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### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (30-41) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (35-34)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have won five of the last seven games and are now 16-11 since bottoming out at a season-high 16 games under .500 (14-30) at the conclusion of play on May 22...are 30-41 (.423) overall, which is the worst record in the American League and third worst in the majors... however, have out-scored the opposition 316-282 and the run differential of +34 is second best in the AL West, tied for fifth best in the AL and tied for eighth best in the majors...are 22-13 (.629) in games decided by three runs or more, which is the third best record in the majors...have 10 wins by seven or more runs, which is the most in the majors...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 44th consecutive day (beginning May 8) and trail first place Houston by 10½ games...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, seven days in fourth, one day tied for fourth and 44 days in fifth.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 13-7 with a 2.19 ERA (42 er in 176.0 ip) over the last 27 games (beginning May 23) and have allowed one run or fewer 15 times over that stretch...have a 3.03 ERA (146 er in 433.1 ip) for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...lead the majors in innings pitched (433.1) and rank second in fewest home runs (30).

**PITCHING:** The A's have a 2.89 ERA (104 er in 324.0 ip) over the last 37 games (beginning May 12) after logging a 4.17 ERA over the first 34 contests...have a 3.51 ERA overall, which ranks third in the American League...have nine shutouts, which is tied for second most in the majors (San Francisco, 11)...have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.357), the second fewest home runs allowed (56) and the fourth lowest opponents batting average (.239) and on-base percentage (.304).

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .310 (80-for-258) with 51 runs scored (7.3 per game) and 21 doubles over the last seven games...are 36-for-94 (.383) with runners in scoring position over that stretch...for the season, the A's lead the majors in stolen base percentage (83.3%)...are tied for second in the American League in triples (19), rank third in runs (316), doubles (121) and walks (226) and fourth in batting average (.259), extra base hits (201) and fewest strikeouts (480).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's committed a season-high tying four errors Friday night (also May 9 at Seattle and May 17 vs. Chicago-AL)...have seven errors in the last three games, 11 in the last seven and 70 for the season...have 12 more errors than any other team (Texas, 58) and have a .974 fielding percentage...have not finished the season with a fielding percentage under .975 since 1983 (.974)...the errors have led to 37 unearned runs, which is the most in the majors (Philadelphia, 35).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 2-2 on this five-game homestand against San Diego (1-1) and Los Angeles-AL (1-1)...have won seven of the last 11 home games after starting the year 6-16...are 13-20 (.394) at home and 17-21 (.447) on the road...have the second worst home record in the American League (Cleveland, 13-21)...have finished the season with a home winning percentage under .429 once in Oakland history and that was in 1979 (31-50, .383)...this homestand begins a stretch where the A's will play 15 of 18 games at home...the only road games during the stretch are three games in Texas beginning Tuesday...are batting .274 (315-for-1151) with 159 runs at home (4.82 per game) compared to .247 (326-for-1322) with 157 runs on the road (4.13 per game) on the road...have a 3.05 ERA (103 er in 304.0 ip) at home compared to 3.94 (142 er in 324.0 ip) on the road...went 3-2 on the last road trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and San Diego (2-0), which was their first winning road trip since June 3-11, 2014 (5-4 vs. Yankees, Orioles and Angels)...it snaps a streak of 11 consecutive road trips with a .500 record or worse, which fell one short of the longest such streak in Oakland history (Aug. 6, 1996-Aug. 31, 1997).

**NIGHT AND DAY:** The A's are 20-24 (.455) in night games compared to 10-17 (.370) during the day...have won nine of their last 13 day games after losing 13 of the first 14...have the second worst record in day games in the American League (Los Angeles, 5-12)...are batting .266 (414-for-1557) at night compared to .248 (227-for-916) during the day...have the third best night batting average in the AL.

**LEFT AND RIGHT:** The A's are 3-13 (.188) when the opponent starts a left-hander pitcher compared to 27-28 (.491) when they start a right-hander...

the mark against lefties is the worst in the majors...are 0-7 against left-handed starters on the road...are batting .229 (139-for-607) against lefties compared to .269 (502-for-1866) with 50 of their 61 home runs off righties...the mark against lefties is third lowest in the American League and the mark against righties is third highest.

