OAKLAND ATHLETICS (29-39) VS. SAN DIEGO PADRES (32-36)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's extended their winning streak to a season-high tying four games last night (May 31-June 4)...have not won more than four straight since July 3-8 of last year when they won six in a row...have also won six of the last eight games and are now 15-9 since bottoming out at a season-high 16 games under .500 (14-30) at the conclusion of play on May 22...are 29-39 (.426) overall, which is the second worst record in the American League (Boston, .418) and fourth worst in the majors...however, have out-scored the opposition 304-266 and the run differential of +38 is the best in the AL West, third best in the AL and sixth best in the majors... are 21-12 in games decided by three runs or more and have 10 wins by seven or more runs, which is the most in the majors...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 41st consecutive day (beginning May 8) and trail first place Houston by 10½ games for the sixth consecutive day...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, seven days in fourth, one day tied for fourth and 41 days in fifth.

OFFENSE: The A's scored a season-high 16 runs on a season-high 20 hits last night...went 20-for-40 (.500), which marks the seventh time in Oakland history the A's hit at least .500 in a game...it tied for the second best singlegame batting average in Oakland history to a 24-for-47 (.511) performance on June 26, 2005 against San Francisco...raised the team batting average four points last night to .259...had 13 hits with runners in scoring position last night, which set an Oakland single-game record (credit: Elias)...are now batting .342 (53-for-155) during the current four-game winning streak and are out-scoring the opposition 39-9...the A's rank second in the AL in runs (304), triples (19) and stolen base percentage (82.7%), tied for second in walks (219) and fourth in on-base percentage (.324) and fewest strikeouts (461)...have been shutout six times, which is tied for the AL lead.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 3-0 in I interleague play...won the first game of this series last night after sweeping a two-game series at San Diego on Monday and Tuesday...the three interleague games are the fewest in the majors...after today, the A's will also play at San Francisco (July 24-26), Los Angeles (July 28-29) and Arizona (Aug. 28-30) and host Colorado (June 29-July 1), Los
Angeles (Aug. 18-19) and San Francisco (Sept. 25-27)...went 13-7 against

the National League last year and have the fifth best all-time interleague record with a mark of 183-144 (.560)...have finished with a winning record against the NL in each of the previous three seasons and 11 of 18 overall.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-1 with a 1.46 ERA (8 er in 49.1 ip) over the last seven games...are 12-6 with a 1.97 ERA (34 er in 155.1 ip) over the last 24 games and have allowed one run or fewer 14 times over that stretch...have a 3.01 ERA (138 er in 412.2 ip) for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...rank second in the majors with 412.2 innings pitched (Mets, 414.2) and have allowed 28 home runs, which is second fewest to Pittsburgh (25).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed one run or fewer in four of the last seven games (14 er in 61.0 ip, 2.07 ERA)...now have a 2.79 ERA (92 er in 297.0 ip) over the last 34 games after logging a 4.17 ERA over the first 34 contests...have a 3.47 ERA overall, which ranks third in the American League...have nine shutouts, which is second most in the majors (San Francisco, 10)...have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.355), the second fewest home runs allowed (53) and the fourth lowest opponents batting average (.239).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed four errors in the last four games and have a Major League leading 63 for the season, which is eight more than any other team (Texas, 55)...the errors have led to 34 unearned runs, which is second most in the majors (Philadelphia, 35).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's have won each of their last three home games, which is their longest home winning streak since Aug. 7-9, 2014 when they also won three straight...have not won more than three straight home games since July 3-18, 2014 when they won seven straight...are 1-0 on this five-game homestand against San Diego (1-0) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...have won six of the last eight home games after starting the year 6-16...are 12-18 (.400) at home and 17-21 (.447) on the road... have the second worst home record in the American League (Cleveland, 12-29)...the home record is the third worst record after 30 home games in Oakland history and is the worst since the 1994 club went 8-22...have posted a winning record on each of the last two homestands and have won back-to-back home series...went 3-2 on the last road trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and San Diego (2-0), which was their first winning road trip since June 3-11, 2014 (5-4 vs. Yankees, Orioles and Angels)...it snaps a streak of 11 consecutive road trips with a .500 record or worse, which fell one short of the longest such streak in Oakland history (Aug. 6, 1996-Aug. 31,

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's are in day six of an eight-day stretch from June 13-20 where they will alternate night games and day games every day... are 20-23 (.465) in night games compared to 9-16 (.360) during the day... have won eight of their last 11 day games after losing 13 of the first 14... have the second worst record in day games in the American League (Los Angeles, 4-11)...are batting .265 (403-for-1520) at night compared to .248 (211-for-850) during the day...have the second best night batting average in the AL (Kansas City, .273).

