OAKLAND ATHLETICS (22-33) VS. DETROIT TIGERS (28-26)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have won a season-high tying three straight (also: May 23-25), five of six and eight of the last 11 games after losing 14 of the previous 16 contests...have not won more than three straight since July 3-8, 2014 when they had a six-game winning streak...have won the first two games of this series in Detroit with one game remaining and have now won consecutive series for the first time this season...prior to that, had five losses and a split over the previous six series...are 14-25 (.359) over the last 38 games (beginning April 23) after starting the year 8-8...are 22-33 (.400) overall, which is the worst record in the American League and third worst in the majors...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 27th consecutive day (beginning May 8) and trail first place Houston by 12½ games, which is one game short of the season high of 13½ (most recently May 27)...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, seven days in fourth, one day tied for fourth and 27 days in fifth.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 7-2 with a 1.36 ERA (11 er in 72.2 ip) over the last 11 games and 8-8 with a 2.28 ERA (33 er in 130.1 ip) over the last 21 contests (beginning May 12)...have a 3.14 ERA (115 er in 330.0 ip) for the season, which is the lowest in the American League...have allowed 22 home runs, which is the fewest in the majors...rank third in the AL in innings pitched (330.0).

PITCHING: The A's have a 1.73 ERA (19 er in 99.0 ip) over their last 11 games and a 2.58 ERA (53 er in 185.0 ip) over the last 21 contests (beginning May 12)...have three shutouts in the last 11 games and eight for the season, which is the most in the American League and second most in the majors (San Francisco, 9)...rank fifth in the AL in strikeouts (415) but have issued the sixth most walks (164)...are tied for the fewest home runs allowed (42) and are tied for third in pickoffs (5).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 54 errors, which is nine more than any other team (Chicago-NL, Milwaukee, Texas, 45)...the errors have led to 31 unearned runs, which is three more than any other team (Washington, 28).

OFFENSE: The A's have gone 18-for-52 (.346) with runners in scoring position over their last six games after going 18-for-140 (.129) over the previous 14 contests...are hitting .203 (50-for-246) with RISP over the last 27 games after hitting .310 with RISP over the first 28 contests...have been shut out five times, which is second most in the AL (Tampa Bay, 6)...rank second in the AL in stolen base percentage (31-for-37, 83.8%) and triples (15) and fourth in batting (.256).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's have won the past four road games, which is their longest road winning streak since they also won four straight June 25-29, 2014...have not won more than four straight on the road since May 4-21, 2014 when they won six in a row...are 2-0 on this six-game road trip to Detroit (2-0) and Boston (three games)...have finished with a .500 record or worse on each of their last 10 road trips dating back to last year, which is the A's longest such streak since a 12-trip streak from Aug. 6, 1996-Aug. 31, 1997...last had a winning road trip June 3-11, 2014 (5-4)...went 3-4 on the last road trip to Houston (1-2) and Tampa Bay (2-2)...are 13-16 (.448) on the road for the season...went 4-3 on their last homestand, a seven-game homestand against Detroit (1-2) and New York-AL (3-1)...it was the A's first winning homestand after finishing with a losing record in each of the first three homestands, which marked the first time the A's had three straight losing homestands in one season since 2005...it also snapped a streak of five consecutive losing homestands dating back to last year, which matched the longest such streak in Oakland history (last four of 1978, first of 1979)...won three of four games against New York-AL over the weekend, which was the A's first home series win this year...the series win snapped a streak of eight consecutive home series without a win dating back to last year, which matched the longest such streak in Oakland history (May 13-June 29, 1977 and June 1-July 15, 1979)...it was their first home series win since they took two of three from Philadelphia Sept. 19-21, 2014...have now lost 15 of their last 21 home games and are 9-17 (.346) at home for the season, which is the second worst home record in the majors (Milwaukee, 9-20).

