OAKLAND ATHLETICS (29-40) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (34-33)

FRIDAY, JUNE 19, 2015 – O.CO COLISEUM – 6:35 P.M. PDT RHP SONNY GRAY (8-3, 1.60) VS. RHP MATT SHOEMAKER (4-5, 4.85) CSNCA – A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME) – EN ESPAÑOL (KIQI 1010 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's had their season-high tying winning streak snapped at four games yesterday...are now 6-3 over the last nine games and 15-10 since bottoming out at a season-high 16 games under .500 (14-30) at the conclusion of play on May 22...are 29-40 (.420) overall, which is the worst record in the American League and third worst in the majors... however, have out-scored the opposition 305-269 and the run differential of +36 is second best in the AL West, tied for fourth best in the AL and tied for seventh best in the majors...are 21-12 in games decided by three runs or more and have 10 wins by seven or more runs, which is the most in the majors...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 42nd consecutive day (beginning May 8) and trail first place Houston by 11½ games...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, seven days in fourth, one day tied for fourth and 42 days in fifth.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-2 with a 1.60 ERA (10 er in 56.1 ip) over the last eight games...have tossed seven or more innings in six of those games and allowed two runs or fewer six times...are 12-7 with a 2.00 ERA (36 er in 162.1 ip) over the last 25 games and have allowed one run or fewer 14 times over that stretch...have a 3.00 ERA (140 er in 419.2 ip) for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...lead the majors with 419.2 innings pitched (Mets, 419.0) and have allowed 30 home runs, which is second fewest to Pittsburgh (26).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed one run or fewer in four of the last eight games (17 er in 70.0 ip, 2.19 ERA)...now have a 2.81 ERA (95 er in 306.0 ip) over the last 35 games after logging a 4.17 ERA over the first 34 contests...have a 3.47 ERA overall, which ranks third in the American League...have nine shutouts, which is tied for second most in the majors (San Francisco, 11)...have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.357), the second fewest home runs allowed (55) and the fourth lowest opponents batting average (.239).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .312 (58-for-186) over the last five games and have out-scored the opposition 40-12...are 29-for-72 (.403) with runners in scoring position over that stretch...for the season, the A's rank second in the American League in runs (305), triples (19) and stolen base percentage (82.7%), third in walks (220) and fourth in on-base percentage (.322) and fewest strikeouts (468)...have been shutout six times, which is tied for second most in the AL (Seattle, 7).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed six errors in the last five games and have a Major League leading 65 for the season, which is 10 more than any other team (Texas, 55)...the errors have led to 34 unearned runs, which is second most in the majors (Philadelphia, 35).

HOME AND AWAY: Had their season-high three-game home winning streak snapped yesterday...are 1-1 on this five-game homestand against San Diego (1-1) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...have won six of the last nine home games after starting the year 6-16...are 12-19 (.387) at home and 17-21 (.447) on the road...have the second worst home record in the majors (Milwaukee, 11-24)...the home record is the third worst record after 31 home games in Oakland history and is the worst since the 1994 club went 8-23...this homestand begins a stretch where the A's will play 15 of 18 games at home...are batting .272 (293-for-1079) with 148 runs at home (4.77 per game) compared to .247 (326-for-1322) with 157 runs on the road (4.13 per game) on the road...have a 2.93 ERA (93 er in 286.0 ip) at home compared to 3.94 (142 er in 324.0 ip) on the road... have the lowest home ERA in the American League...went 3-2 on the last road trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and San Diego (2-0), which was their first winning road trip since June 3-11, 2014 (5-4 vs. Yankees, Orioles and Angels)...it snaps a streak of 11 consecutive road trips with a .500 record or worse, which fell one short of the longest such streak in Oakland history (Aug. 6, 1996-Aug. 31, 1997)...leave on Monday for a brief three-game road trip to Texas.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's are in day seven of an eight-day stretch from June 13-20 where they will alternate night games and day games every day...are 20-23 (.465) in night games compared to 9-17 (.346) during the day...have won eight of their last 12 day games after losing 13 of the first 14...have the second worst record in day games in the American League (Los Angeles, 5-11)...are batting .265 (403-for-1520) at night compared

to .245 (216-for-881) during the day...have the second best night batting average in the AL (Kansas City, .276).

