WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers beat the A's 2-1 in last night's series opener and are 3-1 on this 7-day, 6-game road trip to Kansas City (2-1) and Oakland (1-0)...Rangers have won 4 of 5, 8 of 10, 15 of 19, and 16 of last 21...team is 19-10 beginning 5/10 and **23-11 (.676) beginning 5/4, best record and most wins in MLB** in the latter span...Rangers currently have 5th-best record in A.L. at 31-27 (.534)...club has matched high water mark for season at 4-over (also after win Saturday), this after not being 4-over since 4/28/14 (15-11)...with win tonight, could climb to 5-over for 1st time since 4/27/14 (15-10)...season-best 7-game win streak, 5/20-26...club has 3 win streaks of 4+ G this season, all have come since beginning of May...team is 2 games better than at this point in 2014 (29-29) and was 36-22 thru 58 G in 2013.

SERIES STUFF: Rangers have won season-high 6 consecutive series for 1st time since 6 in a row, Aug. 17-Sept. 6, 2012...club is 7-1-2 in last 10 series after opening season 0-6-2.
 • Rangers have won at least 7 consecutive series just 6 times in club history (club-record 8 twice), the last instance being 7 in a row from June 8-July 1, 2012...current run could join that short list with a win tonight and/or tomorrow.
 • Rangers are 5-2-3 in road series, 5-0-1 in last 6 away series since dropping 2 of 3 from 4/24-26 at LAA.

IN THE STANDINGS: The Rangers enter today in sole possession of 2nd place in the A.L. West for a 6th straight day, 2.0 games behind 1st-place Houston...this is the team's smallest deficit since 4/23 (-2.0 GB), as club has gained 4.5 games on Houston over the last 6 days...prior to Friday, Rangers had not been in sole possession of one of division's top 2 spots since 4/14...Rangers are currently in 2nd place in A.L. Wild Card standings, 2.0 games behind Minnesota and a half-game ahead of Detroit and Tampa Bay.

ON THE ROAD: Rangers are **20-12 (.625) on the road in 2015, highest winning pct. and most away wins in MLB...** Texas has won 10 of 12, 11 of 14, and 16 of the last 21 away from home, the longer span beginning 4/26...**current record is best 32-game road mark in Rangers history** (previously 19-13 in 1977, 1992, 1999, 2006)...best 33-game record is 20-13 in 2006...had 7 straight road wins, 5/20-26, longest away winning streak since 9 victories in a row, 8/4-23/13...club is 24-13 in last 37 away games beginning 9/16/14.

VS. OAKLAND: The Rangers are 4-4 vs. OAK in 2015, alternating losses and wins since opening the season in Oakland (3-2 at the Coliseum)...the Rangers have won 9 of 15 vs. the A's since 9/14/14, and hold slight 14-13 edge in last 27 games played since the start of 2014...Texas has captured 6 of the last 8 games at O.co Coliseum, where the club is 15-8 since the start of 2013...all-time, Texas leads, 338-326 overall with the A's holding a 171-161 advantage in Oakland.

VS. A.L. WEST: Last night was 1st game against a West club since 5/6 at HOU, this after 30 straight contests outside of the division...Rangers are 11-15 overall vs. West in 2015, 8-6 on the road...Texas has won 4 straight and 5 of last 6 against the West, but has a 6-9 mark since 4/18.

BUY MYSELF A GRAY GUITAR AND PLAY: The Rangers pinned a loss on Sonny Gray last night, the 3rd time Texas has beaten the Oakland ace, all here at the Coliseum...Gray's 3 losses against Texas are most against any opponent, and Rangers have handed him 3 of his 10 losses at home, only club to beat him more than once at the Coliseum.

IF IT AIN'T BROKE: Last night was the 3rd time in the last 4 games for Texas to use a lineup of DeShields-Choo-Fielder-Moreland-Gallo-Andrus-Martin-Chirinos-Alberto...it is the 1st lineup the Rangers have used 3 times this season, one of just 3 batting orders used multiple times, as Manager Jeff Banister has used 54 different lineups in 58 games.

CLOSE WIN: After last night's 2-1 win, Texas has won 6 of last 7 one-run games and is now 11-6 (.647) in one-run games this season...the 11-6 record in one-run games is tied with San Francisco (also 11-6) for best record in MLB.
 • Rangers scored game's 1st 2 runs last night, now 27-6 (.818) when scoring first, 4th-best record in MLB to only HOU (.846, 22-4), TB (.846, 22-4), and STL (.839, 26-5)...Rangers' 27 wins when scoring 1st are tied with DET for most in MLB.
 • Rangers now have 5 wins with one-or-2 runs in 2015, all since May 4...only other teams to post 5 wins w/ 2-or-fewer runs since the beginning of May are all in the N.L.: LAD (6), STL (6), and WAS (5).

