### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (26-39) VS. SAN DIEGO PADRES (32-33)

MONDAY, JUNE 15, 2015 – PETCO PARK – 7:05 P.M. PDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Are 3-2 over the last five games, 3-6 over the last nine contests and 12-9 over the last 21 games...are 26-39 (.400) overall, which is the worst record in the American League and third worst in the majors... however, have out-scored the opposition 273-258 and their run differential of +15 is second best in the AL West, tied for fifth best in the AL and tied for eighth best in the majors...won 8-1 yesterday and have eight wins by seven or more runs, which ties Toronto for the most in the majors...the A's 26-39 record is tied for third worst after 65 games in Oakland history and is the worst since the 1997 club was also 26-39...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 38th consecutive day (beginning May 8) and trail first place Houston by 10½ games...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, seven days in fourth, one day tied for fourth and 38 days in fifth.

**INTERLEAGUE PLAY:** The A's are the only team that has yet to play an interleague game...begin interleague play with four straight games against San Diego, playing games at Petco Park today and tomorrow and games in Oakland on Wednesday and Thursday...will also play at San Francisco (July 24-26), Los Angeles (July 28-29) and Arizona (Aug. 28-30) and host Colorado (June 29-July 1), Los Angeles (Aug. 18-19) and San Francisco (Sept. 25-27)...went 13-7 against the National League last year and have the fifth best all-time interleague record with a mark of 180-144 (.556)...have finished with a winning record against the National League in each of the previous three seasons and 11 of 18 overall.

**PITCHERS HITTING:** A's pitchers went 0-for-21 with three sacrifice hits and 10 strikeouts last year and are now 0 for their last 34...the last hit by an A's pitcher was a single by Tommy Milone on June 3, 2013 at Milwaukee...pitchers now have a .079 (26-for-330) average with four doubles, 10 RBI, 10 walks and 151 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is the lowest in the majors over that span (New York-AL, .091)...the last triple by an A's pitcher was by Blue Moon Odom on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston...Odom also hit the last home run on Sept. 4, 1972 against California.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have tossed at least seven innings in each of the last four games and are 2-1 with a 1.17 ERA (4 er in 30.2 ip) over that span...are 10-6 with a 1.98 ERA (30 er in 136.2 ip) over the last 21 games and have allowed one run or fewer 12 times over that stretch...have a 3.06 ERA (134 er in 394.0 ip) for the season, which is the lowest in the AL and third lowest in the majors...have surrendered just seven home runs over the last 21 games and have yielded 26 for the season, which is second fewest in the majors to Pittsburgh (25)...lead the AL and rank second in the majors with 394.0 innings pitched (Mets, 394.2).

**PITCHING:** The A's have allowed one run or fewer in three of the last four games (6 er in 34.0 ip, 1.59 ERA)...now have a 2.80 ERA (84 er in 270.0 ip) over the last 31 games after logging a 4.17 ERA over the first 34 contests...have a 3.53 ERA overall, which ranks third in the AL...tossed their ninth shutout of the season last Thursday which is second most in the majors to San Francisco (10)...have allowed 11 home runs over the last 21 games and 49 for the season, which is second fewest in the AL (Kansas City, 47)...have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.356).

**OFFENSE:** The A's batted .265 in April, .251 in May and are currently hitting .238 (98-for-411) in June...are 7-for-7 in stolen base attempts over the last five games and 40-for-47 (85.1%) for the season, which is tied with Toronto for the best mark in the majors...rank second in the American League in triples (17) and tied for fourth in runs (273) and fewest strikeouts (442)...were shutout for the sixth time this year Saturday night, which ties Seattle and Tampa Bay for the most in the American League.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's committed two errors yesterday and have a Major League leading 61 for the season (Texas, 55)...the errors have led to 33 unearned runs, which is also the most in the majors (Philadelphia, 29).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's snapped their road losing streak at a season-high tying five games yesterday...are now 1-2 on this five-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and San Diego (two games)...with one more loss, will post their 12th consecutive road trip with a .500 record or worse, which would match the longest such streak in Oakland history (Aug. 6, 1996-Aug. 31, 1997)...have not had a winning road trip since June 3-11, 2014 (5-4)...this series with the Padres is the A's fifth in a five-series stretch where they will play in five different cities...went 3-3 on a road trip to Detroit (3-0) and Boston (0-3) and 2-1 on three-game homestand against Texas to start the stretch...have played 36 games on the road this year and 29 at home...are 15-21 (.417) on the road compared to 11-18 (.379) at home...have the second worst home record in the majors (Milwaukee, 11-22).

