TODAY IS A NEW DAY: The Padres kicked off an eight-game, nine-day roadtrip last night at O.co Coliseum in Oakland where they dropped the first of two games against the Athletics last night, losing by a score of 16-2...following this afternoon's game against the A's, the Padres will head to the "Valley of the Sun" where they will play a three-game, weekend series against the Diamondbacks in Phoenix...the Friars will then enjoy an off day Monday before playing a three-game series at AT&T Park against the San Francisco Giants.

- The Padres posted a 1-4 record during their recent homestand, dropping two of three games to the Dodgers (1-2) and both games against the Athletics (0-2).
- Following the current roadtrip, the Padres will return home for five games in six days, including three games against the D-Backs (June 26-28) and Mariners (June 30 - July 1).

WAIT, YOUR PITCHERS DON'T DO WHAT?: The Padres will finish their fourth interleague series of the season this afternoon as they will play the fourth of four games of the current home-and-home series against the Athletics... the Padres have dropped all three games against the Athletics this season.

- The Padres have won four of their last seven games (.571) when playing in an American League ballpark since August 6 of last season, and are 3-3 this season when using the DH.
- The Padres won a three-game set vs. LAA (2-1) in Anaheim, split a two game series against the Mariners in Seattle (1-1) at Safeco Field and were swept by the Houston Astros (0-3) at Petco Park.
- After this four-game series with the A's at both Petco Park and O.co Coliseum, the Padres will have three more series against American League opponents, as the club will play Seattle (June 30 - July 1 at Petco), Texas (July 10-12 at Texas) and Texas one more time (August 31 - September 2 at Petco).

RUN, FRIARS, RUN! The Padres have scored 286 runs this season, the ninth-highest total in Major League Baseball and the third-most in the National League, behind only the Arizona Diamondbacks (294) and Washington Nationals (289).

- The Padres rank second in the National League and are fourth in the Majors with 127 runs with two outs this season, trailing only Toronto (138), Arizona (129) and New York-AL (128).
- The Padres have scored 44 runs in the first inning this season, the highest total in the National League and the fourth-highest total in Major League Baseball, trailing only the New York Yankees (61), Baltimore Orioles (47) and Detroit Tigers (46).

LITTLE NINJA, BIG STICK: Alexi Amarista currently owns a season-long seven game hitting streak, hitting .391/.440/.565 (9-for-23) with a double, a home run and two RBI and a walk in that time...the streak is the third-longest of his career and the longest since also hitting safely in eight straight from July 7-19, 2012.

- Since June 1, is hitting .333/.366/.487 (13-for-39) with three doubles, one home run and five RBI, the fourth-best batting average, and third-best on-base percentage, slugging percentage and OPS (.853) of any Major League shortstop this month with as many or more at-bats.

A GOOD NINJA HAS MANY SKILLS: Alexi Amarista took the mound for the Padres with two outs in the eighth inning and retired the only batter he faced on two pitches last night at Oakland, making him the ninth position player in franchise history to appear in a game as a pitcher and the first since Josh Wilson took the hill for the Friars in the 18th inning on June 7, 2009 vs. Arizona.

- Standing at 5'6", Amarista is now the shortest player in franchise history to make an appearance on the mound, two inches shorter than Danny Boone (5'8"), who last appeared in a game for the Padres in 1982... during the expansion era (since 1961), Amarista is one of four Major League players 5'6" or shorter to appear in a game on the mound, joining Danny Herrera (5'6", 2008-11), Richie Lewis (5'6", 1992-98) and Bobby Shantz (5'6", 1949-64).
- Having also hit a home run in the sixth inning, Amarista is now one of five players since 1974 to hit a home run prior to entering a game to pitch and the first since Nick Swisher did so for the Yankees on April 13, 2009 at TB (see chart)(STATS, Inc.)
- Amarista became the fifth position player since 1914 to enter a game to pitch, record just one out and do so on two or fewer pitches and the first since Daniel Descalso, then with the Cardinals, on May 12 of last season against Chicago-NL.

"MIDDLE" ON, NOT OF THE ROAD: Will Middlebrooks belted his ninth home run of the season last night at Oakland, the second-highest total on the team, trailing only Justin Upton (13)...eight of his nine home runs have come on the road, tied for the seventh-highest total by any National League player away from their home ballpark.

- His eight home runs on the road before the All-Star break are the most by a Padres player since Carlos Quentin also hit eight long balls on the road before the "Mid-Summer Classic" in 2013...the last Padres player with more than eight homers on the road before the All-Star Break was Adrian Gonzalez in 2010 (12).

MATT THE BATT: Matt Kemp has tallied 24 of his 34 RBI on the road this season, the ninth-highest total in the National League and the 15th-most in the Majors.

- Has hit safely in eight of his last nine games away from Petco Park, posting a .275/.310/.450 (11-for-40) line with one home run and 10 RBI in that time.

