OAKLAND ATHLETICS (23-35) VS. BOSTON RED SOX (26-31)

SUNDAY, JUNE 7, 2015 – FENWAY PARK – 1:35 P.M. EDT RHP KENDALL GRAVEMAN (3-2, 5.56) VS. RHP CLAY BUCHHOLZ (3-6, 3.82) CSNCA – A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost the past two games to snap their season-high four-game winning streak, which was their longest since July 3-8, 2014 when they won six straight...have won six of nine and nine of the last 14 games after losing 14 of the previous 16 contests...are 15-27 (.357) over the last 42 games (beginning April 23) after starting the year 8-8...are 23-35 (.397) overall, which is the worst record in the American League and third worst in the majors...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 30th consecutive day (beginning May 8) and trail first place Houston by 111/2 games...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, seven days in fourth, one day tied for fourth and 30 days in fifth...swept the Tigers in a three-game series Tuesday through Thursday for their first sweep this season ... it was their second consecutive series win, which marked the first time the A's won back-to-back series...including this series against the Red Sox, now have two wins, seven losses and a split over the past 10 series.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 8-4 with a 1.91 ERA (19 er in 89.1 ip) over the last 14 games and 9-10 with a 2.51 ERA (41 er in 147.0 ip) over the last 24 contests (beginning May 12)...have a 3.19 ERA (123 er in 346.2 ip) for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and second lowest in the majors (St. Louis, 2.83)...have allowed 23 home runs, which is the fewest in the majors...rank second in the AL in innings pitched (346.2).

PITCHING: The A's have a 2.25 ERA (31 er in 124.0 ip) over their last 14 games and a 2.79 ERA (65 er in 210.0 ip) over the last 24 contests (beginning May 12)...have three shutouts in the last 14 games and eight for the season, which is the most in the American League and tied for second most in the majors (San Francisco, 9)...rank sixth in the AL in strikeouts (436) but have issued the sixth most walks (172)...are tied for the fewest home runs allowed (44) and tied for fourth in most pickoffs (5).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 57 errors, which is five more than any other team (Texas, 52)...the errors have led to 32 unearned runs, which is four more than any other team (Washington, 28).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .222 (37-for-167) with 22 runs in five games on this road trip (4.40 per game)...are batting .199 (54-for-272) with runners in scoring position over the last 30 games (beginning May 6) after hitting .310 over the first 28 contests...have been shut out five times, which is second most in the American League (Tampa Bay, 6)...are tied for the AL lead in triples (17), are second in stolen base percentage (32-for-38, 84.2%), fourth in batting (.254) and fifth in runs (244)...have the fifth most walks (181) and fourth fewest strikeouts (386).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-2 on this six-game road trip to Detroit (3-0) and Boston (0-2)...have finished with a .500 record or worse on each of their last 10 road trips dating back to last year, which is the A's longest such streak since a 12-trip streak from Aug. 6, 1996-Aug. 31, 1997...last had a winning road trip June 3-11, 2014 (5-4)...have lost the first two games of this series in Boston to snap their five-game road winning streak, which was their longest since May 4-21, 2014 when they won six in a row...are 14-18 (.438) on the road for the season, which is the fifth worst record in the American League...return home following the game today for a threegame homestand against Texas beginning Tuesday...went 4-3 on their last homestand, a seven-game homestand against Detroit (1-2) and New York-AL (3-1)...it was the A's first winning homestand after finishing with a losing record in each of the first three homestands, which marked the first time the A's had three straight losing homestands in one season since 2005...it also snapped a streak of five consecutive losing homestands dating back to last year, which matched the longest such streak in Oakland history (last four of 1978, first of 1979)...won three of four games against New York-AL last weekend, which was the A's first home series win this year...the series win snapped a streak of eight consecutive home series without a win dating back to last year, which matched the longest such streak in Oakland history (May 13-June 29, 1977 and June 1-July 15, 1979)...it was their first home series win since they took two of three from Philadelphia Sept. 19-21. 2014...have now lost 15 of their last 21 home games and are 9-17 (.346) at home for the season, which is the second worst home record in the majors (Milwaukee, 9-20).

