OAKLAND ATHLETICS (23-34) VS. BOSTON RED SOX (25-31)

SATURDAY, JUNE 6, 2015 – FENWAY PARK – 4:05 P.M. EDT RHP JESSE CHAVEZ (2-5, 2.11) VS. RHP JOE KELLY (1-4, 5.83) CSNCA – A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Had their season-high four-game winning streak snapped last night, which was their longest since July 3-8, 2014 when they won six straight...have won six of eight and nine of the last 13 games after losing 14 of the previous 16 contests...swept the Tigers in a three-game series Tuesday through Thursday for their first sweep this season and have now won consecutive series for the first time...prior to that, had five losses and a split over the previous six series...are 15-26 (.366) over the last 39 games (beginning April 23) after starting the year 8-8...are 23-34 (.404) overall, which is the worst record in the American League and third worst in the majors...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 29th consecutive day (beginning May 8) and trail first place Houston by 11½ games... have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days in fifth.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 8-3 with a 1.60 ERA (15 er in 84.1 ip) over the last 13 games and 9-9 with a 2.35 ERA (37 er in 142.0 ip) over the last 23 contests (beginning May 12)...have a 3.13 ERA (119 er in 341.2 ip) for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and second lowest in the majors (St. Louis, 2.84)...have allowed 22 home runs, which is the fewest in the majors...rank second in the AL in innings pitched (341.2).

PITCHING: The A's have a 2.09 ERA (27 er in 116.0 ip) over their last 13 games and a 2.72 ERA (61 er in 202.0 ip) over the last 23 contests (beginning May 12)...have three shutouts in the last 13 games and eight for the season, which is the most in the American League and second most in the majors (San Francisco, 9)...rank sixth in the AL in strikeouts (428) but have issued the sixth most walks (166)...have allowed the fewest home runs (43) and are fourth in pickoffs (5).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed three errors last night and now have 57 errors on the season, which is eight more than any other team (Texas, 49)...the errors have led to 32 unearned runs, which is four more than any other team (Washington, 28).

OFFENSE: The A's have gone 22-for-73 (.301) with runners in scoring position over their last eight games after going 18-for-140 (.129) over the previous 14 contests...are hitting .202 (54-for-267) with RISP over the last 29 games after hitting .310 with RISP over the first 28 contests...have been shut out five times, which is second most in the AL (Tampa Bay, 6)... lead the AL in stolen base percentage (32-for-38, 84.2%), are second in triples (16), fourth in batting (.256) and fifth in runs (.242)...have the fifth most walks (177) and fourth fewest strikeouts (376).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's had their five-game road winning streak snapped last night, which was their longest since May 4-21, 2014 when they won six in a row... are 3-1 on this six-game road trip to Detroit (3-0) and Boston (0-1)...have finished with a .500 record or worse on each of their last 10 road trips dating back to last year, which is the A's longest such streak since a 12-trip streak from Aug. 6, 1996-Aug. 31, 1997...last had a winning road trip June 3-11, 2014 (5-4) ... went 3-4 on the last road trip to Houston (1-2) and Tampa Bay (2-2) and are 14-17 (.452) on the road for the season...went 4-3 on their last homestand, a seven-game homestand against Detroit (1-2) and New York-AL (3-1)...it was the A's first winning homestand after finishing with a losing record in each of the first three homestands, which marked the first time the A's had three straight losing homestands in one season since 2005...it also snapped a streak of five consecutive losing homestands dating back to last year, which matched the longest such streak in Oakland history (last four of 1978, first of 1979)...won three of four games against New York-AL last weekend, which was the A's first home series win this year...the series win snapped a streak of eight consecutive home series without a win dating back to last year, which matched the longest such streak in Oakland history (May 13-June 29, 1977 and June 1-July 15, 1979)...it was their first home series win since they took two of three from Philadelphia Sept. 19-21, 2014... have now lost 15 of their last 21 home games and are 9-17 (.346) at home for the season, which is the second worst home record in the majors (Milwaukee, 9-20)

