WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers lost to the Royals 4-3 in last game on Sunday and are 2-1 on this 7-day, 6-game road trip to Kansas City (2-1) and Oakland (3 G)...Sunday's loss snapped 3-game win streak, but Rangers have won 3 of 4, 7 of 9, 14 of 18, and 15 of last 20...team is 18-10 beginning 5/10 and **22-11 (.667) beginning 5/4, best record and most wins in MLB** in the latter span...Rangers currently have 6th-best record in A.L. at 30-27 (.526)...club was season-best 4 games over .500 after win on Saturday for the 1st time since 4/28/14 (15-11), seeking to reach that point again with a win tonight...season-best 7-game win streak, 5/20-26...club has 3 win streaks of 4+ G this season, all have come since beg. of May...team is a game better than at this point in 2014 (29-28) and was 35-22 thru 57 G in 2013.

SERIES STUFF: The Rangers enter this 3-game set having won a season-high 6 consecutive series for 1st time since 6 in a row, Aug. 17-Sept. 6, 2012...club is 7-1-2 in last 10 series after going just 0-6-2 in season's 1st 8 series.
• Rangers are 5-2-3 in road series, 5-0-1 in last 6 away series since dropping 2 of 3 from 4/24-26 at LAA.

IN THE STANDINGS: The Rangers enter today in sole possession of 2nd place in the A.L. West for a 5th straight day, 3.0 games behind 1st-place Houston...this is the team's smallest deficit since 4/24 (-3.0 GB), as club has gained 3.5 games over the last 5 days...prior to Friday, Rangers had not been in sole possession of one of division's top 2 spots since 4/14...Rangers are currently in 3rd place in A.L. Wild Card standings, a half-game behind Tampa Bay and 3.0 games behind K.C.

ON THE ROAD: Rangers are **19-12 (.613) on the road in 2015, highest winning pct. and most away wins in MLB**... Texas has won 9 of 11, 10 of 13, and 15 of the last 20 away from home, the longer span beginning 4/26...had 7 straight road wins, 5/20-26, longest away winning streak since 9 victories in a row, 8/4-23/13...**current record is tied for best 31-game road mark in Rangers history** (also 19-12 in 1977 and 1999)...best 32-game mark is 19-13 in 1977, 1992, 1999, 2006...club is 23-13 in last 36 away games beginning 9/16/14.

VS. OAKLAND: The Rangers are 3-4 vs. OAK in 2015, alternating losses and wins since opening the season in Oakland (2-2 at the Coliseum)...A's took 2 of 3 in last meetings, 5/1-3 in Arlington...the Rangers have won 8 of 14 vs. the A's since 9/14/14, and teams have gone 13-13 in last 26 games played since the start of 2014...Texas has captured 5 of the last 7 games at O.co Coliseum, where the club is 14-8 since the start of 2013...all-time, Texas leads, 337-326 overall with the A's holding a 171-160 advantage in Oakland.

VS. A.L. WEST: Rangers played 25 of 1st 27 games this season against A.L. West foes (10-15 overall, 7-6 on road), but last 30 contests have been played outside the division ahead of tonight's series opener...Texas has won 4 of last 5 against the West, but has a 5-9 mark since 4/18.

LATE COMEBACK: The Rangers posted a 3-run 7th inning on Sunday at K.C. to tie the game and pin a blown save on Kelvin Herrera...Texas had 4 straight hits in that 7th inning after only one hit in the game to that point...it was just the 5th time all season to have an inning of 3+ runs in the 7th-or-later...others: 4/21 at ARI (4-R 8th), 4/22 at ARI (4-R 9th), 5/2 vs. OAK (4-R 7th), and 6/2 vs. CWS (4-R 8th).
• There have been 9 blown saves against Texas this season, 4 by the Royals...K.C. had 3 blown saves on 5/12 in Arlington and still won the game 7-6 in 10 innings, and then Herrera had the blown save on Sunday.

PUT IT ON THE BOARD: Texas has not been shut out in 54 straight, longest streak in MLB in '15...Rangers were blanked in 2 of season's 1st 3 games here in Oakland, none since.