OUT OF THE BLOCKS: Texas has scored in the 1st inning in 3 of 5, 6 of 9, and 8 of 15...Rangers have won 9 straight games when scoring in the opening frame and are 17-5 when posting 1st inning runs in 2015...the Rangers' 40 first-inning runs are 5th in MLB behind only NYY-57, DET-43, SD-42, and TOR-42...Rangers' .316 (74-234) avg. in 1st inning is 2nd in MLB (NYY-.317).

MITCH MORELAND homered last night to account for one of the Rangers' 2 runs, and he has hit safely in 5 straight at .400 (8-20) to rise from .289 to .305...his 7 HR are 3rd-most among Rangers to only Fielder (10) and Choo (8).
 • Moreland has 12 career HR vs. OAK, 5 more than next highest total against an opponent (SEA-7)...his 9 HR at the Coliseum since start of 2010 are 2nd-most by any A's opponent (Trout-10)...he has homered in back-to-back games at the Coliseum (last night and 4/9)...has 5 career multi-HR games, including 2 at this park, last on 5/14/13 at OAK.
 • Rangers are now 7-0 when Moreland homers this season...only other MLB players whose teams are 7-0 or better when they homer in 2015 (credit STATS Inc.): MIN's Torii Hunter (8-0), LAD's Andre Ethier (8-0), HOU's Colby Rasmus (8-0), LAD's Jimmy Rollins (7-0), and NYY's Stephen Drew (7-0).
 • Last night was Moreland's 6th road HR this season, tied with Prince Fielder for the team lead.

NICK MARTINEZ posted his 5th win last night, tied for most among Rangers (also Gallardo and Lewis), allowing just one hit in 6.0 shutout innings...some notes:
 • Last night was the 1st start by a Ranger of 6.0+ innings while allowing one-or-zero hits since Yu Darvish on 4/11/14 vs. HOU (8.0 IP, 1 H, 0 R)...last instance that was not by Darvish and/or vs. Houston was by Rich Harden on 8/23/10 vs. MIN (6.2 IP, 0 H, 0 R).
 • Moved to 3-1, 1.79 (8 ER/40.1 IP) in 7 G/6 GS in his career vs. Oakland, including 3-0, 1.52 (4 ER/23.2 IP) in 4 G/GS in career here at the Coliseum...paired with his 7.0 SHO IP in season debut on 4/9 at OAK, he has consecutive starts of 6.0+ shutout innings here at the Coliseum...**over the last 17 seasons beginning 1999, the only other opposing pitcher with back-to-back scoreless starts of 6.0+ innings at this park (single-season or spanning multiple seasons) was SEA's Felix Hernandez (2 straight in 2013).**

REHAB FRONT: Martin Perez (left elbow ligament surgery) is scheduled to be assigned to Frisco (AA) today and begin a rehab assignment vs. San Antonio tonight at 7:05 p.m. CT...is slated to start and pitch 3.0 innings...Nefthali Feliz (axillary abscess procedure) made his 2nd rehab appearance for Round Rock (AAA) last night vs. Oklahoma City: L, 1.0 IP, 2 H, 2 R-ER, 1 BB, 0 SO, 19 pitches/11 strikes)...Ryan Rua (1-3, RBI, BB) also continued rehab last night at Round Rock.

SHORTS: Rangers have won 9 straight when Prince Fielder has had an RBI...Texas had hits and stranded exactly one runner in each of game's 1st 8 innings last night...Delino DeShields hit team-high 4th triple last night, T3rd-most in A.L...Leonys Martin has multiple hits in 5 of his last 9 games...Shawn Tolleson's team-high 8 saves are all since 5/20, tied A.L. lead in that span (also BAL's Zach Britton).

