OAKLAND ATHLETICS (25-38) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (31-30)

SATURDAY, JUNE 13, 2015 – ANGEL STADIUM – 7:05 P.M. PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost five of the last seven games after winning six of the previous seven contests...are 25-38 (.397) overall, which is the worst record in the American League and third worst in the majors...however, have out-scored the opposition 265-256 and their run differential of +9 is second best in the AL West, seventh best in the AL and 11th best in the majors...the A's record matches the third worst record after 63 games in Oakland history and is the worst since the 1994 club started the year 20-43...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 36th consecutive day (beginning May 8) and trail first place Houston by 10½ games...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, seven days in fourth, one day tied for fourth and 36 days in fifth...have won three of their last four series after going 0-6-1 over their previous seven series.

CLOSE CALLS: Last night, the A's lost for the fifth time this year when leading after seven innings, which is the most in the American League and tied for second most in the majors...fell to 4-17 (.190) in one-run games with the loss last night, which is the worst record in the majors...are 7-26 (.212) in games decided by two runs or fewer, which is also the worst mark in the majors...fell to 1-11 in games decided in the last at bat last night...the wins are the fewest in the majors and the losses are tied for second most...recorded their first walk-off win of the season Wednesday night against Texas...it was also their first win in a game decided in the last at bat since an 8-6, 10-inning win over Philadelphia Sept. 21, 2014...it snapped an 11-game losing streak in those games dating back to last year...that was the longest such streak in Oakland history (previous: 10, May 14-July 17, 1989)...are 0-6 in extra inning games and are the only team without an extra inning win...are tied with Pittsburgh for the Major League lead in extra inning losses and are tied for second in the AL in extra inning games...have not won an extra inning game since the Sept. 21, 2014 win over Philadelphia...have a six-game extra inning losing streak, which matches the longest such streak by an A's team over the last 20 years (May 18-July 5, 2011 and May 21-July 25, 1999).

NIGHT AND DAY: Beginning tonight, the A's will alternate night games and day games for the next eight days (through June 20)...are 18-22 (.450) in night games compared to 7-16 (.304) during the day...have won six of their last nine day games after losing 13 of the first 14...have the second worst record in day games in the American League (Los Angeles, 4-10)...are batting .261 (368-for-1412) with 177 runs at night (4.43 per game) compared to .246 (191-for-775) with 88 runs scored during the day (3.83 per game).

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's have won two of the past four games when the opponent has started a left-handed pitcher...are 3-12 when the opponent starts a left-hander compared to 22-26 when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is the worst in the majors...are batting .227 (126-for-555) against lefties compared to .265 (433-for-1632) with 44 of their 55 home runs off righties...the mark against lefties is second lowest in the American League (Chicago, .211) and the mark against righties is second highest (Detroit, .274).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 9-5 with a 2.16 ERA (29 er in 121.0 ip) over the last 19 games...have allowed one run or fewer 10 times over that stretch...have a 3.164 ERA (133 er in 378.1 ip) for the season, which is second lowest in the American League (Tampa Bay, 3.163)...have surrendered just six home runs over the last 19 games and have yielded 25 for the season, which is tied with Pittsburgh for the fewest in the majors...rank second in the AL with 378.1 innings pitched.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 2.95 ERA (83 er in 253.0 ip) over the last 29 games after logging a 4.17 ERA over the first 34 contests...have a 3.62 ERA overall, which ranks fourth in the American League...tossed their ninth shutout of the season Thursday which is second most in the majors to San Francisco (10)...have allowed just 10 home runs over the last 19 games and 48 for the season, which is second fewest in the AL...have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.359).

OFFENSE: The A's batted .265 in April, .251 in May and are currently hitting .246 (84-for-341) in June...rank second in the American League in triples (17) and stolen base percentage (38-for-45, 84.4%) and fourth in

