OAKLAND ATHLETICS (25-37) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (30-30)

FRIDAY, JUNE 12, 2015 – ANGEL STADIUM – 7:05 P.M. PDT RHP JESSE CHAVEZ (2-6, 2.51) VS. LHP HECTOR SANTIAGO (4-3, 2.55) CSNCA – A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Won two of three from Texas to start the week...have won three of their last four series after going 0-6-1 over their previous seven series...have won two straight, six of the last 10 and 11 of the last 18 contests...are 25-37 (.403) overall, which is the worst record in the American League and third worst in the majors...however, have out-scored the opposition 261-251 and their run differential of +10 is second best in the AL West, tied for fifth best in the AL and tied for ninth best in the majors... the A's record matches the third worst record after 62 games in Oakland history and is the worst since the 2005 club also started the year 25-37... are in fifth place in the AL West for the 35th consecutive day (beginning May 8) and trail first place Houston by 9½ games...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, seven days in fourth, one day tied for fourth and 35 days in fifth.

ONE-HITTERS: Scott Kazmir and Evan Scribner combined on a one-hit shutout yesterday, the A's third one-hitter of the season (April 6 vs. Texas, April 23 at Los Angeles-AL)...the other 29 teams have a combined seven games with one or fewer hits...the last time the A's had three one-hitters in a season was in 2002.

PITCHING: The A's defeated Texas yesterday, 7-0...it was their ninth shutout of the season, which is second most in the majors to San Francisco (10)...now have a 2.87 ERA (78 er in 245.0 ip) over the last 28 games after logging a 4.17 ERA over the first 34 contests...have a 3.59 ERA overall, which ranks third in the American League...have allowed just eight home runs over the last 18 games and 46 for the season, which is tied with Kansas City for the fewest in the AL...have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.356) and the fourth lowest opponents batting average (.242)

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 9-5 with a 2.05 ERA (26 er in 114.0 ip) over the last 18 games...have allowed one run or fewer 10 times over that stretch...have a 3.15 ERA (130 er in 371.1 ip) for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...have surrendered just six home runs over the last 18 games and have yielded 25 for the season, which is tied with Pittsburgh for the fewest in the majors...rank second in the majors with 371.1 innings pitched (NYM, 378.0).

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's have won two of the past three games when the opponent has started a left-handed pitcher...are 3-11 when the opponent starts a left-hander compared to 22-26 when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is the worst in the majors...are batting .225 (119-for-528) against lefties compared to .265 (430-for-1622) with 43 of their 52 home runs off righties...the mark against lefties is second lowest in the American League (Chicago, .209) and the mark against righties is second highest (Detroit, .274).

HOME AND AWAY: This series with the Angels is the A's fourth in a five-series stretch where they will play in five different cities...went 3-3 on a road trip to Detroit (3-0) and Boston (0-3), 2-1 on three-game homestand against Texas, and conclude the stretch with this five-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL (three games) and San Diego (two games)...have played 33 games on the road this year and 29 at home...the A's are 14-19 (.424) on the road and have not had a winning road trip since June 3-11, 2014 (5-4)...have finished with a .500 record or worse on each of their last 11 road trips, which matches the second longest such streak in Oakland history... it is the longest since the A's went an Oakland record 12 consecutive road trips without a winning record from Aug. 6, 1996-Aug. 31, 1997...are 11-18 (.379) at home, which is the second worst home record in the majors (Milwaukee, 10-20)...it matches the second worst record after 29 home games in Oakland history and is the worst since the 1994 club went 8-21.

OFFENSE: The A's batted .265 in April, .251 in May and are currently hitting .243 (74-for-304) in June...are hitting .255 overall, which ranks fourth in the American League...also rank second in the AL in triples (17) and stolen base percentage (36-for-43, 83.7%), third in walks (196) and fourth in runs (261) and fewest strikeouts (414)...have been shut out five times, which is tied for second most in the AL (Tampa Bay, 6)...are batting .264 (33-for-125) with runners in scoring position over the last 13 games after hitting .165 with RISP over the previous 20 contests.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed one error in the last five games but have 58 for the season, which is three more than any other team (Texas, 55)...the errors have led to 32 unearned runs, which is four more than any other team (Philadelphia and Washington, 28).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's recorded their first walk-off win of the season Wednesday night...it was also their first win in a game decided in the last at bat since an 8-6, 10-inning win over Philadelphia Sept. 21, 2014...it snapped an 11-game losing streak in those games dating back to last year...that was the longest such streak in Oakland history (previous: 10, May 14-July 17, 1989)...are now 1-10 in games decided in the last at bat...the losses are tied for third most in the majors and the wins are tied with Pittsburgh for the fewest...are 4-16 (.200) in one-run games, including 2-11 at home...have the worst record in one-run games in the majors and the most losses...are 7-25 (.219) in games decided by two runs or fewer, which is also the worst mark in the majors... are 0-6 in extra inning games and are one of two teams without an extra inning win (Pittsburgh)...are tied with Pittsburgh for the Major League lead in extra-inning losses and are tied with Chicago for the second most extra inning games in the American League (Seattle, 9)...have a six-game extra inning losing streak, which matches the longest such streak by an A's team over the last 20 years (May 18-July 5, 2011 and May 21-July 25, 1999).

