### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (25-39) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (32-30)

SUNDAY, JUNE 14, 2015 – ANGEL STADIUM – 12:35 P.M. PDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have lost six of the last eight games after winning six of the previous seven contests...are 25-39 (.391) overall, which is the worst record in the American League and third worst in the majors...however, have out-scored the opposition 265-257 and their run differential of +8 is eighth best in the AL and 12th best in the majors...the A's record is third worst after 64 games in Oakland history behind the 1979 (19-45) and 1994 (21-43) clubs...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 37th consecutive day (beginning May 8) and trail first place Houston by 10½ games...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, seven days in fourth, one day tied for fourth and 37 days in fifth.

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's suffered their second 1-0 loss of the season last night (May 26 vs. Detroit)...each of the A's last three losses have been by one run and eight of the last nine have been by two runs or fewer...are 4-18 (.182) in one-run games and 7-27 (.206) in games decided by two runs or fewer, both of which are the worst records in the majors...are 1-11 in games decided in the last at bat...the wins are the fewest in the majors and the losses are tied for second most...recorded their first walk-off win of the season Wednesday night against Texas...it was also their first win in a game decided in the last at bat since an 8-6, 10-inning win over Philadelphia Sept. 21, 2014...it snapped an 11-game losing streak in those games dating back to last year...that was the longest such streak in Oakland history (previous: 10, May 14-July 17, 1989)...are 0-6 in extra inning games and are the only team without an extra inning win...are tied with Pittsburgh for the Major League lead in extra inning losses and are tied for second in the AL in extra inning games...have not won an extra inning game since the Sept. 21, 2014 win over Philadelphia...have a six-game extra inning losing streak, which matches the longest such streak by an A's team over the last 20 years (May 18-July 5, 2011 and May 21-July 25, 1999).

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Yesterday began an eight-day stretch (June 13-20) where the A's will alternate night games and day games every day...are 18-23 (.439) in night games compared to 7-16 (.304) during the day...have won six of their last nine day games after losing 13 of the first 14...have the second worst record in day games in the American League (Los Angeles, 4-10)...are batting .257 (370-for-1440) with 177 runs at night (4.32 per game) compared to .246 (191-for-775) with 88 runs scored during the day (3.83 per game).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have tossed at least seven innings in each of the last three games and are 1-1 with a 1.57 ERA (4 er in 23.0 ip)...are 9-6 with a 2.09 ERA (30 er in 129.0 ip) over the last 20 games and have allowed one run or fewer 11 times over that stretch...have a 3.12 ERA (134 er in 386.1 ip) for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...have surrendered just seven home runs over the last 20 games and have yielded 26 for the season, which is second fewest in the majors to Pittsburgh (25)...lead the AL and rank second in the majors with 386.1 innings pitched (Mets, 391.0).

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 2.90 ERA (84 er in 261.0 ip) over the last 30 games after logging a 4.17 ERA over the first 34 contests...have a 3.58 ERA overall, which ranks third in the American League...tossed their ninth shutout of the season Thursday which is second most in the majors to San Francisco (10)...have allowed 11 home runs over the last 20 games and 49 for the season, which is second fewest in the AL (Kansas City, 47)...have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.359).

**OFFENSE:** The A's were shutout for the sixth time this year last night, which ties Tampa Bay for the most in the American League...were held to a season-low two hits last night and are now batting .233 (86-for-369) in June...hit .265 in April and .251 in May...rank second in the AL in triples (17) and stolen base percentage (38-for-45, 84.4%), third in walks (202) and fourth in runs (265) and fewest strikeouts (433).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed two errors in the last seven games but have a Major League leading 59 for the season (Texas, 55)...the errors have led to 32 unearned runs, which is also the most in the majors (Milwaukee, Philadelphia and Washington, 28).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 0-2 on this five-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL (0-2) and San Diego (two games)...with one more loss, will post their 12th consecutive road trip with a .500 record or worse, which would match the longest such streak in Oakland history (Aug. 6, 1996-Aug.