**NIGHT AND DAY:** The A's are in day three of an eight-day stretch from June 13-20 where they will alternate night games and day games every day...are 18-23 (.439) in night games compared to 8-16 (.333) during the day...have won seven of their last 10 day games after losing 13 of the first 14...have the second worst record in day games in the American League (Los Angeles, 4-11)...are batting .257 (370-for-1440) at night compared to .248 (203-for-817) during the day.

**CLOSE CALLS:** Each of the A's last three losses have been by one run and eight of the last nine have been by two runs or fewer...are 4-18 (.182) in one-run games and 7-27 (.206) in games decided by two runs or fewer, both of which are the worst records in the majors...are 1-11 in games decided in the last at bat...the wins are the fewest in the majors and the losses are tied for third most...recorded their first walk-off win of the season last Wednesday against Texas...are 0-6 in extra inning games and are the only team without an extra inning win...are tied with Pittsburgh for the Major League lead in extra inning losses and are tied for second in the AL in extra inning games...have not won an extra inning game since the Sept. 21, 2014 win over Philadelphia...have a six-game extra inning losing streak, which matches the longest such streak by an A's team over the last 20 years (May 18-July 5, 2011 and May 21-July 25, 1999).

**LEFT AND RIGHT:** The A's are 3-13 (.188) when the opponent starts a left-hander pitcher compared to 23-26 (.469) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is the worst in the majors...are batting .225 (132-for-587) against lefties compared to .264 (441-for-1670) with 44 of their 55 home runs off righties...the mark against lefties is second lowest in the American League (Chicago, .212) and the mark against righties is second highest (Detroit, .277).

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have eight players on the disabled list (Crisp, Davis, Doolittle, Ladendorf, Mujica, Parker, Thompson, Venditte)...Crisp, Doolittle, Ladendorf, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...Davis is on a rehab assignment...have had at least seven players on the DL all year...have used the DL a total of 16 times.

**A's vs. PADRES:** The A's lead the all-time series, 16-9...are 8-3 in Oakland and 8-6 in San Diego...including 3-3 at Petco Park...last met in 2012 when the A's won two of three in Oakland from June 15-17...this is the A's first visit to San Diego since 2009 when they also won two of three from June 19-21...have won each of the last two season series and six of eight overall.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Billy Burns** has hit safely in 17 of his last 18 games (26-for-78, .333)...leads AL rookies in hits (51) and multiple hit games (16)...**Mark Canha** is batting .345 (10-for-29) with two doubles, two home runs and five RBI in eight games in June...**Brett Lawrie** is batting .320 (40-for-125) on the road, which ranks sixth in the AL...**Josh Reddick** is tied for the ML lead in two-out RBI (26)...is 15-for-41 (.366) with three home runs and eight RBI over his last 11 games...**Stephen Vogt** leads Major League catchers in home runs (11) and slugging percentage (.566).

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1925** the A's trail 15-3 entering the bottom of the seventh inning before scoring once in the seventh and 13 times in the eighth inning to defeat Cleveland 17-15...the 12 run deficit overcome to win is a Major League record...in **1983** Davey Lopes drives in seven runs and is a single short of the cycle in the A's 10-1 win at Toronto...in **2002** the A's go errorless for the 12<sup>th</sup> consecutive game, breaking the Oakland record of 11.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Hahn (3-5, 3.84 ERA)

**BRIEFLY:** Went 1-1 with a 2.12 ERA and .213 opponents batting average over his first three starts, 0-2 with a 7.63 ERA and .324 opponents average over a three-start stretch from April 29 to May 9, and is 2-2 with a 3.08 ERA (13 er in 38.0 ip) and .228 (33-for-145) opponents average over his last six starts...left his third start April 18 at Kansas City with a blister and missed his turn in the rotation April 23.

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Opponents have reached base on an error a Major League leading 11 times, which matches the most by an A's pitcher over the last 11 years (Milone in 2012 and 2013)...has eight unearned runs, which is the most in the American League...is tied for second in the AL in hit batters (7), tied for sixth in opponents grounded into double plays (10) and tied for ninth in wild pitches (5)...opponents have been successful in 2-of-6 (33.3%) stolen base attempts off him, which is tied for sixth lowest in the AL.

