TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

May 31, 1948: A Memorial Day crowd of 62,626 at Yankee Stadium watches starter Spec Shea allow just two singles to Washington. Four Yankees have three hits apiece (Berra, Keller, Brown and McQuinn) as the Yankees win, 10-0.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

June 1, 1958: In a 10-4 Yankees win over the Red Sox at Fenway Park, Andy Carey goes 5-for-5 with 2HR, 3R and 4RBI. He is one of eight Yankees all time to go 5-for-5 with multiple homers in a game.

June 1, 1925: Lou Gehrig begins his record streak of 2,130 consecutive games played, pinch-hitting for "Pee Wee" Wanninger in a 5-3 loss to Washington at Yankee Stadium.

MONDAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

June 2, 1941: Lou Gehrig dies of amyotrophic lateral sclerosis at age 37 in the Riverdale section of the Bronx.

June 2, 1925: In an 8-5 win over Washington at Yankee Stadium, Lou Gehrig plays in the second game of his 2,130-game streak. After pinch-hitting in the streak's first game on June 1, he starts today's contest, replacing Wally Pipp in the lineup and going 3-for-5 with a double.

AT A GLANCE: Today the Yankees play the fourth game of a seven-game, two-city road trip, with the last of four games in Oakland (1-2 so far)...also play three games in Seattle (Mon.-Wed.)...went 3-3 on their recent homestand, sweeping three games vs. Kansas City after being swept in three games vs. Texas.

- ▶ Have owned at least a share of the AL East lead for five straight days (5/26-present)...lead Tampa Bay by +1.0G...have had at least a share of first place for 33 of the past 38 days, including sole possession for 27-of-38 days...held at least a share of the AL East lead for 28 consecutive days (4/23-5/21), their longest run in first place since sitting atop the division for the final 114 days of the 2012 season (6/11-10/3/12).
- ▶ Snapped a five-game road losing streak (5/17-29) with Saturday's win at Oakland...was the club's longest road losing streak since dropping five in a row from 6/11-15/13...improved to 2-9 in their last 11 road games since 5/12, after going 11-3 over 14 road contests from 4/17-5/11.
- ▶ Are 5-12 in their last 17 overall games after going 18-6 in the previous 24G from 4/17-5/11...are 23-18 in their last 41G.
- ▶ Today marks the 15th of 24 straight games outside the AL East (5-9 so far) and the fourth of 10 straight vs. the AL West (1-5 in 2015)...are in the midst of playing 40-of-43G against non-AL East teams...are 10-11 in non-divisional games this season.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: On Saturday, the Yankees snapped a four-game losing streak at O.co Coliseum, defeating Oakland, 5-3...**RHP Nathan Eovaldi** started and allowed 3ER on 11H (all singles) in 4.2IP, recording a no-decision (0BB, 2K)...**C Brian McCann** (1-for-3, 1BB) had an RBI-single in the first, marking his eighth-straight game with at least 1RBI...**LF Ramon Flores** (0-for-4) made his Major League debut, throwing out a runner at home plate in the bottom of the first and making a sliding catch of a foul pop in the second...**3B Chase Headley** (3-for-5) had an RBI-single in the fifth...**RF Carlos Beltran** (2-for-4, 3RBI) hit a go-ahead two-run-HR in the sixth and had an RBI-single in the eighth...**Yankees relievers** allowed just one baserunner in 4.1IP (1H, 0BB, 8K)...**LHP Chasen Shreve** (1.1IP, 4K) recorded the win in relief of Eovaldi, striking out all four batters faced...**RHP Dellin Betances** tossed 1.1 scoreless IP (1H, 3K)...**LHP Andrew Miller** recorded his 15th save in 15 chances, with a perfect ninth (1.0IP, 1K).

▶ The two teams combined for 22H (12OAK/10NYY), with just one extra-base hit (Beltran's HR)...according to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, is the first MLB game with at least 22H and 1-or-0 XBH since a 6-4 Detroit win at Chicago-AL on 8/14/13 (23H, 1XBH)...is the *first such Yankees game* since an 8-2 loss on 4/12/87 at Kansas City (23 combined hits, 1XBH by Yankees SS Wayne Tolleson-double).