31, 1997)...have not had a winning road trip since June 3-11, 2014 (5-4)...have lost each of their last five road games, which matches the longest road losing streak of the season (May 6-10)...have not lost more than five straight road games since a six-game streak from June 26-July 19, 2011...this series with the Angels is the A's fourth in a five-series stretch where they will play in five different cities...went 3-3 on a road trip to Detroit (3-0) and Boston (0-3) and 2-1 on three-game homestand against Texas to start the stretch...have played 35 games on the road this year and 29 at home...are 14-21 (.400) on the road compared to 11-18 (.379) at home...have the second worst home record in the majors (Milwaukee, 11-21)...the home record matches the second worst record after 29 home games in Oakland history and is the worst since the 1994 club went 8-21.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are 5-6 in June after going 11-19 in May and 9-14 in April...have four consecutive months with a losing record after recording 14 straight months with a winning record...have used 18 relievers, which is already their most since 2012 when they also had 18...have used 22 pitchers overall, which matches the season total from last year...the A's have scored 42 runs in the seventh inning, which is their most in any inning, but have also allowed 40 runs in the seventh, which is their most in an inning.

**LEFT AND RIGHT:** The A's are 3-13 (.188) when the opponent starts a left-hander pitcher compared to 22-26 (.458) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is the worst in the majors...are batting .222 (128-for-577) against lefties compared to .264 (433-for-1638) with 44 of their 55 home runs off righties...the mark against lefties is second lowest in the American League (Chicago, .211) and the mark against righties is second highest (Detroit, .275).

**INTERLEAGUE IS NEXT:** The A's begin interleague play tomorrow with a two-game series at San Diego before returning home to face the Padres in a two-game series on Wednesday and Thursday...the A's are the only team that has yet to play an interleague game...went 13-7 against the National League last year and have the fifth best all-time interleague record with a mark of 180-144 (.556).

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have eight players on the disabled list (Crisp, Davis, Doolittle, Ladendorf, Mujica, Parker, Thompson, Venditte)...Crisp, Doolittle, Ladendorf, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...Davis is on a rehab assignment...have had at least seven players on the DL all year...have used the DL a total of 16 times...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

**A's vs. ANGELS:** The A's trail in the season series, 3-6...are 1-2 in Oakland and 2-4 in Anaheim...have lost 13 of the last 17 games overall and 11 of the last 14 in Anaheim...are 44-41 against the Angels over the last five seasons...including 36-7 when scoring four or more runs...have been held to one run or fewer in 22 of their last 33 losses, including 12 shutouts...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 409-337 against the Angels...that includes 212-158 in Oakland and 197-179 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 458-414 against the Angels.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Billy Burns** has hit safely in 16 of his last 17 games (24-for-73, .329)...leads AL rookies in hits (49) and multiple hit games (15)...**Mark Canha** is batting .345 (10-for-29) with two doubles, two home runs and five RBI in eight games in June...**Brett Lawrie** is batting .322 (39-for-121) on the road, which ranks seventh in the AL...**Josh Reddick** is tied for the ML lead in two-out RBI (26)...is batting .356 (16-for-45) with three home runs and eight RBI over his last 13 games...**Stephen Vogt** leads Major League catchers in home runs (11) and slugging percentage (.581).

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1964** Jim Gentile drives in four runs, including the game winning home run in the top of the 10<sup>th</sup> inning in a 6-5 win at Cleveland...in **1969** the A's defeat the Boston Red Sox 21-7, setting what was then a club record for most runs in a game...Oakland scores five times in the fifth, seventh and eighth innings...Reggie Jackson is 5 for 6 with two doubles, two homers and a club record 10 RBI...in **1975** Campy Campaneris steals his 500th career base in the A's 3-2 loss at Detroit.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (7-3, 1.74 ERA)

**EARNED RUN AVERAGE:** Leads the American League and ranks second in the majors with a 1.74 ERA (Cole, PIT 1.71)...the only qualifying pitchers in Oakland history to have an ERA as low as 1.74 after May 31 are Jim Nash in 1968 (1.71 as late as July 3), Blue Moon Odom in 1968 (1.72 as late as June 12), Vida Blue in 1971 (1.71 as late as Sept. 3), Ken Holtzman in 1973 (1.66 as late as June 13) and Dan Haren in 2007 (1.64 at late as June 15)...has allowed one earned run or fewer in eight of his 13 starts.

