OAKLAND ATHLETICS (21-33) VS. DETROIT TIGERS (28-25)

WEDNESDAY, JUNE 3, 2015 – COMERICA PARK – 7:08 P.M. EDT RHP SONNY GRAY (6-2, 1.82) VS. RHP ANIBAL SANCHEZ (3-6, 5.75) CSNCA – A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have won seven of the last 10 games after losing 14 of the previous 16 contests...are 13-25 (.342) over the last 38 games (beginning April 23) after starting the year 8-8...are 21-33 (.389) overall, which is the worst record in the American League and third worst in the majors...it is the third worst record in Oakland history after 54 games... the 1994 club was 16-38 (lost game 55) and the 1979 club was 18-36 (lost game 55)...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 26th consecutive day (beginning May 8) and trail first place Houston by 12½ games, which is one game short of the season high of 13½ (most recently May 27)...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, seven days in fourth, one day tied for fourth and 26 days in fifth.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 6-2 with a 1.53 ERA (11 er in 64.2 ip) over the last 10 games and 7-8 with a 2.43 ERA (33 er in 122.1 ip) over the last 20 contests...have a 3.21 ERA (115 er in 322.0 ip) for the season, which is the lowest in the American League...have allowed 22 home runs, which is the fewest in the majors...rank second in the AL in innings pitched (322.0).

PITCHING: The A's have a 1.80 ERA (18 er in 90.0 ip) over their last 10 games and a 2.66 ERA (52 er in 176.0 ip) over the last 20 contests...have three shutouts in the last 10 games and eight for the season, which is the most in the American League and second most in the majors (San Francisco, 9)...rank fifth in the AL in strikeouts (407) but are tied for the third most walks (163)...are tied for the fewest home runs allowed (42) and are tied for third in pickoffs (5).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 52 errors, which is eight more than any other team (Chicago-NL, Milwaukee, Texas, 44)...the errors have led to 31 unearned runs, which is three more than any other team (Washington, 28).

OFFENSE: The A's have gone 16-for-43 (.372) with runners in scoring position over their last five games after going 18-for-140 (.129) over the previous 14 contests...are hitting .203 (48-for-237) with RISP over the last 26 games after hitting .310 with RISP over the first 28 contests...have been shut out five times, which is second most in the AL (Tampa Bay, 6)... rank second in the AL in stolen base percentage (31-for-37, 83.8%), tied for second in triples (14) and fourth in batting (.256).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-0 on their current six-game road trip to Detroit (1-0) and Boston (three games)...have finished with a .500 record or worse on each of their last 10 road trips dating back to last year, which is the A's longest such streak since a 12-trip streak from Aug. 6, 1996-Aug. 31, 1997...last had a winning road trip June 3-11, 2014 (5-4)...went 3-4 on the last road trip to Houston (1-2) and Tampa Bay (2-2)...have lost nine of the last 13 road games and are 12-16 (.429) for the season...went 4-3 on their last homestand, a seven-game homestand against Detroit (1-2) and New York-AL (3-1)...it was the A's first winning homestand after finishing with a losing record in each of the first three homestands, which marked the first time the A's had three straight losing homestands in one season since 2005...it also snapped a streak of five consecutive losing homestands dating back to last year, which matched the longest such streak in Oakland history (last four of 1978, first of 1979)...won three of four games against New York-AL over the weekend, which was the A's first home series win this year...the series win snapped a streak of eight consecutive home series without a win dating back to last year, which matched the longest such streak in Oakland history (May 13-June 29, 1977 and June 1-July 15, 1979)...it was their first home series win since they took two of three from Philadelphia Sept. 19-21, 2014...have now lost 15 of their last 21 home games and are 9-17 (.346) at home for the season, which is the second worst home record in the majors (Milwaukee, 9-20).

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's have won four of their last five day games after losing 13 of the first 14...are now 5-14 (.263) during the day compared to 16-19 (.457) at night...are tied with Cincinnati for the worst record in day games in the majors and are tied for the second most losses (White Sox, 15)...are batting .241 (154-for-638) with 68 runs scored during the day (3.58 per game) compared to .264 (328-for-1242) with 159 runs at night (4.54 per game).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 3-15 (.167) in one-run games and 5-22 (.185) in games decided by two runs or fewer, both of which are the worst record in the majors...snapped a 12-game losing streak in one-run games at home on Thursday, which was the longest such streak in Athletics history (dating back to 1901)...are 1-10 in one-run games at home, 2-5 on the road...are 0-6 in extra inning games and are one of two teams without an extra inning win (Pittsburgh)...are tied with Pittsburgh for the Major League lead in extra-inning losses and have the second most extra inning games in the American League (Seattle, 9)... have a six-game extra inning losing streak, which matches the longest such streak by an A's team over the last 20 years (May 18-July 5, 2011 and May 21-July 25, 1999)...are 0-9 in games decided in the last at bat and are the only team without a last at bat win...also lost their final last at bat game of 2014 and the 10-game losing streak in games decided in the last at bat matches the longest such streak in Oakland history (May 14-July 17, 1989).