SINGLED OUT: **RHP Nathan Eovaldi** allowed 11H--all of them singles--on Saturday at Oakland, becoming the first MLBer to allow as many hits without allowing an extra-base hit since S.F.'s Ryan Vogelsong on 7/21/14 at Philadelphia (11H-all singles)...is only the third Yankee to do so since 1990, joining Mike Mussina (7/15/07 vs. Tampa Bay, 11H/11singles) and Andy Pettitte (6/25/02 at Baltimore, 11H/11 singles).

7-8-9: Yankees outfielders are batting .281 (168-for-598) this season, their highest combined mark since 2007 (.284)...rank second in the AL and fourth in MLB this season...also have a .771 OPS, their highest single-season mark since 2012 (.775).

CHIEFS OF STAFF: Yankees pitchers are second in the *Majors* with a 7.2WAR, according to Fangraphs (Nats-7.6).

- ▶ **RHP Michael Pineda** ranks fourth among qualified AL starters and fifth in the *Majors* with a 2.52 FIP...ranks fourth in the AL and fifth in the *Majors* with 2.0 WAR.
- ▶ **RHP Dellin Betances** leads all Major League relievers with a 1.4WAR (next-highest: Drew Storen-1.0).
- ▶ **Yankees pitchers** are third in the AL and fourth in the *Majors* with 424K, and third in the AL with a 3.21 K/BB ratio.
- ▶ **Yankees pitchers** allowed just 4R/3ER in the 3G series against the Royals (5/25-27) after allowing 30 runs in the previous 3G (5/22-24)...marked their fewest runs allowed in a series of at least 3G since allowing 4R in a three-game sweep at Houston from 9/27-29/13...held opponents to 1ER-or-fewer in three straight games for the first time since 5/14-17/14 (3G).

ON THE MEND: Today **INF Brendan Ryan** will begin a rehab assignment with Single-A Tampa at Dunedin...has missed all 50 team games this season with a right calf strain.

DEALIN' BETANCES: **RHP Dellin Betances** has recorded nine of his last 10 outs via strikeout...has pitched 27.1IP in 2015 without allowing an earned run (10H, 3R/0ER, 11BB/1IBB, 44K), the most IP in 2015 by any Major League pitcher who has not allowed an earned run...his 24 consecutive appearances without an earned run to begin a season are a club record and one of just seven such season-opening streaks of at least that length in the *Majors* since the inception of earned runs (1912 in NL, 1913 in AL)...is the third-longest single-season streak without an earned run in Yankees history: Mariano Rivera-28G in 1999, Boone Logan-25G in 2010).

- ▶ Has held opponents to streaks of 0-for-29 (5/4-5/27, 3BB/1IBB, 15F, 14K) and 0-for-26 (4/17-5/1, 2BB, 14K) this season, the two longest hitless streaks of his career.
- ▶ Has fanned 33 of his last 64 batters faced and 36 of his last 69.
- ▶ His 44K are the most strikeouts by a pitcher prior to allowing his first earned run of the season in Yankees history (since the AL's inception of earned runs in 1913).
- ▶ At 4-0, is tied for the Major League lead in relief wins (Santiago Casilla-SF, Joaquin Benoit-SD, Michael Blazek-MIL, Keone Kela-TEX, David Robertson-CWS).

MAC ATTACK: C Brian McCann has at least 1RBI in each of his last 8G, the longest such streak in the *Majors* this season and matching the longest of his career (also 8G from 7/8-19/06)...is the longest RBI streak by a Yankee since Robinson Cano from 6/27-7/6/12 (9G)...with an RBI today, would match the longest RBI streak in the *Majors* since S.F.'s Pablo Sandoval had an RBI in nine straight games from 5/21-29/14...is the first Yankee to drive in runs in eight consecutive games, all as a catcher, since Aaron Robinson from 8/8-15/46 (credit: Elias)...with an RBI today as a catcher, would match Bill Dickey for the second-longest such streak in franchise history according to the *Elias Sports Bureau* (Dickey had a 10G streak from 4/29-5/11/38 and a 9G streak from 5/29-6/5/32).

