OAKLAND ATHLETICS (33-41) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (37-35)

THURSDAY, JUNE 25, 2015 - GLOBE LIFE PARK - 1:05 P.M. CDT RHP SONNY GRAY (8-3, 1.95) VS. RHP COLBY LEWIS (7-3, 4.08) CSNCA - A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won eight of the last 10 games and are now 19-11 since bottoming out at a season-high 16 games under .500 (14-30) at the conclusion of play on May 22...are 33-41 (.446) overall, which is the third worst record in the American League...however, have out-scored the opposition 335-292 and the run differential of +43 is second best in the AL West, fourth best in the AL and tied for sixth best in the majors...are 23-13 (.639) in games decided by three runs or more, which is the third best record in the majors...have 10 wins by seven or more runs, which is the most in the majors...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 48th consecutive day (beginning May 8) and trail first place Houston by nine games.. have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, seven days in fourth, one day tied for fourth and 48 days in fifth.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 16-7 with a 2.30 ERA (50 er in 195.1 ip) over the last 30 games (beginning May 23) and have allowed one run or fewer 16 times over that stretch...have a 3.06 ERA (154 er in 452.2 ip) for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and second lowest in the majors (St. Louis, 2.97)...lead the majors in innings pitched (452.2) and rank second in fewest home runs (31).

PITCHING: The A's have a 2.93 ERA (113 er in 347.0 ip) over the last 39 games (beginning May 12) after logging a 4.17 ERA over the first 34 contests...have a 3.49 ERA overall, which ranks second in the American League (Tampa Bay, 3.28)...have nine shutouts, which is tied for second most in the majors (San Francisco, 12)...have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.359), the second fewest home runs allowed (58), the fourth lowest opponents batting average (.240) and fifth lowest on-base percentage (.305).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .308 (113-for-367) with 70 runs scored (7.0 per game) and 29 doubles over the last 10 games...are 47-for-120 (.392) with runners in scoring position over that stretch...for the season, the A's are second in the majors in stolen base percentage (81.8%)...are tied for second in the American League in triples (19), rank third in runs (335) and walks (235), tied for third in doubles (129), are fourth in extra base hits (213), fewest strikeouts (497) and batting average (.261).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have nine errors in the last six games, 13 in the last 10, and 72 for the season, including a season-high tying four errors Friday night (also May 9 at Seattle and May 17 vs. Chicago-AL)... have 12 more errors than any other team (Texas, 60) and have a .974 fielding percentage, which is the lowest in the majors...have not finished the season with a fielding percentage under .975 since 1983 (.974)...the errors have led to 38 unearned runs, which is tied for the most in the majors (San Deigo).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are in the middle of a stretch where they will play 15 of 18 games at home...the only road games during the stretch are being played during the current three-game series in Texas, and have won the first two games of this series...are riding a season-high tying five game road winning streak...went 3-2 on the last homestand against San Diego (1-1) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1)...have won eight of the last 12 home games after starting the year 6-16... are 14-20 (.412) at home and 19-21 (.475) on the road...have the second worst home record in the American League (Cleveland, 15-22)...have finished the season with a home winning percentage under .429 once in Oakland history and that was in 1979 (31-50, .383)...are batting .273 (323-for-1182) with 162 runs at home (4.76 per game) compared to .251 (351-for-1400) with 173 runs on the road (4.33 per game) on the road...have a 3.02 ERA (105 er in 313.0 ip) at home compared to 3.92 (149 er in 342.0 ip) on the road...have now recorded two straight winning road trips...went 3-2 on the last trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and San Diego (2-0), which was their first winning road trip since June 3-11, 2014 (5-4 vs. Yankees, Orioles and Angels)...it snapped a streak of 11 consecutive road trips with a .500 record or worse, which fell one short of the longest such streak in Oakland history (Aug. 6, 1996-Aug. 31, 1997).

