OAKLAND ATHLETICS (29-41) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (35-33)

ABOUT THE A'S: The game last night was the sixth in Oakland history in which the A's led by at least five runs after six innings and lost (previous: May 4, 2004 vs. New York-AL)...it was the eighth game in Oakland history the A's led by at least five runs and went on to lose by at least five runs (previous: Aug. 25, 2011 at New York-AL in a 22-9 loss)...have now lost two straight after winning a season-high tying four consecutive games...are 15-11 since bottoming out at a season-high 16 games under .500 (14-30) at the conclusion of play on May 22...are 29-41 (.414) overall, which is the worst record in the American League and third worst in the majors...however, have out-scored the opposition 312-281 and the run differential of +31 is second best in the AL West, fifth best in the AL and eighth best in the majors...are 21-13 (.636) in games decided by three runs or more, which is tied for the fourth best record in the majors...have 10 wins by seven or more runs, which is the most in the majors...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 43rd consecutive day (beginning May 8) and trail first place Houston by 11½ games...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, seven days in fourth, one day tied for fourth and 43 days in fifth.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed a season-high tying four errors last night (also May 9 at Seattle and May 17 vs. Chicago-AL)...have six errors in the last two games, 10 in the last six and 69 for the season...have 13 more errors than any other team (Texas, 56) and have a .974 fielding percentage...have not finished the season with a fielding percentage under .975 since 1983 (.974)...the errors have led to 37 unearned runs, which is the most in the majors (Philadelphia, 35).

INNING BY INNING: The A's allowed eight runs in the seventh inning last night, which was their most in an inning this year...for the season, have allowed 48 runs in the seventh inning, which is their most in an inning and third most in the majors in the seventh inning...have scored 49 runs in the seventh inning, which is their most in an inning and tied with Toronto for the most by any Major League team in the seventh inning...lead the majors with 46 runs scored in the eighth inning and 115 runs scored in the seventh through ninth innings.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 12-7 with a 2.19 ERA (41 er in 168.1 ip) over the last 26 games (beginning May 23) and have allowed one run or fewer 14 times over that stretch...have a 3.07 ERA (145 er in 425.2 ip) for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...rank second in the majors in innings pitched (425.2) and fewest home runs (30).

PITCHING: The A's have a 2.94 ERA (103 er in 315.0 ip) over the last 36 games (beginning May 12) after logging a 4.17 ERA over the first 34 contests...have a 3.55 ERA overall, which ranks third in the American League...have nine shutouts, which is tied for second most in the majors (San Francisco, 11)...have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.359) and the second fewest home runs allowed (56).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .309 (69-for-223) with 47 runs scored over the last six games (7.8 runs per game)...are 32-for-80 (.400) with runners in scoring position over that stretch...for the season, the A's lead the majors in stolen base percentage (83.0%), rank second in runs (312), tied for second in triples (19), fourth in walks (223) and sixth in fewest strikeouts (474).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-2 on this five-game homestand against San Diego (1-1) and Los Angeles-AL (0-1)...have won six of the last 10 home games after starting the year 6-16...are 12-20 (.387) at home and 17-21 (.447) on the road...have the second worst home record in the majors (Milwaukee, 11-24)...the home record is the third worst record after 32 home games in Oakland history and is the worst since the 1994 club went 9-23...this homestand begins a stretch where the A's will play 15 of 18 games at home...are batting .272 (304-for-1116) with 155 runs at home (4.84 per game) compared to .247 (326-for-1322) with 157 runs on the road (4.13 per game) on the road...have a 3.11 ERA (102 er in 295.0 ip) at home compared to 3.94 (142 er in 324.0 ip) on the road...went 3-2 on the last road trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and San Diego (2-0), which was their first winning road trip since June 3-11, 2014 (5-4 vs. Yankees, Orioles and Angels)...it snaps a streak of 11 consecutive road trips with a .500 record

or worse, which fell one short of the longest such streak in Oakland history (Aug. 6, 1996-Aug. 31, 1997)...leave on Monday for a brief three-game road trip to Texas.

NIGHT AND DAY: The game today concludes an eight-day stretch from June 13-20 where the A's alternated night games and day games every day...are 20-24 (.455) in night games compared to 9-17 (.346) during the day...have won eight of their last 12 day games after losing 13 of the first 14...have the second worst record in day games in the American League (Los Angeles, 5-11)...are batting .266 (414-for-1557) at night compared to .245 (216-for-881) during the day...have the second best night batting average in the AL (Kansas City, .276).

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 3-13 (.188) when the opponent starts a left-hander pitcher compared to 26-28 (.481) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is the worst in the majors...are 0-7 against left-handed starters on the road...are batting .228 (137-for-601) against lefties compared to .268 (493-for-1837) with 50 of their 61 home runs off righties...the mark against lefties is second lowest in the American League (Chicago, .202) and the mark against righties is third highest.