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's have won each of the last two games started by a left-handed pitcher...are 3-10 when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 18-23 when they start a right-hander...are batting .222 (105-for-474) against lefties compared to .268 (377-for-1406) with 40 of their 47 home runs off righties...the mark against lefties is third lowest in the American League and the mark against righties is third highest.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have nine players on the disabled list (Crisp, Davis, Doolittle, Griffin, Ladendorf, Mujica, Parker, Pomeranz, Thompson)...Griffin, Ladendorf, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...today marks the 15th consecutive day the A's have at least nine players on the DL...have had at least seven players on the DL all year...have used the DL a total of 16 times.

IN MAY: The A's went 11-19 (.367) in May, which was the third worst record in the majors (Boston and Miami, 10-19)...the 19 losses were the A's most in a month since August, 2008 (10-20) and their most in May since 2005 (7-20)...it was the sixth worst May in Oakland history...finished the month 12 games behind first place Houston, which was the A's third largest deficit at the end of May since divisional play began in 1969 (14 in 2001, 13 in 1979)...now have four consecutive months with a losing record after recording 14 straight months with a winning record...had just one off day in May and played 30 games in the month...that matches the most in Oakland history in the month of May (1981, 1997)...the A's pitching staff had 230 strikeouts in May, which was the second most in one month in Oakland history (Aug. 2007)...the record is 246 in Sept. 2013.

A's vs. TIGERS: The A's have split the first four games of the six-game season series with Detroit...lost the season series last year, 5-2...split four games in Oakland but were swept in a three-game series at Detroit...over the previous six seasons, the A's have won one season series, lost three and split two...are 23-27 against the Tigers since the start of the 2009 season...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 247-242 against the Tigers...that includes 138-109 in Oakland, 107-131 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...all-time, the A's are 915-995 against the Tigers.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Burns has five straight multiple hit games, which is an ongoing career high (11-for-23, .478)...now has 13 for the season, which leads American League rookies...is also first among AL rookies in on-base percentage (.374), tied for first in hits (38), and second in batting average (.330) and stolen bases (9)...Brett Lawrie recorded nine assists last night, which tied an Oakland record for most assists in a game by a third baseman (four times)...Sonny Gray is second in the American League in ERA (1.82), fourth in opponents batting average (.196), sixth in innings pitched (74.0), and tied for ninth in strikeouts (66).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1980, the A's trail 4-1 entering the ninth inning at Cleveland when Dave Revering, Mitchell Page and Tony Armas hit consecutive home runs to send the game into extra inning...the A's would go on to lose 6-4 in 10 innings...in 2004 the A's tie an Oakland record by playing their third straight extra inning game, a 2-1 win against Toronto in 11 innings.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (6-2, 1.82 ERA)

EARNED RUN AVERAGE: Allowed two runs in eight innings in his last start, which raised his ERA to 1.82...that is still the second lowest mark in the majors...since 1991, the only other qualifying A's pitcher with an ERA under 2.00 at the end of May is Dan Haren (1.64 in 2007)...has allowed one earned run or fewer in seven of his 11 starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Has the second lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.253), is tied for fifth in wins (6), ranks third in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.36), fourth in opponents batting average (.196) and on-base percentage (.258), sixth in innings pitched (74.0) and tied for ninth in strikeouts (66)...is also tied for fourth in wild pitches (6).

MONTH BY MONTH: Went 3-2 with a 1.67 ERA (7 er in 37.2 ip) in six starts in May after going 3-0 with a 1.98 ERA in five starts in April...the only other time he finished a month with an ERA under 2.00 was in July, 2014 (1.03)...his May ERA was third lowest in the American League while his April ERA ranked ninth...tied for third in the AL in April wins.