**CLOSE CALLS:** Nine of the A's last 11 losses have been two runs or fewer...are 5-18 (.217) in one-run games and 8-28 (.222) in games decided by two runs or fewer, both of which are the worst records in the majors...are 2-11 in games decided in the last at bat...the wins are tied with the Yankees for the fewest in the majors and the losses are tied for third most...are 0-6 in extra inning games and are the only team without an extra inning win...are tied with Pittsburgh for the Major League lead in extra inning losses and are tied for second in the AL in extra inning games...have not won an extra inning game since Sept. 21, 2014, an 8-6 win over Philadelphia in 10 innings...have a six-game extra inning losing streak, which matches the longest such streak by an A's team over the last 20 years (May 18-July 5, 2011 and May 21-July 25, 1999).

**INNING BY INNING:** The A's have scored 49 runs in the seventh inning, allowed 48 runs and committed 11 errors, all of which are their most in any inning...are tied for the Major League lead in runs scored in the seventh inning and rank third in runs allowed...lead the majors in runs scored in the eighth inning (46) and in innings seven through nine (115).

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are 10-8 in June after going 11-19 in May and 9-14 in April...have four consecutive months with a losing record after recording 14 straight months with a winning record...have used 18 relievers, which is already their most since 2012 when they also had 18...have used 22 pitchers overall, which matches the season total from last year.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have six players on the disabled list (Crisp, Doolittle, Ladendorf, Parker, Thompson, Venditte)...Crisp, Doolittle, Ladendorf, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...had at least seven players on the DL all year until Friday...have used the DL a total of 16 times...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

**A's vs. ANGELS:** The A's trail in the season series, 5-7...are 2-3 in Oakland and 3-4 in Anaheim...have lost 14 of the last 20 games overall and 11 of the last 15 in Anaheim...are 46-42 against the Angels over the last five seasons, including 38-8 when scoring four or more runs...have been held to one run or fewer in 22 of their last 34 losses, including 12 shutouts...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 411-338 against the Angels...that includes 213-159 in Oakland and 198-179 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 460-415 against the Angels.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Billy Burns** extended his hitting streak to 11 games yesterday, which is one short of his career high of 12 (May 26 to June 20)...has also hit safely in 23 of his last 24 games (37-for-106, .349)...leads Major League rookies in stolen bases (15) and multiple hit games (19) and is tied for the lead in hits (62)...**Brett Lawrie** is batting .356 (21-for-59) in June...**Josh Reddick** ranks second among American League outfielders in RBI (40), sixth in slugging (.483) and tied for sixth in home runs (10)...**Stephen Vogt** has reached base safely in all 32 of his home games, which is the second longest season-opening home reaching base streak in Oakland history (33, Rickey Henderson in 1993)...leads Major League catchers in home runs (13), RBI (47) and slugging percentage (.608), ranks second in on-base percentage (.379) and third in batting average (.301)...**Ben Zobrist** is 10-for-23 (.435) with 12 runs, four doubles, a triple, two home runs, eight RBI and five walks over his last seven games.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1971** Vida Blue improves his record to 15-2 and strikes out 13 as the A's defeat the Twins at Minnesota, 3-2...in **2000** Eric Chavez becomes the first player to hit for the cycle in the Coliseum as the A's defeat Baltimore, 10-3...at the age of 22 years, 197 days, Chavez becomes the eighth youngest player in major league history to hit for the cycle...in **2002** Billy Koch records the save in the A's 5-3 win at Cincinnati, making him the first pitcher in Oakland history with five saves in five consecutive team games.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Scott Kazmir (3-4, 2.84 ERA)

**BRIEFLY:** Is 1-1 with a 2.18 ERA (5 er in 20.2 ip) and .203 (15-for-74) opponents batting average over his last four starts...went 2-0 with a 0.99 ERA and .158 opponents average over his first four starts and 0-3 with a 5.14 ERA and .291 opponents average in five starts in between (May 1-22)...has a 2.84 ERA overall, which ranks 10th in the American League.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 2-1 with a 1.274 ERA (5 er in 35.1 ip) and .148 (18-for-122) opponents batting average in six starts in Oakland compared to 1-3 with a 4.20 ERA (19 er in 40.2 ip) and .280 (44-for-157) opponents average in seven starts on the road...has the lowest home opponents batting average in the majors and the second lowest ERA (Burnett, PIT 1.266)...has not allowed a run in four of his six home starts...has allowed all seven of his home runs on the road.