CLOSE CALLS: Each of the A's last three losses have been by one run and eight of the last nine have been by two runs or fewer...are 5-18 (.217) in one-run games and 8-27 (.229) in games decided by two runs or fewer, both of which are the worst records in the majors...are 2-11 in games decided in the last at bat...the wins are tied with the Yankees for the fewest in the majors and the losses are tied for third most...are 0-6 in extra inning games and are the only team without an extra inning win...are tied with Pittsburgh for the Major League lead in extra inning losses and are tied for second in the AL in extra inning games...have not won an extra inning game since Sept. 21, 2014, an 8-6 win over Philadelphia in 10 innings. have a six-game extra inning losing streak, which matches the longest such streak by an A's team over the last 20 years (May 18-July 5, 2011 and May 21-July 25, 1999).

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 3-13 (.188) when the opponent starts a lefthander pitcher compared to 26-26 (.500) when they start a right-hander. the mark against lefties is the worst in the majors...are batting .228 (135for-591) against lefties compared to .269 (479-for-1779) with 47 of their 58 home runs off righties...the mark against lefties is second lowest in the American League (Chicago, .202) and the mark against righties is second highest (Detroit, .274).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have eight players on the disabled list (Crisp, Davis, Doolittle, Ladendorf, Mujica, Parker, Thompson, Venditte)... Crisp. Doolittle, Ladendorf, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL. Davis and Mujica are on rehab assignments...have had at least seven players on the DL all year...have used the DL a total of 16 times

A's vs. PADRES: The A's lead the season series 3-0...won the first game in Oakland last night after sweeping a two-game series in San Diego on Monday and Tuesday...have swept a season series once (3-0 in 2000)... have now won three consecutive season series and seven of nine overall...lead the all-time series, 19-9...are 9-3 in Oakland and 10-6 in San Diego...including 5-3 at Petco Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Burns Has hit safely in each of his last eight games (13-for-35, .371) and 20 of his last 21 (31-for-92, .338)....leads American League rookies in hits (56) and multiple hit games (17) and is tied for the lead in stolen bases (13)...Josh Reddick is tied for the lead among AL outfielders in RBI (39), ranks fifth in slugging (.502) and tied for fifth in home runs (10)...Stephen Vogt leads Major League catchers in home runs (12), RBI (44) and slugging percentage (.578).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1984 Davey Lopes hits an inside-the park home run in the A's 10-2 win over the Kansas City Royals...in 1993 the A's overcome a then club record eight-run deficit to defeat the Kansas City Royals 10-9....trailing 8-0 entering the bottom of the second, the A's score twice in the second and six times in the fifth before Craig Paquette's two-run seventh inning homer puts the A's ahead for good ... in 1996 Mark McGwire homers in the fifth inning of the A's 8-5 win at Detroit to extend his Oakland record streak of consecutive games reaching base to 62.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (3-3, 4.22

FOR OPENERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville May 23 for his second stint with the A's this year and is 2-1 with a 2.20 ERA (8 er in 32.2 ip) and .258 (32-for-124) opponents batting average in five starts since his return...was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 1-2 with an 8.27 ERA and .348 opponents batting average in four starts before he was optioned to Nashville April 26...went 2-1 with a 1.85 ERA in four starts with the Sounds...was acquired from Toronto Nov., 28, 2014 with pitcher Sean Nolin, infielder Brett Lawrie and minor league infielder Franklin Barreto for Josh Donaldson...made his Major League debut with the Blue Jays last year in just his second professional season and compiled a 3.86 ERA in five relief appearances.