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's have won five of their last seven day games after losing 13 of the first 14...are now 6-15 (.286) during the day compared

to 17-20 (.459) at night...are tied for the most losses in day games in the majors (Chicago-AL, Cincinnati, Philadelphia) and are tied for the second worst record (Cincinnati, 5-15)...are batting .243 (169-for-706) with 77 runs scored during the day (3.67 per game) compared to .262 (343-for-1307) with 167 runs at night (4.51 per game).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 3-15 (.167) in one-run games and 6-24 (.200) in games decided by two runs or fewer, both of which are the worst record in the majors...are 1-10 in one-run games at home, 2-5 on the road...are 0-6 in extra inning games and are one of two teams without an extra inning win (Pittsburgh)...are tied with Pittsburgh for the Major League lead in extra-inning losses and are tied for the second most extra inning games in the American League (Seattle, 9)...have a six-game extra inning losing streak, which matches the longest such streak by an A's team over the last 20 years (May 18-July 5, 2011 and May 21-July 25, 1999)...are 0-9 in games decided in the last at bat and are the only team without a last at bat win...also lost their final last at bat game of 2014 and the 10-game losing streak in Oakland history (May 14-July 17, 1989).

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's have won two of the past three games when the opponent has started a left-handed pitcher...are now 3-11 when the opponent starts a left-hander compared to 20-24 when they start a righthander...are batting .222 (115-for-517) against lefties compared to .265 (397-for-1496) with 42 of their 50 home runs off righties...the mark against lefties is second lowest in the American League and the mark against righties is second highest.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have eight players on the disabled list (Crisp, Davis, Doolittle, Griffin, Ladendorf, Mujica, Parker, Thompson)... Crisp, Griffin, Ladendorf, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL... Griffin is on a rehab assignment...have had at least seven players on the DL all year...have used the DL a total of 16 times.

IN MAY: The A's went 11-19 (.367) in May, which was the third worst record in the majors (Boston and Miami, 10-19)...the 19 losses were the A's most in a month since August, 2008 (10-20) and their most in May since 2005 (7-20)...it was the sixth worst May in Oakland history...finished the month 12 games behind first place Houston, which was the A's third largest deficit at the end of May since divisional play began in 1969 (14 in 2001, 13 in 1979)...now have four consecutive months with a losing record after recording 14 straight months with a winning record...had just one off day in May and played 30 games in the month...that matches the most in Oakland history in the month of May (1981, 1997)...the A's pitching staff had 230 strikeouts in May, which was the second most in one month in Oakland history...the record is 246 in Sept. 2013.

A's vs. RED SOX: The A's have lost the season series as they trail 4-1 with today's game remaining...went 1-2 in Oakland and are 0-2 in Boston...it is the A's first season series loss against the Red Sox since 2011...are now 16-11 against Boston over the past four seasons...are 12-4 in Oakland and 4-7 in Boston over that span...since the start of the 2007 season, the A's are 36-36 against the Red Sox...that breaks down to 25-11 in Oakland, 10-24 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 235-285 since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 141-118 in Oakland, 93-166 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyo...all-time, the A's are 877-1066 against the Red Sox.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Burns has hit safely in each of his past 11 games (17 for 47, .362), which is an ongoing career-high and is one game short of tying an A's season-high (12, Billy Butler and Josh Reddick)...ranks first among American League rookies in hits (42) and multiple hit games (13)...**Brett Lawrie** has four multiple hit games over his past five contests and is 9-for-15 (.600) with five runs, three doubles, one home run, three RBI and two walks over that span.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1994** Rickey Henderson steals second base against Milwaukee for the 1100th steal of his career...in **2008** Carlos Gonzalez doubles twice against Los Angeles-AL, giving him seven career hits, all doubles...he is the first player in Major League history to produce extra base hits for each of his first seven hits since Johnny Mize in 1936.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (3-2, 5.56 ERA)