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's have won five of their last six day games after losing 13 of the first 14...are now 6-14 (.300) during the day compared to 17-20 (.459) at night...are tied for the second worst record in the majors in day games (Cincinnati, 5-14) and are tied for the second most losses (Chicago-AL, 15)...are batting .243 (164-for-674) with 75 runs scored dur-

ing the day (3.75 per game) compared to .262 (343-for-1307) with 167 runs at night (4.51 per game).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 3-15 (.167) in one-run games and 6-23 (.207) in games decided by two runs or fewer, both of which are the worst record in the majors...are 0-6 in extra inning games and are one of two teams without an extra inning win (Pittsburgh)... are tied with Pittsburgh for the Major League lead in extra-inning losses and are tied for the second most extra inning games in the American League (Seattle, 9)...have a six-game extra inning losing streak, which matches the longest such streak by an A's team over the last 20 years (May 18-July 5, 2011 and May 21-July 25, 1999)...are 0-9 in games decided in the last at bat and are the only team without a last at bat win...also lost their final last at bat game of 2014 and the 10-game losing streak in games decided in the last at bat matches the longest such streak in Oakland history (May 14-July 17, 1989)...snapped a 12-game losing streak in Athletics history (dating back to 1901)...are now 1-10 in one-run games at home, 2-5 on the road.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's have won two of the past three games when the opponent has started a left-handed pitcher...are now 3-11 when the opponent starts a left-hander compared to 20-23 when they start a righthander...are batting .223 (115-for-515) against lefties compared to .267 (392-for-1466) with 41 of their 49 home runs off righties...the mark against lefties is second lowest in the American League and the mark against righties is second highest.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have eight players on the disabled list (Crisp, Davis, Doolittle, Griffin, Ladendorf, Mujica, Parker, Thompson)... Crisp, Griffin, Ladendorf, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL... Griffin is on a rehab assignment...have had at least seven players on the DL all year...have used the DL a total of 16 times.

IN MAY: The A's went 11-19 (.367) in May, which was the third worst record in the majors (Boston and Miami, 10-19)...the 19 losses were the A's most in a month since August, 2008 (10-20) and their most in May since 2005 (7-20)...it was the sixth worst May in Oakland history...finished the month 12 games behind first place Houston, which was the A's third largest deficit at the end of May since divisional play began in 1969 (14 in 2001, 13 in 1979)...now have four consecutive months with a losing record after recording 14 straight months with a winning record...had just one off day in May and played 30 games in the month...that matches the most in Oakland history in the month of May (1981, 1997)...the A's pitching staff had 230 strikeouts in May, which was the second most in one month in Oakland history (Aug. 2007)...the record is 246 in Sept. 2013.

A's vs. RED SOX: The A's trail the season series, 3-1...went 1-2 in Oakland and are 0-1 in Boston...won the season series last year, 4-3...went 3-1 in Oakland and 1-2 in Boston...won two of the previous three season series against the Red Sox and are 16-10 against Boston over the last four years...are 12-4 in Oakland and 4-6 in Boston over that span...since the start of the 2007 season, the A's are 36-35 against the Red Sox...that breaks down to 25-11 in Oakland, 10-23 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 235-284 since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 141-118 in Oakland, 93-165 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyo...all-time, the A's are 877-1065 against the Red Sox.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Burns has hit safely in each of his past 10 games, which is an ongoing career-high (16 for 43, .372)...ranks first among American League rookies in hits (41) and multiple hit games (13)...**Jesse Chavez** has tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings in each of his past two starts and has not allowed an earned run over that span (16.0 ip, 12 h, 1 r, 2 bb, 10 so)...has a 15.0-inning scoreless streak during that stretch, which is an ongoing career-high...**Brett Lawrie** has four straight multiple hit games and is 9-for-15 (.600) with five runs, three doubles, one home run and three RBI over that span...**Pat Venditte** was selected from Triple-A Nashville yesterday and tossed 2.0 scoreless innings in his Major League debut...became the first switch-handed pitcher to appear in a Major League game since Greg Harris on Sept. 28, 1995.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Chavez (2-5, 2.11 ERA)

LAST TWO STARTS: Has tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings in each of his past two starts and has not allowed an earned run over that span (16.0 ip, 12 h, 1 r, 2 bb, 10 so)...has a 15.0-inning scoreless streak during that stretch, which is an ongoing career-high (previous: 12.2, May 15-June 13, 2013).