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's are 22-24 (.478) in night games compared to 11-17 (.393) during the day...have won 10 of their last 14 day games after losing 13 of the first 14...have the second worst record in day games in the American League (Los Angeles, 6-13)...are batting .269 (439-for-1635) at night compared to .248 (235-for-947) during the day...have the third best night batting average in the AL.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 4-13 (.235) when the opponent starts a lefthander pitcher compared to 29-28 (.509) when they start a right-hander. the mark against lefties is the worst in the majors...are now 1-7 against left-handed starters on the road...are batting .237 (152-for-641) against lefties compared to .269 (522-for-1941) with 52 of their 65 home runs off righties...the mark against lefties is fourth lowest in the American League and the mark against righties is third highest.

CLOSE CALLS: Nine of the A's last 11 losses have been by two runs or fewer...are 6-18 (.250) in one-run games and 10-28 (.263) in games decided by two runs or fewer, both of which are the worst records in the majors...are 2-11 in games decided in the last at bat...the wins are tied with the Yankees for the fewest in the majors and the losses are tied for third most...are 0-6 in extra inning games and are the only team without an extra inning win...are tied with Pittsburgh for the Major League lead in extra inning losses and are tied for third in the AL in extra inning games... have not won an extra inning game since Sept. 21, 2014, an 8-6 win over Philadelphia in 10 innings...have a six-game extra inning losing streak, which matches the longest such streak by an A's team over the last 20 years (May 18-July 5, 2011 and May 21-July 25, 1999).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 13-8 in June after going 11-19 in May and 9-14 in April...have four consecutive months with a losing record after recording 14 straight months with a winning record...need one more June win to avoid their fifth straight losing month...have used 18 relievers, which is already their most since 2012 when they also had 18...have used 22 pitchers overall, which matches the season total from last year.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have six players on the disabled list (Crisp, Doolittle, Ladendorf, Parker, Thompson, Venditte)...Crisp, Doolittle, Ladendorf, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...had at least seven players on the DL all year until Friday...have used the DL a total of 17 times...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's lead the season series, 8-4...are 4-3 in Oakland and 4-1 at Texas...a win today would give the A's their fourth series sweep at Texas in the last four seasons (one each in 2012, 2013, 2014)... over the last two years, are 6-10 in Oakland and 11-4 in Texas...have won three season series and lost three season series over the previous six years and are 64-62 over the last seven years...are 330-338 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 173-161 in Oakland and 157-177 in Texas...including 90-89 at Globe Life Park...have an all-time record of 427-420 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Burns extended his hitting streak to an ongoing career-high 14 games yesterday...also had a 12-game streak from May 26 to June 20 which account for the two longest hitting streaks by a rookie this season...has hit safely in 26 of his last 27 games and is batting .347 (42for-121) with 20 runs scored and 12 multiple hit games over that span.. leads Major League rookies in stolen bases (15) and multiple hit games (20)...Brett Lawrie had three hits yesterday, including his third career grand slam, and is now batting .361 (26-for-72) in June...Stephen Vogt is 14-for-30 (.467) with four doubles, two home runs and 13 RBI over his last eight games...leads Major League catchers in home runs (13) and leads the American League with 53 RBI...the A's improved to 28-13 when the bullpen allows one run or fewer...Ben Zobrist is 14-for-35 (.400) with 15 runs, four doubles, a triple, three home runs, 10 RBI, seven walks, and just one striketout over his last 10 games...team is 10-2 during that stretch.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1950 Eddie Joost homers in both games of a doubleheader at Chicago and combines to drive in seven runs...in 1996 Mark McGwire hits his 300th career home run in the second inning of the A's 10-8 loss to Detroit...he would later add #301 for his 33rd career multi-homer game.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (8-3, 1.95 ERA)

