### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (20-33) VS. DETROIT TIGERS (28-24)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Won three of four games against New York-AL over the weekend, marking their first series win since taking two of three at Texas, May 1-3...now have one win, five losses and a split over the past seven series...have won six of the last nine games after losing 14 of the previous 16 contests...are 12-25 (.324) over the last 37 games (beginning April 23) after starting the year 8-8...are 20-33 (.377) overall, which is the worst record in the American League and third worst in the majors...it is the third worst record in Oakland history after 53 games...the 1994 club was 16-37 (lost game 54) and the 1979 club was 18-35 (lost game 54)...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 25th consecutive day (beginning May 8) and trail first place Houston by 12½ games, which is one game short of the season high of 13½ (most recently May 27)...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, seven days in fourth, one day tied for fourth and 25 days in fifth.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 5-2 with a 1.23 ERA (8 er in 58.2 ip) over the last nine games and 6-8 with a 2.32 ERA (30 er in 116.1 ip) over the last 19 contests...have a 3.19 ERA (112 er in 316.0 ip) for the season, which is the lowest in the American League...have allowed 22 home runs, which is the fewest in the AL and tied with Pittsburgh for the fewest in the majors...rank third in the AL in innings pitched (316.0).

**PITCHING:** The A's have a 1.67 ERA (15 er in 81.0 ip) over their last nine games and a 2.64 ERA (49 er in 167.0 ip) over the last 19 contests...have three shutouts in the last nine games and eight for the season, which is the most in the American League and second most in the majors (San Francisco, 9)...rank fourth in the AL in strikeouts (402) but have issued the fourth most walks (161)...have allowed the second fewest home runs (42) and are tied for third in pickoffs (5).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed 52 errors, which is eight more than any other team (Milwaukee and Texas, 44)...the errors have led to 31 unearned runs, which is three more than any other team (Washington, 28).

**OFFENSE:** The A's went 13-for-36 (.361) with runners in scoring position in four games over the weekend against New York-AL after going 18-for-140 (.129) over the previous 14 contests...are hitting .196 (45-for-230) with RISP over the last 25 games after hitting .310 with RISP over the first 28 contests...have been shut out five times, which is second most in the AL (Tampa Bay, 6)...rank second in the AL in stolen base percentage (31-for-37, 83.8%), tied for second in triples (14) and fifth in batting (.257).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's begin a six-game road trip tonight to Detroit (three games) and Boston (three games)...have finished with a .500 record or worse on each of their last 10 road trips dating back to last year, which is the A's longest such streak since a 12-trip streak from Aug. 6, 1996-Aug. 31, 1997...last had a winning road trip June 3-11, 2014 (5-4)...went 3-4 on the last road trip to Houston (1-2) and Tampa Bay (2-2)...have lost nine of the last 12 road games and are 11-16 (.407) for the season...went 4-3 on their last homestand, a seven-game homestand against Detroit (1-2) and New York-AL (3-1)...it was the A's first winning homestand after finishing with a losing record in each of the first three homestands, which marked the first time the A's had three straight losing homestands in one season since 2005...it also snapped a streak of five consecutive losing homestands dating back to last year, which matched the longest such streak in Oakland history (last four of 1978, first of 1979)...won three of four games against New York-AL over the weekend, which was the A's first home series win this year...the series win snapped a streak of eight consecutive home series without a win dating back to last year, which matched the longest such streak in Oakland history (May 13-June 29, 1977 and June 1-July 15, 1979)...it was their first home series win since they took two of three from Philadelphia Sept. 19-21, 2014...have now lost 15 of their last 21 home games and are 9-17 (.346) at home for the season, which is the second worst home record in the majors (Milwaukee, 9-20).

**NIGHT AND DAY:** The A's have won four of their last five day games after losing 13 of the first 14...are now 5-14 (.263) during the day compared to 15-19 (.441) at night...are tied with Cincinnati for the worst record in day games in the majors and are tied for the second most losses (White Sox, 15)...are batting .241 (154-for-638) with 68 runs scored during the day (3.58 per game) compared to .266 (321-for-1208) with 154 runs at night (4.53 per game).

**ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 3-15 (.167) in one-run games and 4-22 (.154) in games decided by two runs or fewer, both of which are the worst record in the majors...snapped a 12-game losing streak in one-run games at home on Thursday, which was the longest such streak in Athletics history (dating back to 1901)...are 1-10 in one-run games at home, 2-5 on the road...are 0-6 in extra inning games and are one of three teams without an extra inning win (New York-AL, Pittsburgh)...are tied with Pittsburgh for the Major League lead in extra inning losses and have the second most extra inning games in the American League...have a six-game extra inning losing streak, which matches the longest such streak by an A's team over the last 20 years (May 18-July 5, 2011 and May 21-July 25, 1999)...are 0-9 in games decided in the last at bat and are the only team without a last at bat win...also lost their final last at bat game of 2014 and the 10-game losing streak in games decided in the last at bat matches the longest such streak in Oakland history (May 14-July 17, 1989).

**LEFT AND RIGHT:** The A's have won each of the last two games started by a left-handed pitcher...are 3-10 when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 17-23 when they start a right-hander...are batting .222 (105-for-474) against lefties compared to .270 (370-for-1372) with 39 of their 46 home runs off righties...the mark against lefties is third lowest in the American League and the mark against righties is third highest.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have nine players on the disabled list (Crisp, Davis, Doolittle, Griffin, Ladendorf, Mujica, Parker, Pomeranz, Thompson)...Griffin, Ladendorf, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...today marks the 14th consecutive day the A's have at least nine players on the DL...have had at least seven players on the DL all year...have used the DL a total of 16 times.

**IN MAY:** The A's went 11-19 (.367) in May, which was the third worst record in the majors (Boston and Miami, 10-19)...the 19 losses were the A's most in a month since August, 2008 (10-20) and their most in May since 2005 (7-20)...it was the sixth worst May in Oakland history...finished the month 12 games behind first place Houston, which was the A's third largest deficit at the end of May since divisional play began in 1969 (14 in 2001, 13 in 1979)...now have four consecutive months with a losing record after recording 14 straight months with a winning record...had just one off day in May and played 30 games in the month...that matches the most in Oakland history in the month of May (1981, 1997)...the A's pitching staff had 230 strikeouts in May, which was the second most in one month in Oakland history (Aug. 2007)...the record is 246 in Sept. 2013.

**A's vs. TIGERS:** The A's trail the season series after losing two of three games in Oakland last week...lost the season series last year, 5-2...split four games in Oakland but were swept in a three-game series at Detroit...over the previous six seasons, the A's have won one season series, lost three and split two...are 22-27 against the Tigers since the start of the 2009 season...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 246-242 against the Tigers...that includes 138-109 in Oakland, 106-131 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...all-time, the A's are 914-995 against the Tigers.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Billy Burns** has four straight multiple hit games for the first time in his career (9-for-18, .500)...now has 12 for the season, which leads American League rookies...is also second among AL rookies in stolen bases (9) and tied for second in hits (36)...**Kendall Graveman** was recalled from Triple-A Nashville May 23 for his second stint with the A's this year and is 1-0 with a 2.31 ERA (3 er in 11.2 ip) in two starts since his return...**Stephen Vogt** has hit safely in each of his last nine regular season games against Detroit (14-for-33, .424) and is a .368 (14-for-38) career hitter against the Tigers.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1967** reliever Lew Krausse has the game-winning two-run single and picks up the win in the A's 6-4, 13-inning win at Chicago...in **1977** Mike Norris tosses a four-hit shutout as the A's defeat the Mariners in Seattle, 1-0...Jim Tyrone's double in the fourth inning drives in the only run of the game...in **1982** Mike Norris tosses a four-hit shutout as the A's defeat Boston 5-0.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (2-2, 5.79 ERA)

**FOR OPENERS:** Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville May 23 for his second stint with the A's this year and is 1-0 with a 2.31 ERA (3 er in 11.2 ip) in two starts since his return...was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 1-2 with an 8.27 ERA in four starts before he was optioned to Nashville April 26...went 2-1 with a 1.85 ERA in four starts with the Sounds...was acquired from Toronto Nov., 28, 2014 with pitcher Sean Nolin, infielder Brett Lawrie and minor league infielder Franklin Barreto for Josh Donaldson...made his Major League debut with the Blue Jays last year in just his second professional season and compiled a 3.86 ERA in five relief appearances.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 2-0 with a 1.26 ERA (2 er in 14.1 ip) and .208 (11-for-53) opponents batting average in three starts on the road compared to 0-2 with a 10.54 ERA (16 er in 13.2 ip) and .377 (23-for-61) opponents average in three starts at home.

