OAKLAND ATHLETICS (28-39) VS. SAN DIEGO PADRES (32-35)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three straight, which is one short of the longest winning streak of the season (4, May 31-June 4)...have also won five of the last seven games and are now 14-9 since bottoming out at a season-high 16 games under .500 (14-30) at the conclusion of play on May 22...are 28-39 (.418) overall, which is the worst record in the American League and third worst in the majors...however, have out-scored the opposition 288-264 and their run differential of +24 is second best in the AL West, fifth best in the AL and eighth best in the majors...are 20-12 in games decided by three runs or more and have nine wins by seven or more runs, which is the most in the majors...the A's 28-39 record is tied for fourth worst after 67 games in Oakland history and is the worst since the 2011 club was also 28-39...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 40th consecutive day (beginning May 8) and trail first place Houston by 10½ games for the fifth consecutive day...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, seven days in fourth, one day tied for fourth and 40 days in fifth.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 2-0 in interleague play after sweeping a two-game series at San Diego...the two interleague games are the fewest in the majors...continue interleague play by hosting a two game series against the Padres...will also play at San Francisco (July 24-26), Los Angeles (July 28-29) and Arizona (Aug. 28-30) and host Colorado (June 29-July 1), Los Angeles (Aug. 18-19) and San Francisco (Sept. 25-27)...went 13-7 against the National League last year and have the fifth best all-time interleague record with a mark of 182-144 (.558)...have finished with a winning record against the National League in each of the previous three seasons and 11 of 18 overall.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 3-1 with a 1.49 ERA (7 er in 42.1 ip) over the last six games...are 11-6 with a 2.00 ERA (33 er in 148.1 ip) over the last 23 games and have allowed one run or fewer 13 times over that stretch...have a 3.04 ERA (137 er in 405.2 ip) for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...rank second in the majors with 405.2 innings pitched (Mets, 407.2) and have allowed 27 home runs, which is second fewest to Pittsburgh (25).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed one run or fewer in four of the last six games (12 er in 52.0 ip, 2.08 ERA)...now have a 2.81 ERA (90 er in 288.0 ip) over the last 33 games after logging a 4.17 ERA over the first 34 contests...have a 3.50 ERA overall, which ranks third in the American League...have nine shutouts, which is second most in the majors (San Francisco, 10)...have the second fewest home runs allowed in the AL (51) and the lowest opponents slugging percentage (.355).

OFFENSE: The A's batted .265 in April, .251 in May and are currently hitting .246 (119-for-484) in June...are 10-for-11 in stolen base attempts over the last seven games and 43-for-51 (84.3%) for the season, which is the second best mark in the majors (Toronto, 85.1%)...rank second in the American League in triples (18), fourth in fewest strikeouts (457) and tied for fourth in runs scored (288)...were shutout for the sixth time this year last Saturday night, which is tied for the most in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed four errors in the last three games and have a Major League leading 63 for the season, which is eight more than any other team (Texas, 55)...the errors have led to 34 unearned runs, which is also the most in the majors (Philadelphia, 31).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's went 3-2 on the last road trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and San Diego (2-0), which was their first winning road trip since June 3-11, 2014 (5-4 vs. Yankees, Orioles and Angels)...it snaps a streak of 11 consecutive road trips with a .500 record or worse, which fell one short of the longest such streak in Oakland history (Aug. 6, 1996-Aug. 31, 1997)...begin a five-game homestand tonight against San Diego (two games) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...won each of the final two games on the last homestand, which matches the longest home winning streak of the season...have not won more than two straight home games since Aug. 7-9, 2014 when they won three straight...have won five of the

last seven home games after starting the year 6-16...are 11-18 (.379) at home and 17-21 (.447) on the road...have the second worst home record in the majors (Milwaukee, 11-24)...the home record matches the second worst record after 29 home games in Oakland history and is the worst since the 1994 club went 8-21...have posted a winning record on each of the last two homestands and have won back-to-back home series.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's are in day five of an eight-day stretch from June 13-20 where they will alternate night games and day games every day...are 19-23 (.452) in night games compared to 9-16 (.360) during the day...have won eight of their last 11 day games after losing 13 of the first 14...have the second worst record in day games in the American League (Los Angeles, 4-11)...are batting .259 (383-for-1480) at night compared to .248 (211-for-850) during the day.

CLOSE CALLS: Each of the A's last three losses have been by one run and eight of the last nine have been by two runs or fewer...are 5-18 (.217) in one-run games and 8-27 (.229) in games decided by two runs or fewer, both of which are the worst records in the majors...are 2-11 in games decided in the last at bat...the wins are tied with the Yankees for the fewest in the majors and the losses are tied for third most...recorded their first walk-off win of the season a week ago today against Texas...are 0-6 in extra inning games and are the only team without an extra inning win...are tied with Pittsburgh for the Major League lead in extra inning losses and are tied for second in the AL in extra inning games...have not won an extra inning game since Sept. 21, 2014, an 8-6 win over Philadelphia in 10 innings...have a six-game extra inning losing streak, which matches the longest such streak by an A's team over the last 20 years (May 18-July 5, 2011 and May 21-July 25, 1999).

