OAKLAND ATHLETICS (27-39) VS. SAN DIEGO PADRES (32-34)

ABOUT THE A'S: Are 4-2 over the last six games, 4-6 over the last 10 contests and 13-9 over the last 22 games...are 27-39 (.409) overall, which is the worst record in the American League and third worst in the majors... however, have out-scored the opposition 282-259 and their run differential of +23 is second best in the AL West, fourth best in the AL and seventh best in the majors...have nine wins by seven or more runs, which is the most in the majors...the A's 27-39 record is tied for third worst after 66 games in Oakland history and is the worst since the 2005 club was also 27-39...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 39th consecutive day (beginning May 8) and trail first place Houston by 10½ games...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, seven days in fourth, one day tied for fourth and 39 days in fifth.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's became the last team to play an interleague game last night...begin interleague play with four straight games against San Diego, including tomorrow and Thursday in Oakland... will also play at San Francisco (July 24-26), Los Angeles (July 28-29) and Arizona (Aug. 28-30) and host Colorado (June 29-July 1), Los Angeles (Aug. 18-19) and San Francisco (Sept. 25-27)...went 13-7 against the National League last year and have the fifth best all-time interleague record with a mark of 181-144 (.557)... have finished with a winning record against the National League in each of the previous three seasons and 11 of 18 overall.

PITCHERS HITTING: Jesse Hahn went 0-for-3 with two strikeouts last night and A's pitchers are now 0 for their last 37...the last hit by an A's pitcher was a single by Tommy Milone on June 3, 2013 at Milwaukee...pitchers now have a .078 (26-for-333) average with four doubles, 10 RBI, 10 walks and 153 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is the lowest in the majors over that span (New York-AL, .090)...the last triple by an A's pitcher was by Blue Moon Odom on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston...Odom also hit the last home run on Sept. 4, 1972 against California.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 3-1 with a 1.21 ERA (5 er in 37.1 ip) over the last five games...are 11-6 with a 1.95 ERA (31 er in 143.1 ip) over the last 22 games and have allowed one run or fewer 13 times over that stretch...have a 3.03 ERA (135 er in 400.2 ip) for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...have surrendered just seven home runs over the last 22 games and have yielded 26 for the season, which is second fewest in the majors to Pittsburgh (25)...are tied with the Mets for the Major League lead in innings pitched (400.2).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed one run or fewer in four of the last five games (7 er in 43.0 ip, 1.47 ERA)...now have a 2.74 ERA (85 er in 279.0 ip) over the last 32 games after logging a 4.17 ERA over the first 34 contests...have a 3.49 ERA overall, which ranks third in the AL...tossed their ninth shutout of the season last Thursday which is second most in the majors to San Francisco (10)...have allowed 11 home runs over the last 22 games and 49 for the season, which is second fewest in the AL (Kansas City, 47)...have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.354).

OFFENSE: The A's batted .265 in April, .251 in May and are currently hitting .246 (111-for-451) in June...are 8-for-8 in stolen base attempts over the last six games and 41-for-48 (85.4%) for the season, which is the best mark in the majors...are tied for second in the American League in triples (17) and rank fourth in runs (282) and fewest strikeouts (452)...were shut-out for the sixth time this year Saturday night, which ties Seattle and Tampa Bay for the most in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed three errors in the last two games and have a Major League leading 62 for the season, which is seven more than any other team (Texas, 55)...the errors have led to 33 unearned runs, which is also the most in the majors (Philadelphia, 29).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-2 on this five-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and San Diego (1-0)...have not finished a road trip with a winning record since June 3-11, 2014 (5-4)...currently have a streak of 11 consecutive road trips with a .500 record or worse, which is one short of

the longest such streak in Oakland history (Aug. 6, 1996-Aug. 31, 1997)... this series with the Padres is the A's fifth in a five-series stretch where they will play in five different cities...went 3-3 on a road trip to Detroit (3-0) and Boston (0-3) and 2-1 on three-game homestand against Texas to start the stretch...have played 37 games on the road this year and 29 at home... are 16-21 (.432) on the road compared to 11-18 (.379) at home...have the second worst home record in the majors (Milwaukee, 11-23)...return home following the game today for a five-game homestand against San Diego (two games) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...snapped their road losing streak at a season-high tying five games Sunday.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's are in day four of an eight-day stretch from June 13-20 where they will alternate night games and day games every day... are 19-23 (.452) in night games compared to 8-16 (.333) during the day... have won seven of their last 10 day games after losing 13 of the first 14... have the second worst record in day games in the American League (Los Angeles, 4-11)...are batting .259 (383-for-1480) at night compared to .248 (203-for-817) during the day.

CLOSE CALLS: Each of the A's last three losses have been by one run and eight of the last nine have been by two runs or fewer...are 4-18 (.182) in one-run games and 7-27 (.206) in games decided by two runs or fewer, both of which are the worst records in the majors...are 1-11 in games decided in the last at bat...the wins are the fewest in the majors and the losses are tied for third most...recorded their first walk-off win of the season last Wednesday against Texas...are 0-6 in extra inning games and are the only team without an extra inning win...are tied with Pittsburgh for the Major League lead in extra inning losses and are tied for second in the AL in extra inning games...have not won an extra inning game since the Sept. 21, 2014 win over Philadelphia...have a six-game extra inning losing streak, which matches the longest such streak by an A's team over the last 20 years (May 18-July 5, 2011 and May 21-July 25, 1999).