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's have won four of their last five day games after losing 13 of the first 14...are now 5-14 (.263) during the day compared to 17-19 (.472) at night...are tied with Cincinnati for the worst record in day

games in the majors and are tied for the second most losses (White Sox, 15)...are batting .241 (154-for-638) with 68 runs scored during the day (3.58 per game) compared to .263 (335-for-1274) with 165 runs at night (4.58 per game).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 3-15 (.167) in one-run games and 5-22 (.185) in games decided by two runs or fewer, both of which are the worst record in the majors...snapped a 12-game losing streak in one-run games at home on Thursday, which was the longest such streak in Athletics history (dating back to 1901)...are 1-10 in one-run games at home, 2-5 on the road...are 0-6 in extra inning games and are one of two teams without an extra inning win (Pittsburgh)...are tied with Pittsburgh for the Major League lead in extra-inning losses and have the second most extra inning games in the American League (Seattle, 9)...have a six-game extra inning losing streak, which matches the longest such streak by an A's team over the last 20 years (May 18-July 5, 2011 and May 21-July 25, 1999)...are 0-9 in games decided in the last at bat and are the only team without a last at bat win...also lost their final last at bat game of 2014 and the 10-game losing streak in games decided in the last at bat matches the longest such streak in Oakland history (May 14-July 17, 1989).

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's have won each of the last two games started by a left-handed pitcher...are 3-10 when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 19-23 when they start a right-hander...are batting .223 (107-for-479) against lefties compared to .267 (382-for-1433) with 41 of their 48 home runs off righties...the mark against lefties is third lowest in the American League and the mark against righties is third highest.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have eight players on the disabled list (Crisp, Davis, Doolittle, Griffin, Ladendorf, Mujica, Parker, Thompson)...Griffin, Ladendorf, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...Griffin is on a rehab assignment...have had at least seven players on the DL all year...have used the DL a total of 16 times.

IN MAY: The A's went 11-19 (.367) in May, which was the third worst record in the majors (Boston and Miami, 10-19)...the 19 losses were the A's most in a month since August, 2008 (10-20) and their most in May since 2005 (7-20)...it was the sixth worst May in Oakland history...finished the month 12 games behind first place Houston, which was the A's third largest deficit at the end of May since divisional play began in 1969 (14 in 2001, 13 in 1979)...now have four consecutive months with a losing record after recording 14 straight months with a winning record...had just one off day in May and played 30 games in the month...that matches the most in Oakland history in the month of May (1981, 1997)...the A's pitching staff had 230 strikeouts in May, which was the second most in one month in Oakland history (Aug. 2007)...the record is 246 in Sept. 2013.

A's vs. TIGERS: The A's lead the season series, 3-2...lost two of three in Oakland last week but have won the first two games of this three-game series in Detroit...lost the season series last year, 5-2...split four games in Oakland but were swept in a three-game series at Detroit...over the previous six seasons, the A's have won one season series, lost three and split two...are 24-27 against the Tigers since the start of the 2009 season...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 248-242 against the Tigers...that includes 138-109 in Oakland, 108-131 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...all-time, the A's are 916-995 against the Tigers.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Burns has hit safely in each of his past eight games, which is an ongoing career-high (14 for 34, .412)...ranks first among AL rookies in multiple hit games (13) and is tied for first in hits (39)...**Jesse Hahn** is 1-2 with a 2.63 ERA (8 er in 27.1 ip) and .202 (21-for-111) opponents average over his last four starts.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1971** the A's take a 3-0 lead into the bottom of the ninth at Washington before the Senators score three times to send the game into extra innings...the A's finally win with two runs in the top of the 21st inning to win the longest game (by innings) in Oakland history...in **1972** Catfish Hunter pitches a two-hit shutout in the first game of a double-header at Baltimore for his 100th career victory...the future Hall of Famer would go on to win 224 games with the A's and the Yankees.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Hahn (2-5, 3.77 ERA)

BRIEFLY: Went 1-1 with a 2.12 ERA and .213 opponents batting average over his first three starts, 0-2 with a 7.63 ERA and .324 opponents average over a three-start stretch from April 29 to May 9, and is 1-2 with a 2.63 ERA (8 er in 27.1 ip) and .202 (21-for-111) opponents average over his last four starts...left his third start April 18 at Kansas City with a blister and missed his turn in the rotation April 23.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Opponents have reached base on an error a Major League leading 10 times, which tops Jesse Chavez' team-leading total of eight from last year...has eight unearned runs, which is the most in the American League...is tied for seventh in the AL in opponents grounded into double plays (9) and hit batters (4) and tied for 10th in losses (5).