- ▶ Has an eight-game hitting streak (since 5/20), going 10-for-26 (.385) with 7R, 1 double, 4HR, 12RBI and 7BB...has reached safely in 17 of his last 31PA.
- ▶ Had his streak of homering in four straight games snapped on Saturday at Oakland...was the longest streak by a catcher in the *Majors* this season...became one of two Yankees to homer in four straight games all at catcher since 1957, joining Mike Stanley (4 total HR in 4G from 7/20-25/93).
- ▶ From 5/25-28, joined Stanley (7/20-23/93) as the only two players in Yankees franchise history to reach base safely three times with a homer in each of three straight games, all as a catcher.
- ▶ Is second among MLB catchers with 33RBI in 2015 (As' Stephen Vogt-35RBI).

HOT ROD: DH Alex Rodriguez is batting .394 (13-for-33) with 7R, 1 double, 1HR, 5RBI and 3BB during his season-high 9G-hitting streak (since 5/22), raising his season BA from .246 to .276...marks his longest streak since a 13G streak from 7/19-9/9/12.

- ▶ Has hit safely in 14 consecutive starts and is batting .339 (19-for-56) in his last 16G overall since 5/13.
- ▶ His sac fly on Thursday gave him 1,996 career RBI, tying Barry Bonds for second place on baseball's all-time list according to Elias, which is the official statistician of MLB (please note that the stats found on MLB.com and baseball-reference.com are NOT official stats)...please also note that RBI only became an official statistic in 1920...passed Lou Gehrig (1,993) for the all-time AL RBI record with a three-run HR on Wednesday.
- ▶ Has 1,947 career runs scored, two shy of tying Stan Musial (1,949R) for eighth place on MLB's all-time list.

POWERING UP: Yankees batters have homered in six straight games (11HR over the stretch) and eight of their last nine (16HR)...have hit 63HR in 50G, tied for second in the *Majors* (HOU-68, LAD-63)...did not hit their 63rd HR of 2014 until their 77th game (6/25/14).

- ▶ Have homered in 36 of 50 games this season.
- ▶ Hit 13HR on their recent six-game homestand (5/22-27), accounting for 28 of their 38 runs (73.7%)...have scored 106 of their 228 runs on HR this season (46.5%).
- ▶ Are third in the AL and fourth in the *Majors* with 155 extra-base hits and a .170 ISO.
- ▶ Rank fifth in the AL and eighth in MLB with a .413 slugging pct. (in 2014, had a .380 SLG, 10th-AL/17th-MLB)...are second in the AL with a .422 slugging pct. vs. RHP.
- ▶ Since 4/26, the Yankees have recorded an RBI on each of their last 130 runs over the last 31-plus games.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP ADAM WARREN (3-3, 3.91 ERA)

RHP Adam Warren is scheduled to make his 10th start of the season and 13th of his career today at Oakland...will pitch on regular four days' rest...has tossed the three longest starts of his career in his last three outings (all quality starts) but has gone 1-2 over that stretch...the Yankees are still 6-2 in his last eight starts...was selected by the Yankees in the fourth round of the 2009 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of North Carolina...made his Major League debut in 2012 and spent the past two seasons (2013-14) in the Yankees bullpen.

LAST TIME OUT: Recorded his third straight quality start and earned the win in a Yankees' 5-1 victory on 5/26 vs. Kansas City (6.1IP, 2H, 1ER, 1HR, 5K)...retired his first 10 batters faced...allowed his only run on a solo shot by Paulo Orlando in the sixth inning...his 2H allowed tied his career low as a starter (also 9/27/13 at Houston).

2015: Is in his first season as a full-time member of the Yankees' starting rotation...has completed at least 6.0IP in each of his last three starts after failing to reach the mark in each of his first nine career starts...the Yankees are 6-3 in his nine starts...has been scoreless in 40 of his 54 frames this season...took a shutout into the fifth inning of three consecutive starts from 4/27-5/8.

VS. OAKLAND: Will make his first career start against the Athletics today...is 0-1 with a 2.19 ERA (12.1IP, 3ER) in five career relief appearances against Oakland...went 0-1 with an 8.10 ERA (3.1IP, 3ER) in three relief appearances in 2014...has made two relief appearances at O.co Coliseum, tossing 8.0 scoreless innings (5H, 3BB, 8K).

