OAKLAND ATHLETICS (23-36) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (30-27)

ABOUT THE A'S: Were swept in a three-game series at Boston over the weekend after sweeping a three-game series at Detroit to start the last road trip...have a three-game losing streak after winning four straight, which was their longest winning streak since July 3-8, 2014 when they won six in a row...are now 9-6 over the last 15 games after going 2-14 over the previous 16 contests...are 23-36 (.390) overall, which is the worst record in the American League and third worst in the majors...it matches the third worst record after 59 games in Oakland history (last in 2005)...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 32nd consecutive day (beginning May 8) and trail first place Houston by 11 games...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, seven days in fourth, one day tied for fourth and 32 days in fifth...swept a three-game series at Detroit last week, the A's first sweep of a series of three or more games since July 3-6, 2014 against Toronto...it was their first road sweep since June 27-29 at Miami...it gave the A's back-to-back series wins for the first time since Aug. 22-27, 2014.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 8-4 with a 1.87 ERA (20 er in 96.1 ip) over the last 15 games...have allowed one run or fewer nine times over that stretch...have a 3.16 ERA (124 er in 353.2 ip) for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...have surrendered just five home runs over the last 15 games and have yielded 24 for the season, which is tied with Pittsburgh for the fewest in the majors...rank third in the AL in innings pitched (353.2).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 2.97 ERA (72 er in 218.0 ip) over the last 25 games after logging a 4.17 ERA over the first 34 contests...have a 3.67 ERA overall, which ranks fifth in the American League...have allowed just seven home runs over the last 15 games and 45 for the season, which is tied with Kansas City for the fewest in the AL...have the second lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.361)...lead the AL and are tied for second in the majors with eight shutouts.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have gone back-to-back games without an error...have gone more than two straight games without an error just once this year and that was a four-game streak from April 13-17...have committed 57 errors, which is five more than any other team (Texas, 52)...the errors have led to 32 unearned runs, which is four more than any other team (Washington, 28).

OFFENSE: The A's rank second in the American League in triples (17) and stolen base percentage (33-for-40, 82.5%), fourth in batting (.255) and fewest strikeouts (394) and tied for fourth in runs (248) and walks (184)...have been shut out five times, which is second most in the AL (Tampa Bay, 6)...the A's are batting .286 (26-for-91) with runners in scoring position over the last 10 games after hitting .165 with RISP over the previous 20 contests.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are in the middle of a five series stretch where they will play in five different cities...went 3-3 on the last road trip to Detroit (3-0) and Boston (0-3), begin a three-game homestand against Texas tonight, and leave following the game Thursday for a five-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL (three games) and San Diego (two games)...have played 33 games on the road this year and 26 at home...went 4-3 on the last homestand against Detroit (1-2) and New York-AL (3-1), which was the A's first winning homestand since Aug. 19-24, 2014 (3-2 vs. Mets and Angels...it snapped a streak of five consecutive losing homestands, which matched the longest such streak in Oakland history (last four of 1978, first of 1979)...are 9-17 (.346) at home, which is the second worst record in the majors (Milwaukee, 9-20)...it is the second worst record after 26 games in Oakland history to the 1994 club (7-19, lost game 27)...won three of four games from New York (AL) to close out the last homestand, which was the A's first home series win this year...it snapped a streak of eight consecutive home series without a win dating back to Sept. 19-21, 2014 when they won two of three from Philadelphia...that matched the longest such streak in Oakland history (May 13-June 29, 1977 and June 1-July 15, 1979)...are 14-19 (.424) on the road and have not had a winning road trip since June 3-11, 2014 (5-4)...have finished with a .500 record or worse on each of their last 11 road trips, which matches the second longest such streak in Oakland history...it is the longest since a 12-trip streak from Aug. 6, 1996-Aug. 31, 1997.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 3-15 (.167) in one-run games and 6-24 (.200) in games decided by two runs or fewer, both of which are the worst record in the majors...are 1-10 in one-run games at home, 2-5 on the road...are 0-6 in extra inning games and are one of two teams without an extra inning win (Pittsburgh)...are tied with Pittsburgh for the Major League lead in extra-inning losses and are tied for the second most extra inning games in the American League (Seattle, 9)...have a six-game extra inning losing streak, which matches the longest such streak by an A's team over the last 20 years (May 18-July 5, 2011 and May 21-July 25, 1999)...are 0-10 in games decided in the last at bat and are the only team without a last at bat win...the 10 losses are tied for third most in the majors...also lost their final last at bat game of 2014 and the 11-game losing streak in games decided in the last at bat is the longest such streak in Oakland history (previous: 10, May 14-July 17, 1989)...have not won a game decided in the last at bat since an 8-6, 10-inning win over Philadelphia Sept. 21, 2014.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's have won five of their last eight day games after losing 13 of the first 14...are now 6-16 (.273) during the day compared to 17-20 (.459) at night...have the worst record in day games in the majors...are batting .242 (180-for-743) with 81 runs scored during the day (3.68 per game) compared to .262 (343-for-1307) with 167 runs at night (4.51 per game).