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Ranks second in the American League in opponents batting average (.196) and slugging percentage (.259), third in opponents on-base percentage (.253), tied for third in wins (7), fifth in innings pitched (88.0) and ninth in strikeouts (79)...is also tied for fifth in wild pitched (7), ranks fourth in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.41), fifth in fewest pitches per innings (14.7) and 10th in run support (5.73).

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is 2-1 with a 0.69 ERA (2 er in 26.0 ip) in four starts during the day compared to 5-2 with a 2.18 ERA (15 er in 62.0 ip) in nine starts at night...has the lowest day ERA in the majors.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 5-1 with a 0.98 ERA (6 er in 55.0 ip) in eight starts on four days rest compared to 2-2 with a 3.00 ERA (11 er in 33.0 ip) in five starts on five days rest or more...has the lowest ERA on four days rest in the majors.

**MONTH BY MONTH:** Is 1-1 with a 1.29 ERA (2 er in 14.0 ip) in two starts in June after going 3-2 with a 1.67 ERA in six starts in May...ranked third in the American League in May ERA and was sixth in strikeouts (41)...his 41 strikeouts tied for third most in Oakland history in May and fell three short of the record of 44 (Chuck Dobson in 1968, Vida Blue in 1971)...it was his first month with 40 or more strikeouts...was 3-0 with a 1.98 ERA in five starts in April...tied for third in the AL in April wins and ranked ninth in ERA...has now finished a month with an ERA under 2.00 three times in his career (also 1.03 in July, 2014).

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 3-2 with a 1.62 ERA (8 er in 44.1 ip) and .181 (28-for-155) opponents batting average in six starts at home compared to 4-1 with a 1.85 ERA (9 er in 43.2 ip) and .211 (34-for-161) opponents average in six starts on the road...has the third lowest home ERA in the American League and the sixth lowest road ERA...has walked six batters in 44.1 innings at home compared to 16 in 43.2 innings on the road.

**INNING BY INNING:** Has allowed 12 of his 18 runs over the first three innings of a game...has a 2.77 ERA (12 er in 39.0 ip) in innings one through three and a 0.92 ERA (5 er in 49.0 ip) from the fourth inning on...has a 3.32 career ERA (62 er in 168.0 ip) in innings 1-3, 2.17 (49 er in 203.0 ip) from the fourth inning on.

**AGAINST THE WEST:** Is 4-2 with a 1.67 ERA (10 er in 54.0 ip) in eight starts against American League West competition compared to 3-1 with a 1.85 ERA (7 er in 34.0 ip) in four starts against everyone else...is now 16-7 with a 2.14 ERA (48 er in 202.1 ip) in 30 career appearances against AL West teams compared to 10-9 with a 3.36 ERA (63 er in 168.2 ip) in 28 games against everyone else.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has held the opposition to a .155 (17-for-110) batting average with runners on base, which is the lowest in the majors among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title...10 of the 11 extra base hits he has allowed have come with the bases empty...has surrendered three of his four home runs to left-handed hitters...has yielded a .385 (15-for-39) opponents batting average to the opponents clean-up hitter compared to .170 (47-for-277) against all other spots in the order.

**THIS AND THAT:** Leads American League pitchers in putouts (18), ranks second in total chances (31) and tied for fourth in assists (13)...has tossed at least seven innings in seven of his 13 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 11 times and walked two batters or fewer 11 times...the A's are 7-6 (.538) in his starting assignments and are 31-25 (.554) in his career.