LAST TWO STARTS: Has tossed seven or more innings and allowed one run or fewer in each of his last two starts but has a no decision and a loss in those two games (2 er in 15.0 ip, 1.20 ERA)...the bullpen blew the save in the no decision and the A's were shutout 1-0 in the loss

GO THE DISTANCE: Tossed his first career complete game is his ninth Major League start last Saturday at Los Angeles (AL), but took the loss... is the 37th pitcher in Oakland history to toss a complete game and lose 1-0...is the third to do it in the last 10 years (Scott Kazmir, Sept. 11, 2014 at Chicago-AL; Brandon McCarthy, April 21, 2011 at Seattle)...is one of three American League rookies with a complete game.

INTERLEAGUE: Is scheduled to make his first career interleague appear-

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .325 (26-for-80) batting average with runners on base...however, opponents are batting .222 (10-for-45) with runners in scoring position...has yielded a .408 (29-for-71) batting average to the opponents three, four and five hitters...has surrendered four of his six home runs in Oakland and four during the day

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-1 with a 1.78 ERA (7 er in 35.1 ip) and .248 (33for-133) opponents batting average in six starts on the road compared to 0-2 with a 10.54 ERA (16 er in 13.2 ip) and .377 (23-for-61) opponents average in three starts at home.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-1 loss to Texas April 9 in Oakland, his first Major League start...allowed three runs in the first, a two-run home run to Moreland in the third and a three-run home run to Choo in the fourth...the two home runs were the first of his career...surrendered just five home runs in 207.0 minor league innings...yielded eight runs in 3.1 innings to become the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to allow eight or more runs in his A's debut (last: Clayton Mortensen, 8 on Aug. 8, 2009 at Kansas City).

SECOND START: He combined with O'Flaherty, Otero, Abad and Clippard on an eight-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win at Houston April 14...it was his first Major League win...tossed 5.1 innings and allowed four of the hits... allowed four runners into scoring position and retired the side in order just once (fifth inning).

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-3 win at Los Angeles April 20...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed two in the bottom of the first on a two-run single by Freese...the A's then scored three runs in the third to take a 4-2 lead but he allowed a Pujols RBI single in the bottom of the third...had a 5-3 lead when he walked the first two batters in the fourth inning...was relieved by Otero who stranded both runners and tossed 4.0 scoreless innings for the win.

FOURTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-3 loss to Houston on April 25 in Oakland...allowed a RBI double to Lowrie in the first inning and a three-run home run to Altuve in the third... also yielded a RBI single to Lowrie in the fifth and was relieved by Bassitt with runners on first and third and two outs in the sixth...Bassitt allowed one of the runners to score on a wild pitch.

FIFTH START: He combined with Scribner and Clippard on a six-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win at Tampa Bay last Saturday...tossed six innings and allowed three of the hits...retired 12 of the first 13 batters he faced...allowed only two runners to advance into scoring position.

SIXTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win over New York (AL) May 28 in Oakland...allowed a solo home run to McCann in the second inning, a RBI single to McCann in the fourth and a sacrifice fly to Rodriguez in the fifth...was relieved by Abad with two outs in the sixth inning and the A's trailing 3-1...Oakland scored twice in the bottom of the sixth to get him off the hook and twice in the seventh for the win.

SEVENTH START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-3 win at Detroit June 2...allowed three runs, all in the fourth inning...one run scored on a wild pitch and he allowed a two-run single to Castellanos...the A's scored five runs in the seventh to take the lead...Scribner tossed a scoreless se enth and eighth and Clippard a scoreless ninth to earn him the win.

EIGHTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-4 loss at Boston last Sunday...shutout the Red Sox on five hits and two walks over the first seven innings...had a 4-0 lead and had retired 13 straight before Castillo led off the eighth inning with a home run...the bullpen allowed six more runs in the eighth inning with Clippard getting the blown save and loss.

LAST START: He tossed his first career complete game, an eight-hitter in the A's 1-0 loss at Los Angeles (AL) last Saturday...did not walk a batter and struck out a career-high seven...tossed a career-high 111 pitches... allowed the only run of the game on a two-out home run to Pujols in the first inning...Wilson, Smith and Street combined to shutout the A's on two hits and four walks.
