts, 9-15 with a 5.02 ERA in 204 relief appearances.

**MONTH BY MONTH:** Is 1-3 with a 2.38 ERA (9 er in 34.0 ip) in five starts in May...is tied for sixth in the American League in losses in May but has the ninth lowest ERA...went 0-2 with a 2.55 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in six games, including two starts, this April...is 2-2 with a 2.10 ERA in 12 games, eight starts, in April over the last two years...has a 2.68 career ERA in April, which is his best for any month of the season

**INNING BY INNING:** Has not allowed an earned run in the first two innings (14.0 ip) and has a 1.08 ERA (2 er in 16.2 ip) from the sixth inning on...has yielded 13 of his 17 runs in the third through fifth innings (12 er in 21.0 ip, 5.14 ERA).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed just two home runs in 51.2 innings, an average of 0.35 per nine innings...his .215 opponents batting average includes a .168 (16-for-95) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .264 (24-for-91) against lefties...has yielded seven of his nine extra base hits to lefties (five doubles, two home runs) and has a .189 opponents slugging percentage against righties...has issued 12 of his 15 walks to right-handed hitters...has walked just three batters leading off an inning...has a .147 (11-for-75) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .261 (29-for-111) after that...the opponents number three hitter is 2-for-18 (.111).

**IN RELIEF:** Stranded his only inherited runner in his four relief appearances and first batters faced were 1-for-4 (.250)...recorded the save in his final relief appearance April 18 at Kansas City, tossing 3.2 scoreless innings...has two career saves, both at Kansas City and both at least 3.2 innings...struck out six, which matched the most by an A's pitcher in a game in which he recorded the save...the only other time it happened since the save became an official stat in 1969 was by Rollie Fingers on Sept. 1, 1972 against Detroit.

**FIRST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-0 loss at Los Angeles (AL) April 23...tossed six innings and allowed just one hit...the hit was a two-run home run by Calhoun in the third inning and it scored Butera, who reached on an error...it was the Angels only hit of the game...Tropeano, Salas, Smith and Street combined to shutout the A's on eight hits.

**SECOND START:** He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 6-5 loss to Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland April 30...allowed a run in the third inning on Giavotella RBI single and three more in the fifth on a two-run single by Calhoun and a Freese RBI fielders choice...left after five innings trailing 4-0.

**THIRD START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 win at Minnesota May 5...it was his first win since July 23, 2014...the A's scored a run in the first inning and one more in the sixth and he shutout the Twins on three hits and a walk over the first seven innings...allowed his only run in the eighth inning on a Dozier RBI single.

**FOURTH START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-3 loss at Seattle May 10...did not allow a hit until Cruz singled with one out in the fourth...had a 1-0 lead at the time but Seager followed with a RBI double and Ackley added a two-run double one out later...also allowed a sacrifice fly to Cano in the fifth.

**FIFTH START:** He had a no decision in the A's 4-3 loss to Chicago (AL) May 16 in Oakland...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed his only runs in the third inning on a two-run single by Garcia...retired the side in order just one (fourth inning)...left after six innings with the scored tied 2-2.

**SIXTH START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-0 loss at Tampa Bay May 21...DeJesus had a RBI double in the fourth and a solo home run in the seventh...allowed a Guyer single following the DeJesus homer and was relieved by Mujica, who allowed Guyer to score...Colome and four Rays relievers combined to shutout the A's on six hits and two walks.

**LAST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 1-0 loss to Detroit last Tuesday in Oakland...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings and allowed just five hits...the only run came in the first inning and it was unearned...Gose led off with a single, stole second and went to third on a Phegley error on the steal...Davis followed with a sacrifice fly and that would be the only run of the game...retired 12 straight at one point...Price and three relievers combined to shutout the A's on seven hits.

**CHAVEZ vs. NEW YORK:** Is 3-0 with a 2.29 ERA (19.2 ip, 14 h, 5 r, 5 er, 5 bb, 17 so, 1 hr) in four career appearances, including two starts...went 2-0 with a 3.75 ERA (12.0 ip, 12 h, 5 r, 5 er, 2 bb, 9 so, 1 hr) in two starts last year...the first win came in his only career outing at Yankee Stadium, a 7-4 A's win on June 4...allowed four runs in 6.0 innings, all in the third inning on a Jeter RBI single and a Ellsbury three-run home run...that gave the Yankees a 4-0 lead but the A's scored seven unanswered runs for the win and he retired seven of the final eight batters he faced...then picked up the win in a 10-5 decision in Oakland June 15...shutout the Yankees on three hits over the first five innings...had a 10-0 lead when he allowed his only run on a Teixeira RBI double in the sixth inning.

**SPRING TRAINING RECAP:** Went 3-0 with a 3.27 ERA (22.0 ip, 27 h, 11 r, 8 er, 5 bb, 18 so) in six games, five starts...tied for second in the Cactus League in wins...did not allow a home run in 22.0 innings...opponents batted .333 (27-for-89)...is now 8-1 with a 2.68 ERA (15 er in 50.1 ip) in 13 games, 10 starts, over the last two springs.

**2014 RECAP:** Began the season in the starting rotation but was moved to the bullpen following the acquisition of Jon Lester at the trading deadline...went 8-7 with a 3.44 ERA in his 21 starts and 0-1 with a 3.54 ERA in 11 relief appearances...was 8-8 with a 3.45 ERA in 32 games, 21 starts, overall...had career highs in every category except games pitched and his ERA was a career low...had just nine wins in 191 career appearances entering the season...his 146.0 innings were more than double his previous high (67.1 in 2009) as were his 136 strikeouts (55 in 2013)...was 4-1 with a 2.54 ERA and a .216 opponents batting average over his first nine starts through May 18...then went 4-6 with a 4.17 ERA and .280 opponents batting average over his final 12 starts...allowed a .149 batting average with runners in scoring position over his first 10 games through May 24, .354 after that.

## TUESDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**RHP Kendall Graveman (2-2, 5.79 ERA):** Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville May 23 for his second stint with the A's this year and is 1-0 with a 2.31 ERA in two starts since his return...was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 1-2 with an 8.27 ERA in four starts before he was optioned to Nashville April 26...went 2-1 with a 1.85 ERA in four starts with the Sounds...is 2-0 with a 1.26 ERA and .208 opponents batting average in three starts on the road compared to 0-2 with a 10.54 ERA and .377 opponents average in three starts at home...the A's are 4-2 (.667) in his starting assignments...had a no decision in his last start, a 5-4 A's win over New York (AL) on Thursday (5.2 ip, 7 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 4 so)...has never faced the Tigers in his career...allowed five runs in 5.0 innings in his first start with Nashville and took the loss...then went 2-0 with a 0.93 ERA over his final three Triple-A starts.

- The A's bullpen has posted a 3.53 ERA (26 er in 66.1 ip) over its last 22 games...has a 2-5 record and is 3 for 6 in save chances over that stretch...compiled a 7.98 ERA over the previous 15 contests...now has a 4.56 ERA for the season, which is the highest in the American League and second highest in the majors.
- Has the most losses in the majors (13)...has the second fewest saves and the second lowest save percentage in the AL...is tied for the second most most blown saves (8) in the AL.
- Has allowed 33-of-92 (35.9%) inherited runners to score, which is the second highest percentage in the AL.
- First batters faced are hitting .264 (37-for-140), which is third highest in the AL...have the most first batter RBI in the majors (28) and rank third in home runs (7).
- Has allowed two runs or more in 26 of 51 games...the A's are 2-24 when the pen allows two runs or more, 16-9 when it allows one run or fewer (one complete game).