INNING BY INNING: Has allowed 11 of his 16 runs over the first three innings of a game...has a 3.00 ERA (11 er in 33.0 ip) in innings one through three and a 0.88 ERA (4 er in 41.0 ip) from the fourth inning on...has a 3.39 career ERA (61 er in 162.0 ip) in innings 1-3, 2.22 (48 er in 195.0 ip) from the fourth inning on.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 4-1 with a 1.15 ERA (6 er in 47.0 ip) in seven starts on four days rest compared to 2-1 with a 3.00 ERA (9 er in 27.0 ip) in four starts on five days rest or more.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held the opposition to a .178 (16-for-90) batting average with runners on base, which is third lowest in the American League among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title...opponents are batting .239 (22-for-92) with two home runs the first time through the lineup, .173 (30-for-173) with one home run after that...has yielded a .394 (13-for-33) opponents batting average to the opponents clean-up hitter compared to .168 (39-for-232) against all other spots in the order.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-1 with a 1.41 ERA (6 er in 38.1 ip) and .154 (20-for-130) opponents batting average in five starts at home compared to 3-1 with a 2.27 ERA (9 er in 35.2 ip) and .237 (32-for-135) opponents average in five starts on the road...has the second lowest home ERA in the American League and the sixth lowest road ERA...has walked five batters in 38.1 innings at home compared to 15 in 35.2 innings on the road.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 2-1 with a 0.69 ERA (2 er in 26.0 ip) and .163 (15-for-92) opponents batting average in four starts during the day compared to 4-1 with a 2.44 ERA (13 er in 48.0 ip) and .214 (37-for-173) opponents average in seven starts at night...has the lowest day ERA in the majors.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 4-1 with a 1.50 ERA (8 er in 48.0 ip) in seven starts against American League West competition compared to 2-1 with a 2.42 ERA (7 er in 26.0 ip) in four starts against everyone else...is now 16-6 with a 2.11 ERA (46 er in 196.1 ip) in 29 career appearances against AL West teams compared to 9-9 with a 3.52 ERA (63 er in 160.2 ip) in 27 games against everyone else.

THIS AND THAT: Leads American League pitchers in putouts (13), is tied for second in total chances (26) and ranks third in assists (13)...has tossed at least seven innings in six of his 11 starts, allowed two runs or fewer nine times and walked two batters or fewer nine times...the A's are 6-5 (.545) in his starting assignments and are 30-24 (.556) in his career.

2015 HIGHLIGHTS: Combined with Evan Scribner on a one-hit shutout in the A's 8-0 win over Texas on Opening Day April 6...became the first A's pitcher to start consecutive openers since Barry Zito in 2005 and 2006... tossed 8.0 shutout innings and allowed just one hit to become the first pitcher to toss eight or more innings and allow one hit or fewer in an opener since Bob Lemon one-hit the White Sox for Cleveland in 1953...it marked the third time in Oakland history the starting pitcher did not allow a run on Opening Day (Gray, 2014; Hudson, 2003)...is now 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA in two career Opening Day starts (14.0 ip, 6 h, 4 bb, 10 so)...the win was the 20th of his career and it came in his 46th appearance...joins Tim Hudson (37 games), Vida Blue (39), A.J. Griffin (44) and Barry Zito (45) as the only pitchers in Oakland history to win 20 games in 46 or fewer career outings...had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 11-inning loss to Seattle April 11 in Oakland...retired nine of the first 10 batters he faced with the one exception being a lead off home run to Ackley in the third...that snapped his season-opening scoreless streak at 10.0 innings and it snapped an overall scoreless streak of 20.0 innings dating back to Sept. 23, 2014...that is a new career high...had a 2-1 lead when he was relieved with one out and a runner on first in eighth inning...the bullpen allowed that run to score plus two more for the blown save (Otero)...it was the first of two times the bullpen blew a save in a start of his (May 8 at Seattle)...allowed a career-