FOR OPENERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville May 23 for his second stint with the A's this year and is 2-0 with a 3.06 ERA (6 er in 17.2 ip) in three starts since his return...the two-game winning streak is the first of his career...was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 1-2 with an 8.27 ERA in four starts before he was optioned to Nashville April 26...went 2-1 with a 1.85 ERA in four starts with the Sounds...was acquired from Toronto Nov., 28, 2014 with pitcher Sean Nolin, infielder Brett Lawrie and minor league infielder Franklin Barreto for Josh Donaldson...made his Major League debut with the Blue Jays last year in just his second professional season and compiled a 3.86 ERA in five relief appearances.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-0 with a 2.21 ERA (5 er in 20.1 ip) and .244 (19-for-78) opponents batting average in four starts on the road compared to 0-2 with a 10.54 ERA (16 er in 13.2 ip) and .377 (23-for-61) opponents average in three starts at home.

THIS AND THAT: Has allowed a .354 (23-for-65) batting average and three of his four home runs with runners on base compared to .257 (19-for-74) with the bases empty...has surrendered three of his four home runs to left-handed hitters...the opponents two through five hitters in the order are batting a combined .394 (28-for-71), the rest of the order is hitting .206 (14-for-68)...the A's are 5-2 (.714) in his starting assignments...has tossed fewer than five innings in three of his seven starts, which are the first starts of his career.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-1 loss to Texas April 9 in Oakland, his first Major League start...allowed three runs in the first, a two-run home run to Moreland in the third and a three-run home run to Choo in the fourth...the two home runs were the first of his career...surrendered just five home runs in 207.0 minor league innings...yielded eight runs in 3.1 innings to become the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to allow eight or more runs in his A's debut (last: Clayton Mortensen, 8 on Aug. 8, 2009 at Kansas City).

SECOND START: He combined with O'Flaherty, Otero, Abad and Clippard on an eight-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win at Houston April 14...it was his first Major League win...tossed 5.1 innings and allowed four of the hits... allowed four runners into scoring position and retired the side in order just once (fifth inning).

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-3 win at Los Angeles April 20...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed two in the bottom of the first on a two-run single by Freese...the A's then scored three runs in the third to take a 4-2 lead but he allowed a Pujols RBI single in the bottom of the third...had a 5-3 lead when he walked the first two batters in the fourth inning...was relieved by Otero who stranded both runners and tossed 4.0 scoreless innings for the win.

FOURTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-3 loss to Houston on April 25 in Oakland...allowed a RBI double to Lowrie in the first inning and a three-run home run to Altuve in the third...also yielded a RBI single to Lowrie in the fifth and was relieved by Bassitt with runners on first and third and two outs in the sixth...Bassitt allowed one of the runners to score on a wild pitch.

FIFTH START: He combined with Scribner and Clippard on a six-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win at Tampa Bay last Saturday...tossed a career-high six innings and allowed three of the hits...struck out a career-high six...retired 12 of the first 13 batters he faced...allowed only two runners to advance into scoring position.

SIXTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win over New York (AL) last Thursday in Oakland...tossed a career-high 99 pitches...allowed a solo home run to McCann in the second inning, a RBI single to McCann in the fourth and a sacrifice fly to Rodriguez in the fifth...was relieved by Abad with two outs in the sixth inning and the A's trailing 3-1...Oakland scored twice in the bottom of the sixth to get him off the hook and twice in the seventh for the win.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-3 win at Detroit Tuesday...tossed a career-high tying 6.0 innings...also tossed a career-high tying 99 pitches for the second consecutive start...allowed three runs, all in the fourth inning...one run scored on a wild pitch and he allowed a two-run single to Castellanos...the A's scored five runs in the seventh to take the lead...Scribner tossed a scoreless seventh and eighth and Clippard a scoreless ninth to earn him the win.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 3-1 with a 0.36 ERA in six spring training starts...had the lowest ERA in the majors and the lowest ERA by a Cactus League qualifier since at least 2006...allowed just one earned run all spring...tied for second in the Cactus League in wins and tied for fifth in innings pitched (25.1)...held the opposition to a .141 (12-for-85) batting average...surrendered just one home run in 25.1 innings...did not allow an earned run over his final 20.1 spring innings...it was his first Major League Spring Training.

