OAKLAND ATHLETICS (32-41) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (37-34)

WEDNESDAY, JUNE 24, 2015 – GLOBE LIFE PARK – 7:05 P.M. CDT RHP KENDALL GRAVEMAN (3-4, 4.02) VS. LHP WANDY RODRIGUEZ (4-2, 3.20) CSNCA – A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won seven of the last nine games and are now 18-11 since bottoming out at a season-high 16 games under .500 (14-30) at the conclusion of play on May 22...are 32-41 (.438) overall, which is the second worst record in the American League and fifth worst in the majors...however, have out-scored the opposition 327-290 and the run differential of +37 is second best in the AL West, fifth best in the AL and eighth best in the majors...are 22-13 (.629) in games decided by three runs or more, which is the third best record in the majors...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 47th consecutive day (beginning May 8) and trail first place Houston by 10 games...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days in fifth.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 15-7 with a 2.29 ERA (48 er in 188.1 ip) over the last 29 games (beginning May 23) and have allowed one run or fewer 16 times over that stretch...have a 3.07 ERA (152 er in 445.2 ip) for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and second lowest in the majors (St. Louis, 3.00)...lead the majors in innings pitched (445.2) and rank second in fewest home runs (31).

PITCHING: The A's have a 2.96 ERA (111 er in 338.0 ip) over the last 38 games (beginning May 12) after logging a 4.17 ERA over the first 34 contests...have a 3.51 ERA overall, which ranks second in the American League (Tampa Bay, 3.33)...have nine shutouts, which is tied for second most in the majors (San Francisco, 11)...have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.359), the second fewest home runs allowed (58), the third lowest opponents batting average (.240) and fourth lowest on-base percentage (.305).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .304 (99-for-326) with 62 runs scored (6.9 per game) and 26 doubles over the last nine games...are 43-for-108 (.398) with runners in scoring position over that stretch...for the season, the A's are second in the majors in stolen base percentage (81.8%)...are tied for second in the American League in triples (19), rank fourth in runs (327) and walks (230), tied for fourth in doubles (126), are fourth in extra base hits (208) and fewest strikeouts (488) and fifth in batting average (.260).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have nine errors in the last five games, 13 in the last nine and 72 for the season, including a season-high tying four errors Friday night (also May 9 at Seattle and May 17 vs. Chicago-AL)... have 14 more errors than any other team (Texas, 58) and have a .974 fielding percentage, which is the lowest in the majors...have not finished the season with a fielding percentage under .975 since 1983 (.974)...the errors have led to 38 unearned runs, which is the most in the majors (Philadelphia, 35).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are in the middle of a stretch where they will play 15 of 18 games at home...the only road games during the stretch are being played during the current three-game series in Texas...went 3-2 on the last homestand against San Diego (1-1) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1)...have won eight of the last 12 home games after starting the year 6-16...are 14-20 (.412) at home and 18-21 (.462) on the road...have the second worst home record in the American League (Cleveland, 14-22)... have finished the season with a home winning percentage under .429 once in Oakland history and that was in 1979 (31-50, .383)...are batting .273 (323-for-1182) with 162 runs at home (4.76 per game) compared to .248 (337-for-1359) with 165 runs on the road (4.23 per game) on the road... have a 3.02 ERA (105 er in 313.0 ip) at home compared to 3.97 (147 er in 333.0 ip) on the road...went 3-2 on the last road trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and San Diego (2-0), which was their first winning road trip since June 3-11, 2014 (5-4 vs. Yankees, Orioles and Angels)...it snaps a streak of 11 consecutive road trips with a .500 record or worse, which fell one short of the longest such streak in Oakland history (Aug. 6, 1996-Aug. 31, 1997).

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's are 21-24 (.467) in night games compared to 11-17 (.393) during the day...have won 10 of their last 14 day games after losing 13 of the first 14...have the second worst record in day games in the American League (Los Angeles, 5-13)...are batting .267 (425-for-1594) at night compared to .248 (235-for-947) during the day...have the third best night batting average in the AL.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 3-13 (.188) when the opponent starts a lefthander pitcher compared to 29-28 (.509) when they start a right-hander... the mark against lefties is the worst in the majors...are 0-7 against lefthanded starters on the road...are batting .227 (140-for-616) against lefties compared to .70 (520-for-1925) with 52 of their 63 home runs off righties... the mark against lefties is second lowest in the American League and the mark against righties is third highest.