runs (265), walks (198) and fewest strikeouts (423)...have been shut out five times, which is tied for second most in the AL (Tampa Bay, 6).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed two errors in the last six games but have a Major League leading 59 for the season (Texas, 55)...the errors have led to 32 unearned runs, which is also the most in the majors (Philadelphia and Washington, 28).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's have lost each of their last four road games, which is one short of the longest road losing streak of the season (5, May 6-10)...this series with the Angels is the A's fourth in a five-series stretch where they will play in five different cities...went 3-3 on a road trip to Detroit (3-0) and Boston (0-3), 2-1 on three-game homestand against Texas, and are 0-1 on this five-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL (0-1) and San Diego (two games)...have played 34 games on the road this year and 29 at home...the A's are 14-20 (.412) on the road and have not had a winning road trip since June 3-11, 2014 (5-4)...have finished with a .500 record or worse on each of their last 11 road trips, which matches the second longest such streak in Oakland history...it is the longest since the A's went an Oakland record 12 consecutive road trips without a winning record from Aug. 6, 1996-Aug. 31, 1997...are 11-18 (.379) at home, which is the second worst home record in the majors (Milwaukee, 11-20)...it matches the second worst record after 29 home games in Oakland history and is the worst since the 1994 club went 8-21.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 5-5 in June after going 11-19 in May and 9-14 in April...have four consecutive months with a losing record after recording 14 straight months with a winning record...the A's have used 18 relievers, which is already their most since 2012 when they also had 18...have used 22 pitchers overall, which matches the season total from last year...the A's have scored 42 runs in the seventh inning, which is their most in any inning, but have also allowed 40 runs in the seventh, which is their most in an inning.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have nine players on the disabled list (Crisp, Davis, Doolittle, Griffin, Ladendorf, Mujica, Parker, Thompson, Venditte)...Crisp, Griffin, Ladendorf, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...Davis and Griffin are on rehab assignments...have had at least seven players on the DL all year...have used the DL a total of 16 times...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's trail in the season series, 3-5...are 1-2 in Oakland and 2-3 in Anaheim...have lost 12 of the last 16 games overall and 10 of the last 13 in Anaheim...are 44-40 against the Angels over the last five seasons...including 36-7 when scoring four or more runs...have been held to one run or fewer in 21 of their last 32 losses, including 11 shutouts...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 409-336 against the Angels...that includes 212-158 in Oakland and 197-178 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 458-413 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Burns has hit safely in 15 of his last 16 games (23-for-69, .333)...leads AL rookies in hits (48) and multiple hit games (15)...**Mark Canha** is batting .400 (10-for-25) with two doubles, two home runs and five RBI in seven games in June...**Brett Lawrie** is batting .328 (39-for-119) on the road, which ranks sixth in the AL...**Josh Reddick** leads the majors in two-out RBI (26)...is batting .365 (16-for-44) with three home runs and eight RBI over his last 12 games...**Stephen Vogt** leads Major League catchers in home runs (11) and slugging percentage (.581).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1931** George Earnshaw goes 4 for 5 with a home run and three RBI and tosses a complete game five-hitter in the A's 14-1 win over St. Louis in the second game of a doubleheader...in **1968** Jim Nash, Paul Lindblad and Ed Sprague combine to shutout the Cleveland Indians 1-0 in 11 innings...it is the A's third straight shutout...in **1992** Carney Lansford homers off Texas pitcher Bobby Witt for the 2000th hit of his major league career.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (3-2, 4.83 ERA)

FOR OPENERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville May 23 for his second stint with the A's this year and is 2-0 with a 2.55 ERA (7 er in 24.2 ip) in four starts since his return...was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 1-2 with an 8.27 ERA in four starts before he was optioned to Nashville April 26...went 2-1 with a 1.85 ERA in four starts with the Sounds...was acquired from Toronto Nov., 28, 2014 with pitcher Sean Nolin, infielder Brett Lawrie and minor league infielder Franklin Barreto for Josh Donaldson...made his Major League debut with the Blue Jays last year in just his second professional season and compiled a 3.86 ERA in five relief appearances.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-0 with a 1.98 ERA (6 er in 27.1 ip) and .243 (25-for-103) opponents batting average in five starts on the road compared to 0-2 with a 10.54 ERA (16 er in 13.2 ip) and .377 (23-for-61) opponents average in three starts at home.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .250 (23-for-92) opponents batting average with the bases empty compared to .347 (25-for-72) with runners on base...however, opponents are batting .238 (10-for-42) with runners in scoring position...has surrendered four of his five home runs in Oakland and four during the day

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 1-2 with an 8.27 ERA (15 er in 16.1 ip) in four starts against American League West competition compared to 3-0 with a 2.55 ERA (7 er in 24.2 ip) in four starts against everyone else.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-1 loss to Texas April 9 in Oakland, his first Major League start...allowed three runs in the first, a two-run home run to Moreland in the third and a three-run home run to Choo in the fourth...the two home runs were the first of his career...surrendered just five home runs in 207.0 minor league innings...yielded eight runs in 3.1 innings to become the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to allow eight or more runs in his A's debut (last: Clayton Mortensen, 8 on Aug. 8, 2009 at Kansas City).

SECOND START: He combined with O'Flaherty, Otero, Abad and Clippard on an eight-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win at Houston April 14...it was his first Major League win...tossed 5.1 innings and allowed four of the hits...allowed four runners into scoring position and retired the side in order just once (fifth inning).

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-3 win at Los Angeles April 20...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed two in the bottom of the first on a two-run single by Freese...the A's then scored three runs in the third to take a 4-2 lead but he allowed a Pujols RBI single in the bottom of the third...had a 5-3 lead when he walked the first two batters in the fourth inning...was relieved by Otero who stranded both runners and tossed 4.0 scoreless innings for the win.

FOURTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-3 loss to Houston on April 25 in Oakland...allowed a RBI double to Lowrie in the first inning and a three-run home run to Altuve in the third...also yielded a RBI single to Lowrie in the fifth and was relieved by Bassitt with runners on first and third and two outs in the sixth...Bassitt allowed one of the runners to score on a wild pitch.

FIFTH START: He combined with Scribner and Clippard on a six-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win at Tampa Bay last Saturday...tossed six innings and allowed three of the hits...struck out a career-high six...retired 12 of the first 13 batters he faced...allowed only two runners to advance into scoring position.

SIXTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win over New York (AL) May 28 in Oakland...allowed a solo home run to McCann in the second inning, a RBI single to McCann in the fourth and a sacrifice fly to Rodriguez in the fifth...was relieved by Abad with two outs in the sixth inning and the A's trailing 3-1...Oakland scored twice in the bottom of the sixth to get him off the hook and twice in the seventh for the win.

SEVENTH START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-3 win at Detroit June 2...allowed three runs, all in the fourth inning...one run scored on a wild pitch and he allowed a two-run single to Castellanos...the A's scored five runs in the seventh to take the lead...Scribner tossed a scoreless seventh and eighth and Clippard a scoreless ninth to earn him the win.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-4 loss at Boston last Sunday...tossed a career-high 7.0 innings and a career-high 101 pitches while striking out a career-high tying six...shutout the Red Sox on five hits and two walks over the first seven innings...had a 4-0 lead and had retired 13 straight before Castillo led off the eighth inning with a home run...the bullpen allowed six more runs in the eighth inning with Clippard getting the blown save and loss.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 3-1 with a 0.36 ERA in six spring training starts...had the lowest ERA in the majors and the lowest ERA by a Cactus League qualifier since at least 2006...allowed just one earned run all spring...tied for second in the Cactus League in wins and tied for fifth in innings pitched (25.1)...held the opposition to a .141 (12-for-85) batting average...surrendered just one home run in 25.1 innings...did not allow an earned run over his final 20.1 spring innings...it was his first Major League Spring Training.

2014 RECAP: Was named a *Baseball America* Minor League Baseball First Team All-Star after combining for a 14-6 record and a 1.83 ERA in 27 starts with Single-A Lansing, Single-A Dunedin, Double-A New Hampshire and Triple-A Buffalo...then made his Major League debut with Toronto in September in just his second professional season...was recalled from Triple-A Buffalo Sept. 2 and had no decisions and a 3.86 ERA in five relief appearances...allowed a .222 batting average and did not walk a batter in 4.2 innings...yielded a .200 (2-for-10) average against right-handed hitters, .250 (2-for-8) against lefthanders...stranded his only inherited runner but first batters faced were 2-for-5 (.400)...was named the A's sixth best prospect by *Baseball America* following the trade.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Sonny Gray (7-3, 1.74 ERA): Leads the American League and ranks second in the majors with a 1.74 ERA...is one of six starting pitchers in Oakland history to have an ERA as low as 1.74 after May 31...is 2-1 with a 0.69 ERA in four starts during the day compared to 5-2 with a 2.18 ERA in nine starts at night...has the lowest day ERA in the majors...is scheduled to start on four days rest tomorrow...is 5-1 with a 0.98 ERA in eight starts on four days rest compared to 2-2 with a 3.00 ERA in five starts on five days rest or more...has the lowest ERA on four days rest in the majors...has a 2.77 ERA in innings one through three and a 0.92 ERA from the fourth inning on...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 2-1 A's loss to Texas last Tuesday in Oakland (6.0 ip, 8 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 6 so)...is 4-1 with a 2.42 ERA in eight career appearances, including seven starts, against Los Angeles...is 2-0 with a 1.80 ERA in two starts this year.

- The A's bullpen was charged with its 15th loss of the season last night, which is tied with Arizona and Seattle for the most in the majors.
- Was also tagged with its 10th blown save, which is tied with Texas and Toronto for the most in the American League...has just 10 saves, which is second fewest in the AL, and the save percentage of 50.0 is second lowest in the AL.
- Has a 4.58 ERA, which is the highest in the AL and third highest in the majors...have allowed the fourth most home runs in the AL (23).
- Is 1-2 with a save, two blown saves and a 5.66 ERA (13 er in 20.2 ip) over the last nine games.
- Has allowed 35-of-103 (34.0%) inherited runners to score, which is the fourth highest percentage in the AL.
- Has allowed the most first batter RBI in the majors (30) and are tied for the second most home runs (8).
- The A's are 3-26 when the bullpen allows two runs or more, 21-12 when it allows one run or fewer (one complete game).