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's have won two of the past three games when the opponent has started a left-handed pitcher...are 3-11 when the opponent starts a left-hander compared to 20-25 when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is the worst in the majors...are batting .221 (115-for-520) against lefties compared to .267 (408-for-1530) with 42 of their 50 home runs off righties...the mark against lefties is second lowest in the American League (Chicago, .203) and the mark against righties is second highest (Detroit, .273).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have eight players on the disabled list (Crisp, Davis, Doolittle, Griffin, Ladendorf, Mujica, Parker, Thompson)...Crisp, Griffin, Ladendorf, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...Griffin is on a rehab assignment...have had at least seven players on the DL all year...have used the DL a total of 16 times...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

MONTH BY MONTH: The A's are 3-3 in June after going 11-19 (.367) in May...had the third worst record in the majors in May (Boston and Miami, 10-19) and the sixth worst May in Oakland history...finished the month 12 games behind first place Houston, which was the A's third largest deficit at the end of May since divisional play began in 1969 (14 in 2001, 13 in 1979)...went 9-14 in April and now have four consecutive months with a losing record after recording 14 straight months with a winning record.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's lead the season series, 4-3...are 2-2 in Oakland and 2-1 at Texas...over the last two years, the A's are 4-9 in Oakland and 9-4 in Texas...have won three season series and lost three season series over the previous six years and are 60-61 over the last seven years...are 326-337 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 171-160 in Oakland and 155-177 in Texas...including 88-89 at Globe Life Park...have an all-time record of 423-419 against the Rangers/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Burns extended his hitting streak to 12 games on Sunday, which is an on-going career high...it matches the A's season-high and is tied for the third longest active streak in the American League...is 18-for-52 (.346) during the streak, which matches the longest by a Major League rookie...leads AL rookies in hits (43) and multiple hit games (13)...**Josh Reddick** has hit safely and driven in a run in each of his last six games against the Rangers dating back to last year and is 13-for-24 (.542) with three home runs and 13 RBI over that stretch

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1973** Ken Holtzman tosses a two-hit shutout to improve to 11-3 in the A's 4-0 win over Detroit...in **1990** Dave Stewart tosses a four-hitter as the A's shutout Kansas City, 5-0...in **1991** Jim "Catfish" Hunter becomes the first player in Oakland history to have his number retired when the A's honor the Hall of Famer by retiring number 27.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (7-2, 1.65 ERA)

EARNED RUN AVERAGE: Tossed 8.0 shutout innings in his last start to lower his ERA to a Major League leading 1.65...the only qualifying pitchers in Oakland history to have an ERA as low as 1.65 after May 31 are Jim Nash in 1968 (1.64 as late as June 29), Vida Blue in 1971 (1.62 as late as Aug. 11), Ken Holtzman in 1973 (1.66 as late as June 13) and Dan Haren in 2007 (1.64 at late as June 15)...has allowed one earned run or fewer in eight of his 12 starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Has the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the majors (.237), the second lowest batting average (.186) and fourth lowest on-base percentage (.245)...is tied for second in the American League in wins (7), ranks sixth in innings pitched (82.0), tied for eighth in winning percentage (.778) and 10th in strikeouts (73)...also ranks second in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.33), fifth in wild pitches (6) and fewest pitches per innings (14.6) and seventh in run support (6.15).

THREE-GAME WINNING STREAK: Has not allowed a run in two of his last three starts and is 3-0 with a 0.86 ERA (2 er in 21.0 ip) and .141 (10-for-71) opponents batting average over that span.

