OAKLAND ATHLETICS (34-41) VS. KANSAS CITY ROYALS (41-28)

ABOUT THE A'S: Extended their winning streak to a season-high five games yesterday, topping the previous best of four (twice)...this marks the first time the A's have won more than four consecutive games since July 3-8, 2014 when they won six in a row...with the win yesterday, the A's moved into a tie for fourth place in the American League West with Seattle, snapping a streak of 48 consecutive days in sole possession of last...the last time the A's were not alone in last was May 7 when they were tied for fourth...have won nine of the last 11 games and are 20-11 (.645) since bottoming out at a season-high 16 games under .500 (14-30) at the conclusion of play on May 22...have the second best record in the AL (Toronto, 20-10) and fourth best in the majors dating back to May 23...are 34-41 (.453) overall, which is the fourth worst record in the AL...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, seven days in fourth, two days tied for fourth and 48 days in fifth.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have earned the win in each of the last five games (12 er in 33.0 ip, 3.27 ERA), which is the first time they have done that since Sept. 11-15, 2013...are now 17-7 with a 2.37 ERA (53 er in 201.1 ip) over the last 31 games (beginning May 23) and have allowed one run or fewer 16 times over that stretch...have a 3.081 ERA (157 er in 458.2 ip) for the season, which is second lowest in the American League (Tampa Bay, 3.075) and third lowest in the majors (St. Louis, 2.93)...lead the majors in innings pitched (458.2) and rank second in fewest home runs (32).

PITCHING: The A's have a 2.90 ERA (116 er in 360.0 ip) over the last 41 games (beginning May 12) after logging a 4.17 ERA over the first 34 contests...have a 3.48 ERA overall, which ranks second in the American League (Tampa Bay, 3.27)...lead the AL in shutouts (9) and opponents slugging percentage (.360), have surrendered the second fewest home runs (59) and rank fourth in opponents batting average (.241), on-base percentage (.304).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .306 (123-for-402) with 76 runs scored (6.9 per game), 29 doubles, two triples and 10 home runs over the last 11 games...are 51-for-129 (.395) with runners in scoring position over that stretch...for the season, are tied for second in the American League in triples (19), rank third in runs (341) and walks (239) and fourth in extra base hits (213) and fewest strikeouts (501)...have been successful in 45-of-55 (81.8%) stolen base attempts, which is the best mark in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 13 errors in the last 11 games, including a season-high tying four a week ago tonight against the Angels (also May 9 at Seattle and May 17 vs. Chicago-AL)...now have 72 for the season, which is 12 more than any other team (Texas, 60)...have a .974 fielding percentage and have not finished the season with a fielding percentage under .975 since 1983 (.974)...the errors have led to 38 unearned runs, which is tied for the most in the majors (San Diego).

RUN DIFFERENTIAL: The A's have out-scored the opposition 341-295 for a run differential of +46...that is second best in the American League West, fourth best in the AL and sixth best in the majors...are 24-13 (.649) in games decided by three runs or more, which is the third best record in the majors...however, are 10-28 (.263) in games decided by two runs or fewer, which is the worst mark in the majors...have 10 wins by seven or more runs, which is the most in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a 10-game homestand tonight against Kansas City (three games), Colorado (three games) and Seattle (four games)...it is the A's second longest homestand of the season (11, July 30-Aug. 9)...this homestand concludes a stretch where the A's will play 15 of 18 games at home...are 7-1 over the first eight games of the stretch...have now won eight of the last 12 home games after starting the year 6-16...are 14-20 (.412) at home and 20-21 (.488) on the road...have the second worst home record in the American League (Cleveland, 15-23)...have finished the season with a home winning percentage under .429 once in Oakland history and that was in 1979 (31-50, .383)...went 3-0 on the last road trip to Texas and have a season-best six-game road winning streak...have back-to-back winning road trips after a streak of 11 consecutive road trips with a .500 record or worse...that fell one short of the longest such streak in Oakland history...are batting .273 (323-for-1182) at home compared to .252 (361-for-1435) on the road...have a 3.02 ERA (105 er in 313.0 ip) at home compared to 3.90 (152 er in 351.0 ip) on the road.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 4-13 (.235) when the opponent starts a left-hander pitcher compared to 30-28 (.517) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second worst in the majors (Colorado, 3-11)...are batting .240 (155-for-647) against lefties compared to .269 (529-for-1970) with 52 of their 65 home runs off righties...the mark against lefties is fourth lowest in the American League and the mark against righties is third highest.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's are 22-24 (.478) in night games compared to 12-17 (.413) during the day...have won 11 of their last 15 day games after losing 13 of the first 14...have the third worst record in day games in the American League...are batting .269 (439-for-1635) at night compared to .249 (245-for-982) during the day...have the third best night batting average in the AL.

