OAKLAND ATHLETICS (31-41) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (37-33)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won six of the last eight games and are now 17-11 since bottoming out at a season-high 16 games under .500 (14-30) at the conclusion of play on May 22...are 31-41 (.431) overall, which is the worst record in the American League and fourth worst in the majors...however, have out-scored the opposition 319-284 and the run differential of +35 is second best in the AL West, fifth best in the AL and eighth best in the majors...are 22-13 (.629) in games decided by three runs or more, which is the third best record in the majors...have 10 wins by seven or more runs, which is the most in the majors...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 46th consecutive day (beginning May 8) and trail first place Houston by 10 games...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, seven days in fourth, one day tied for fourth and 46 days in fifth.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 14-7 with a 2.11 ERA (43 er in 183.1 ip) over the last 28 games (beginning May 23) and have allowed one run or fewer 16 times over that stretch...have a 3.00 ERA (147 er in 440.2 ip) for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and second lowest in the majors (St. Louis, 2.99)...lead the majors in innings pitched (440.2) and rank second in fewest home runs (30).

PITCHING: The A's have a 2.86 ERA (106 er in 333.0 ip) over the last 37 games (beginning May 12) after logging a 4.17 ERA over the first 34 contests...have a 3.49 ERA overall, which ranks second in the American League (Tampa Bay, 3.35)...have nine shutouts, which is tied for second most in the majors (San Francisco, 11)...have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.356), the second fewest home runs allowed (57), the third lowest opponents batting average (.239) and fourth lowest on-base percentage (.304).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .304 (88-for-289) with 54 runs scored (6.8 per game) and 23 doubles over the last eight games...are 39-for-100 (.390) with runners in scoring position over that stretch...for the season, the A's are tied with New York (NL) for the Major League lead in stolen base percentage (81.8%)...are tied for second in the American League in triples (19), rank third in runs (319) and walks (228), tied for third in doubles (123), are fourth in extra base hits (203) and fewest strikeouts (483) and fifth in batting average (.259).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have eight errors in the last four games, 12 in the last eight and 71 for the season...including a season-high tying four errors Friday night (also May 9 at Seattle and May 17 vs. Chicago-AL)...have 13 more errors than any other team (Texas, 58) and have a .974 fielding percentage...have not finished the season with a fielding percentage under .975 since 1983 (.974)...the errors have led to 37 unearned runs, which is the most in the majors (Philadelphia, 35).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are in the middle of a stretch where they will play 15 of 18 games at home...the only road games during the stretch are three games in Texas beginning today...went 3-2 on the last homestand against San Diego (1-1) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1)...have won eight of the last 12 home games after starting the year 6-16...are 14-20 (.412) at home and 17-21 (.447) on the road...have the second worst home record in the American League (Cleveland, 14-22)...have finished the season with a home winning percentage under .429 once in Oakland history and that was in 1979 (31-50, .383)...are batting .273 (323-for-1182) with 162 runs at home (4.76 per game) compared to .247 (326-for-1322) with 157 runs on the road (4.13 per game) on the road...have a 3.02 ERA (105 er in 313.0 ip) at home compared to 3.94 (142 er in 324.0 ip) on the road...went 3-2 on the last road trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and San Diego (2-0), which was their first winning road trip since June 3-11, 2014 (5-4 vs. Yankees, Orioles and Angels)...it snaps a streak of 11 consecutive road trips with a .500 record or worse, which fell one short of the longest such streak in Oakland history (Aug. 6, 1996-Aug. 31, 1997).

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's are 20-24 (.455) in night games compared to 11-17 (.393) during the day...have won 10 of their last 14 day games after losing 13 of the first 14...have the second worst record in day games in the American League (Los Angeles, 5-13)...are batting .266 (414-for-1557) at

night compared to .248 (235-for-947) during the day...have the third best night batting average in the AL.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 3-13 (.188) when the opponent starts a left-hander pitcher compared to 28-28 (.500) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is the worst in the majors...are 0-7 against left-handed starters on the road...are batting .229 (139-for-607) against lefties compared to .269 (510-for-1897) with 50 of their 61 home runs off righties...the mark against lefties is third lowest in the American League and the mark against righties is third highest.

CLOSE CALLS: Nine of the A's last 11 losses have been by two runs or fewer...are 5-18 (.217) in one-run games and 8-28 (.222) in games decided by two runs or fewer, both of which are the worst records in the majors...are 2-11 in games decided in the last at bat...the wins are tied with the Yankees for the fewest in the majors and the losses are tied for third most...are 0-6 in extra inning games and are the only team without an extra inning win...are tied with Pittsburgh for the Major League lead in extra inning losses and are tied for third in the AL in extra inning games...have not won an extra inning game since Sept. 21, 2014, an 8-6 win over Philadelphia in 10 innings...have a six-game extra inning losing streak, which matches the longest such streak by an A's team over the last 20 years (May 18-July 5, 2011 and May 21-July 25, 1999).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 11-8 in June after going 11-19 in May and 9-14 in April...have four consecutive months with a losing record after recording 14 straight months with a winning record...have used 18 relievers, which is already their most since 2012 when they also had 18...have used 22 pitchers overall, which matches the season total from last year..