**THE LONG BALL:** Has allowed just three home run in 70.1 innings for an average of 0.38 per nine innings...that ranks fourth lowest in the American League...also ranks sixth in the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.325)...has surrendered seven home runs in 143.2 career innings (0.44 per nine innings)...six have come with runners on base.

**WITH THE BAT:** Is 2-for-22 (.091) with a run, RBI, two sacrifice hits and 12 strikeouts as a hitter, all last year with San Diego...had a RBI single off the Mets Zack Wheeler in the fourth inning June 14, 2014 for his first hit and RBI.

**INTERLEAGUE:** Is 1-1 with a 2.13 ERA (12.2 ip, 9 h, 4 r, 3 er, 6 bb, 10 so) in two career interleague starts, both with San Diego last year (June 19 vs. Seattle, Aug. 5 at Minnesota).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has a .248 opponents batting average, which includes .179 (24-for-134) against right-handed hitters compared to .314 (44-for-140) against left-handers...the mark against righties is fifth lowest in the AL...has walked just two batters to lead off an inning...has a .270 (27-for-100) opponents average the first time through the lineup, .170 (17-for-100) the second time through and .324 (24-for-74) after that...has allowed a .333 (20-for-60) average with runners in scoring position.

**INNING BY INNING:** Has a 4.25 ERA (17 er in 36.0 ip) over the first three innings of a game, 0.82 (4 er in 22.0 ip) over innings four through five and 6.94 (9 er in 11.2 ip) from the sixth inning on.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is 2-1 with a 1.63 ERA (5 er in 27.2 ip) and .170 (17-for-100) opponents batting average in four starts during the day compared to 1-4 with a 5.27 ERA (25 er in 42.2 ip) and .293 (51-for-174) opponents batting average in eight starts at night.

**LOSING STREAK SNAPPED:** Tossed a four-hit shutout May 25 against Detroit to snap his career-high tying three-game losing streak (also Aug. 5, 2014-April 7, 2015)...had a 5.86 ERA and .267 opponents batting average during the losing streak, which spanned five starts.

**GO THE DISTANCE:** Tossed his first career complete game against Detroit May 25, a four-hit shutout in Oakland...became the first A's pitcher with a shutout on Memorial Day since Dick Fowler and Joe Coleman did it both ends of a 1947 doubleheader against New York...according to Elias, he became the first A's pitcher to toss a shutout in a game in which his team made at least three errors since Diego Segui did it for the Kansas City A's June 15, 1965 against California...joins since Mark Mulder (April 24, 2003) as the only A's pitchers to shutout Detroit over the last 27 years.

**THIS AND THAT:** Went 1-4 with a 4.30 ERA in six starts in May...tied for third in the American League in May losses...the A's are 4-8 (.333) in his starting assignments...the Padres went 9-3 (.750) in his starting assignment last year...has tossed six innings or fewer in nine of his 12 starts this year...has tossed more than six innings in just six of his 24 career starts...has walked two batters or fewer in 11 of his 12 starts this year.

**2015-START-BY-START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss to Texas **April 7** in Oakland...allowed base runners in each of his first five innings, including the third when he allowed a RBI single to Fielder...left after six innings trailing 3-1...had a no decision in the A's 8-7, 10-inning loss to Seattle **April 12** in Oakland...retired each of the first 13 batters before Seager reached on a Semien error...took a no-hitter and a 3-0 lead into the sixth inning...allowed a leadoff double to Morrison and the Mariners ended up scoring four times, although only one run was earned...combined with Chavez on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win at Kansas City **April 18**...it was his first win as an Athletic...tossed 5.1 innings and allowed three of the hits...allowed only one base runner to advance into scoring position...left with one out in the sixth inning with a blister...had a no decision in the A's 6-3 loss to Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland **April 29**...allowed a two-run single to Aybar in the first inning and a solo home run to Trout in the third...