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 3-13 (.188) when the opponent starts a left-hander pitcher compared to 26-27 (.491) when they start a right-hander... the mark against lefties is the worst in the majors...are batting .228 (135-for-591) against lefties compared to .267 (484-for-181) with 48 of their 59 home runs off righties...the mark against lefties is third lowest in the American League and the mark against righties is third highest.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's lost 3-1 yesterday and nine of their last 10 losses have been two runs or fewer...are 5-18 (.217) in one-run games and 8-28 (.222) in games decided by two runs or fewer, both of which are the worst records in the majors...are 2-11 in games decided in the last at bat...the wins are tied with the Yankees for the fewest in the majors and the losses are tied for third most...are 0-6 in extra inning games and are the only team without an extra inning win...are tied with Pittsburgh for the Major League lead in extra inning losses and are tied for second in the AL in extra inning games...have not won an extra inning game since Sept. 21, 2014, an 8-6 win over Philadelphia in 10 innings...have a six-game extra inning losing streak, which matches the longest such streak by an A's team over the last 20 years (May 18-July 5, 2011 and May 21-July 25, 1999).

INNING BY INNING: The A's scored seven runs in the eighth inning Wednesday night, matching the A's season high for runs in an inning... also scored seven runs in the eighth inning May 1 at Texas...the A's two highest scoring innings are the seventh (49 runs) and eighth (46) innings... lead the majors in runs scored in the eighth inning and the seventh through ninth innings (115) and are tied for the lead in runs in the seventh inning... the two innings the A's pitching staff has allowed the most runs in are the seventh (40) and eighth innings (39).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 9-7 in June after going 11-19 in May and 9-14 in April...have four consecutive months with a losing record after recording 14 straight months with a winning record...have used 18 relievers, which is already their most since 2012 when they also had 18...have used 22 pitchers overall, which matches the season total from last year..

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have six players on the disabled list (Crisp, Doolittle, Ladendorf, Parker, Thompson, Venditte)...Crisp, Doolittle, Ladendorf, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...had at least seven players on the DL all year until today...have used the DL a total of 16 times...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's trail in the season series, 4-6...are 1-2 in Oakland and 3-4 in Anaheim...have lost 13 of the last 18 games overall and 11 of the last 15 in Anaheim...are 45-41 against the Angels over the last five seasons...including 37-7 when scoring four or more runs...have been held to one run or fewer in 22 of their last 33 losses, including 12 shutouts... since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 410-337 against the Angels... that includes 212-158 in Oakland and 198-179 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 459-414 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Burns Has hit safely in each of his last nine games (14-for-39, .359) and 21 of his last 22 (32-for-96, .333)....leads American League rookies in hits (56) and multiple hit games (17) and is tied for the lead in stolen bases (13)...Josh Reddick ranks second among AL outfielders in RBI (39) and tied for fifth in home runs (10)...Stephen Vogt leads Major League catchers in home runs (12), RBI (44) and slugging percentage (.586)...Ben Zobrist has scored three runs in three of his last five games and is 8-for-15 (.533) with 10 runs, three doubles, a triple, home run, five RBI and four walks over that stretch.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1979 Wayne Gross, Dave Revering and Mike Heath hit consecutive homers in the fourth inning of the A's 6-5 win against Kansas City... Gross, Mike Edwards and Revering also turn a triple play, the second of the A's major league recording tying three triple plays in 1979...in 2003 Miguel Tejada ties an Oakland record with five hits as the A's defeat Texas, 9-2.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (8-3, 1.60 ERA)

EARNED RUN AVERAGE: Has the lowest ERA in the majors (1.60)... joins Jim Nash (1.42 ERA as late as June 23, 1968) and Vida Blue (1.56 ERA as late as Aug. 7, 1971) as the only qualifying pitchers in Oakland history to have an ERA as low as 1.60 after mid-June...has allowed one earned run or fewer in nine of his 14 starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Has the lowest opponents on-base percentage in the American League (.247), ranks second in batting average (.194) and slugging percentage (.252), tied for second in wins (8), fourth in innings pitched (95.2) and tied for fifth in strikeouts (88)...also ranks second in wild pitches (8), third in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.38), third in fewest pitches per innings (14.6) and ninth in run support (6.02).