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have six players on the disabled list (Crisp, Doolittle, Ladendorf, Parker, Thompson, Venditte)...Crisp, Doolittle, Ladendorf, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...had at least seven players on the DL all year until Friday...have used the DL a total of 17 times...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's lead the season series, 6-4...are 4-3 in Oakland and 2-1 at Texas...over the last two years, are 6-10 in Oakland and 9-4 in Texas...have won three season series and lost three season series over the previous six years and are 62-62 over the last seven years...are 328-338 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 173-161 in Oakland and 155-177 in Texas...including 88-89 at Globe Life Park...have an all-time record of 425-420 against the Rangers/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Burns extended his hitting streak to a career-high tying 12 games Sunday (also: May 26 to June 20)...has hit safely in 24 of his last 25 games and is batting .345 (38-for-110) with 18 runs scored and 11 multiple hit games over that span...leads Major League rookies in stolen bases (15) and multiple hit games (19)...**Brett Lawrie** is batting .365 (23-for-63) in June...**Stephen Vogt** is 11-for-25 (.440) with three doubles, two home runs and 11 RBI over his last seven games...leads Major League catchers in home runs (13), RBI (47) and slugging percentage (.604), ranks second in on-base percentage (.381) and third in batting average (.302)...**Ben Zobrist** is 11-for-27 (.407) with 13 runs, four doubles, a triple, two home runs, eight RBI and five walks over his last eight games.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1978** Tim Conroy becomes the youngest Oakland pitcher to start a game at the age of 18 years, 81 days...he had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win at Kansas City (3.1 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 1 er, 5 bb, 1 so)...in **1979**, four days after turning their second triple play of the season, the A's turn their third against Texas, tying a Major League record...in **1992** the A's score 10 runs in the third inning of a 12-7 win against Seattle...Harold Baines has five RBI in the inning with a two-run double and a three-run homer and has seven RBI for the day...in **1997** Jason Giambi extends his hitting streak to an Oakland record 25 games in a 6-5 loss at Seattle, breaking the mark of 24 set by Carney Lansford in 1984.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Chavez (3-6, 2.52 ERA)

BRIEFLY: Is 3-6 with a 2.52 ERA in 15 games, including 11 starts...has the sixth lowest ERA in the American League but is tied for ninth in losses and is tied for the seventh lowest winning percentage (.333)...has received no run support in four of his 11 starts and has received two runs or fewer in eight starts...is averaging 2.88 (23 rs in 72.0 ip) runs of support in his 11 starting assignments...his season RSA of 2.63 (23 rs in 78.2 ip) is third lowest in the AL.

LAST FIVE STARTS: Is 2-2 with a 2.06 ERA (8 er in 35.0 ip) over his last five starts...has tossed seven or more innings in four of those outings and has allowed one run or fewer three times over that stretch.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Ranks sixth in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.313) and eighth in opponents on-base percentage (.281)...has allowed just four home runs in 78.2 innings and his average of 0.46 home runs per nine innings is fourth lowest in the AL...has issued 15 of his 19 walks to right-handed hitters...has yielded three of his four home runs to lefties...has walked just four of the 80 batters he has faced leading off an inning.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 2-2 with a 1.71 ERA (9 er in 47.1 ip) in nine games at night compared to 1-4 with a 3.73 ERA (13 er in 31.1 ip) in six games during the day.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 3-6 despite a 2.75 ERA (22 er in 72.0 ip) in his 11 starting assignments...began the season in the bullpen and did not allow a run in his four relief appearances (6.2 ip)...his first start came April 23 when Jesse Hahn missed a start due to a blister...remained in the rotation following the option of Kendall Graveman to Nashville April 26...is now 11-14 with a 3.53 ERA (81 er in 206.1 ip) in 34 career starts, 9-15 with a 5.02 ERA in 204 relief appearances.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 1.23 ERA (3 er in 22.0 ip) in the first and second innings, a 3.82 ERA (14 er in 33.0 ip) in the third through fifth innings and a 1.90 ERA (5 er in 23.2 ip) from the sixth inning on.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 0-3 with a 3.90 ERA (12 er in 27.2 ip) in seven games against American League West competition compared to 3-3 with a 1.76 ERA (10 er in 51.0 ip) in eight games against everyone else.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-2 with a 1.75 ERA (7 er in 36.0 ip) in seven games at home compared to 1-4 with a 3.16 ERA (12 er in 35.2 ip) in eight games on the road...has the fifth lowest home ERA in the American League...has surrendered all three of his home runs on the road.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 3-4 with a 1.65 ERA (9 er in 49.0 ip) in seven starts on four days rest compared to 0-2 with a 5.09 ERA (13 er in 23.0 ip) in four starts on five days rest or more.