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 3-13 (.188) when the opponent starts a left-hander pitcher compared to 25-26 (.490) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is the worst in the majors...are batting .225 (132-for-587) against lefties compared to .265 (462-for-1743) with 46 of their 57 home runs off righties...the mark against lefties is second lowest in the American League (Chicago, .204) and the mark against righties is third highest.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have eight players on the disabled list (Crisp, Davis, Doolittle, Ladendorf, Mujica, Parker, Thompson, Venditte)...Crisp, Doolittle, Ladendorf, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...Davis and Mujica are on rehab assignments...have had at least seven players on the DL all year...have used the DL a total of 16 times...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. PADRES: The A's lead the season series 2-0 after sweeping a two-game series in San Diego on Monday and Tuesday...have won each of the previous two season series and six of eight overall...now lead the all-time series, 18-9...are 8-3 in Oakland and 10-6 in San Diego...including 5-3 at Petco Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Burns has hit safely in each of his last seven games (10-for-30, .333) and 19 of his last 20 (28-for-87, .322)...leads American League rookies in hits (53) and multiple hit games (16) and is tied for the lead in stolen bases (13)...**Josh Reddick** ranks second among AL outfielders in RBI (38), tied for fourth in slugging (.509), fifth in on-base percentage (.373) and tied for fifth in home runs (10)...**Stephen Vogt** leads Major League catchers in home runs (12), RBI (42) and slugging percentage (.586) and ranks third in on-base percentage (.374).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1967** the A's and Tigers set an American League record for longest doubleheader with a combined time of nine hours and five minutes...the first game includes a rain delay and the second goes 19 innings before Dave Duncan homers for a 6-5 win...in **1988** Stan Javier's RBI single in the bottom of the 14th inning leads the A's to a 7-6 win over Texas...the A's would play three extra inning games in the this three game series with the Rangers...in **1996** Terry Steinbach hits a grand slam in the 10th inning as the A's defeat Detroit, 8-4.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Chavez (2-6, 2.64 ERA)

BRIEFLY: Is 2-6 with a 2.64 ERA in 14 games, including 10 starts...has the eighth lowest ERA in the American League but is tied for eighth in losses and is tied for the lowest winning percentage...has received no run support in four of his 10 starts and has received two runs or fewer in eight starts...is averaging 1.94 (14 rs in 65.0 ip) runs of support in his nine starting assignments...his season RSA of 1.76 (14 rs in 71.2 ip) is the lowest mark in the majors (Kluber, CLE 2.33).

FIRST SEVEN, LAST SEVEN: Is 1-4 with a 3.09 ERA (16 er in 46.2 ip) and .269 (47-for-175) opponents batting average over his last seven starts...went 1-2 with a 1.80 ERA and .191 opponents batting average over his first seven games, including three starts.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Went 1-0 with a 2.81 ERA in four games, including two starts, in interleague play last year...is now 1-2 with a 4.27 ERA (22 er in 46.1 ip) in 20 career interleague appearances...that includes 1-1 with a 6.41 ERA (14 er in 19.2 ip) in four starts.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 2-6 despite a 2.91 ERA (21 er in 65.0 ip) in his 10 starting assignments...began the season in the bullpen and did not allow a run in his four relief appearances (6.2 ip)...his first start came April 23 when Jesse Hahn missed a start due to a blister...remained in the rotation following the option of Kendall Graveman to Nashville April 26...is now 10-14 with a 3.57 ERA (79 er in 199.1 ip) in 33 career starts, 9-15 with a 5.02 ERA in 204 relief appearances.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Ranks seventh in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.318)...has allowed just three home runs in 71.2 innings and his average of 0.38 home runs per nine innings is fourth lowest in the AL...has issued 14 of his 18 walks to right-handed hitters...has walked just four of the 73 batters he has faced leading off an inning.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-2 with a 1.86 ERA (6 er in 29.0 ip) in six games at home compared to 1-4 with a 3.16 ERA (12 er in 35.2 ip) in eight games on the road...has the fifth lowest home ERA in the American League...has surrendered all three of his home runs on the road.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 2-4 with a 1.71 ERA (8 er in 42.0 ip) in six starts on four days rest compared to 0-2 with a 5.09 ERA (13 er in 23.0 ip) in four starts on five days rest or more.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 1.35 ERA (3 er in 20.0 ip) in the first and second innings, a 4.20 ERA (14 er in 30.0 ip) in the third through fifth innings and a 1.66 ERA (4 er in 21.2 ip) from the sixth inning on.