CLOSE CALLS: Nine of the A's last 11 losses have been by two runs or fewer...are 6-18 (.250) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the majors...are 2-11 in games decided in the last at bat...the wins are tied with the Yankees for the fewest in the majors and the losses are second most in the AL...are 0-6 in extra inning games and are the only team without an extra inning win...rank second in the majors in extra inning losses (Pittsburgh, 7)...have not won an extra inning game since Sept. 21, 2014, an 8-6 win over Philadelphia in 10 innings...have a six-game extra inning losing streak, which matches the longest such streak by an A's team over the last 20 years (May 18-July 5, 2011 and May 21-July 25, 1999).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 14-8 in June and have clinched a winning record for the month...it snaps a four-month streak with a losing record and is the A's first winning month since last July when they went 15-10...have used 18 relievers, which is already their most since 2012 when they also had 18...have used 22 pitchers overall, which matches the season total from last year.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have six players on the disabled list (Crisp, Doolittle, Ladendorf, Parker, Thompson, Venditte)...Crisp, Doolittle, Ladendorf, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...have had at least six players on the DL all year...have used the DL a total of 17 times...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ROYALS: The A's trail in the season series 1-2 after losing two of three in Kansas City in April...lost five of seven last year in addition to the American League Wild Card game...went 1-2 in Oakland and 1-3 in Kansas City...have lost two of the previous three season series and are 12-13 against the Royals over the last four years...all-time, the A's are 308-256 against the Royals...that breaks down to 169-111 in Oakland and 139-145 in Kansas City.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Burns has a 15-game hitting streak (25-for-69, .362), which matches the longest hitting streak by an Athletic over the last five years...it is the longest by a Major League rookie this year and is fourth longest in Oakland history by a rookie...has now hit safely in 27 of his last 28 games...leads Major League rookies in stolen bases (15), multiple hit games (20) and hits (68)...**Josh Reddick** is tied for eighth in the American League with 45 RBI...43 of those have come as an outfielder, which is second most among AL outfielders...**Stephen Vogt** is 17-for-34 (.500) with four doubles, two home runs, 13 RBI on four three-hit games in his last nine contests...leads ML catchers in home runs (13), RBI (47), batting average (.310), slugging percentage (.603) and on-base percentage (.386)...**Ben Zobrist** had the go-ahead RBI in the seventh inning yesterday and 13 of his 27 RBI have given the A's the lead.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1958** Hector Lopez hits three home runs in the A's 8-6, 12 inning win over Washington...in **1974** Campy Campaneris has two hits in the A's 5-0 win over California, giving him 1000 in his Oakland career...in **1997** Mark McGwire hits his ninth career grand slam in a 6-3 win over Texas, tying the franchise record held by Jimmie Foxx, Sam Chapman and Gus Zernial...in **2005** the A's set an Oakland record for margin of victory in a shutout with a 16-0 win over San Francisco...switch-hitter Nick Swisher becomes just the second player in Oakland history to homer from both side of the plate in the same game.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Hahn (5-5, 3.40 ERA)

BRIEFLY: Is 4-1 with a 2.25 ERA (10 er in 40.0 ip) and .204 (30-for-147) opponents batting average over his last six starts...went 1-1 with a 2.12 ERA and .213 opponents batting average over his first three starts...left his third start April 18 at Kansas City with a blister and missed his turn in the rotation April 23...went 0-3 with a 5.86 ERA and .278 opponents batting average over a five starts stretch from April 29 to May 20.