**AGAINST THE WEST:** Is 3-0 with a 1.06 ERA (4 er in 34.0 ip) in five starts against American League West opponents compared to 0-4 with a 4.29 ERA (20 er in 42.0 ip) in eight starts against everyone else.

**WITH RUNNERS ON BASE:** Has allowed a .253 (41-for-162) batting average with the bases empty compared to .179 (21-for-117) with runners on base...the mark with runners on base is the lowest among American League pitchers with enough innings to qualify for the ERA title...opponents are hitting .193 (11-for-57) with runners in scoring position, which ranks fourth among AL qualifiers...opponents are 1-for-22 (.045) with RISP and two outs...opponents are now 6-for-84 (.071) off him with RISP and two outs over the last two years...five of the seven home runs he has allowed this year have come with the bases empty.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is 1-1 with a 2.28 ERA (7 er in 27.2 ip) and .188 (19-for-101) opponents batting average in five starts during the day compared to 2-3 with a 3.17 ERA (17 er in 48.1 ip) and .242 (43-for-178) opponents average in eight starts at night...has the 10th lowest day ERA in the American League...has allowed six of his seven home runs at night.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has issued 26 of his 29 walks to right-handed hitters...has held the opponents number three hitter to a .152 (5-for-33) batting average, which is tied for fifth lowest in the AL...the two through four hitters are a combined 16-for-96 (.167)...has allowed a .319 (36-for-113) batting average and six of his seven home runs with no outs...opponents are hitting .213 (19-for-89) with one out and .091 (7-for-77) with two outs...has yielded a .342 (25-for-73) average and four of his six home runs to batters leading off an inning...has a .603 slugging percentage against batters leading off an inning...the slugging percentage leading off an inning is second highest in the AL among qualifiers for the ERA title and the batting average is third highest.

**RUN SUPPORT:** Has received 12 runs of support in his last two starts after tallying just nine runs of support over his previous nine starts (50.0 ip, 1.62 RSA)...has three starts this year with seven or more runs of support and eight starts with two runs or fewer.

**MONTH BY MONTH:** Is 1-1 with a 2.55 ERA (5 er in 17.2 ip) in three starts in June...went 0-3 with a 4.65 ERA and .269 opponents batting average in six starts in May after going 2-0 with a 0.99 ERA and .158 opponents average in four starts in April...posted the fourth lowest April ERA in the American League...in two seasons with the A's, he is 6-0 with a 1.64 ERA in 10 starts in April, 2-5 with a 3.67 ERA in 11 starts in May and 4-2 with a 2.92 ERA (17 er in 52.1 ip) in nine starts in June.

**FOUR-GAME LOSING STREAK SNAPPED:** Tossed 8.0 shutout innings June 11 against Texas to snap a four-game losing streak...compiled a 4.85 ERA and .299 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned six starts from May 6 to June 5...tossed six innings or fewer in all six starts during the losing streak, which is the longest by an Athletic this year.

**2015 HIGHLIGHTS:** He combined with Otero and Alvarez on a three-hit shutout in the A's 10-0 win over Texas **April 8**...tossed seven innings and allowed just one hit while striking out 10...it was his 23rd career 10-strikeout game, his second with the A's...became just the fifth pitcher in Oakland history to strikeout 10 while allowing one hit or fewer, the first since Barry Zito on Aug. 4, 2001 vs. Detroit (10 so, 1 h)...was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-1 win at Houston **April 13**...retired each of the first nine batters to extend his season-opening scoreless streak to 10.0 innings...struck out eight to become the only A's pitcher on an Opening Day roster since at least 1914 to strike out eight or more batters in each of his first two starts of the season...had a no decision in the A's 4-2 loss at Kansas City **April 19**...left with a 2-1 lead but the bullpen blew the save...it was the first of three times the bullpen blew a save in his start (May 11 vs. Boston, June 16 at San Diego)...had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 5-4, 11 inning loss to Houston **April 24** in Oakland...tossed 7.0 shutout innings and allowed just five hits while walking three...Keuchel shutout the A's on two hits in nine innings of work and the game was scoreless going into extra