#VOTENORRIS: Derek Norris leads NL catchers in many categories, both offensive and defensive (see below) (stats are based on players to have played at least 75% of their games as a catcher).

- Has 62 hits on the season, tied for the third-highest total of any catcher in baseball and tied for second-most in the National League (Buster Posey, 68).
- Has 26 extra-base hits this season, the highest total of any Major League catcher and seven more than the second place catcher in the National League (Buster Posey, 19).
- Norris has 18 doubles on the season, by far the highest total by a Major League catcher and seven more than that of the second-place NL catcher (STL Yadier Molina, 11)...his doubles total is also tied for the 10th-highest total of any player in Major League Baseball and tied for the sixth-most in the National League this season, regardless of position.
- Norris' 39 RBI are the most by a NL catcher and third-most of any catcher in baseball (Vogt, 47, Brian McCann 40).
- His seven home runs this season are the fourth-highest total by an NL catcher this season, trailing only Posey (9), Miguel Montero (9) and Yasmani Grandal (8).
- Has tossed out 21 attempted base stealers, the most in the Majors (Russell Martin, 17) and a career-high...his 21 CCS this season surpass his previous career high of eight, which came in 114 games and 870.1 innings played behind the plate last season.

TONIGHT'S STARTER

#22 IAN KENNEDY - RHP

FOR STARTERS: Ian Kennedy will take the mound for the Padres this afternoon against the Athletics in what will be his 12th start of the season and his fifth on the road.

- Did not factor into the decision in his last outing on June 13 vs. LAD after he allowed one run on four hits with four strikeouts against one walk over 7.0 innings of work.
- Snapped a four-game losing streak in his outing on June 2 vs. the Mets at Petco Park, working 6.0 innings of two-run ball and striking out a season-best eight batters...held the Mets to just one run through 5.0 innings before allowing a second run in the sixth in the club's 7-2 victory.
- Over his last nine starts since coming off the DL on April 25, has worked 6.0 innings or more with two earned or less five times and gone less than 6.0 innings with five-or-more runs four times.
- Padres are 5-6 in his 11 starts overall.
- Had a stint on the 15-day DL from April 10-25 with a strained left hamstring.
- Recorded his 1,000th career strikeout in his outing on 5/28 vs. PIT.

HE'S GOT SENIORITY IN THE SENIOR CIRCUIT: After being draft by the New York Yankees and traded to the Arizona Diamondbacks prior to the start of the 2010 season, Kennedy has spent his last six seasons in the National League for the D-backs and Padres, landing on the DL just once in the span earlier this season from April 10-25.

- Among all pitchers in the National League since 2010, his 173 games started are the most in the NL, one ahead of both Cole Hamels and Clayton Kershaw.
- His 1,063.2 innings pitched in the NL since 2010 rank third-most, behind Kershaw (1192.2) and Hamels (1159.0).
- His 978 strikeouts since 2010 are the fourth-most by an NL pitcher, behind Kershaw, Hamels and Tim Lincecum, and ahead of Madison Bumgarner.
- His 68 wins since 2010 rank tied for sixth-most in the NL.

TURNING IT AROUND: Over his last three starts since June 2, Kennedy has posted a 1-0 record with a 3.00 ERA (6 ER, 18.0 IP) and 18 strikeouts against just three walks while limiting the opposition to a .265 batting average.

- Over his last five starts, has gone 1-2 with a 4.88 ERA (15 ER, 27.2 IP)...removing his start on May 28 when he allowed seven runs on seven hits over 3.2 innings pitched, he's gone 1-1 with a 3.38 ERA (8 ER, 24.0 IP).

VS. OAKLAND: Kennedy will be making his second career start against the Athletics and his first since July 3, 2011 as a member of the Diamondbacks...in his only appearance against the A's, allowed seven runs on 10 hits with six strikeouts against two walks over 5.2 innings pitched.

- Owns a lifetime 4-11 record with a 5.73 ERA (62 ER, 87.1 IP) an 92 strikeouts against 34 walks in 16 starts during Interleague play...made his only start against the AL this season on May 12 at Seattle, taking the loss after allowing five runs on eight hits in 4.2 IP.
- Is 0-5 with a 8.33 ERA (25 ER, 27.0 IP) in six career games, five starts, against AL West opponents.

AS A PADRE: Since being acquired by the Padres on July 31, 2013, Kennedy has made 54 starts for San Diego, with the club 28-26 in his starts.

- In his 54 starts for the Padres he is 20-20 with a 4.14 ERA (145 ER, 315.1 IP) with 317 strikeouts against 112 walks.

- Tagged with his first and only blown save of the season 5/9 at ARI, snapping a string of converting 35-straight save opportunities dating back to last season, which was the longest streak in baseball.
- Since his first full season in 2011, leads all Major Leaguers in saves (201), **51 more than the next closest closer in that span (Fernando Rodney, 150).**