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 3-13 (.188) when the opponent starts a left-hander pitcher compared to 24-26 (.480) when they start a right-hander... the mark against lefties is the worst in the majors...are batting .225 (132-for-587) against lefties compared to .265 (454-for-1710) with 45 of their 56 home runs off righties...the mark against lefties is second lowest in the American League (Chicago, .205) and the mark against righties is second highest (Detroit, .278).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have eight players on the disabled list (Crisp, Davis, Doolittle, Ladendorf, Mujica, Parker, Thompson, Venditte)... Crisp, Doolittle, Ladendorf, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL... Davis and Mujica are on rehab assignments...have had at least seven players on the DL all year...have used the DL a total of 16 times.

A's vs. PADRES: The A's won the first meeting of 2015 last night and now lead the all-time series, 17-9...are 8-3 in Oakland and 9-6 in San Diego... including 4-3 at Petco Park...prior to last night, had not met since 2012 when the A's won two of three in Oakland from June 15-17...this is the A's first visit to San Diego since 2009 when they also won two of three from June 19-21...have won each of the last two season series and six of eight overall.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Burns has hit safely in 18 of his last 19 games (27-for-84, .321)... leads AL rookies in hits (52) and multiple hit games (16)...**Brett Lawrie** is batting .331 (43-for-130) on the road, which ranks fifth in the AL...**Stephen Vogt** leads Major League catchers in home runs (12), RBI (42) and slugging percentage (.586)...**Ben Zobrist** is the second Athletic with back-to-back games of three or more runs over the last 15 years (Crisp, June 25-26, 2010).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1934** Bob Johnson collects six hits in the second game of a double-header against Chicago...in **1938** Jimmie Foxx sets an AL record by walking six times in a nine-inning game against Boston...in **1971** Mike Epstein homers in his first two at bats after homering in his final two at bats the day before to give him four home runs in four at bats, tying a major league record for consecutive home runs...in **1996** Mark McGwire ties an Oakland record with three doubles at Milwaukee and drives in his 790th career run, breaking Sal Bando's Oakland career RBI record.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Scott Kazmir (3-4, 2.79 ERA)

FOUR-GAME LOSING STREAK SNAPPED: Tossed 8.0 shutout innings in his last start to snap a four-game losing streak...compiled a 4.85 ERA and .299 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned six starts from May 6 to June 5...tossed six innings or fewer in all six starts during the losing streak, which is the longest by an Athletic this year.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 1-1 with a 1.99 ERA (5 er in 22.2 ip) and .173 (14-for-81) opponents batting average in four starts during the day compared to 2-3 with a 3.17 ERA (17 er in 48.1 ip) and .242 (43-for-178) opponents average in eight starts at night...has allowed all six of his home runs at night.

INTERLEAGUE: Went 3-1 with a 4.45 ERA in five interleague starts last year and is 9-3 in 14 interleague starts over the last five years...is 14-6 with a 4.52 ERA (75 er in 149.1 ip) in 27 career interleague starts.

WITH THE BAT: Went 0 for 4 with a strikeout last year...is 2-for-22 (.091) with a RBI, sacrifice hit and eight strikeouts in his career.

WITH RUNNERS ON BASE: Has allowed a .253 (38-for-150) batting average with the bases empty compared to .174 (19-for-109) with runners on base...the mark with runners on base is second lowest among American League pitchers with enough innings to qualify for the ERA title (Gray, OAK .171)...opponents are hitting .189 (10-for-53) with runners in scoring position, which ranks sixth among AL qualifiers...opponents are 1-for-21 (.048) with RISP and two outs...last year, he held the opposition to a .081 batting average with runners in scoring position and two outs, which was the lowest mark by a Major Leaguer with 162 or more innings pitched since Bobby Bolin had a .079 average with San Francisco in 1965...opponents are now 6-for-83 (.072) off him with RISP and two outs over the last two years...four of the six home runs he has allowed this year have come with the bases empty.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has issued 25 of his 28 walks to right-handed hitters...the 28 walks are tied for seventh most in the American League...has held the opponents number three hitter to a .133 (4-for-30) batting average, which is third lowest in the AL...the two through four hitters are a combined 14-for-89 (.157)...has allowed a .327 (35-for-107) batting average and all six of his home runs with no outs...opponents are hitting .190 (15-for-79) with one out and .096 (7-for-73) with two outs...has yielded a .353 (24-for-68) average and four of his six home runs to batters leading off an inning...has a .632 slugging percentage against batters leading off an inning...the batting average and slugging percentage leading off an inning are second highest in the AL among qualifiers for the ERA title.