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed just three home runs in 59.2 innings for an average of 0.45 per nine innings...that ranks fifth lowest in the American League...has surrendered seven home runs in 133.0 career innings (0.47 per nine innings)...six have come with runners on base.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .240 opponents batting average, including .173 (19-for-110) against right-handed hitters compared to .301 (37-for-123) against left-handers...has a .286 (24-for-84) opponents average the first time through the lineup, .165 (14-for-85) the second time through and .281 (18-for-64) after that...has walked just one batter to lead off an inning...has allowed a .320 (16-for-50) average with runners in scoring position.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 1-1 with a 1.74 ERA (4 er in 20.2 ip) and .160 (12-for-75) opponents batting average in three starts during the day compared to 1-4 with a 4.85 ERA (21 er in 39.0 ip) and .278 (44-for-158) opponents batting average in seven starts at night.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: Is 2-1 with a 2.81 ERA (8 er in 25.2 ip) in four starts against American League Central teams compared to 0-4 with a 4.50 ERA (17 er in 34.0 ip) in six starts against everyone else.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 4.95 ERA (11 er in 20.0 ip) over the first two innings of a game, 1.80 (6 er in 30.0 ip) over innings three through five and 7.45 (8 er in 9.2 ip) from the sixth inning on.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-2 with a 2.84 ERA (12 er in 38.0 ip) and .210 (30-for-143) opponents batting average in six starts at home compared to 1-3 with a 5.40 ERA (13 er in 21.2 ip) and .289 (26-for-90) opponents batting average in four starts on the road.

LOSING STREAK SNAPPED: Tossed a four-hit shutout May 25 against Detroit to snap his career-high tying three-game losing streak (also Aug. 5, 2014-April 7, 2015)...had a 5.86 ERA and .267 opponents batting average during the losing streak, which spanned five starts.

GO THE DISTANCE: Tossed his first career complete game against Detroit May 25, a four-hit shutout in Oakland...became the first A's pitcher with a shutout on Memorial Day since Dick Fowler and Joe Coleman did it both ends of a 1947 doubleheader against New York...according to Elias, he became the first A's pitcher to toss a shutout in a game in which his team made at least three errors since Diego Segui did it for the Kansas City A's June 15, 1965 against California...joins since Mark Mulder (April 24, 2003) as the only A's pitchers to shutout Detroit over the last 27 years.

THIS AND THAT: Went 1-4 with a 4.30 ERA in six starts in May...tied for second in the American League in May losses...the A's are 2-8 (.200) in his starting assignments...the Padres went 9-3 (.750) in his starting assignment last year...has tossed six innings or fewer in eight of his 10 starts this year...has tossed more than six innings in just five of his 22 career starts...has walked two batters or fewer in nine of his starts this year.

2015-START-BY-START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss to Texas **April 7** in Oakland...allowed base runners in each of his first five innings, including the third when he allowed a RBI single to Fielder...allowed two mor runs in the fourth when Fielder had another RBI single and Andrus scored on a Gentry error...retired the side in order in his final inning, the sixth, and left after six innings trailing 3-1...had a no decision in the A's 8-7, 10-inning loss to Seattle **April 12** in Oakland...retired each of the first 13 batters before Seager reached on a Semien error...Seager was erased on a double play and Graveman took a no-hitter and a 3-0 lead into the sixth inning...allowed a leadoff double to Morrison and the Mariners ended up scoring four times, although only one run was earned...Miller had a sacrifice fly, two more runs scored on a Josh Reddick error and Seager had a RBI single...the A's tied the game in the bottom of the ninth before losing in the 10th...combined with Chavez on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win at Kansas City **April 18**...it was his first win as an Athletic...tossed 5.1 innings and allowed three of the hits...allowed only one base runner to advance into scoring position...left with one out in the sixth inning with a blister...had a no decision in the A's 6-3 loss to Los Angeles (AL) in