**THIS AND THAT:** Has allowed a .352 (19-for-54) batting average and three of his four home runs with runners on base compared to .250 (15-for-60) with the bases empty...has surrendered three of his four home runs to left-handed hitters...the opponents two through five hitters in the order are batting a combined .424 (25-for-59), the rest of the order is hitting .164 (9-for-55)...the A's are 4-2 (.667) in his starting assignments...has tossed fewer than five innings in three of his six starts, which are the first starts of his career.

**FIRST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-1 loss to Texas April 9 in Oakland, his first Major League start...allowed three runs in the first, a two-run home run to Moreland in the third and a three-run home run to Choo in the fourth...the two home runs were the first of his career...surrendered just five home runs in 207.0 minor league innings...yielded eight runs in 3.1 innings to become the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to allow eight or more runs in his A's debut (last: Clayton Mortensen, 8 on Aug. 8, 2009 at Kansas City).

**SECOND START:** He combined with O'Flaherty, Otero, Abad and Clippard on an eight-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win at Houston April 14...it was his first Major League win...tossed 5.1 innings and allowed four of the hits...allowed four runners into scoring position and retired the side in order just once (fifth inning).

**THIRD START:** He had a no decision in the A's 6-3 win at Los Angeles April 20...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed two in the bottom of the first on a two-run single by Freese...the A's then scored three runs in the third to take a 4-2 lead but he allowed a Pujols RBI single in the bottom of the third...had a 5-3 lead when he walked the first two batters in the fourth inning...was relieved by Otero who stranded both runners and tossed 4.0 scoreless innings for the win.

**FOURTH START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-3 loss to Houston on April 25 in Oakland...allowed a RBI double to Lowrie in the first inning and a three-run home run to Altuve in the third...also yielded a RBI single to Lowrie in the fifth and was relieved by Bassitt with runners on first and third and two outs in the sixth...Bassitt allowed one of the runners to score on a wild pitch.

**FIFTH START:** He combined with Scribner and Clippard on a six-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win at Tampa Bay last Saturday...tossed a career-high six innings and allowed three of the hits...struck out a career-high six...retired 12 of the first 13 batters he faced...allowed only two runners to advance into scoring position.

**LAST START:** He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win over New York (AL) last Thursday in Oakland...tossed a career-high 99 pitches...allowed a solo home run to McCann in the second inning, a RBI single to McCann in the fourth and a sacrifice fly to Rodriguez in the fifth...was relieved by Abad with two outs in the sixth inning and the A's trailing 3-1...Oakland scored twice in the bottom of the sixth to get him off the hook and twice in the seventh for the win.

**SPRING TRAINING RECAP:** Went 3-1 with a 0.36 ERA in six spring training starts...had the lowest ERA in the majors and the lowest ERA by a Cactus League qualifier since at least 2006...allowed just one earned run all spring...tied for second in the Cactus League in wins and tied for fifth in innings pitched (25.1)...held the opposition to a .141 (12-for-85) batting average...surrendered just one home run in 25.1 innings...did not allow an earned run over his final 20.1 spring innings...it was his first Major League Spring Training.

**2014 RECAP:** Was named a *Baseball America* Minor League Baseball First Team All-Star after combining for a 14-6 record and a 1.83 ERA in 27 starts with Single-A Lansing, Single-A Dunedin, Double-A New Hampshire and Triple-A Buffalo...then made his Major League debut with Toronto in September in just his second professional season...was recalled from Triple-A Buffalo Sept. 2 and had no decisions and a 3.86 ERA in five relief appearances...allowed a .222 batting average and did not walk a batter in 4.2 innings...yielded a .200 (2-for-10) average against right-handed hitters, .250 (2-for-8) against lefthanders...stranded his only inherited runner but first batters faced were 2-for-5 (.400)...was named the A's sixth best prospect by *Baseball America* following the trade.

**WITH TORONTO:** Made his debut Sept. 5 at Boston and allowed a single to the only batter he faced, Yoenis Cespedes...he later scored...struck out Nelson Cruz to end the seventh inning in his second outing Sept. 16 at Baltimore for his first strikeout...did not allow a run over his final two appearances (3.0 ip).