RUN SUPPORT: Received seven runs of support in his last start after tallying just nine runs of support over his previous nine starts (50.0 ip, 1.62 RSA)...has three starts this year with seven or more runs of support and three runs or fewer in his other nine starts...including four with no run support.

MONTH BY MONTH: Is 1-1 with a 2.13 ERA (3 er in 12.2 ip) in two starts in June...went 0-3 with a 4.65 ERA and .269 opponents batting average in six starts in May after going 2-0 with a 0.99 ERA and .158 opponents average in four starts in April...posted the fourth lowest April ERA in the American League...in two seasons with the A's, he is 6-0 with a 1.64 ERA in 10 starts in April, 2-5 with a 3.67 ERA in 11 starts in May and 4-2 with a 2.85 ERA (17 er in 47.1 ip) in eight starts in June.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-1 with a 1.27 ERA (5 er in 35.1 ip) and .148 (18-for-122) opponents batting average in six starts in Oakland compared to 1-3 with a 4.29 ERA (17 er in 35.2 ip) and .285 (39-for-137) opponents average in six starts on the road...has the lowest home opponents batting average in the majors and the second lowest ERA (Cueto, CIN 1.25)...has not allowed a run in four of his six home starts...has allowed all six of his home runs on the road...tossed 7.0 shutout innings in each of his first two starts at home to become the second A's pitcher since 1914 on an Opening Day roster to start the season by tossing seven or more innings and not allowing a run in his first two home starts (Tommy Milone, 2012).

2015 HIGHLIGHTS: He combined with Otero and Alvarez on a three-hit shutout in the A's 10-0 win over Texas **April 8**...tossed seven innings and allowed just one hit while striking out 10...it was his 23rd career 10-strikeout game, his second with the A's...became just the fifth pitcher in Oakland history to strikeout 10 while allowing one hit or fewer, the first since Barry Zito on Aug. 4, 2001 vs. Detroit (10 so, 1 h)...was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-1 win at Houston **April 13**...retired each of the first nine batters to extend his season-opening scoreless streak to 10.0 innings...struck out eight to become the only A's pitcher on an Opening Day roster since at least 1914 to strike out eight or more batters in each of his first two starts of the season...had a no decision in the A's 4-2 loss at Kansas City **April 19**...left with a 2-1 lead but the bullpen blew the save...it was the first of two times the bullpen blew a save in his start (May 11 vs. Boston)...had his

second consecutive no decision in the A's 5-4, 11 inning loss to Houston **April 24** in Oakland...tossed 7.0 shutout innings and allowed just five hits while walking three...Keuchel shutout the A's on two hits in nine innings of work and the game was scoreless going into extra innings...that gave him a season-opening stretch where he pitched six or more innings and allowed two runs or fewer in each of his first four starts, which matched the longest such streak by an A's pitcher on the Opening Day roster since at least 1914 (fifth time, last: Jesse Chavez, 2014)...had his third straight no decision in the A's 7-5 win at Texas **May 1**...left after six innings trailing 3-0 and the Rangers built a 5-0 lead before the A's scored seven times in the eighth for the win...was the losing pitcher in the A's 13-0 loss at Minnesota **May 6**...Gibson, Pressly and Graham combined to shutout the A's on six hits...extended his losing streak to three games in the A's 5-2 loss at Tampa Bay **May 22**...it was the 250th appearance of his career...had a no decision in the A's 3-2 loss to Detroit **May 27** in Oakland...it was the 250th start of his career...did not allow a run or hit but tossed a season-low 3.0 innings before leaving the game with tightness in his left shoulder...missed a turn in the rotation.

LAST START: He combined with Scribner on a one-hit shutout in the A's 7-0 win over Texas last Thursday...tossed eight of the innings and allowed the one hit on a one-out single by Andrus in the fifth inning...it was his first win since April 13, his second start of the season...did not allow a runner past first base.

RHP Jesse Chavez (2-6, 2.64 ERA): Is 2-6 with a 2.64 ERA in 14 games, including 10 starts...has the eight lowest ERA in the American League but is tied for seventh in losses and is tied for the lowest winning percentage...has lowest run support in the majors (1.76)...is 1-4 with a 3.09 ERA and .269 opponents batting average over his last seven starts...went 1-2 with a 1.80 ERA and .191 opponents batting average over his first seven games, including three starts...is 2-6 despite a 2.91 ERA in his 10 starting assignments...ranks sixth in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.318)...had a no decision in his last start, a 5-4 loss at Los Angeles (AL) on Friday (7.0 ip, 7 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 3 so)...is 0-0 with a 5.06 ERA in six career appearances against San Diego, all in relief...is 1-2 with a 4.27 ERA in 20 career interleague appearances, including 1-1 with a 6.41 ERA in four starts.

- Has allowed 16 hits, 10 of which are for extra bases (five doubles, one triple, four home runs)...has the third highest opponents slugging percentage among American League relievers (.593).
- Is tied for the Major League lead in inherited runners (29) and is tied for second in most inherited runners scored (10).
- First batters faced are 8-for-23 (.348) with three home runs and 11 RBI...the RBI are the most in the majors and the home runs are tied for the most.