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's have won six of their last nine day games after losing 13 of the first 14...are now 7-16 (.304) during the day compared to 18-21 (.462) at night...have the second worst record in day games in the American League (Los Angeles, 4-10)...are batting .246 (191-for-775) with 88 runs scored during the day (3.83 per game) compared to .260 (358-for-1375) with 173 runs at night (4.44 per game).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 5-4 in June after going 11-19 in May and 9-14 in April...now have four consecutive months with a losing record after recording 14 straight months with a winning record...the A's have used 18 relievers, which is already their most since 2012 when they also had 18... have used 22 pitchers overall, which matches the season total from last year...the A's have scored 40 runs in the seventh inning, which is their most in any inning, but have also allowed 40 runs in the seventh, which is their most in an inning.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have nine players on the disabled list (Crisp, Davis, Doolittle, Griffin, Ladendorf, Mujica, Parker, Thompson, Venditte)...Crisp, Griffin, Ladendorf, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...Griffin is on a rehab assignment...have had at least seven players on the DL all year...have used the DL a total of 16 times...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's trail in the season series, 3-4...are 1-2 in Oakland and 2-2 in Anaheim...have lost 11 of the last 15 games overall and nine of the last 12 in Anaheim...are 44-39 against the Angels over the last five seasons...including 36-6 when scoring four or more runs...have been held to one run or fewer in 21 of their last 31 losses, including 11 shutouts...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 409-335 against the Angels...that includes 212-158 in Oakland and 197-177 in Anaheim... all-time, the A's are 458-412 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Josh Reddick hit .389 over his first 20 games, .220 over a 24-game stretch from May 5 to 29, and is 15-for-39 (.385) over his last 11 contests...**Evan Scribner** has not walked a batter since May 1 at Texas and has a streak of 19 games, 19.1 innings and 80 batters faced without a walk

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1938 Bob Johnson has three home runs and a single and drives in all the A's runs in an 8-3 win over St. Louis in the first game of a double-header...in 1975 Billy Williams hits his 400th career home run in a 9-7 A's loss at Milwaukee...in 1990 Rickey Henderson steals third base against Texas, his 900th career steal...in that game, Dennis Eckersley walks his first batter of the season, snapping a string of 52.0 innings and 186 hitters without a walk...in 2009 Jack Hannahan commits his first error of the season, snapping a 72-game errorless streak dating back to August 10, 2008, which is an Oakland record for a third baseman.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Chavez (2-6, 2.51 ERA)

BRIEFLY: Is 2-6 with a 2.51 ERA in 13 games, including nine starts...has the sixth lowest ERA in the American League but is tied for fifth in losses and is tied for the lowest winning percentage...has received no run support in four of his nine starts and has received three runs or fewer in all nine starts...is averaging 1.55 (10 rs in 58.0 ip) runs of support in his nine starting assignments...his season RSA of 1.39 (10 rs in 64.2 ip) is the lowest mark in the majors (Kluber, CLE 2.45).

FIRST SEVEN, LAST SEVEN: Is 1-4 with a 2.95 ERA (13 er in 39.2 ip) and .268 (40-for-149) opponents batting average over his last seven starts. went 1-2 with a 1.80 ERA and .191 opponents batting average over his first seven games, including three starts.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 2-6 despite a 2.79 ERA (18 er in 58.0 ip) in his eight starting assignments...began the season in the bullpen and did not allow a run in his four relief appearances (6.2 ip)...his first start came April 23 when Jesse Hahn missed a start due to a blister...remained in the rotation following the option of Kendall Graveman to Nashville April 26...is now 10-14 with a 3.56 ERA (76 er in 192.1 ip) in 32 career starts, 9-15 with a 5.02 ERA in 204 relief appearances.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Ranks fifth in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.315) and ninth in on-base percentage (.288)...has allowed just three home runs in 64.2 innings and his average of 0.42 home runs per nine innings is fifth lowest in the AL...his .239 opponents batting average includes a .205 (24-for-117) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .273 (33-for-121) against lefties...has yielded nine of his 12 extra base hits to lefties (seven doubles, two home runs) and has a .248 opponents slugging percentage against righties...has issued 13 of his 16 walks to right-handed hitters...has walked just three batters leading off an innina.