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER

#49 Yovani Gallardo, RHP (5-6, 3.54)

TONIGHT: The 29-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his 13th start of the season tonight in the middle game of this 3-game set in Oakland...is seeking his first single-season 3-game win streak since 2013, going to a 1.50 ERA (3 ER/18.0 IP) over his last 3 starts...did not factor into the decision for the first time this season in the Rangers' 2-1, 11-inning win over the White Sox on Thursday in Arlington...has allowed 3 ER-or-less in 10 of last 11 starts since the season opener in Oakland, a 3.34 ERA (24 ER/64.2 IP) in that span...is 3-1 with a 2.70 ERA (9 ER/30.0 IP) in his last 5 starts to drop season ERA from 4.19 to 3.54...opposing batters have a .235/.274/.330 line during that stretch...is slated to work on extended 5-days' rest for the 2nd straight start...T5th in A.L. w/ 6 losses, but is tied for team lead w/ 5 wins...2nd on staff w/ 49 SO...has allowed 6 unearned runs, 4th-most in the A.L....spent his entire pro career in the Brewers organization until he was acquired by the Rangers on Jan. 19, 2015 in a 4-player trade with MIL...currently ranks T4th among natives of Mexico in major league wins (94), tied with Teddy Higuera...acquired in 4-player trade with MIL on 1/19/15...was a mainstay of Brewers rotation over last 6 seasons as one of just 9 pitchers to work at least 180.0 innings and one of 10 hurlers to make 30+ starts each year from 2009-14...was a 2nd round selection by the Brewers in the 2004 1st Year Player Draft out of Trimble Tech High School in Fort Worth, TX...is still a Fort Worth resident...pronounced yoh-VAH-nee giy-YAHR-doh...currently ranks T4th among natives of Mexico in major league wins (94), tied with Teddy Higuera...last won 3 straight games in a single-season, 8/17-9/8/13.

BY THE NUMBERS: His team-high 6 losses are T5th-most in A.L. (Sabathia, Sanchez, Tillman, Kluber - 7)...tied for team lead w/ 5 wins (Martinez and Lewis) and ranks 2nd on staff w/ 49 SO...ranks 10th in A.L. with team-best 53.6% ground ball percentage...opponents hitting .130 (9-69) on 1st pitch of a PA, lowest in majors among pitchers with 40+ plate appearances against on 1st pitch...opponents have reached via error 7 times, T2nd-most in the A.L. behind tonight's Oakland starter Jesse Hahn (10).

LAST START: Did not factor into the decision for the first time this season in the Rangers' 2-1, 11-inning win over the White Sox on Thursday in Arlington (6.0 IP, 3 H, 1 R-0 ER, 2 BB, 4 SO, 0 HR, 106 pitches/61 strikes)...was staked to a 1-0 lead after the first inning...lone run scored in the 4th after Garcia reached on a throwing error by Joey Gallo in his first career fielding chance...Garcia would move to 3rd on a Ramirez single and score on Beckham's sacrifice fly...Sox were 0-for-3 with RISP...retired 9 of final 10 batters faced, with lone batter to reach in that stretch doing so via error...the game would remain tied until Shin-Soo Choo's walk-off single in the 11th.

VS. OAKLAND: Is 0-3, 6.48 (12 ER/16.2 IP) in 3 career starts vs. Oakland, including 0-2, 5.91 (7 ER/10.2 IP) in a pair of starts this season...took the loss on Opening Night in Oakland (4.0 IP, 6 H, 4 R-ER, 1 BB, 5 SO, 1 HR, 89 pitches/51 strikes)...surrendered a 2-run home run to Ben Zobrist in the first...in the 4th, permitted a RBI single by Marcus Semien and another run scored on a wild pitch...was relieved by Anthony Bass in the 5th after a leadoff single by Sam Fuld...started in a 7-1 Texas loss to Oakland on 5/3 in Arlington (6.2 IP, 7 H, 4 R-3 ER, 4 BB, 1 SO, 1 HR, 118 pitches/65 strikes)...held the A's scoreless over the first 4 innings before Oakland scored the first run of the game in the 5th on a 2-out, throwing error by Elvis Andrus...Oakland added another run on Vogt's leadoff home run in the 6th...exited the game trailing 2-0, but Alex Claudio allowed a pair of inherited runners to score and the A's added 3 more runs against the Texas pen...issued a season-high 4 walks...matched up with Sonny Gray in each of the first 2 starts and not receive a single run of support.

ON THE ROAD: Is 2-4, 4.60 (16 ER/31.1 IP) in 6 starts away from Arlington...defeated the Yankees in his last start on 5/24 at Yankee Stadium, ending a 3-game losing streak on the road...has a 3.95 ERA (12 ER/27.1 IP) in 5 starts since road opener on 4/6 at OAK...opponents have a .271/.309/.442 line on the road compared to .220/.287/.291 at home...has surrendered 5 of 7 home runs on the road.