EARNED RUN AVERAGE: Leads the American League and ranks fourth in the majors with a 1.95 ERA...only five pitchers in Oakland history have finished the month of June with an ERA under 2.00: Vida Blue in 1971 (1.53), Jim Nash in 1968 (1.64), Dan Haren in 2007 (1.91), Justin Duchscherer in 2008 (1.91) and Blue Moon Odom in 1968 (1.92)...is scheduled to make one more start in June after today...has allowed one earned run or fewer in nine of his 15 starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Has the lowest opponents on-base percentage (.250) and slugging percentage in the American League (.255), ranks second in opponents batting average (.196) and fewest home runs per nine innings (0.35), tied for fourth in wins (8), fifth in innings pitched (101.2) and ninth in strikeouts (90)...is also third in wild pitches (8) and eighth in run support (6.29) and fewest pitches per inning (14.8).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 5-1 with a 1.58 ERA (9 er in 51.1 ip) and .205 (39-for-190) opponents average in seven starts on the road compared to 3-2 with a 2.32 ERA (13 er in 50.1 ip) and .185 (33-for-178) opponents batting average in seven starts at home...has the third lowest road ERA in the American League...posted a 2.51 ERA on the road last year, which was fourth lowest in Oakland history and the lowest since Mike Torrez logged a 2.50 ERA in 1976.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 3-1 with a 0.53 ERA (2 er in 33.2 ip) in five starts during the day compared to 5-2 with a 2.65 ERA (20 er in 68.0 ip) in 10 starts at night...has the lowest day ERA in the majors.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 5-2 with a 2.00 ERA (15 er in 67.2 ip) in 10 starts against American League West competition compared to 3-1 with a 1.85 ERA (7 er in 34.0 ip) in five starts against everyone else...is now 17-7 with a 2.21 ERA (53 er in 216.0 ip) in 32 career appearances against AL West teams compared to 10-9 with a 3.36 ERA (63 er in 168.2 ip) in 28 games against everyone else.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 6-1 with a 1.44 ERA (11 er in 68.2 ip) in 10 starts on four days rest compared to 2-2 with a 3.00 ERA (11 er in 33.0 ip) in five starts on five days rest or more... has the second lowest ERA on four days rest in the majors (Scherzer, 1.40)

INNING BY INNING: Has allowed 13 of his 25 runs over the first three innings of a game...has a 2.60 ERA (13 er in 45.0 ip) in innings one through three and a 1.43 ERA (9 er in 56.2 ip) from the fourth inning on...has a 3.26 career ERA (63 er in 174.0 ip) in innings 1-3, 2.12 (53 er in 210.2 ip) from the fourth inning on.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held the opposition to a .189 (24-for-127) batting average with runners on base, which is third lowest in the American League among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title (Kazmir, .177)...11 of the 13 extra base hits he has allowed have come with the bases empty... has surrendered three of his four home runs to left-handed hitters...has yielded a .356 (16-for-45) opponents batting average to the opponents clean-up hitter compared to .173 (56-for-323) against all other spots in the order

MONTH BY MONTH: Is 2-1 with a 2.48 ERA (7 er in 27.2 ip) in four starts in June after going 3-2 with a 1.67 ERA and 41 strikeouts in six starts in May...the strikeouts tied for third most in Oakland history in May and fell three short of the record of 44 (Chuck Dobson in 1968, Vida Blue in 1971)...it was his first month with 40 or more strikeouts...was 3-0 with a 1.98 ERA in five starts in April...has now finished a month with an ERA under 2.00 three times in his career (also 1.03 in July, 2014).

THIS AND THAT: Leads Major League pitchers in putouts (20), is tied for second in total chances (34) and is tied for fifth in the AL in assists (14)... the 20 putouts are the most by an A's pitcher since Chad Gaudin had 22 in 2007...the A's bullpen has blown a save in three of his starts (April 11, May 8, June 19)...is 4-1 in eight starts following an A's loss...has tossed at least seven innings in eight of his 15 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 12 times and walked two batters or fewer 12 times...the A's are 8-7 (.533) in his starting assignments and are 32-26 (.552) in his career...is 25-1 in 34 career starts with three runs of support or more.

2015 HIGHLIGHTS: Combined with Evan Scribner on a one-hit shutout in the A's 8-0 win over Texas on Opening Day *April* 6...became the first A's pitcher to start consecutive openers since Barry Zito in 2005 and 2006... allowed a lead off home run to Ackley in the third inning *Aprill* 11 against Seattle...that snapped a 20.0-inning scoreless streak dating back to Sept. 23, 2014, which is a new career high...allowed a career-high 11 hits in 6.0 innings in a 6-4 loss at Kansas City *April* 17...had a streak of five consecutive games with a wild pitch from April 22 to May 13, which is the longest such streak in Oakland history...it was the longest by an A's pitcher since Stu Flythe also had a five-game streak from July 1 to 31, 1936...struck out 10 while walking a career-high seven batters in 6.2 shutout innings in a 7-1