Oakland **April 29**...allowed a two-run single to Aybar in the first inning and a solo home run to Trout in the third...the A's scored a run in the fourth and he left after five innings trailing 3-1...Oakland scored twice in the bottom of the sixth to get him off the hook...was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-7 loss at Minnesota **May 4**...allowed a career-high six runs on a career-high 10 hits in 5.0 innings...the A's scored four times in the first inning but he allowed four runs in the second on a Schafer RBI double, a Santana RBI single and a Dozier two-run double...Oakland scored a run in the sixth to take a 5-4 lead but he put runners on second and third to start the bottom of the sixth...was relieved by Alvarez who allowed both runs to score plus two of his own...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 7-2 loss at Seattle **May 9**...yielded a career-high tying six runs for the second consecutive start...allowed two runs in the first inning on a Cruz RBI double and an error, and another in the second on a Smith RBI double...the A's scored a run in the fifth inning to make the score 3-1, but he allowed two more runs in the bottom of the fifth, both scoring on a Lawrie error...was relieved by Castro with runners on first and second and one out in the sixth and Castro allowed one of the runs to score...had a no decision in the A's 7-6 loss to Chicago (AL) **May 15** in Oakland...faced eight batters in the first inning but allowed just two runs on a bases loaded walk to LaRoche and a Gillaspie RBI single...the A's scored four times in the fourth and he left with a 6-2 lead and runners on first and second with one out in the seventh...the bullpen allowed both runs to score and the White Sox scored five unearned runs in the inning (Scribner blown save)...extended his losing streak to three games in the A's 6-1 loss at Houston **May 20**...allowed a RBI single to Marisnick in the third inning and the A's tied the game with a run in the sixth...retired the first two batters in the bottom of the sixth but Spring single and Carter hit a two-run home run...tossed his first career complete game, a four-hit shutout against Detroit **May 25** in Oakland...walked just one batter while striking out five...tossed a career-high 112 pitches...allowed only one base runners to advance into scoring position and that was Collins, who singled to lead off the fifth, went to second on a Semien error and third on a McCann grounded into double play...was aided by three double plays.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-3 loss to New York (AL) last Saturday in Oakland...allowed a run in the first inning on a McCann RBI single but then blanked the Yankees on one hit over the next three innings...the A's scored twice in the third and once in the fourth to take a 3-1 lead but he allowed an unearned run in the fifth on a Headley RBI single...then surrendered a two-run home run to Beltran in the sixth for the loss.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Scott Kazmir (2-3, 2.93 ERA): Went 0-3 with a 4.65 ERA and .269 opponents batting average in six starts in May after going 2-0 with a 0.99 ERA and .158 opponents average in four starts in April...posted the fourth lowest April ERA in the American League...has allowed a .258 (32-for-124) batting average with the bases empty compared to .167 (15-for-90) with runners on base...the mark with runners on base is second lowest among AL pitchers with enough innings to qualify for the ERA title...had a no decision in the A's 3-2 loss to Detroit last Wednesday in Oakland...did not allow a run or hit but tossed a season-low 3.0 innings...left the game with tightness in his left shoulder...is 9-8 with a 3.94 ERA (157.2 ip, 144 h, 75 r, 69 er, 84 bb, 160 so, 17 hr) in 28 career starts against Boston...the starts and losses are his most against any team.

- The A's bullpen has posted a 3.41 ERA (27 er in 71.1 ip) over its last 25 games...is 2-5 with five saves and three blown saves over that span... compiled a 7.98 ERA in its previous 15 contests...now has a 4.47 ERA for the season, which is the highest in the American League and fourth highest in the majors.
- Is tied for the second most losses in the majors...has the second fewest saves (9) in the AL, second lowest save percentage (52.9%) and is tied for the second most most blown saves (8).
- Has allowed 33-of-92 (35.9%) inherited runners to score, which is the second highest percentage in the AL.
- First batters faced are hitting .264 (38-for-144), which is fifth highest in the AL...have the most first batter RBI in the majors (28) and are tied for third in home runs (7).
- Has allowed one run or fewer in six straight games after surrendering two runs or more in 26 of 48 games to start the season...the A's are 2-24 when the bullpen allows two runs or more, 19-9 when it allows one run or fewer (one complete game).

- Tossed 1.1 innings on Saturday after pitching fewer than 1.0 inning in each of his previous 14 outings (5.2 ip, 8 h, 6 r, 6 er, 2 bb, 4 so, 3 hr, 9.53 ERA), which was the longest such streak in Athletics history...the previous high was 12 by Mike Venafro (July 12-Sept. 22, 2002) and Jay Marshall (May 19-June 14, 2007).
- Has allowed 15 hits, 10 of which are for extra bases (five doubles, one triple, four home runs)...has the second highest opponents slugging percentage among AL relievers (.654), is tied for third in home runs and tied for fourth in extra base hits.
- Leads the majors in inherited runners (29) and is second in most inherited runners scored (10).
- First batters faced are 8-for-21 (.381) with two doubles, a triple, three home runs and 11 RBI...the RBI are the **most** in the majors and the home runs are tied for the most.
- Has not allowed an earned run in four games and 3.1 innings in his career against Detroit (2 h, 1 r, 2 bb, 4 so).