MONTH BY MONTH: Is 1-1 with a 3.79 ERA (8 er in 19.0 ip) in three starts in June...went 2-3 with a 1.93 ERA in six starts in May...tied for sixth in the American League in losses in May but had the fourth lowest ERA...went 0-2 with a 2.55 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in six games, including two starts, this April...is 2-2 with a 2.10 ERA in 12 games, eight starts, in April over the last two years...has a 2.68 career ERA in April, which is his best for any month of the season

IN RELIEF: Stranded his only inherited runner in his four relief appearances and first batters faced were 1-for-4 (.250)...recorded the save in his final relief appearance April 18 at Kansas City, tossing 3.2 scoreless innings...has two career saves, both at Kansas City and both at least 3.2 innings...struck out six, which matched the most by an A's pitcher in a game in which he recorded the save...the only other time it happened since the save became an official stat in 1969 was by Rollie Fingers on Sept. 1, 1972 against Detroit.

THE LAST THREE YEARS: Is 13-18 with a 3.29 ERA (103 er in 282.0 ip) in 82 games, including 32 starts, over the last three years...started his career by going 7-11 with a 5.99 ERA in 156 games, including two starts, over his first five years from 2008-12

2015 START-BY-START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-0 loss at Los Angeles (AL) **April 23**...tossed six innings and allowed just one hit, a two-run home run by Calhoun in the third inning...it was the Angels only hit of the game...Tropeano, Salas, Smith and Street combined to shutout the A's on eight hits...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 6-5 loss to Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland **April 30**...left after five innings trailing 4-0...was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 win at Minnesota **May 5**...it was his first win since July 23, 2014...allowed his only run in the eighth inning on a Dozier RBI single...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-3 loss at Seattle **May 10**...had a 1-0 when Seager had a RBI double and Ackley added a two-run double in the fourth...had a no decision in the A's 4-3 loss to Chicago (AL) **May 16** in Oakland...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed his only runs

in the third inning on a two-run single by Garcia...was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-0 loss at Tampa Bay **May 21**...DeJesus had a RBI double in the fourth and a solo home run in the seventh...Colome and four Rays relievers combined to shutout the A's on six hits and two walks...was the losing pitcher in the A's 1-0 loss to Detroit **May 26** in Oakland...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings and allowed just five hits...the only run came in the first inning and it was unearned...retired 12 straight at one point...Price and three relievers combined to shutout the A's on seven hits...combined with Clippard on an eight-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win over New York in Oakland on **May 31**...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings for the second consecutive start and allowed seven of the hits...also tossed a career-high 110 pitches...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss at Boston **June 6**...allowed a career-high tying 10 hits in 5.0 innings...surrendered a two-run home run to Ramirez in the first inning to snap his scoreless streak at a career-high 15.0 innings...had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss at Los Angeles (AL) **June 12**...left with a 4-3 lead...was relieved by Scribner to start the eighth and he allowed solo home runs to Trout and Calhoun for the blown save and loss.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 16-2 win over San Diego last Wednesday in Oakland...struck out a career-high 11 batters, which tied the Oakland record for strikeouts in an interleague game (fifth time, last: Rich Harden, June 26, 2008 vs. Philadelphia)...shutout the Padres on two hits over the first five innings and had a 5-0 lead when Amarista homered to lead off the sixth...that was the only time he allowed a runner past first base in his seven innings of work.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Kendall Graveman (3-4, 4.02 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville May 23 for his second stint with the A's this year and is 2-2 with a 2.27 ERA and .247 opponents batting average in six starts since his return...has tossed seven or more innings and allowed two runs or fewer in each of his last three starts but has a no decision and two losses over that span (1.63 ERA)...is just the second A's pitcher since at least 1914 to toss seven or more innings and allow two runs or fewer in three consecutive starts without earning a win in any of the starts (Orlando Pena, May 5-15, 1963)...is 3-1 with a 1.78 ERA in six starts on the road compared to 0-3 with a 7.84 ERA in four starts at home...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 3-1 loss to San Diego last Thursday in Oakland (7.0 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 6 so)...was the losing pitcher in his only career start against Texas, a 10-1 A's loss in Oakland on April 9 (3.1 ip, 7 h, 8 r, 7 er, 1 bb, 1 so).

- Has a 4.58 ERA for the season, which is the highest in the American League and tied with Colorado for the highest in the majors...has 16 losses, which are the most in the majors.
- Is tied for the AL lead in blown saves (12), has the second fewest saves (13) and the second lowest save percentage (52.0%).
- Is tied for third in the AL in home runs allowed (27).
- Has allowed the most first batter RBI in the majors (34) and the second most home runs (9).
- The A's are 4-27 when the bullpen allows two runs or more, 26-13 when it allows one run or fewer (two complete games).