high 11 hits in 6.0 innings in a 6-4 loss at Kansas City April 17...had a streak of five consecutive games with a wild pitch from April 22 to May 13, which is the longest such streak in Oakland history...it was the longest by an A's pitcher since Stu Flythe also had a five-game streak from July 1 to 31, 1936... struck out 10 while walking a career-high seven batters in 6.2 shutout innings in a 7-1 win at Texas May 3... the seven walks matched the most by an A's pitcher since at least 1914 in a game with 10 or more strikeouts (Bobby Shantz, May 30, 1952 vs. New York, G#2)...they equaled the most in Oakland history by a pitcher who did not allow a run (Eric Plunk, July 26, 1986 vs. Toronto; Vida Blue, Sept. 15, 1973 vs. Texas)...it was his second career game with 10 or more strikeouts (12, Sept. 23, 2014 vs. Los Angeles-AL)...it began a streak of three consecutive starts with nine or more strikeouts through may 13...that matched the longest such streak by an A's pitcher over the last 44 years (fourth time, last by Jeff Samardzija from Aug. 25-Sept. 5, 2014)...made his 50th career start May 8 at Seattle and had a no decision in a 4-3, 11-inning loss...was charged with his first loss May 13 against Boston after starting the season 4-0 for the first time in his career...it snapped a five-game winning streak dating back to Sept. 28, 2014...posted a 1.40 ERA and .194 opponents batting average during that streak, which spanned eight starts...left his start on May 24 at Tampa Bay after 5.0 scoreless innings with a right ankle contusion but did not

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-2 victory over New York (AL) last Friday in Oakland...tossed 8.0 innings...walked the leadoff batter and then retired 11 straight before allowing a leadoff home run to McCann in the fourth...had a 4-0 lead at the time...also allowed a run to score on a Gardner ground out in the sixth inning.

Martinez but the A's tied the game with two runs in the second...allowed a solo home run to Cabrera in the third and a RBI double to Avila in the fourth but the A's scored three times in the bottom of the fourth...left after six innings with a 5-4 lead but Otero allowed a run in the seventh for the blown save and Abad was charged with a run in the eighth for the loss...is also 0-1 with a 2.08 ERA (13.0 ip, 10 h, 3 r, 3 er, 6 bb, 12 so, 1 hr) in two career psotseason starts, both in the 2013 ALDS...combined with Grant Balfour on a four-hit shutout in the A's 1-0 win in Oakland in Game 2 on Oct. 5 (8.0 ip, 4 h, 2 bb, 9 so) but had a no decision...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he became the third rookie to strikeout at least nine without allowing a run in a postseason game (Dave Righetti, Game 2 of 1981 ALDS; Mike Boddicker, Game 2 of 1983 ALCS)...was the fourth pitcher with 10 or fewer career regular season starts that did not allow a run in a postseason start (Duster Mails, Game 6 of 1920 World Series; Brandon Backe, Game 5 of 2004 NLCS; Matt Moore, Game 1 of 2011 ALDS)...then took the loss in the A's 3-0 loss in Game 5 in Oakland on Oct. 10 (5.0 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 4 bb, 3 so)... Verlander and Benoit shutout the A's on three hits and a walk...is 0-1 with a 3.32 ERA (19.0 ip, 18 h, 7 r, 7 er, 7 bb, 17 so, 2 hr) in three starts against Detroit during the regular season and postseason.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jesse Hahn (2-5, 3.77 ERA): Went 1-1 with a 2.12 ERA and .213 opponents batting average over his first three starts, 0-2 with a 7.63 ERA and .324 opponents average over a three-start stretch from April 29 to May 9, and is 1-2 with a 2.63 and .202 opponents average over his last four starts...opponents have reached base on an error a Major League leading 10 times, which tops Jesse Chavez' team-leading total of eight from last year...has eight unearned runs, which is the most in the American League...has allowed a .240 opponents batting average, including .173 against right-handed hitters compared to .301 against left-handers...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 5-3 A's loss to New York (AL) last Saturday in Oakland (6.0 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 4 so)...has made one career appearance against Detroit and it came two starts ago in Oakland on May 25 when he tossed his first career complete game, a four-hit, 4-0 shutout.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

4-13, 4.44 ERA (78 er in 158.0 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 9-for-17 (52.9%)

- The A's bullpen has posted a 3.33 ERA (26 er in 70.1 ip) over its last 24 games...is 2-5 with five saves and three blown saves over that span... compiled a 7.98 ERA in its previous 15 contests...now has a 4.44 ERA for the season, which is the highest in the American League and fourth highest in the majors.
- Is tied for the second most losses in the majors...has the second fewest saves (9) in the AL, second lowest save percentage (52.9%) and is tied for the second most most blown saves (8).
- Has allowed 33-of-92 (35.9%) inherited runners to score, which is the second highest percentage in the AL
- First batters faced are hitting .266 (38-for-143), which is fifth highest in the AL...have the most first batter RBI in the majors (28) and are tied for third in home runs (7).
- Has allowed two runs or more in 26 of 53 games for the season...the A's are 2-24 when the bullpen allows two runs or more, 18-9 when it allows one run or fewer (one complete game).