LAST FIVE STARTS: Has allowed two runs or fewer in each of his last five starts and is 4-1 with a 1.04 ERA (4 er in 34.2 ip) over that span...has struck out 31 and walked just four while holding the opposition to a .184 (23-for-125) batting average...went 4-2 with a 1.92 ERA over his first nine starts.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 6-1 with a 0.86 ERA (6 er in 62.2 ip) in nine starts on four days rest compared to 2-2 with a 3.00 ERA (11 er in 33.0 ip) in five starts on five days rest or more... has the lowest ERA on four days rest in the majors.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 5-2 with a 1.46 ERA (10 er in 61.2 ip) in nine starts against American League West competition compared to 3-1 with a 1.85 ERA (7 er in 34.0 ip) in four starts against everyone else...is now 17-7 with a 2.06 ERA (48 er in 210.0 ip) in 31 career appearances against AL West teams compared to 10-9 with a 3.36 ERA (63 er in 168.2 ip) in 28 games against everyone else.

INNING BY INNING: Has allowed 12 of his 19 runs over the first three innings of a game...has a 2.57 ERA (12 er in 42.0 ip) in innings one through three and a 0.84 ERA (5 er in 53.2 ip) from the fourth inning on...has a 3.26 career ERA (62 er in 171.0 ip) in innings 1-3, 2.12 (49 er in 207.2 ip) from the fourth inning on.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-2 with a 1.62 ERA (8 er in 44.1 ip) and .181 (28-for-155) opponents batting average in six starts at home compared to 5-1 with a 1.58 ERA (9 er in 51.1 ip) and .205 (39-for-190) opponents average in seven starts on the road...has the fifth lowest home ERA in the American League and the fourth lowest road ERA...has walked six batters in 44.1 innings at home compared to 16 in 51.1 innings on the road.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 3-1 with a 0.53 ERA (2 er in 33.2 ip) in five starts during the day compared to 5-2 with a 2.18 ERA (15 er in 62.0 ip) in nine starts at night...has the lowest day ERA in the majors.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held the opposition to a .171 (20-for-117) batting average with runners on base, which is second lowest in the majors among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title (Cueto, CIN .169)...10 of the 11 extra base hits he has allowed have come with the bases empty...has surrendered three of his four home runs to left-handed hitters...has yielded a .381 (16-for-42) opponents batting average to the opponents clean-up hitter compared to .168 (51-for-303) against all other spots in the order.

MONTH BY MONTH: Is 2-1 with a 0.83 ERA (2 er in 21.2 ip) in three starts in June after going 3-2 with a 1.67 ERA in six starts in May...ranked third in the American League in May ERA and was sixth in strikeouts (41)...his 41 strikeouts tied for third most in Oakland history in May and fell three short of the record of 44 (Chuck Dobson in 1968, Vida Blue in 1971)...it was his first month with 40 or more strikeouts...was 3-0 with a 1.98 ERA in five starts in April...tied for third in the AL in April wins and ranked ninth in ERA...has now finished a month with an ERA under 2.00 three times in his career (also 1.03 in July, 2014).

THIS AND THAT: Leads American League pitchers in putouts (19), ranks third in total chances (32) and tied for sixth in assists (13)...the 19 putouts are the most by an A's pitcher since Chad Gaudin had 22 in 2007...has tossed at least seven innings in eight of his 14 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 12 times and walked two batters or fewer 12 times...the A's are 8-6 (.571) in his starting assignments and are 32-25 (.561) in his career...is 25-1 in 33 career starts with three runs of support or more.

2015 HIGHLIGHTS: Combined with Evan Scribner on a one-hit shutout in the A's 8-0 win over Texas on Opening Day *April* 6...became the first A's pitcher to start consecutive openers since Barry Zito in 2005 and 2006... tossed 8.0 shutout innings and allowed just one hit to become the first pitcher to toss eight or more innings and allow one hit or fewer in an opener since Bob Lemon one-hit the White Sox for Cleveland in 1953...allowed a lead off home run to Ackley in the third inning *Aprill* 11 against Seattle... that snapped his season-opening scoreless streak at 10.0 innings and it snapped an overall scoreless streak of 20.0 innings dating back to Sept. 23, 2014, which is a new career high...had a 2-1 lead when he was relieved with one out and a runner on first in eighth inning...the bullpen allowed that