innings...that gave him a season-opening stretch where he pitched six or more innings and allowed two runs or fewer in each of his first four starts, which matched the longest such streak by an A's pitcher on the Opening Day roster since at least 1914 (fifth time, last: Jesse Chavez, 2014)...had his third straight no decision in the A's 7-5 win at Texas **May 1**...left after six innings trailing 3-0 and the Rangers built a 5-0 lead before the A's scored seven times in the eighth for the win...was the losing pitcher in the A's 13-0 loss at Minnesota **May 6**...Gibson, Pressly and Graham combined to shutout the A's on six hits...extended his losing streak to three games in the A's 5-2 loss at Tampa Bay **May 22**...it was the 250th appearance of his career...had a no decision in the A's 3-2 loss to Detroit **May 27** in Oakland...it was the 250th start of his career...did not allow a run or hit but tossed a season-low 3.0 innings before leaving the game with tightness in his left shoulder...missed a turn in the rotation...combined with Scribner on a one-hit shutout in the A's 7-0 win over Texas **June 11** in Oakland...tossed eight of the innings and allowed the one hit on a one-out single by Andrus in the fifth inning...it was his first win since April 13.

**LAST START:** He had a no decision in the A's 6-5 win at San Diego last Tuesday...allowed a solo home run to Hedges in the third inning to give the Padres a 1-0 lead...the A's then scored three times in the fifth inning and he drove in the tying run with a single...allowed a RBI single to Barnes in the fourth and an unearned run in the fifth when M.Upton reached on a Kazmir error, stole second, went to third on a ground out and scored on a balk on a steal of home attempt...left with a 5-3 lead but the bullpen allowed two runs in the eighth for the blown save.

**KAZMIR vs. LOS ANGELES:** Is 2-5 with a 7.56 ERA (33.1 ip, 39 h, 29 r, 28 er, 16 bb, 31 so, 3 hr) in seven career starts...the ERA is his highest against any team he has faced more than twice...has a four-game losing streak against the Angels (21 er in 14.0 ip, 13.50 ERA) and has not won since May 10, 2008...has tossed 3.0 innings or fewer in each of his last three starts...is 2-3 with a 6.75 ERA (19 er in 25.1 ip) in five starts in his home ballparks and 0-2 with a 10.13 ERA (9 er in 8.0 ip) in two starts at Angel Stadium as a visiting pitcher...pitched for the Angels from 2009-11 and is 2-11 with a 5.88 ERA (54 er in 82.2 ip) in 16 career starts at Angel Stadium...the winning percentage is the lowest in Angel Stadium history among pitchers with 10 or more decisions...went 0-2 with a 27.00 ERA (4.1 ip, 12 h, 13 r, 13 er, 6 bb, 1 so) in two starts last year...the first loss came in a 9-4 decision in Oakland Aug. 24...allowed three runs in the second inning, a two-run home run to Hamilton in the third and was charged with two more runs in the fourth...also lost his next start at Anaheim, an 8-1 decision on Aug. 31...allowed six runs in a career-low tying 1.1 innings pitched (also May 17, 2014 at Cleveland)...retired the side in order in the first inning before facing seven Angels in the second inning and recording just one out.

## TUESDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**RHP Jesse Chavez (3-6, 2.52 ERA):** Has the sixth lowest ERA in the American League but is tied for ninth in losses and is tied for the seventh lowest winning percentage (.333)...has the third lowest run support in the AL (2.63)...is 2-2 with a 2.06 ERA over his last five starts...ranks sixth in the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.313) and eighth in opponents on-base percentage (.281)...has allowed just four home runs in 78.2 innings and his average of 0.46 home runs per nine innings is third lowest in the AL...is 3-6 despite a 2.75 ERA in his 11 starting assignments...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 16-2 A's win over San Diego Wednesday in Oakland when he struck out a career-high 11 (7.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb)...is 1-1 with a 5.04 ERA in 12 career appearances, including one start, against Texas...faced the Rangers once this year in relief on April 7 in Oakland (1.1 ip, 1 so).

- The A's bullpen is 2-3 with a 5.27 ERA (16 er in 27.1 ip), two saves and four blown saves over its past 12 games (beginning June 7).