PRINCE FIELDER enters today leading the American League with a .356 batting average, 80 hits, and an MLB-high 26 multi-hit games...only ML player with a higher qualifying average is Miami's Dee Gordon (.366), and Gordon is also the only player with more hits (87)...Fielder's .960 OPS figure is also 3rd in the A.L. behind only Nelson Cruz (.997) and Miguel Cabrera (.985).

• The only Rangers to have more hits through 57 team games than Fielder's current 80 hits were Michael Young (83 in 2004) and Will Clark (81 in 1994).

• Fielder has received 4 of his 5 intentional walks this season since Adrian Beltre left the game on 5/31 vs. BOS with a sprained left thumb...his 5 IBB are 7th in the A.L.

• After going 0-for-4 in the season opener on 4/6, Fielder has hit safely in his last 6 games against the A's at 11-for-22 with a HR, 2 doubles, 4 RBI, 4 BB, and a HBP.

MITCH MORELAND posted each of the Rangers' 1st 2 hits on Sunday and has 3 straight multiple hit games to begin this road trip at 6-for-11 (.545), rising from .286 to .307, highest since 5/25 (.309)...while he does not qualify for league leader status due to DL time, Moreland's .881 OPS in '15 ranks 2nd among club regulars (Fielder-.960), and he is also among team's best in 2B (3rd, 10), HR (T3rd, 6), and RBI (4th, 21).

• Moreland has 11 career HR vs. OAK, 4 more than next highest total against an opponent (SEA-7)...his 8 HR at the Coliseum since start of 2010 are 2nd-most by any A's opponent (Trout-10)...has 5 career multi-HR games vs. OAK, including 2 at this park, last on 5/14/13 at OAK.

NICK MARTINEZ seeks to rebound from consecutive losses in his start tonight, and he is looking to extend his career success against the A's as well...Martinez is 2-1 with a 2.10 ERA over 6 games/5 starts vs. Oakland in his career, the 5th-lowest ERA against the A's among active pitchers (min. 30.0 IP)...the 4 pitchers ahead of him: Wei-Yin Chen (1.69), Joe Nathan (1.77), Hector Santiago (1.91), and Kevin Gregg (1.97)...Martinez is facing Sonny Gray for the 3rd time in a span of 4 starts vs. A's, as they squared off twice in September (Martinez won on 9/18/14 here at O.co, but took loss in season finale on 9/28/14 in Arlington).

• The A's are one of 2 opponents against which Martinez has multiple wins (also 2-1 vs. HOU)...Martinez is 2-0, 2.04 (4 ER/17.2 IP) in 3 G/GS in his career at the Coliseum, and a win tonight would match his highest win total in any ML park (3-9 at Globe Life Park).

OUT OF THE BLOCKS: Texas has scored in the 1st inning in 3 of 4, 6 of 8, and 8 of 14...Rangers have won 9 straight games when scoring in the opening frame and are 17-5 when posting 1st inning runs in 2015...the Rangers' 40 first-inning runs are 5th in MLB behind only NYY-57, DET-42, SD-42, and TOR-42...Rangers' .317 (73-230) avg. in 1st inning is 2nd in MLB (NYY-.321).

• Texas is 26-6 (.813) when scoring 1st in a game, 5th-best win pct. in MLB to STL (.867, 26-4), HOU (.846, 22-4), TB (.846, 22-4), and LAD (.815, 22-5).

BEYOND THE GRAY SKY: For the 9th time in as many series vs. Oakland since the start of 2014, the Rangers will face Sonny Gray...Texas is seeking to break Gray's streak of 3 consecutive wins vs. Texas (all scoreless outings)...Rangers have twice beaten Gray in his career, both here at the Coliseum...Texas has had a CG SHO thrown against the club 6 times since the start of 2014, 2 of those by Gray.

• Players with most career PA's vs. Sonny Gray: 29-Elvis Andrus, 27-Leonys Martin, 27-Kyle Seager.