the A's scored a run in the fourth and he left after five innings trailing 3-1... Oakland scored twice in the bottom of the sixth to get him off the hook... was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-7 loss at Minnesota **May 4**...allowed a career-high six runs on a career-high 10 hits in 5.0 innings...the A's scored four times in the first inning but he allowed four runs in the second on a Schafer RBI double, a Santana RBI single and a Dozier two-run double... Oakland scored a run in the sixth to take a 5-4 lead but he put runners on second and third to start the bottom of the sixth...was relieved by Alvarez who allowed both runs to score plus two of his own...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 7-2 loss at Seattle **May 9**...yielded a career-high tying six runs for the second consecutive start...allowed two runs in the first inning on a Cruz RBI double and an error, and another in the second on a Smith RBI double...the A's scored a run in the fifth inning to make the score 3-1, but he allowed two more runs in the bottom of the fifth, both scoring on a Lawrie error...was relieved by Castro with runners on first and second and one out in the sixth and Castro allowed one of the runs to score...had a no decision in the A's 7-6 loss to Chicago (AL) **May 15** in Oakland...faced eight batters in the first inning but allowed just two runs on a bases loaded walk to LaRoche and a Gillaspie RBI single...the A's scored four times in the fourth and he left with a 6-2 lead and runners on first and second with one out in the seventh...the bullpen allowed both runs to score and the White Sox scored five unearned runs in the inning (Scribner blown save)... extended his losing streak to three games in the A's 6-1 loss at Houston **May 20**...allowed a RBI single to Marisnick in the third inning and the A's tied the game with a run in the sixth...retired the first two batters in the bottom of the sixth but Spring single and Carter hit a two-run home run... tossed his first career complete game, a four-hit shutout against Detroit **May 25** in Oakland...walked just one batter while striking out five...tossed a career-high 112 pitches...allowed only one base runners to advance into scoring position and that was Collins, who singled to lead off the fifth, went to second on a Semien error and third on a McCann grounded into double play...was aided by three double plays...was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-3 loss to New York (AL) **May 30** in Oakland...allowed a run in the first inning on a McCann RBI single but then blanked the Yankees on one hit over the next three innings...the A's scored twice in the third and once in the fourth to take a 3-1 lead but he allowed an unearned run in the fifth on a Headley RBI single...then surrendered a two-run home run to Beltran in the sixth for the loss...was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-5 win at Detroit **June 4**...shutout the Tigers on one hit and one walk over the first five innings and had a 6-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the sixth inning... Gose and Iglesias had back-to-back two-out singles and Gose scored on a Cabrera RBI single.

**LAST START:** He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win over Texas last Wednesday in Oakland...tossed 3.2 innings, which matched his shortest career outing as a starter (June 3, 2014 vs. Pittsburgh)...hit three batters, which tied the Oakland single game record (ninth time, first since Barry Zito on April 15, 2005)...had a 1-0 lead after two innings but the Rangers sent nine men to the plate in the third inning and scored three times on a Fielder sacrifice fly, a Moreland RBI single and a Martin hit by pitch...also allowed a RBI single to Moreland in the fourth and left trailing 4-1.

**LHP Scott Kazmir (3-4, 2.79 ERA):** Tossed 8.0 shutout innings in his last start to snap a four-game losing streak...compiled a 4.85 ERA and .299 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned six starts from May 6 to June 5...is 1-1 with a 1.99 ERA and .173 opponents batting average in four starts during the day compared to 2-3 with a 3.17 ERA and .242 opponents average in eight starts at night...went 3-1 with a 4.45 ERA in five interleague starts last year and is 14-6 with a 4.52 ERA in 27 career interleague starts...is 2 for 22 (.091) with a RBI, sacrifice hit and eight strikeouts as a batter in his career...picked up his first win since his second start of the season in his last start, a 7-0 A's win over Texas last Thursday in Oakland (8.0 ip, 1 h, 2 bb, 6 so)...had a no decision in his only career start against San Diego, an 11-4 win at Tampa Bay on June 12, 2007 (6.0 ip, 9 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 11 so).

- The A's bullpen was charged with its 15th loss of the season Friday night, which is tied for the most in the majors.
- Was also tagged with its 10th blown save Friday, which is tied for the most in the American League...has just 10 saves, which is second fewest in the AL (Toronto, 8), and the save percentage of 50.0 is second lowest in the AL (Toronto, 44.4%).
- Has a 4.55 ERA, which is the highest in the AL and third highest in the majors...have allowed the fourth most home runs in the AL (23).
- Is 1-2 with a save, two blown saves and a 5.32 ERA (13 er in 22.0 ip) over its last 10 games.
- Has allowed the most first batter RBI in the majors (30) and are tied for the second most home runs (8).
- The A's are 3-26 when the bullpen allows two runs or more, 22-12 when it allows one run or fewer (two complete games).