2014 RECAP: Was named a *Baseball America* Minor League Baseball First Team All-Star after combining for a 14-6 record and a 1.83 ERA in 27 starts with Single-A Lansing, Single-A Dunedin, Double-A New Hampshire and Triple-A Buffalo...then made his Major League debut with Toronto in September in just his second professional season...was recalled from Triple-A Buffalo Sept. 2 and had no decisions and a 3.86 ERA in five relief appearances...allowed a .222 batting average and did not walk a batter in 4.2 innings...yielded a .200 (2-for-10) average against right-handed hitters, .250 (2-for-8) against lefthanders...stranded his only inherited runner but first batters faced were 2-for-5 (.400)...was named the A's sixth best prospect by *Baseball America* following the trade.

WITH TORONTO: Made his debut Sept. 5 at Boston and allowed a single to the only batter he faced, Yoenis Céspedes...he later scored...struck out Nelson Cruz to end the seventh inning in his second outing Sept. 16 at Baltimore for his first strikeout...did not allow a run over his final two appearances (3.0 ip).

MINORS: His 14 wins tied for third most in the all of the minor leagues and his 1.83 ERA ranked fourth among full season minor leaguers...ranked seventh in the minors in innings pitched (167.1)...led the Blue Jays farm system in ERA and wins and ranked fourth in strikeouts (115)...surrendered just two home runs, an average of 0.11 per nine innings...allowed a .232 opponents batting average, including .196 (66-for-335) against right-handed hitters compared to .272 (76-for-279) against left-handers...compiled a 1.41 ERA over the first five innings of a game, a 4.91 ERA in the sixth inning and a 0.79 ERA from the seventh inning on.

RHP Sonny Gray (7-2, 1.65 ERA): Tossed 8.0 scoreless innings in his last start, which lowered his ERA to 1.65...that is the lowest mark in the majors...has seven wins, which is tied for second in the American League and tied for fifth in the majors...went 3-2 with a 1.67 ERA in six starts in May after going 3-0 with a 1.98 ERA in five starts in April...since 1991, the only other qualifying A's pitcher with an ERA under 2.00 at the end of May is Dan Haren (1.64 in 2007)...has a 2.75 ERA (11 er in 36.0 ip) in innings 1-3 and a 0.78 ERA (4 er in 46.0 ip) from the fourth inning on...is 4-1 with a 1.50 ERA (8 er in 48.0 ip) in seven starts against AL West competition... was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 6-1 A's win in Detroit Wednesday (8.0 ip, 2 h, 1 bb, 7 so)...is 6-2 with a 1.54 ERA in eight starts in his career against Texas (58.1 ip, 37 h, 11 r, 10 er, 21 bb, 48 so, 1 hr)...including 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA in two starts this year (14.2 ip, 3 h, 8 bb, 13 so).

- Has allowed 33-of-96 (34.4%) inherited runners to score, which is the fourth highest percentage in the AL.

- Tossed 1.1 innings in his last appearance May 30 after pitching fewer than 1.0 inning in each of his previous 14 outings, which was the longest such streak in Athletics history...the previous high was 12 by Mike Venafro (July 12-Sept. 22, 2002) and Jay Marshall (May 19-June 14, 2007).
- Has allowed 15 hits, 10 of which are for extra bases (five doubles, one triple, four home runs)...has the second highest opponents slugging percentage among AL relievers (.654), is tied for fourth in home runs and tied for seventh in extra base hits.
- Leads the majors in inherited runners (29) and is second in most inherited runners scored (10).
- First batters faced are 8-for-21 (.381) with two doubles, a triple, three home runs and 11 RBI...the RBI are the most in the majors and the home runs are tied for the most.
- Has not allowed a run in two games against Boston (0.2 ip)...however, has an 8.44 ERA in eight games against the Red Sox in his career (5.1 ip, 6 h, 5 r, 5 er, 2 bb, 5 so, 2 hr).

Last Year: Posted a 1.57 ERA and allowed just 13.2% (5-of-38) of inherited runners to score in a career-high 69 appearances in his first full season in the majors... ranked third among AL relievers in pct. of inherited runners scored and fifth in ERA.