**MINORS:** His 14 wins tied for third most in the all of the minor leagues and his 1.83 ERA ranked fourth among full season minor leaguers...ranked seventh in the minors in innings pitched (167.1)...led the Blue Jays farm system in ERA and wins and ranked fourth in strikeouts (115)...surrendered just two home runs, an average of 0.11 per nine innings...allowed a .232 opponents batting average, including .196 (66-for-335) against right-handed hitters compared to .272 (76-for-279) against left-handers...compiled a 1.41 ERA over the first five innings of a game, a 4.91 ERA in the sixth inning and a 0.79 ERA from the seventh inning on...did not allow an earned run in the second inning (27.0 ip)...his teams were 17-10 (.630) in his starting assignments...allowed four runs or fewer in all 27 of his starts, including two runs or fewer 23 times...walked two batters or fewer 25 times and tossed at least six innings in 21 of his starts.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
<b>RHP Sonny Gray (6-2, 1.82 ERA):</b> Allowed two runs in eight innings in his last start, which raised his ERA to 1.82...that is the second lowest mark in the American League and sixth lowest in the majors...since 1991, the only other qualifying A's pitcher with an ERA under 2.00 at the end of May is Dan Haren (1.64 in 2007)...went 3-2 with a 1.67 ERA in six starts in May after going 3-0 with a 1.98 ERA in five starts in April...the only other time he finished a month with an ERA under 2.00 was in July, 2014 (1.03)...has a 3.00 ERA in innings 1-3 and a 0.88 ERA from the fourth inning on...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 6-2 A's win over New York (AL) last Saturday in Oakland (8.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 5 so)...had a no decision in his only career regular season appearance, a start in the A's 6-5 loss in Oakland last year on May 27 (6.0 ip, 8 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 5 so)...is also 0-1 with a 2.08 ERA in two career postseason starts, both in the 2013 ALDS.

**Saves/Opportunities:** 8-for-16 (50.0%)

- The A's bullpen has posted a 3.48 ERA (26 er in 67.1 ip) over its last 23 games...is 2-5 with four saves and three blown saves over that span... compiled a 7.98 ERA in its previous 15 contests...now has a 4.53 ERA for the season, which is the highest in the American League and second highest in the majors.
- Is tied for the most losses in the majors (13)...has the second fewest saves (8) in the AL, second lowest save percentage (50.0%) and is tied for the second most most blown saves (8).
- Has allowed 33-of-92 (35.9%) inherited runners to score, which is the second highest percentage in the AL.
- First batters faced are hitting .270 (38-for-141), which is fourth highest in the AL...have the most first batter RBI in the majors (28) and are tied for third in home runs (7).
- Has allowed two runs or more in 26 of 52 games for the season...the A's are 2-24 when the bullpen allows two runs or more, 17-9 when it allows one run or fewer (one complete game).

- Pitched 1.1 innings on Saturday after tossing fewer than 1.0 inning in each of his previous 14 outings (5.2 ip, 8 h, 6 r, 6 er, 2 bb, 4 so, 3 hr, 9.53 ERA), which was the longest such streak in Athletics history...the previous high was 12 by Mike Venafro (July 12-Sept. 22, 2002) and Jay Marshall (May 19-June 14, 2007).
- Has allowed 15 hits, 10 of which are for extra bases (five doubles, one triple, four home runs)...has the second highest opponents slugging percentage among AL relievers (.654) and is tied for third in home runs and extra base hits.
- Leads the majors in inherited runners (29) and is second in inherited runners scored (10).
- Faced three batters a week ago today, ending his Athletics record-tying streak of five consecutive games facing just one batter (Mike Mohler, June 1-21, 1993; Buddy Groom, July 5-14, 1998).
- First batters faced are 8-for-21 (.381) with two doubles, a triple, three home runs and 11 RBI...the RBI are the most in the majors and the home runs are tied for the most.
- Has not allowed an earned run in four games and 3.1 innings in his career against Detroit (2 h, 1 r, 2 bb, 4 so).

**Last Year:** Posted a 1.57 ERA and allowed just 13.2% (5-of-38) of inherited runners to score in a career-high 69 appearances in his first full season in the majors... ranked third among AL relievers in pct. of inherited runners scored and fifth in ERA.