SHORTS: Sunday was Rangers' 2nd loss in '15 when opponent did not have a hit w/ RISP (also 4/22 at ARI)...Matt Harrison (L, 5.0 IP, 8 H, 6 R-ER, 2 BB, 2 SO, 86 pitches/54 strikes) made his 2nd rehab start last night w/ Round Rock vs. Oklahoma City...Ryan Rua and Neftali Feliz are also rehabbing at Round Rock.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER

#22 Nick Martinez, RHP
(4-2, 2.89)

TONIGHT: The 24-year-old right-hander is slated to make his 12th start of the season in tonight's series opener in Oakland...took loss in last start Wed. vs. CWS and will be pitching on extra 5 days' rest after the off day yesterday...has lost 2 straight starts after going 4-0 over 1st 9 starts in 2015, allowing season-high 9 hits in 2 straight (matching career high for hits allowed)...still ranks 11th in A.L. with 2.89 ERA, and is also among A.L. leaders in quality starts (T8th, 8)...his 7 R allowed on Wednesday ended a club-record span of allowing 3-ER-or-less in 16 consecutive starts...compiled a 0.35 ERA over 4 starts in in April, which was the lowest monthly ERA in Rangers history (min. 25.0 IP), but has a 4.58 ERA (20 ER/39.1 IP) in 7 starts since the beginning of May...was selected as Rangers April Player of the Month after the MLB-low 0.35 ERA (1 ER/26.0 IP)...opened the season with 5 consecutive quality starts, becoming the 7th member of a Texas Opening Day rotation to accomplish the feat and 3rd since 1993...spent the majority of his college career as an infielder at Fordham University...was the only repeat member of the Texas season-opening rotation from 2014...Rangers are 8-3 in his 11 starts.

ON THE LEADERBOARD: Ranks among the A.L. leaders in ERA (11th, 2.89), quality starts (T8th, 8), and HR/9 IP (15th, 0.69)...has MLB-high 8 hit batsmen...6.89 run support average is the 6th-highest mark in the A.L. and 2nd on the staff behind Colby Lewis (7.00)...has held left-handed batters to a .212 average (25-118), 9th-lowest among right-handed pitchers in A.L. (min. 100 AB)...opponents are batting .177 (11-62) with RISP, 7th-lowest in the A.L.

LAST START: Suffered his 2nd straight loss in Rangers' 9-2 defeat on Wed. vs. CWS (3.1 IP, 9 H, 7 R-ER, 2 BB, 5 SO, 1 HR, 1 HBP, 89 pitches/56 strikes), his shorest start and most runs allowed in '15, raising his season ERA over three-quarters of a run from 2.03 to 2.89...allowed just one baserunner in both the 1st and 3rd innings, but Sox sent 10 men to the plate in a 6-run 2nd inning that included Jose Abreu's 2-R HR...permitted 3 of 4 BF in the 4th inning to reach (single, 2 BB) before he was removed...the outing ended Martinez's club-record span of 16 consecutive starts of allowing 3-ER-or-less dating to last season.

VS. OAKLAND: Career 2-1, 2.10 (8 ER/34.1 IP) in 6 games/5 starts vs. OAK, including 1-0, 1.38 (2 ER/13.0 IP) in 2 G/GS in 2015...won his 1st start of the season on 4/9 at OAK (7.0 IP, 4 H, 0 R-ER), when he did not allow a runner to advance to 3rd base until the 7th inning...also took ND in Rangers' come-from-behind, 10-inning 8-7 win on 5/2 vs. OAK (6.0 IP, 7 H, 5 R-2 ER)...in latter start, came out for 7th inning and faced 4 batters, all of whom reached, one on an Elvis Andrus error, one on a batted ball hitting the 2nd base umpire on a potential double play ball, and one hit batter...still exited with a 3-2 lead before an action-packed ending to the game...faced Sonny Gray twice last Sept., win on 9/18/14 here at O.co, but taking loss in season finale on 9/28/14 in Arlington.