GRAY'S CAREER HIGHS

win at Texas *May 3*...it began a streak of three consecutive starts with nine or more strikeouts through May 13...that matched the longest such streak by an A's pitcher over the last 44 years...made his 50th career start *May 8* at Seattle and had a no decision in a 4-3, 11-inning loss...was charged with his first loss *May 13* against Boston after starting the season 4-0 for the first time in his career...it snapped a five-game winning streak dating back to Sept. 28, 2014...posted a 1.40 ERA and .194 opponents batting average during that streak, which spanned eight starts.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 12-7 loss to Los Angeles (AL) last Friday in Oakland...allowed a season-high six runs after surrendering just five runs over his previous five starts...allowed a RBI double to Giavotella in the second and an unearned run in the fourth on a Giavotella sacrifice fly...had a 7-2 lead after six innings and allowed a RBI single to Joyce in the seventh...left with the bases loaded and no outs and the bullpen allowed all three inherited runners to score plus four more runs for the blown save and loss.

GRAY vs. TEXAS: Is 6-3 with a 1.68 ERA (64.1 ip, 45 h, 13 r, 12 er, 22 bb, 54 so, 2 hr) in nine career starts... has not allowed a run in four of those starts and his 1.68 ERA is the lowest by any pitcher against the Texas Rangers with a minimum of 60 innings pitched (Dick Woodson, 1.69)...his six career wins are his most against any team...is 4-0 with a 0.29 ERA (1 er in 31.1 ip) in four starts in Texas and 2-3 with a 3.00 ERA (11 er in 33.0

ip) in five starts in Oakland...his ERA at Globe Life Park is the lowest by any pitcher with a minimum of 15 innings...is 2-1 with a 0.87 ERA (20.2 ip, 11 h, 2 r, 2 er, 9 bb, 19 so, 1 hr) in three starts this year...combined with Evan Scribner on a one-hit shutout in the A's 8-0 win on Opening Day April 6...tossed eight innings and allowed the only hit on a Ryan Rua single to lead off the eighth inning...allowed just one base runner as far as second base (Martin two-base error on Zobrist dropped fly ball)...also picked up the win at Texas May 3 in a 7-1 decision...tossed 6.2 shutout innings and struck out 10 while walking a career-high seven batters...tossed a career-high 119 pitches...then took the loss in a 2-1 decision in Oakland on June 9...allowed a RBI single to Fielder in the third inning to snap a 25.2-inning scoreless streak against Texas, which is the longest in Oakland history against the Rangers...also yielded a lead off home run to Moreland in the sixth...Martinez shutout the A's on one hit over the first six innings and the A's scored their lone run off the bullpen in the eighth inning.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jesse Hahn (5-5, 3.40 ERA): Is 4-1 with a 2.25 ERA and .204 opponents batting average over his last six starts...including 3-0 with a 2.52 ERA over his last four starts...the three-game winning streak is one short of his career high of four...opponents have reached base on an error a Major League leading 13 times, which are the most by an A's pitcher since Tim Hudson had 15 in 2001...has eight unearned runs, which are the second most in the American League...has allowed just three home runs in 84.2 innings for an average of 0.32 per nine innings...that is the lowest mark in the AL and third lowest in the majors...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 4-1 A's win over Los Angeles (AL) last Saturday in Oakland (7.2 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 4 bb, 4 so)...combined with Jesse Chavez on a seven-hit shutout in his only career appearance against Kansas City, a start in the A's 5-0 win at Kansas City April 18 (5.1 ip, 3 h, 1 bb).

- The A's bullpen has allowed two earned runs in 9.0 innings (2.00 ERA) over its last four contests after allowing 10 earned runs in 11.0 innings (8.18 ERA) over its previous four games.
- Has a 4.45 ERA for the season, which is the highest in the American League and second highest in the majors (Colorado, 4.56)...has 16 losses, which are tied for the most in the majors (Atlanta), and six wins, which are tied for the fewest in the majors.
- Is tied for the AL lead in blown saves (12), has the second fewest saves (14) and the second lowest save percentage (53.8%).
- Is tied for third in the AL in home runs allowed (27).
- Has allowed the most first batter RBI in the majors (35) and is tied for the second most home runs (9).