CLOSE CALLS: Nine of the A's last 11 losses have been by two runs or fewer...are 6-18 (.250) in one-run games and 10-28 (.263) in games decided by two runs or fewer, both of which are the worst records in the majors...are 2-11 in games decided in the last at bat...the wins are tied with the Yankees for the fewest in the majors and the losses are tied for third most...are 0-6 in extra inning games and are the only team without an extra inning win...are tied with Pittsburgh for the Major League lead in extra inning losses and are tied for third in the AL in extra inning games... have not won an extra inning game since Sept. 21, 2014, an 8-6 win over Philadelphia in 10 innings...have a six-game extra inning losing streak, which matches the longest such streak by an A's team over the last 20 years (May 18-July 5, 2011 and May 21-July 25, 1999).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 12-8 in June after going 11-19 in May and 9-14 in April...have four consecutive months with a losing record after recording 14 straight months with a winning record...need to go at least 2-5 over the final seven games in June to avoid their fifth straight losing month...have used 18 relievers, which is already their most since 2012 when they also had 18...have used 22 pitchers overall, which matches the season total from last year.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have six players on the disabled list (Crisp, Doolittle, Ladendorf, Parker, Thompson, Venditte)...Crisp, Doolittle, Ladendorf, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...had at least seven players on the DL all year until Friday...have used the DL a total of 17 times...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's lead the season series, 7-4...are 4-3 in Oakland and 3-1 at Texas...over the last two years, are 6-10 in Oakland and 10-4 in Texas...have won three season series and lost three season series over the previous six years and are 63-62 over the last seven years...are 329-338 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 173-161 in Oakland and 156-177 in Texas...including 89-89 at Globe Life Park... have an all-time record of 426-420 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Burns extended his hitting streak to a career-high 13 games yesterday...also had a 12-game streak from May 26 to June 20, which account for the two longest hitting streaks by a rookie this season...has hit safely in 25 of his last 26 games and is batting .339 (39-for-115) with 18 runs scored and 11 multiple hit games over that span...leads Major League rookies in stolen bases (15) and multiple hit games (19)... **Brett Lawrie** is batting .343 (23-for-67) in June...**Stephen Vogt** is 11-for-25 (.440) with three doubles, two home runs and 11 RBI over his last seven games...leads Major League catchers in home runs (13), RBI (47) and slugging percentage (.604), ranks second in on-base percentage (.381) and batting average (.302)...**Ben Zobrist** is 13-for-31 (.419) with 15 runs, four doubles, a triple, three home runs, 10 RBI and six walks over his last nine games...**Drew Pomeranz** earned his first career save last night.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1979** Rickey Henderson steals the first base of his career in his Major League debut in the first game of a doubleheader against Texas...he doubles in his first big league at bat and adds a single in three other at bats...in **2012** Derek Norris hits his first Major League home run, a walk-off three-run blast in the A's 4-2 win over San Francisco..

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (3-4, 4.02 ERA)

FOR OPENERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville May 23 for his second stint with the A's this year and is 2-2 with a 2.27 ERA (10 er in 39.2 ip) and .247 (37-for-150) opponents batting average in six starts since his return...was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 1-2 with an 8.27 ERA and .348 opponents batting average in four starts before he was optioned to Nashville April 26...went 2-1 with a 1.85 ERA in four starts with the Sounds.