WARREN COMMISSION: Has recorded quality starts in each of his last three starts but has gone 1-2 over the stretch.
 ✦ Is the first Yankees pitcher with three straight quality starts in a season since Hiroki Kuroda from 9/14-25/14 (also three in-a-row).

ON THE SIDE: Has held lefties to a .185 (10-for-54) average with three doubles in his last six starts...right-handed batters went 3-for-27 (.111) in his last two starts (all HR) but are still batting .267 (27-for-101) over his last eight starts...five of the eight hits he has allowed to RHB in his last three starts have gone for extra bases (1 double, 4HR).

ROAD BUMP: Since the beginning of 2014, is 2-7 with a 4.80 ERA (63.2IP, 35ER) in 38 games (five starts) on the road...is 4-2 with three saves and a 1.84 ERA (63.2IP, 13ER) at Yankee Stadium over that stretch.

HOLD IT RIGHT THERE: Has not allowed a stolen base in his last 101.2IP, spanning 56 appearances since 5/23/14 (credit: *Elias*)...only two baserunners have attempted steals in that span: Asdrubal Cabrera (CS on 5/13/15 at Tampa Bay) and Manny Machado (CS on 5/8/15 vs. Baltimore).

FOR STARTERS: Is 4-3 with a 4.43 ERA (61.0IP, 30ER) in 12 career Major League starts.
 ✦ Is 5-8 with four saves and a 3.23 ERA (147.2IP, 53ER) in 101 Major League relief appearances.
 ✦ Spent his entire minor league career as a starter, going 28-25 with a 3.11 ERA (497.0IP, 172ER) in 90 starts from 2009-12.

OTHER STARTS: Recorded his second straight quality start but took the loss in the Yankees' 3-2 defeat on 5/20 at Washington...threw a career-high 7.0IP with a career-high 7K and recorded his first career QS in a 3-2 loss on 5/13 at Tampa Bay...earned his second win on 5/3 at Boston, carrying a shutout into the sixth before allowing four of the Red Sox' five runs in the frame...did not record a decision despite allowing just 1ER in 5.2IP on 4/27 vs. Tampa Bay...marked his first career start without issuing a walk...set a career high with four walks (all in the first five batters) but recovered to earn his first win of the season in a 13-4 win on 4/22 at Detroit...was staked to a 6-0 lead in the top of the first, and after yielding 4R in the bottom half, was scoreless the rest of the way...surrendered all 4ER (back-to-back HRs by Dykstra and Forsythe) in the fourth inning of a no-decision on 4/17 at Tampa Bay in a Yankees' 5-4 win...made his 2015 debut on 4/11 vs. Boston, taking the loss despite 2R/1ER in 5.1IP on 4/11.

MONDAY'S STARTING PITCHER AT SEATTLE: RHP MICHAEL PINEDA (6-2, 3.36 ERA)

RHP Michael Pineda will make his team-leading 11th start of the season on Monday at Seattle...makes his first start at Safeco since being acquired by the Yankees from the Mariners along with RHP Jose Campos in exchange for C/DH Jesus Montero and RHP Hector Noesi on 1/23/12...will start on regular four days' rest...his six wins are tied for third in the AL and tied for sixth in the Majors...has walked a batter in consecutive starts for the first time this season...made his Yankees debut in 2014 (5-5, 1.89 ERA in 13 GS)...spent his first six professional seasons in the Mariners organization (2006-11)...made his MLB debut in 2011, earning an AL All-Star selection and finishing fifth in AL "Rookie of the Year" voting.

2015: According to Fangraphs, his 2.0 WAR ranks fourth in the AL and fifth among Major League pitchers...his 2.54 FIP is fourth-best in the AL and fifth in the Majors...leads qualified MLB pitchers with a 13.40 K/BB ratio (67K, 5BB)...has completed at least 6.0IP in seven of his 10 starts (the Yankees are 6-1 in those games).

LAST TIME OUT: Permitted only a solo HR over 6.2IP to earn his sixth win, completing the Yankees' three-game sweep of Kansas City on Wednesday (6H, 1ER, 1BB, 8K, 1WP)...improved to 3-1 with a 2.54 ERA (39.0IP, 11ER) in six home starts this season...issued a walk to Alex Gordon in the fourth, just his fifth walk of the season...struck out his final three batters and five of his last eight.