**2015 HIGHLIGHTS:** Combined with Evan Scribner on a one-hit shutout in the A's 8-0 win over Texas on Opening Day **April 6**...became the first A's pitcher to start consecutive openers since Barry Zito in 2005 and 2006...tossed 8.0 shutout innings and allowed just one hit to become the first pitcher to toss eight or more innings and allow one hit or fewer in an opener since Bob Lemon one-hit the White Sox for Cleveland in 1953...allowed a lead off home run to Ackley in the third inning **April 11** against Seattle...that snapped his season-opening scoreless streak at 10.0 innings and it snapped an overall scoreless streak of 20.0 innings dating back to Sept. 23, 2014, which is a new career high...had a 2-1 lead when he was relieved with one out and a runner on first in eighth inning...the bullpen allowed that run to score plus two more for the blown save (Otero)...it was the first of two times the bullpen blew a save in a start of his (May 8 at Seattle)...allowed a career-high 11 hits in 6.0 innings in a 6-4 loss at Kansas City

**April 17**...had a streak of five consecutive games with a wild pitch from April 22 to May 13, which is the longest such streak in Oakland history...it was the longest by an A's pitcher since Stu Flythe also had a five-game streak from July 1 to 31, 1936...struck out 10 while walking a career-high seven batters in 6.2 shutout innings in a 7-1 win at Texas **May 3**...it began a streak of three consecutive starts with nine or more strikeouts through May 13...that matched the longest such streak by an A's pitcher over the last 44 years...made his 50th career start **May 8** at Seattle and had a no decision in a 4-3, 11-inning loss...was charged with his first loss **May 13** against Boston after starting the season 4-0 for the first time in his career...it snapped a five-game winning streak dating back to Sept. 28, 2014...posted a 1.40 ERA and .194 opponents batting average during that streak, which spanned eight starts.

**LAST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss to Texas last Tuesday in Oakland...allowed a RBI single to Fielder in the third inning and a lead off home run to Moreland in the sixth...those were the only two runs he would allow in six innings of work...Martinez shutout the A's on one hit over the first six innings and the A's scored their lone run off the bullpen in the eighth inning.

the first win came in a 9-2 win at Anaheim April 22...the A's scored a run in the first and after he retired the side in order in the bottom of the first, he allowed a run to score in the second when Freese doubled, went to third on a wild pitch and scored on an Aybar ground out...loaded the bases with one out in the third inning but then retired each of the final 14 batters he faced...the A's scored five times in the seventh and three times in the eighth for the win...also picked up the win in a 6-2 victory in Oakland April 28...allowed two runs in the first inning on a two-run single by Freese...the A's came back with five runs in the bottom of the first and he blanked the Angels on four hits over his final seven innings...retired 18 of the final 19 batters he faced, including 13 straight at one point.

## TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**RHP Jesse Hahn (3-5, 3.84 ERA):** Went 1-1 with a 2.12 ERA and .213 opponents batting average over his first three starts, 0-2 with a 7.63 ERA and .324 opponents average over a three-start stretch from April 29 to May 9, and is 2-2 with a 3.08 ERA and .228 opponents average over his last six starts...opponents have reached base on an error a Major League leading 11 times, which matches the most by an A's pitcher over the last 11 years...has eight unearned runs, which is the most in the American League...is 2-for-22 (.091) with a run, RBI, two sacrifice hits and 12 strikeouts as a hitter, all last year with San Diego...had a no decision in his last start, a 5-4 A's win over Texas last Wednesday in Oakland (3.2 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb)...has never faced San Diego in his career...made his Major League debut with the Padres last year and went 7-4 with a 3.07 ERA in 14 games, 12 starts...was 3-2 with a 2.95 ERA in seven games, six starts, at Petco Park.

## TEAM

5-15, 4.58 ERA (91 er in 178.2 ip)  
**Saves/Opportunities:** 10-for-20 (50.0%)

- The A's bullpen was charged with its 15th loss of the season Friday night, which is tied with Arizona and Seattle for the most in the majors.
- Was also tagged with its 10th blown save, which is tied with Texas and Toronto for the most in the American League...has just 10 saves, which is second fewest in the AL (Toronto, 8), and the save percentage of 50.0 is second lowest in the AL (Toronto, 44.4%).