INNING BY INNING: Has yielded 15 of his 21 runs in the third through fifth innings for a 4.67 ERA (14 er in 27.0 ip)...has a 1.00 ERA (2 er in 18.0 ip) over the first two innings and a 0.92 ERA (2 er in 19.2 ip) from the sixth

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-2 with a 1.86 ERA (6 er in 29.0 ip) in six games at home compared to 1-4 with a 3.03 ERA (12 er in 35.2 ip) in seven games on the road...has the sixth lowest home ERA in the American League... has surrendered all three of his home runs on the road.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 2-4 with a 1.71 ERA (8 er in 42.0 ip) in six starts on four days rest compared to 0-2 with a 5.63 ERA (10 er in 16.0 ip) in three starts on five days rest or more.

MONTH BY MONTH: Allowed four runs in 5.0 innings for the loss in his first start in June...went 2-3 with a 1.93 ERA in six starts in May...tied for sixth in the American League in losses in May but had the fourth lowest ERA...went 0-2 with a 2.55 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in six games, including two starts, this April...is 2-2 with a 2.10 ERA in 12 games, eight starts, in April over the last two years...has a 2.68 career ERA in April, which is his best for any month of the season

IN RELIEF: Stranded his only inherited runner in his four relief appearances and first batters faced were 1-for-4 (.250)...recorded the save in his final relief appearance April 18 at Kansas City, tossing 3.2 scoreless innings...has two career saves, both at Kansas City and both at least 3.2 innings...struck out six, which matched the most by an A's pitcher in a game in which he recorded the save...the only other time it happened since the save became an official stat in 1969 was by Rollie Fingers on Sept. 1, 1972 against Detroit.

2015 START-BY-START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-0 loss at Los Angeles (AL) April 23...tossed six innings and allowed just one hit... the hit was a two-run home run by Calhoun in the third inning and it scored Butera, who reached on an error...it was the Angels only hit of the game... Tropeano, Salas, Smith and Street combined to shutout the A's on eight hits...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 6-5 loss to Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland April 30...allowed a run in the third inning on Giavotella RBI single and three more in the fifth on a two-run single by Calhoun and a Freese RBI fielders choice...left after five innings trailing 4-0...was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 win at Minnesota May 5...it was his first win since July 23, 2014...the A's scored a run in the first inning and one more in the sixth and he shutout the Twins on three hits and a walk over the first seven innings...allowed his only run in the eighth inning on a Dozier RBI single...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-3 loss at Seattle *May 10*...did not allow a hit until Cruz singled with one out in the fourth...had a 1-0 lead at the time but Seager followed with a RBI double and Ackley added a tworun double one out later...also allowed a sacrifice fly to Cano in the fifth... had a no decision in the A's 4-3 loss to Chicago (AL) May 16 in Oakland... had a 2-0 lead when he allowed his only runs in the third inning on a tworun single by Garcia...retired the side in order just one (fourth inning)...left after six innings with the scored tied 2-2...was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-0 loss at Tampa Bay *May 21*...DeJesus had a RBI double in the fourth and a solo home run in the seventh...allowed a Guyer single following the DeJesus homer and was relieved by Mujica, who allowed Guyer to score... Colome and four Rays relievers combined to shutout the A's on six hits and two walks...was the losing pitcher in the A's 1-0 loss to Detroit May 26 in Oakland...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings and allowed just five hits...the only run came in the first inning and it was unearned...Gose led off with a single, stole second and went to third on a Phegley error on the steal...Davis followed with a sacrifice fly and that would be the only run of the game...retired 12 straight at one point...Price and three relievers combined to shutout the A's on seven hits...combined with Clippard on an eight-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win over New York in Oakland on May 31... tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings for the second consecutive start and allowed seven of the hits...also tossed a career-high 110 pitches...the A's scored two runs in the sixth and one more in the eighth...Clippard tossed a scoreless ninth to record the save.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss at Boston last Saturday...allowed a career-high tying 10 hits in 5.0 innings...surrendered a two-run home run to Ramirez in the first inning to snap his scoreless streak at a career-high 15.0 innings...the A's scored a run in the third to cut the lead in half. but he allowed two runs in the bottom of the third on an Ortiz RBI double and a Napoli RBI single.

RHP Kendall Graveman (3-2, 4.83 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville May 23 for his second stint with the A's this year and is 2-0 with a 2.55 ERA in four starts since his return...was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 1-2 with an 8.27 ERA in four starts before he was optioned to Nashville April 26...went 2-1 with a 1.85 ERA in four starts with the Sounds...is 3-0 with a 1.98 ERA and .243 opponents batting average in five starts on the road compared to 0-2 with a 10.54 ERA and .377 opponents average in three starts at home...is 1-2 with an 8.27 ERA in four starts against American League West competition compared to 3-0 with a 2.55 ERA in four starts against everyone else...had a no decision in his last start, a 7-4 A's loss at Boston last Sunday (7.0 ip, 6 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 6 so)...

had a no decision in his only career start against Los Angeles, a 6-3 A's win at Anaheim earlier this year on April 20 (3.0 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 2 so).