CLOSE CALLS: Nine of the A's last 11 losses have been two runs or fewer...are 5-18 (.217) in one-run games and 8-28 (.222) in games decided by two runs or fewer, both of which are the worst records in the majors...are 2-11 in games decided in the last at bat...the wins are tied with the Yankees for the fewest in the majors and the losses are tied for third most...are 0-6 in extra inning games and are the only team without an extra inning win...are tied with Pittsburgh for the Major League lead in extra inning losses and are tied for second in the AL in extra inning games...have not won an extra inning game since Sept. 21, 2014, an 8-6 win over Philadelphia in 10 innings...have a six-game extra inning losing streak, which matches the longest such streak by an A's team over the last 20 years (May 18-July 5, 2011 and May 21-July 25, 1999).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have six players on the disabled list (Crisp, Doolittle, Ladendorf, Parker, Thompson, Venditte)...Crisp, Doolittle, Ladendorf, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...had at least seven players on the DL all year until yesterday...have used the DL a total of 16 times...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's trail in the season series, 4-7...are 1-3 in Oakland and 3-4 in Anaheim...have lost 14 of the last 19 games overall and 11 of the last 15 in Anaheim...are 45-42 against the Angels over the last five seasons...including 37-8 when scoring four or more runs...have been held to one run or fewer in 22 of their last 34 losses, including 12 shutouts...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 410-338 against the Angels...that includes 212-159 in Oakland and 198-179 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 459-415 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Burns Has hit safely in each of his last 10 games (17-for-44, .386) and 22 of his last 23 (35-for-101, .347)...leads American League rookies in hits (60), stolen bases (14) and multiple hit games (18)...**Josh Reddick** ranks second among AL outfielders in RBI (39) and tied for sixth in home runs (10)...**Stephen Vogt** leads Major League catchers in home runs (13), RBI (47) and slugging percentage (.608) and ranks third in batting average (.301) and on-base percentage (.379)...**Ben Zobrist** is 10-for-20 (.500) with 11 runs, four doubles, a triple, two home runs, eight RBI and four walks over his last six games.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1932** Roger Cramer ties an American League record by collecting six hits in six at bats in a nine inning game...in **1972** Catfish Hunter pitches all 11 innings of the A's 3-2 win over Detroit...Joe Rudi has three hits including the game winning homer to lead off the bottom of the 11th...in **1990** Terry Steinbach drives in six runs on a grand slam and a two-run single as the A's defeat the Tigers at Detroit, 12-7...in **2002** Billy Koch records the save in a 5-3 win at Pittsburgh, giving him the save in all three games of the three-game series against Pittsburgh.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Hahn (4-5, 3.62 ERA)

BRIEFLY: Is 3-1 with a 2.51 ERA (9 er in 32.1 ip) and .215 (26-for-121) opponents batting average over his last five starts...went 1-1 with a 2.12 ERA and .213 opponents batting average over his first three starts...left his third start April 18 at Kansas City with a blister and missed his turn in the rotation April 23...went 0-3 with a 5.86 ERA and .278 opponents batting average over a five starts stretch from April 29 to May 20.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Opponents have reached base on an error a Major League leading 12 times, which are the most by an A's pitcher since Mark Mulder also had 12 in 2004...has eight unearned runs, which are the most in the American League...is tied for second in the AL in hit batters (8), tied for sixth in opponents grounded into double plays (10) and tied for ninth in wild pitches (5)...opponents have been successful in 2-of-6 (33.3%) stolen base attempts off him, which is tied for sixth lowest in the AL.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed just three home runs in 77.0 innings for an average of 0.35 per nine innings...that is the lowest mark in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors...ranks seventh in the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.313)...has surrendered seven home runs in 150.1 career innings (0.42 per nine innings)...six have come with runners on base.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 2-1 with a 1.63 ERA (5 er in 27.2 ip) and .170 (17-for-100) opponents batting average in four starts during the day compared to 2-4 with a 4.74 ERA (26 er in 49.1 ip) and .274 (54-for-197) opponents batting average in nine starts at night...has the fifth lowest day ERA in the American League.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 0-3 with a 5.12 ERA (18 er in 31.2 ip) in six starts against American League West competition compared to 4-2 with a 2.59 ERA (13 er in 45.1 ip) in seven starts against everyone else.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has a .239 opponents batting average, which includes .181 (26-for-144) against right-handed hitters compared to .294 (45-for-153) against left-handers...the mark against righties is fourth lowest in the AL...has walked just three of the 81 batters he has faced to lead off an inning...has a .255 (27-for-106) opponents average the first time through the lineup, .167 (18-for-108) the second time through and .313 (26-for-83) after that...has allowed a .338 (22-for-65) average with runners in scoring position, which is fourth highest in the AL.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 4.15 ERA (18 er in 39.0 ip) over the first three innings of a game, 1.50 (4 er in 24.0 ip) over innings four through five and 6.08 (9 er in 13.1 ip) from the sixth inning on.