LAST THREE STARTS: Has tossed seven or more innings and allowed two runs or fewer in each of his last three starts but has a no decision and two losses over that span (4 er in 22.0 ip, 1.63 ERA)...the bullpen blew the save in the no decision and the A's lost 1-0 and 3-1 in his two losses... is just the second A's pitcher since at least 1914 to toss seven or more innings and allow two runs or fewer in three consecutive starts without earning a win in any of the starts...the other was Orlando Pena for the Kansas City A's (May 5-15, 1963).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-1 with a 1.78 ERA (7 er in 35.1 ip) and .248 (33-for-133) opponents batting average in six starts on the road compared to 0-3 with a 7.84 ERA (18 er in 20.2 ip) and .322 (28-for-87) opponents average in four starts at home...has surrendered six of his eight home runs in Oakland.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 1-3 with a 5.92 ERA (16 er in 24.1 ip) in five starts against American League West competition compared to 2-0 with a 2.55 ERA (9 er in 31.2 ip) in five starts against everyone else.

GO THE DISTANCE: Tossed his first career complete game is his ninth Major League start June 13 at Los Angeles (AL), but took the loss...is the 37th pitcher in Oakland history to toss a complete game and lose 1-0... is the third to do it in the last 10 years (Scott Kazmir, Sept. 11, 2014 at Chicago-AL; Brandon McCarthy, April 21, 2011 at Seattle)...is one of three American League rookies with a complete game.

THIS AND THAT: Has received one run of support or fewer in five of his 10 starts and his season run support in 3.70 (23 rs in 56.0 ip)...has allowed six of his eight home runs during the day...opponents are batting .208 (10-for-48) with runners in scoring position...has yielded a .392 (31-for-79) batting average to the opponents three, four and five hitters...the A's are 5-5 (.500) in his starting assignments.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-1 loss to Texas April 9 in Oakland, his first Major League start...allowed three runs in the first, a two-run home run to Moreland in the third and a three-run home run to Choo in the fourth...the two home runs were the first of his career...surrendered just five home runs in 207.0 minor league innings...yielded eight runs in 3.1 innings to become the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to allow eight or more runs in his A's debut (last: Clayton Mortensen, 8 on Aug. 8, 2009 at Kansas City).

SECOND START: He combined with O'Flaherty, Otero, Abad and Clippard on an eight-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win at Houston April 14...it was his first Major League win...tossed 5.1 innings and allowed four of the hits... allowed four runners into scoring position and retired the side in order just once (fifth inning).

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-3 win at Los Angeles April 20...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed two in the bottom of the first on a two-run single by Freese...the A's then scored three runs in the third to take a 4-2 lead but he allowed a Pujols RBI single in the bottom of the third...had a 5-3 lead when he walked the first two batters in the fourth inning...was relieved by Otero who stranded both runners and tossed 4.0 scoreless innings for the win.

FOURTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-3 loss to Houston on April 25 in Oakland...allowed a RBI double to Lowrie in the first inning and a three-run home run to Altuve in the third...also yielded a RBI single to Lowrie in the fifth and was relieved by Bassitt with runners on first and third and two outs in the sixth...Bassitt allowed one of the runners to score on a wild pitch.

FIFTH START: He combined with Scribner and Clippard on a six-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win at Tampa Bay last Saturday...tossed six innings and allowed three of the hits...retired 12 of the first 13 batters he faced...allowed only two runners to advance into scoring position.

SIXTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win over New York (AL) May 28 in Oakland...allowed a solo home run to McCann in the second inning, a RBI single to McCann in the fourth and a sacrifice fly to Rodriguez in the fifth...was relieved by Abad with two outs in the sixth inning and the A's trailing 3-1...Oakland scored twice in the bottom of the sixth to get him off the hook and twice in the seventh for the win.

SEVENTH START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-3 win at Detroit June 2...allowed three runs, all in the fourth inning...one run scored on a wild pitch and he allowed a two-run single to Castellanos...the A's scored five runs in the seventh to take the lead...Scribner tossed a scoreless seventh and eighth and Clippard a scoreless ninth to earn him the win.

EIGHTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-4 loss at Boston last Sunday...shutout the Red Sox on five hits and two walks over the first seven innings...had a 4-0 lead and had retired 13 straight before Castillo led off the eighth inning with a home run...the bullpen allowed six more runs in the eighth inning with Clippard getting the blown save and loss.

