TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – RHP MATT SHOEMAKER

4-5, 4.85 ERA

Has a 11-2 career record in road games

- Making 13th start of the season and seventh at home...Fourth start of 2015 vs. Athletics (second consecutive start vs. A's)...Is in third Major League season (second full year) with Angels...Began season in the Major League starting rotation for first time in career.
- Missed one start while on the bereavement list from April 22-29.
- **ROAD WARRIOR:** Owns a 11-2 career record across 17 appearances (15 starts) away from The Big A (4-1 record in six road starts this season)...Had streak of seven consecutive winning decisions on the road snapped on May 21 in Toronto...**Angels franchise record streak of nine straight wins in his road starts was also snapped in that game.**
- **DO NOT WALK:** Has issued one-or-fewer walks in 23 of 33 career starts, including nine of 12 this season...Has 11 career starts with zero walks allowed...**Since start of 2014 season, has averaged 1.71 walks per nine innings (8th fewest in A.L., min. 150 innings pitched).**
- **HEATING UP:** In last four starts, is 1-1 with a 2.22 ERA (24.1 IP – 6 ER) with 22 strikeouts and six walks.
- **CONSISTENT QUALITY:** Has allowed three-or-fewer earned runs in 28 of 33 career starts...Has registered a quality start in 17 of those contests.
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Charged with the loss in last start Sunday vs. A's after being charged with four runs (three earned) on six hits with no walks and five strikeouts across 5.2 innings pitched...Marked first home loss since May 9.
- **VS. OAKLAND:** In five career games (four starts) against the A's, is 1-2 with a 4.57 ERA (21.2 IP – 11 ER)...In three starts this season, is 0-2 with a 6.91 ERA (14.1 IP – 11 ER)...Made back-to-back starts vs. A's on April 20 & April 29 (0-1, 8.31 ERA)...Had pitched 7.1 shutout innings against Athletics across first two career appearances.
- **AT O.CO COLISEUM:** Did not factor in the decision in only career game at the Coliseum on April 29 (5.2 IP, 3 ER, 6 H, 1 BB, 3 SO)...In eight career road games (six starts) at A.L. West division ballparks, is 5-0 with a 4.38 ERA (39 IP – 19 ER).
- Matched a career-high with 10 strikeouts (third time) on May 4 vs. Seattle.
- **DRAWING ACES:** Has made 14 career starts (five in 2015) facing off against a former All-Star starting pitcher...**Has a 8-3 record and 2.76 ERA (88 IP – 27 ER) in those contests...**This season, is 2-2 with a 4.26 ERA (31.2 IP – 15 ER) when opposing a former All-Star.
- **STREAKING:** Had career-best streak of winning nine consecutive decisions snapped on April 20 vs. Oakland...During that span, was 9-0 with a 1.92 ERA (61 IP – 13 ER) across 10 games (nine starts), dating back to August 9, 2014.
- **SELECT COMPANY:** Became one of 11 pitchers all-time to earn at least 18 wins through his first 30 career games.