LOSING STREAK SNAPPED: Tossed a four-hit shutout May 25 against Detroit to snap his career-high tying three-game losing streak (also Aug. 5, 2014-April 7, 2015)...had a 5.86 ERA and .267 opponents batting average during the losing streak, which spanned five starts.

GO THE DISTANCE: Tossed his first career complete game against Detroit May 25, a four-hit shutout in Oakland...became the first A's pitcher with a shutout on Memorial Day since Dick Fowler and Joe Coleman did it both ends of a 1947 doubleheader against New York...according to Elias, he became the first A's pitcher to toss a shutout in a game in which his team made at least three errors since Diego Segui did it for the Kansas City A's June 15, 1965 against California...joins since Mark Mulder (April 24, 2003) as the only A's pitchers to shutout Detroit over the last 27 years.

THIS AND THAT: Went 1-4 with a 4.30 ERA in six starts in May...tied for third in the American League in May losses...the A's are 5-8 (.385) in his starting assignments...the Padres went 9-3 (.750) in his starting assignment last year...has tossed six innings or fewer in nine of his 13 starts this year...has tossed more than six innings in just seven of his 25 career starts...has walked two batters or fewer in 12 of his 13 starts this year.

2015-START-BY-START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss to Texas April 7 in Oakland...allowed base runners in each of his first five innings, including the third when he allowed a RBI single to Fielder...left after six innings trailing 3-1...had a no decision in the A's 8-7, 10-inning loss to Seattle April 12 in Oakland...retired each of the first 13 batters before Seager reached on a Semien error...took a no-hitter and a 3-0 lead into the sixth inning...allowed a leadoff double to Morrison and the Mariners ended up scoring four times, although only one run was earned...combined with Chavez on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win at Kansas City April 18...it was his first win as an Athletic...tossed 5.1 innings and allowed three of the hits...left with one out in the sixth inning with a blister...had a no decision in the A's 6-3 loss to Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland April 29...allowed a two-run single to Aybar in the first inning and a solo home run to Trout in the third...was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-7 loss at Minnesota May 4...allowed a career-high six runs on a career-high 10 hits in 5.0 innings...

the A's scored four times in the first inning but he allowed four runs in the second...Oakland scored a run in the sixth to take a 5-4 lead but he put runners on second and third to start the bottom of the sixth...was relieved by Alvarez who allowed both runs to score plus two of his own...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 7-2 loss at Seattle May 9...yielded a career-high tying six runs for the second consecutive start...had a no decision in the A's 7-6 loss to Chicago (AL) May 15 in Oakland...faced eight batters in the first inning but allowed just two runs on a bases loaded walk to LaRoche and a Gillaspie RBI single...left with a 6-2 lead and runners on first and second with one out in the seventh...the bullpen allowed both runs to score and the White Sox scored five unearned runs in the inning (Scribner blown save)...extended his losing streak to three games in the A's 6-1 loss at Houston May 20...the score was tied 1-1 entering the bottom of the sixth but he allowed a two-out two-run home run to Carter...tossed his first career complete game, a four-hit shutout against Detroit May 25 in Oakland...walked just one batter while striking out five...tossed a career-high 112 pitches...allowed only one base runners to advance into scoring position and that was Collins, who singled to lead off the fifth, went to second on a Semien error and third on a McCann grounded into double play...was aided by three double plays...was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-3 loss to New York (AL) May 30 in Oakland...allowed a run in the first inning on a McCann RBI single but then blanked the Yankees on one hit over the next three innings...the A's scored twice in the third and once in the fourth to take a 3-1 lead but he allowed an unearned run in the fifth on a Headley RBI single...then surrendered a two-run home run to Beltran in the sixth for the loss...was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-5 win at Detroit June 4...shutout the Tigers on one hit and one walk over the first five innings and had a 6-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the sixth inning...Gose and Iglesias had back-to-back two-out singles and Gose scored on a Cabrera RBI single...had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win over Texas June 10 in Oakland...tossed 3.2 innings, which matched his shortest career outing as a starter (June 3, 2014 vs. Pittsburgh)...hit three batters, which tied the Oakland single game record (ninth time, first since Barry Zito on April 15, 2005)...had a 1-0 lead after two innings but the Rangers sent nine men to the plate in the third inning and scored three times on a Fielder sacrifice fly, a Moreland RBI single and a Martin hit by pitch...also allowed a RBI single to Moreland in the fourth and left trailing 4-1.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-1 victory at San Diego on Monday...had a 3-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the third inning on a Venable RBI double...yielded just one hit over the first six innings before allowing singles to Norris and M.Upton in the seventh...was relieved by Pomeranz with two outs in the seventh and the A's leading 4-1.