FIVE LOSSES: Has been charged with five losses, which are tied for 10th most in the American League...has a 3.41 ERA (12 er in 31.2 ip) in those five games and has received no run support in four of those games...has received no run support in four of this eight starts, two runs of support three times and three runs one time...has a run support average of 1.53 (9 rs in 53.0 ip) in his starting assignments...has the third lowest run support in the majors dating back to April 23, which was the date of his first start...Scott Kazmir is second lowest (1.48).

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 2-5 despite a 2.38 ERA (14 er in 53.0 ip) in his eight starting assignments...began the season in the bullpen and did not allow a run in his four relief appearances (6.2 ip)...his first start came April 23 when Jesse Hahn missed a start due to a blister...remained in the rotation following the option of Kendall Graveman to Nashville April 26...is now 10-13 with a 3.46 ERA (72 er in 187.1 ip) in 31 career starts, 9-15 with a 5.02 ERA in 204 relief appearances.

MONTH BY MONTH: Went 2-3 with a 1.93 ERA (9 er in 42.0 ip) in six starts in May...the ERA was fifth lowest in the American League in May but the losses were tied for sixth most...went 0-2 with a 2.55 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in six games, including two starts, this April... is 2-2 with a 2.10 ERA in 12 games, eight starts, in April over the last two years...has a 2.68 career ERA in April, which is his best for any month of the season

INNING BY INNING: Has not allowed an earned run in the first two innings (16.0 ip) and has a 0.92 ERA (2 er in 19.2 ip) from the sixth inning on... has yielded 13 of his 17 runs in the third through fifth innings (12 er in 24.0 ip, 4.50 ERA).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed just two home runs in 59.2 innings, an average of 0.30 per nine innings...his .219 opponents batting average includes a .173 (18-for-104) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .261 (29-for-111) against lefties...has yielded seven of his nine extra base hits to lefties (five doubles, two home runs) and has a .192 opponents slugging percentage against righties...has issued 12 of his 15 walks to right-handed hitters...has walked just three batters leading off an inning... has a .179 (15-for-84) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .244 (32-for-131) after that...the opponents number three hitter is 3-for-21 (.143).

IN RELIEF: Stranded his only inherited runner in his four relief appearances and first batters faced were 1-for-4 (.250)...recorded the save in his final relief appearance April 18 at Kansas City, tossing 3.2 scoreless innings...has two career saves, both at Kansas City and both at least 3.2 innings...struck out six, which matched the most by an A's pitcher in a game in which he recorded the save...the only other time it happened since the save became an official stat in 1969 was by Rollie Fingers on Sept. 1, 1972 against Detroit.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-0 loss at Los Angeles (AL) April 23...tossed six innings and allowed just one hit...the hit was a two-run home run by Calhoun in the third inning and it scored Butera, who reached on an error...it was the Angels only hit of the game...Tropeano, Salas, Smith and Street combined to shutout the A's on eight hits.

SECOND START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 6-5 loss to Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland April 30...allowed a run in the third inning on Giavotella RBI single and three more in the fifth on a two-run single by Calhoun and a Freese RBI fielders choice...left after five innings trailing 4-0.

THIRD START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 win at Minnesota May 5...it was his first win since July 23, 2014...the A's scored a run in the first inning and one more in the sixth and he shutout the Twins on three hits and a walk over the first seven innings...allowed his only run in the eighth inning on a Dozier RBI single.

FOURTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-3 loss at Seattle May 10...did not allow a hit until Cruz singled with one out in the fourth... had a 1-0 lead at the time but Seager followed with a RBI double and Ackley added a two-run double one out later...also allowed a sacrifice fly to Cano in the fifth.

FIFTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-3 loss to Chicago (AL) May 16 in Oakland...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed his only runs in the third inning on a two-run single by Garcia...retired the side in order just one

SIXTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-0 loss at Tampa Bay May 21...DeJesus had a RBI double in the fourth and a solo home run in the seventh...allowed a Guyer single following the DeJesus homer and was relieved by Mujica, who allowed Guyer to score...Colome and four Rays relievers combined to shutout the A's on six hits and two walks.

SEVENTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 1-0 loss to Detroit May 26 in Oakland...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings and allowed just five hits...the only run came in the first inning and it was unearned... Gose led off with a single, stole second and went to third on a Phegley error on the steal...Davis followed with a sacrifice fly and that would be the only run of the game...retired 12 straight at one point...Price and three relievers combined to shutout the A's on seven hits.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 3-0 win against New York (AL) in Oakland May 31...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings for the second consecutive start to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 15.0 innings...also tossed a career-high 110 pitches...the A's scored two runs in the sixth and one more in the eighth...Clippard tossed a scoreless ninth to record the save.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 3-0 with a 3.27 ERA (22.0 ip, 27 h, 11 r, 8 er, 5 bb, 18 so) in six games, five starts...tied for second in the Cactus League in wins...did not allow a home run in 22.0 innings...opponents batted .333 (27-for-89)...is now 8-1 with a 2.68 ERA (15 er in 50.1 ip) in 13 games, 10 starts, over the last two springs.

2014 RECAP: Began the season in the starting rotation but was moved to the bullpen following the acquisition of Jon Lester at the trading dead-line...went 8-7 with a 3.44 ERA in his 21 starts and 0-1 with a 3.54 ERA in 11 relief appearances...was 8-8 with a 3.45 ERA in 32 games, 21 starts, overall...had career highs in every category except games pitched and his ERA was a career low...had just nine wins in 191 career appearances entering the season...his 146.0 innings were more than double his previous high (67.1 in 2009) as were his 136 strikeouts (55 in 2013)...was 4-1 with a 2.54 ERA and a .216 opponents batting average over his first nine starts through May 18...then went 4-6 with a 4.17 ERA and .280 opponents batting average over his final 12 starts...allowed a .149 batting average with runners in scoring position over his first 10 games through May 24, .354 after that.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Kendall Graveman (3-2, 5.56 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville May 23 for his second stint with the A's this year and is 2-0 with a 3.06 ERA in three starts since his return...was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 1-2 with an 8.27 ERA in four starts before he was optioned to Nashville April 26...went 2-1 with a 1.85 ERA in four starts with the Sounds...is 3-0 with a 2.21 ERA and .244 opponents batting average in three starts on the road compared to 0-2 with a 10.54 ERA and .377 opponents average in three starts at home...the A's are 5-2 (.714) in his starting assignments...earned the win in his last start, a 5-3 A's win in Detroit on Tuesday (6.0 ip, 8 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 1 so)...has faced the Red Sox one time in his career, a relief appearance in Boston in his Major League debut on Sept. 5 of last year...allowed a single to the only batter he faced (Cespedes) and the run later scored on a Betts RBI single.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

4-13, 4.55 ERA (83 er in 164.1 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 10-for-18 (55.6%)

- The A's bullpen has posted a 3.64 ERA (31 er in 76.2 ip) over its last 27 games (beginning May 7)...is 2-5 with six saves and three blown saves over that span...compiled a 7.98 ERA in its previous 15 contests.
- Has a 4.55 ERA for the season, which is the highest in the American League and third highest in the majors...has 13 losses, which is third most in the majors.
- Has the second fewest saves (10) in the AL, second lowest save percentage (55.6%) and is tied for the second most most blown saves (8).
- Has allowed 33-of-94 (35.1%) inherited runners to score, which is the third highest percentage in the AL.
- First batters faced are hitting .253 (38-for-150), which is fifth highest in the AL...have the most first batter RBI in the majors (28) and are tied for third in home runs (7).
- The A's are 3-24 when the bullpen allows two runs or more, 19-10 when it allows one run or fewer (one complete game).

- Tossed 1.1 innings a week ago today after pitching fewer than 1.0 inning in each of his previous 14 outings, which was the longest such streak in Athletics history...the previous high was 12 by Mike Venafro (July 12-Sept. 22, 2002) and Jay Marshall (May 19-June 14, 2007).
- Has allowed 15 hits, 10 of which are for extra bases (five doubles, one triple, four home runs)...has the second highest opponents slugging percentage among AL relievers (.654), is tied for third in home runs and tied for sixth in extra base hits.
- Leads the majors in inherited runners (29) and is second in most inherited runners scored (10).
- First batters faced are 8-for-21 (.381) with two doubles, a triple, three home runs and 11 RBI...the RBI are the most in the majors and the home runs are tied for the most.
- Has not allowed a run in two games against Boston (0.2 ip)...however, has an 8.44 ERA in eight games against the Red Sox in his career (5.1 ip, 6 h, 5 r, 5 er, 2 bb, 5 so, 2 hr).