run to score plus two more for the blown save (Otero)...it was the first of two times the bullpen blew a save in a start of his (May 8 at Seattle). allowed a career-high 11 hits in 6.0 innings in a 6-4 loss at Kansas City April 17...had a streak of five consecutive games with a wild pitch from April 22 to May 13, which is the longest such streak in Oakland history... it was the longest by an A's pitcher since Stu Flythe also had a five-game streak from July 1 to 31, 1936...struck out 10 while walking a career-high seven batters in 6.2 shutout innings in a 7-1 win at Texas May 3...it began a streak of three consecutive starts with nine or more strikeouts through May 13...that matched the longest such streak by an A's pitcher over the last 44 years...made his 50th career start May 8 at Seattle and had a no decision in a 4-3, 11-inning loss...was charged with his first loss May 13 against Boston after starting the season 4-0 for the first time in his career... it snapped a five-game winning streak dating back to Sept. 28, 2014... posted a 1.40 ERA and .194 opponents batting average during that streak, which spanned eight starts.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-1 win at Los Angeles (AL) last Sunday...retired each of the first nine batters and had a 2-0 lead when Aybar reached on a Semien error to start the fourth...Aybar went to second on a wild pitch, third on a passed ball and scored on a Pujols single...that unearned run was the only run he would allow in 7.2 innings.

GRAY vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 5-1 with a 2.11 ERA (59.2 ip, 41 h, 16 r, 14 er, 16 bb, 58 so, 4 hr) in nine career appearances, including eight starts...is 3-1 with a 2.50 ERA (10 er in 36.0 ip) in five starts in Oakland and 2-0 with a 1.52 ERA (4 er in 23.2 ip) in four games at Anaheim...is 3-0 with a 1.19 ERA (22.2 ip, 13 h, 4 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 22 so) in three starts this year...the first win came in a 9-2 win

at Anaheim April 22...the A's scored a run in the first and after he retired the side in order in the bottom of the first, he allowed a run to score in the second when Freese doubled, went to third on a wild pitch and scored on an Aybar ground out...loaded the bases with one out in the third inning but then retired each of the final 14 batters he faced...the A's scored five times in the seventh and three times in the eighth for the win...also picked up the win in a 6-2 victory in Oakland April 28...allowed two runs in the first inning on a two-run single by Freese...the A's came back with five runs in the bottom of the first and he blanked the Angels on four hits over his final seven innings...retired 18 of the final 19 batters he faced, including 13 straight at one point...also picked up the win in his last start last Sunday (see last start above).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jesse Hahn (4-5, 3.62 ERA): Is 3-1 with a 2.51 ERA and .215 opponents batting average over his last five starts...opponents have reached base on an error a Major League leading 12 times, which are the most by an A's pitcher since Mark Mulder also had 12 in 2004...has eight unearned runs, which are the most in the American League...is 2-1 with a 1.63 ERA and .170 opponents batting average in four starts during the day compared to 2-4 with a 4.74 ERA and .274 opponents batting average in nine starts at night...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 9-1 win at San Diego on Monday (6.2 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 4 so)...had a no decision in his only career appearance against Los Angeles, a start in the A's 6-3 loss in Oakland on April 29 of this year (5.0 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 6 so)...is 0-3 with a 5.12 ERA in six starts against AL West competition compared to 4-2 with a 2.59 ERA in seven starts against everyone else.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

6-15, 4.49 ERA (95 er in 190.1 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 11-for-22 (50.0%)

- The A's bullpen is 2-1 with a 2.45 ERA (6 er in 22.0 ip), one save and two blown saves over its past nine games and has allowed one run or fewer seven times over that stretch.
- Has a 4.49 ERA for the season, which is the highest in the American League and third highest in the majors.
- Is tied for the Major League lead in losses (15).
- Is tied for the most blown saves in the AL (11), has the second fewest saves (11) and the second lowest save percentage (50.0%).
- Has allowed the fourth most home runs in the AL (25).
- Has allowed the most first batter RBI in the majors (31) and the second most home runs (9).
- The A's are 4-26 when the bullpen allows two runs or more, 24-13 when it allows one run or fewer (two complete games).