MONTH BY MONTH: Tossed 8.0 shutout innings for the win in his first start in June after going 3-2 with a 1.67 ERA in six starts in May...ranked third in the American League in May ERA and was sixth in strikeouts (41)...his 41 strikeouts tied for third most in Oakland history in May and fell three short of the record of 44 (Chuck Dobson in 1968, Vida Blue in 1971)...it was his first month with 40 or more strikeouts...was 3-0 with a 1.98 ERA in five starts in April...tied for third in the AL in April wins and ranked ninth in ERA...has now finished a month with an ERA under 2.00 three times in his career (also 1.03 in July, 2014).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-1 with a 1.41 ERA (6 er in 38.1 ip) and .154 (20-for-130) opponents batting average in five starts at home compared to 4-1 with a 1.85 ERA (9 er in 43.2 ip) and .211 (34-for-161) opponents average in six starts on the road...has the second lowest home ERA in the American League and the fifth lowest road ERA...has walked five batters in 38.1 innings at home compared to 16 in 43.2 innings on the road.

INNING BY INNING: Has allowed 11 of his 16 runs over the first three innings of a game...has a 2.75 ERA (11 er in 36.0 ip) in innings one through three and a 0.78 ERA (4 er in 46.0 ip) from the fourth inning on...has a 3.33 career ERA (61 er in 165.0 ip) in innings 1-3, 2.16 (48 er in 200.0 ip) from the fourth inning on.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 4-1 with a 1.50 ERA (8 er in 48.0 ip) in seven starts against American League West competition compared to 3-1 with a 1.85 ERA (7 er in 34.0 ip) in four starts against everyone else...is now 16-6 with a 2.11 ERA (46 er in 196.1 ip) in 29 career appearances against AL West teams compared to 10-9 with a 3.36 ERA (63 er in 168.2 ip) in 28 games against everyone else.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held the opposition to a .163 (16-for-98) batting average with runners on base, which is second lowest in the majors among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title (Cueto, CIN .152)...eight of the nine extra base hits he has allowed have come with the bases empty...opponents are batting .220 (22-for-100) with two home runs the first time through the lineup, .168 (32-for-191) with one home run after that...has yielded a .389 (14-for-36) opponents batting average to the opponents clean-up hitter compared to .157 (40-for-255) against all other spots in the order.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 2-1 with a 0.69 ERA (2 er in 26.0 ip) and .163 (15-for-92) opponents batting average in four starts during the day compared to 5-1 with a 2.09 ERA (13 er in 56.0 ip) and .196 (39-for-199) opponents average in eight starts at night...has the lowest day ERA in the majors.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 5-1 with a 0.98 ERA (6 er in 55.0 ip) in eight starts on four days rest compared to 2-1 with a 3.00 ERA (9 er in 27.0 ip) in four starts on five days rest or more.

THIS AND THAT: Leads American League pitchers in putouts (17), ranks second in total chances (30) and tied for third in assists (13)...has tossed at least seven innings in seven of his 12 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 10 times and walked two batters or fewer 10 times...the A's are 7-5 (.583) in his starting assignments and are 31-24 (.564) in his career.

2015 HIGHLIGHTS: Combined with Evan Scribner on a one-hit shutout in the A's 8-0 win over Texas on Opening Day **April 6**...became the first A's pitcher to start consecutive openers since Barry Zito in 2005 and 2006...tossed 8.0 shutout innings and allowed just one hit to become the first pitcher to toss eight or more innings and allow one hit or fewer in an opener since Bob Lemon one-hit the White Sox for Cleveland in 1953...allowed a lead off home run to Ackley in the third inning **April 11** against Seattle...that snapped his season-opening scoreless streak at 10.0 innings and it

