**LEADING OFF:** Today the Angels play the fourth game (2-1) of a five-game trip to Arizona (1-1) and Oakland (6/19-21; 1-0)... Halos are 18-12 vs. A.L. West foes (17-21 vs. other divisions)... **Angels are 24-18 in last 42 contests (11-15 in previous 26)**... LAA is 8-9 this month (6-3 last nine games)... **Club is 8-4 in last 12 home games (6-8 in last 14 road affairs)**... On Monday, the Angels open a nine-game homestand vs. **Houston** (6/22-24), **Seattle** (6/26-28) and **New York Yankees** (6/29-7/1).

**WHAT'S YOUR 20?** With his 13<sup>th</sup> career grand slam last night (HR #20), **Albert Pujols became 1 of 6 players all-time** with 20+ HRs in 14 of first 15 MLB seasons (ESPN STATS)... **Has 20 HRs in 65 games, fastest since his 2009 MVP season.**

**ABOUT LAST NIGHT:** Angels erased a 5-run deficit to win, largest comeback victory of season...Just second time in franchise history coming back from 5-run deficit at Oakland, first time coming back from 5-run deficit in 7<sup>th</sup> or later against A's – STATS LLC.

**DINGER DUO:** Albert Pujols has 12 HRs his last 21 games (9 this month – Club record for June is 13 by Tim Salmon in 1996)...Mike Trout has seven HRs his last 19 games...**Pujols leads A.L. with 20 HRs (Trout T2nd w/18)**...Only teammates in Top 5 in MLB in HRs...The combined 38 HRs are MLB's most by a team duo...The tandem has homered in the same game 24 times (five times in 2015).

**BE QUICK, DON'T HURRY:** Angels played their 43<sup>rd</sup> contest under three hours Thursday (Game #67)...Halos didn't play their 43<sup>rd</sup> such affair in 2014 until Game #128 (8/22/14).

**STARTING POINTS:** Halos' 40 quality starts rank second in A.L...Angels are 28-5 when limiting opposition to three runs or less...Starter's ERA of 3.94 ranks 6<sup>th</sup> in A.L...Halos starters have allowed most HRs in A.L. (57).

**HOLD ME:** Joe Smith leads MLB with 19 holds...Smith has appeared in 105 games since joining LAA in 2014 (second-most among A.L. hurlers).

**TAKE IT TO THE STREET:** Huston Street is second in A.L. with 20 saves (20/22)...Since 2011, he leads MLB converting 92% of save chances (146/158)...On May 13, 2015, Street signed a two-year contract extension through 2017...**Huston is five saves shy (295) of becoming 27th player in MLB history to reach 300 saves.**

**COMIN' IN HOT:** Albert Pujols is batting .354 (28/79) with 11 home runs and 25 RBI his last 21 contests to raise season average from .235 to .273...Mike Trout is hitting .360 (18/50) during last 13 games (11 R, 4 HR, 10 RBI)...He has hits in 26 of last 30 games (23 R, 19 XBH)...David Freese has hits in 16 of 20 games...Johnny Giavotella is batting .329 (26/79) his last 24 games...C.J. Wilson has allowed one earned run over his last two starts (15 IP).

**THIS N' THAT:** 34 players have signed from the Angels 2015 draft class...Cesar Ramos celebrates his 31<sup>st</sup> birthday June 22<sup>nd</sup>...Johnny Giavotella is batting .471 (16-for-34) in close and late situations...Albert Pujols started in the cleanup spot for the 240th time in his career Tuesday, first time with Angels and first time since May 21, 2010 (735 consecutive starts)...With Saturday's win, C.J. **ALL BAY:** Angels (415.2) and A's (425.2) starting pitchers have tossed the most innings in A.L...Since his 2011 debut, Mike Trout's 10 career home runs in Oakland are most by any visiting player...Trout has nine home runs and 23 RBI his last 21 games at O.Co Coliseum...Erick Aybar is batting .342 (83/243) in his career at O.Co Coliseum – T3rd best all-time by an opponent (min. 120 PA).

### THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY

June 20

(1980) Angels tied a club record with 26 hits at Boston en route to a 20-2 victory...Every starter in the Angels' lineup collected two-or-more hits and Fred Patek, standing at 5'4" and nicknamed "The Flea", became just the second shortstop in MLB history to post three HRs in a game (Patek hit a total of five HRs in 1980 – three coming in that game); (1999) Troy Percival recorded 127<sup>th</sup> career save to become Angels' all-time save leader in 4-2 win at New York.