MONTH BY MONTH: Is 0-1 with a 5.25 ERA (7 er in 12.0 ip) in two starts in June...went 2-3 with a 1.93 ERA in six starts in May...tied for sixth in the American League in losses in May but had the fourth lowest ERA...went 0-2 with a 2.55 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in six games, including two starts, this April...is 2-2 with a 2.10 ERA in 12 games, eight starts, in April over the last two years...has a 2.68 career ERA in April, which is his best for any month of the season

IN RELIEF: Stranded his only inherited runner in his four relief appearances and first batters faced were 1-for-4 (.250)...recorded the save in his final relief appearance April 18 at Kansas City, tossing 3.2 scoreless innings...has two career saves, both at Kansas City and both at least 3.2 innings...struck out six, which matched the most by an A's pitcher in a game in which he recorded the save...the only other time it happened since the save became an official stat in 1969 was by Rollie Fingers on Sept. 1, 1972 against Detroit.

2015 START-BY-START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-0 loss at Los Angeles (AL) **April 23**...tossed six innings and allowed just one hit...the hit was a two-run home run by Calhoun in the third inning and it scored Butera, who reached on an error...it was the Angels only hit of the game...Tropeano, Salas, Smith and Street combined to shutout the A's on eight hits...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 6-5 loss to Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland **April 30**...allowed a run in the third inning on Giavotella RBI single and three more in the fifth on a two-run single by Calhoun and a Freese RBI fielders choice...left after five innings trailing 4-0...was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 win at Minnesota **May 5**...it was his first win since July 23, 2014...the A's scored a run in the first inning and one more in the sixth and he shutout the Twins on three hits and a walk over the first seven innings...allowed his only run in the eighth inning on a Dozier RBI single...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-3 loss at Seattle **May 10**...did not allow a hit until Cruz singled with one out in the fourth...had a 1-0 lead at the time but Seager followed with a RBI double and Ackley added a two-run double one out later...also allowed a sacrifice fly to Cano in the fifth...had a no decision in the A's 4-3 loss to Chicago (AL) **May 16** in Oakland...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed his only runs in the third inning on a two-run single by Garcia...retired the side in order just one (fourth inning)...left

after six innings with the score tied 2-2...was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-0 loss at Tampa Bay **May 21**...DeJesus had a RBI double in the fourth and a solo home run in the seventh...allowed a Guyer single following the DeJesus homer and was relieved by Mujica, who allowed Guyer to score...Colome and four Rays relievers combined to shutout the A's on six hits and two walks...was the losing pitcher in the A's 1-0 loss to Detroit **May 26** in Oakland...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings and allowed just five hits...the only run came in the first inning and it was unearned...Gose led off with a single, stole second and went to third on a Phegley error on the steal...Davis followed with a sacrifice fly and that would be the only run of the game...retired 12 straight at one point...Price and three relievers combined to shutout the A's on seven hits...combined with Clippard on an eight-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win over New York in Oakland on **May 31**...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings for the second consecutive start and allowed seven of the hits...also tossed a career-high 110 pitches...the A's scored two runs in the sixth and one more in the eighth...Clippard tossed a scoreless ninth to record the save...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss at Boston June 6...allowed a career-high tying 10 hits in 5.0 innings...surrendered a two-run home run to Ramirez in the first inning to snap his scoreless streak at a career-high 15.0 innings...the A's scored a run in the third to cut the lead in half, but he allowed two runs in the bottom of the third on an Ortiz RBI double and a Napoli RBI single.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss at Los Angeles (AL) last Friday...allowed a RBI single to Navarro in the second inning but the A's scored twice in the fourth...allowed a two-run single to Calhoun in the fifth but the A's scored twice in the seventh to give him a 4-3 lead...was relieved by Scribner to start the eighth and he allowed solo home runs to Trout and Calhoun for the blown save and loss.

RHP Kendall Graveman (3-3, 4.22 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville May 23 for his second stint with the A's this year and is 2-1 with a 2.20 ERA and .258 opponents batting average in five starts since his return...was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 1-2 with an 8.27 ERA and .348 opponents batting average in four starts before he was optioned to Nashville April 26...has tossed seven or more innings and allowed one run or fewer in each of his last two starts but has a no decision and a loss in those two games (1.20 ERA)...is 3-1 with a 1.78 ERA and .248 opponents batting average in six starts on the road compared to 0-2 with a 10.54 ERA and .377 opponents average in three starts at home...tossed his first career complete game in his last start, a 1-0 loss at Los Angeles (AL) last Saturday (8.0 ip, 8 h, 1 r, 1 er, 7 so)...has never faced the Padres in his career...has never pitched in an interleague game.