snapped an overall scoreless streak of 20.0 innings dating back to Sept. 23, 2014, which is a new career high...had a 2-1 lead when he was relieved with one out and a runner on first in eighth inning...the bullpen allowed that run to score plus two more for the blown save (Otero)...it was the first of two times the bullpen blew a save in a start of his (May 8 at Seattle)...allowed a career-high 11 hits in 6.0 innings in a 6-4 loss at Kansas City **April 17**...had a streak of five consecutive games with a wild pitch from April 22 to May 13, which is the longest such streak in Oakland history...it was the longest by an A's pitcher since Stu Flythe also had a five-game streak from July 1 to 31, 1936...struck out 10 while walking a career-high seven batters in 6.2 shutout innings in a 7-1 win at Texas **May 3**...it began a streak of three consecutive starts with nine or more strikeouts through May 13...that matched the longest such streak by an A's pitcher over the last 44 years...made his 50th career start **May 8** at Seattle and had a no decision in a 4-3, 11-inning loss...was charged with his first loss **May 13** against Boston after starting the season 4-0 for the first time in his career...it snapped a five-game winning streak dating back to Sept. 28, 2014...posted a 1.40 ERA and .194 opponents batting average during that streak, which spanned eight starts.

LAST START: He won his third consecutive start in the A's 6-1 win at Detroit last Wednesday...tossed 8.0 shutout innings and allowed just two hits...it marked his third career outing with at least 8.0 shutout innings and two hits or fewer...in Oakland history, only Vida Blue has more such outings (7)...did not allow a runner past first base.

GRAY vs. TEXAS: Is 6-2 with a 1.54 ERA (58.1 ip, 37 h, 11 r, 10 er, 21 bb, 48 so, 1 hr) in eight career starts...has not allowed a run in his last three starts and has a 23.2-inning scoreless streak, which is the longest in Oakland history against the Rangers...has not allowed a run in four of his eight career starts and his 1.54 ERA is second lowest by any pitcher against the Texas Rangers with a minimum of 50 innings pitched (1.28, Sparky Lyle)...his six career wins are his most against any team...is 4-0 with a 0.29 ERA (1 er in 31.1 ip) in four starts in Texas and 2-2 with a 3.00 ERA (9 er in 27.0 ip) in four starts in Oakland...his ERA at Globe Life Park is the lowest by any pitcher with a minimum of 15 innings...is 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA (14.2 ip, 3 h, 8 bb, 13 so) in two starts this year...combined with Evan Scribner on a one-hit shutout in the A's 8-0 win on Opening Day April 6...tossed eight innings and allowed the only hit on a Ryan Rua single to lead off the eighth inning...walked just one batter...allowed just one base runner as far as second base (Martin two-base error on Zobrist dropped fly ball)...also picked up the win at Texas May 3 in a 7-1 decision...tossed 6.2 shutout innings and struck out 10 while walking a career-high seven batters...tossed a career-high 119 pitches.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Jesse Hahn (3-5, 3.51 ERA): Went 1-1 with a 2.12 ERA and .213 opponents batting average over his first three starts, 0-2 with a 7.63 ERA and .324 opponents average over a three-start stretch from April 29 to May 9, and is 2-2 with a 2.36 and .202 opponents average over his last five starts...opponents have reached base on an error a Major League leading 10 times and his eight unearned runs are the most in the American League...has allowed just three home run in 66.2 innings for an average of 0.41 per nine innings...that ranks fourth lowest in the AL...his opponents batting average includes a .181 mark against right-handed hitters compared to .290 against lefties...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 7-5 A's win at Detroit last Thursday (7.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 5 so)...was the losing pitcher in his only career appearance against Texas, a start in the A's 3-1 loss in Oakland earlier this year on April 7 (6.0 ip, 7 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 so).

- The A's bullpen was 0-1 with two saves, a blown save and 7.43 ERA (11 er in 13.1 ip) in six games on the past road trip...was 1-1 with three saves and a 2.93 ERA in six games on the previous homestand.
- Has a 4.76 ERA for the season, which is the highest in the American League and second highest in the majors (Atlanta, 4.90)...has 14 losses, which is tied for second most in the majors (Seattle, 15).
- Has the second fewest saves (10) in the AL, second lowest save percentage (52.6%) and is tied for the second most most blown saves (9).
- Has allowed 35-of-100 (35.0%) inherited runners to score, which is the third highest percentage in the AL.
- First batters faced are hitting .256 (40-for-156), which is fifth highest in the AL...have the most first batter RBI in the majors (29) and are tied for third in home runs (7).
- The A's are 3-25 when the bullpen allows two runs or more, 19-11 when it allows one run or fewer (one complete game).