GIMME SOME LOVIN': Has received season-high 5 runs of support 3 times this season, including in 2 of his last 5 starts (both wins), but has gotten 2-or-fewer runs of support in 8 of other 9...is 5-1 when receiving 2+ runs of support, as offense has provided 4 total runs of support with Gallardo on the mound in his 6 defeats...his team-low 3.28 run support average is 9th-lowest in the A.L.

BACK ME UP: Gallardo has been charged with 5 runs this season after leaving games, T3rd-most in AL and T6th in majors...only other AL starters charged with 5+ such runs are HOU's Roberto Hernandez (6) and TOR's Drew Hutchison (6)...has allowed 6 unearned runs this season, 4th-most in the A.L.

2015: Robinson Chirinos caught first 5 starts and 10 of 12 overall (3.54 ERA) and Carlos Corporan started 2 straight 5/3 and 5/8 (4.50 ERA)...first time through order: .242 (24-99); 2nd time: .227 (22-97); 3rd time: .271 (19-70); 4th time: .250 (1-4)...batters w/ 2 outs: .173 (13-75)...batters w/ RISP: .241 (14-58)...has allowed 9 runs in the first inning, more than any other frame...batters leading off

TOMORROW'S SCHEDULED STARTER — RHP CHI CHI GONZALEZ (2-0, 0.00 ERA in 2 games/start)

The 23-year-old right-hander is slated to make his 3rd major league start, his 2nd at Globe Life Park, in tomorrow's series finale at Oakland...became the 3rd pitcher in Rangers history to win starts in each of his 1st 2 major league outings (Glen Cook in 1985, Kevin Brown in 1986-88)...threw a 3-hit CG-SHO against the Royals on 6/5 in Kansas City, retiring 12 straight after a leadoff walk to Lorenzo Cain...his 14.2 scoreless innings to begin his ML career are the longest career-opening scoreless streak by any starting pitcher in Rangers history (previously Scott Chiamparino, 12.0 IP in 1990)...according to Elias Sports Bureau, he is 4th pitcher since 1969 to go 2-0 with 0 runs allowed and at least one shutout in first 2 career MLB starts...the outing was just the 7th shutout of 3-hits-or-less by a rookie in Rangers history, 3rd such SHO in the last 39 years (Derek Holland, 8/9/09 at LAA and Edwin Correa, 5/2/86 at NYY)...won his ML debut on Sat. vs. BOS, taking a no-hitter into the 6th inning (5.2 IP, 2 H, 0 R, 5 BB, 2 SO, 102 pitches/60 strikes)...held Boston hitless until David Ortiz's leadoff double in the 6th inning...it was the most no-hit innings to begin a career for a Texas starter since Roger Pavlik on 5/2/92 at Chicago-AL (5.1 IP)...prior to ML debut, went 3-5 with a 4.15 ERA (20 ER/43.1 IP) in 8 G/starts with Round Rock...the club's 2014 Nolan Ryan Minor League Pitcher of the Year has compiled a 3.16 ERA over three seasons in the Texas farm system...drafted in first round (23rd overall) out of Oral Roberts U. in Tulsa in 2013 June draft, where he finished 2nd in the nation with 126 strikeouts...went 9-5 with a 1.83 ERA (23 ER/113.1 IP) and 126 strikeouts against 27 walks in 15 starts as a junior for the Golden Eagles...won the Summit League Pitcher of the Year award as a freshman and was named a 2011 NCBWA Freshman All-American.

TEAM PITCHING: Have allowed just 8 R/7 ER in 46.0 IP last 5 G (1.37 ERA), dropping season ERA from 4.24 to 3.99, 12th in A.L. but 1st sub-4.00 figure for Rangers since 5/7 (3.97)...season-low was 3.96 on 4/14...staff has a 2.52 ERA (28 ER/100.0 IP) last 11 G, dropping season ERA from 4.33...had 2 SHO in span of 6 G (5/30 vs. BOS and Fri. at KC) after no SHO in 1st 49 G, last ML team without a SHO...season-best 21.0-inning scoreless streak, Thurs. vs. CWS (5th inn) thru Sat. at KC (5th inn)...did not allow an XBH for 26.0 consecutive innings before Alex Gordon's double in 5th Sat. at KC...**opponents are just 2-for-30 (.067) w/ RISP over last 5 G...**pitchers have 2 walkless games in '15, both in last 7 contests (6/2 vs. CWS, Sat. at KC)...club is 21-1 when allowing 2-R-or-less, 10-26 when permitting 3+ runs, winning 6 of last 9 such games...60 HR allowed are T2nd-most in A.L. (TOR-68).