ON ROAD: Has gone 2-0 with a 1.76 ERA (6 ER/30.2 IP) in his 5 road starts in 2015, the 4th-lowest road ERA in the A.L. (5+ road starts)...had quality start in last away outing on 5/23 at NYY (7.0 IP, 2 R-ER)...last 7 road starts beg. 8/31/14 at HOU: 3-0, 1.94 (9 ER/41.2 IP) w/ 2 HR allowed.

SUB-3 STREAK: Martinez made a club-record 16 consecutive starts of allowing 3 earned runs-or-less from Aug. 31, 2014-May 28, 2015...was 6-3, 2.13 (23 ER/97.1 IP) over those 16 starts...previous record was held by Denton resident Rich Hand, who set the previous mark with 15 straight in 1972.

APRIL: Chosen as the Rangers April Player of the Month in a near unanimous vote by writers and broadcasters who cover the team on a regular basis...went 2-0 with a 0.35 ERA (1 ER/26.0 IP) over 4 starts during the month, with Texas going 4-0 in his outings...finished the month with the lowest qualifying ERA in MLB and the lowest ERA by any pitcher with 25.0-or-more innings in March/April since Roger Clemens had a 0.28 ERA (1 ER/32.0 IP) for the Red Sox in 1991...the figure was also the lowest monthly ERA in Rangers history, ahead of Kenny Rogers' 0.65 ERA (3 ER/41.1 IP) in May 1995...previous low ERA by a Rangers right-hander was Nolan Ryan at 0.99 (3 ER/27. IP) in Sept. 1992.

2015: Chirinos has caught 7 starts (2.57 ERA, 12 ER/42.0 IP), and Corporan has caught 4 (3.47 ERA, 9 ER/23.1 IP)...Corporan caught 1st, 4th, 9th, 11th starts...RHBs (.319) are batting over 100 points higher than LHB (.212)...batters leading off an inning are hitting .233 (14-60) w/ 6 BB...opponents are 11-for-62 (.177) w/ RISP, hitting .212 (24-113) with men on base...opponents by time through lineup: 1st - .270 (24-89), 2nd - .205 (18-88), 3rd - .362 (25-69), 4th - .143 (1-7)...outing 4/9 at OAK was 3rd and longest scoreless start of his career (7.0 IP)...snapped his 18-inning walkless streak in that contest, a streak that spanned through his final 2 starts last season...did not issue a free pass until the 6th inning on 4/9 at OAK...surrendered home run on 5/12 vs. KC (Hosmer), 1st HR allowed since 9/11/14 vs. LAA, a span of 59.2 innings pitched without a home run allowed...was the longest active homerless streak by a starting pitcher in the majors at that time...loss on 5/28 vs. BOS snapped career-best 4-game win streak, receiving season-low one run of support.

2014: A surprise addition to the Opening Day rotation at the end of spring training, ranked 2nd on the club in starts (2nd, 24), innings (3rd, 140.1), and strikeouts (3rd, 77)...was among A.L. rookie leaders in starts (6th) and innings (6th)...tied for 8th in A.L. in losses (12)...became just the 9th rookie in Rangers history with

24-or-more starts in a season, the 4th in the last 25 seasons (see charts on right)...was 5-11, 4.90 (70 ER/128.2 IP) in 24 starts and 0-1, 0.77 (1 ER/11.2 IP) in 5 relief appearances.

AMATEUR BACKGROUND: Selected by Texas in 18th round of 2011 June draft as a pitcher...played 3 seasons at Fordham University in Bronx, NY...was primarily as a second baseman with a .295 career average, 4 HR, and 66 RBI with the Rams...appeared in 15 games in relief, going 1-3, 5.33...batted .292 and led team in runs (46), walks (37), and OBP (.404) in 2011...also appeared in 10 games in relief that season...was the 1st Fordham player to appear in the majors since RHP Pete Harnisch in 2001...played baseball at Belen Jesuit Prep in Miami, FL (graduated 2008).

TOMORROW'S SCHEDULED STARTER — RHP YOVANI GALLARDO (5-6, 3.54 in 12 games/starts)