NINTH START: He tossed his first career complete game, an eight-hitter in the A's 1-0 loss at Los Angeles (AL) June 13...did not walk a batter and struck out a career-high seven...tossed a career-high 111 pitches... allowed the only run of the game on a two-out home run to Pujols in the first inning...Wilson, Smith and Street combined to shutout the A's on two hits and four walks.

LAST START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 3-1 loss to San Diego last Thursday in Oakland...it marks the first losing streak of hsi career...did not allow a hit until Kemp hit a solo home run with two outs in the fourth inning...yielded a lead-off home run to Norris in the sixth and those were the only runs he would allow in seven innings...Kennedy and three Padres relievers combined to shutout the A's on five hits and a walk.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Sonny Gray (8-3, 1.95 ERA): Leads the American League and ranks fourth in the majors with a 1.95 ERA...only five pitchers in Oakland history have finished the month of June with an ERA under 2.00: Vida Blue in 1971 (1.53), Jim Nash in 1968 (1.64), Dan Haren in 2007 (1.91), Justin Duchscherer in 2008 (1.91) and Blue Moon Odom in 1968 (1.92)...is 5-1 with a 1.58 ERA in seven starts on the road and has the third lowest road ERA in the AL...had a no decision in his last start, a 12-7 A's loss to Los Angeles (AL) last Friday in Oakland (6.0 ip, 5 h, 6 r, 5 er, 3 bb, 2 so)...is 6-3 with a 1.68 ERA in nine career starts against Texas...his 1.68 ERA is the lowest by any pitcher against the Texas Rangers with a minimum of 60 innings pitched...is 4-0 with a 0.29 ERA in four starts in Texas and his ERA at Globe Life Park is the lowest by any pitcher with a minimum of 15 innings...is 2-1 with a 0.87 ERA in three starts this year.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

6-16, 4.49 ERA (100 er in 200.1 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 14-for-26 (53.8%)

- The A's bullpen has allowed two earned runs in 7.0 innings (2.57 ERA) over their last three contests after allowing 10 earned runs in 11.0 innings over their previous four games (8.18 ERA).
- Has a 4.49 ERA for the season, which is the highest in the American League and second highest in the majors (Colorado, 4.56)...has 16 losses, which are the most in the majors, and six wins, which are tied for the fewest in the majors.
- Is tied for the AL lead in blown saves (12), has the second fewest saves (14) and the second lowest save percentage (53.8%).
- Is tied for third in the AL in home runs allowed (27).
- Has allowed the most first batter RBI in the majors (35) and tied for the second most home runs (9).
- The A's are 4-27 when the bullpen allows two runs or more, 27-13 when it allows one run or fewer (two complete games).

- Has not allowed a run in 13 of his past 16 games (4 er in 9.2 ip, 3.72 ERA) after posting a 7.04 ERA in his first 11 contests.
- Has allowed 17 hits, 11 of which are for extra bases (five doubles, one triple, five home runs)...has the second highest opponents slugging percentage among American League relievers (.600).
- Is second in the majors in inherited runners (31) and tied for third in most
- inherited runners scored (10). Has an 11.57 ERA (3 er in 2.1 ip) in four games against Texas...posted a 1.93 ERA in 14 career relief appearances against the Rangers entering this season.

- Tossed 1.2 innings Sunday and 1.1 innings Saturday and earned the save in both games...is the first A's reliever with saves of three or more outs on consecutive days since Billy Taylor from Sept. 22-23, 1996.
- Has eight saves in his last 11 appearances after tallying four over his first 18 contests.
- Posted a 2.89 ERA in April, a 2.08 ERA in May but has a 4.50 ERA (4 er in 8.0 ip) in seven outings in June.
- Has a .198 opponents batting average, which breaks down to .109 (6for-55) against lefties and .279 (17-for-61) against righties.
- Is tied for seventh among American League relievers in losses (3)
- Has a win and save in three appearances against the Rangers (3.0 ip, 1 h. 1 bb. 1 so).
- Has a 0.64 ERA (1 er in 14.0 ip) in 13 games at night compared to a 4.96 ERA (9 er in 16.1 ip) in 16 games during the day.