THREE-GAME WINNING STREAK: Is 3-0 with a 2.52 ERA (7 er in 25.0 ip) over his last four starts...has allowed just one run in three of those starts...the three-game winning streak is one short of his career high of four (June 14-30, 2014).

AMONG THE LEADERS: Opponents have reached base on an error a Major League leading 13 times, which are the most by an A's pitcher since Tim Hudson had 15 in 2001...has eight unearned runs, which are second most in the American League (Danks, CWS 9)...is tied for second in the AL in hit batters (8), tied for third in opponents grounded into double plays (12) and tied for seventh in wild pitches (6)...opponents have been successful in 2-of-6 (33.3%) stolen base attempts off him, which is tied for fourth lowest in the AL.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed just three home runs in 84.2 innings for an average of 0.32 per nine innings...that is the lowest mark in the American League and third lowest in the majors...ranks fourth in the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.300)...has surrendered seven home runs in 158.0 career innings (0.40 per nine innings)...six have come with runners on base.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: Is 3-1 with a 2.48 ERA (9 er in 32.2 ip) in five starts against American League Central teams compared to 2-4 with a 3.98 ERA (23 er in 52.0 ip) in seven starts against everyone else.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has a .232 opponents batting average, which includes .182 (28-for-154) against right-handed hitters compared to .278 (47-for-169) against left-handers...the mark against righties is tied for third lowest in the AL...has walked just three of the 89 batters he has faced to lead off an inning...has a .246 (28-for-114) opponents average the first time through the lineup, .164 (19-for-116) the second time through and .301 (28-for-93) after that...has allowed a .333 (23-for-69) average with runners in scoring position, which is tied for fourth highest in the AL.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 3-1 with a 1.53 ERA (6 er in 35.1 ip) and .167 (21-for-126) opponents batting average in five starts during the day compared to 2-4 with a 4.74 ERA (26 er in 49.1 ip) and .274 (54-for-197) opponents batting average in nine starts at night...has the fifth lowest day ERA in the American League.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 3.86 ERA (18 er in 42.0 ip) over the first three innings of a game, 1.38 (4 er in 26.0 ip) over innings four through five and 5.63 (10 er in 16.0 ip) from the sixth inning on.

LOSING STREAK SNAPPED: Tossed a four-hit shutout May 25 against Detroit to snap his career-high tying three-game losing streak (also Aug. 5, 2014-April 7, 2015)...had a 5.86 ERA and .267 opponents batting average during the losing streak, which spanned five starts.

GO THE DISTANCE: Tossed his first career complete game against Detroit May 25, a four-hit shutout in Oakland...became the first A's pitcher with a shutout on Memorial Day since Dick Fowler and Joe Coleman did it both ends of a 1947 doubleheader against New York...according to Elias, he became the first A's pitcher to toss a shutout in a game in which his team made at least three errors since Diego Segui did it for the Kansas City A's June 15, 1965 against California...joins since Mark Mulder (April 24, 2003) as the only A's pitchers to shutout Detroit over the last 27 years.

THIS AND THAT: Went 1-4 with a 4.30 ERA in six starts in May...tied for third in the American League in May losses...the A's are 6-8 (.429) in his starting assignments...the Padres went 9-3 (.750) in his starting assignment last year...has tossed six innings or fewer in nine of his 14 starts this year...has tossed more than six innings in just eight of his 26 career starts...has walked two batters or fewer in 12 of his 14 starts this year.

2015-START-BY-START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss to Texas **April 7** in Oakland...allowed base runners in each of his first five innings, including the third when he allowed a RBI single to Fielder...left after six innings trailing 3-1...had a no decision in the A's 8-7, 10-inning loss to Seattle **April 12** in Oakland...retired each of the first 13 batters before Seager reached on a Semien error...took a no-hitter and a 3-0 lead into the sixth inning...allowed a leadoff double to Morrison and the Mariners ended up scoring four times, although only one run was earned...combined with Chavez on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win at Kansas City **April 18**...it was his first win as an Athletic...tossed 5.1 innings and allowed three of the hits...left with one out in the sixth inning with a blister...had a no deci-

sion in the A's 6-3 loss to Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland **April 29**...allowed a two-run single to Aybar in the first inning and a solo home run to Trout in the third...was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-7 loss at Minnesota **May 4**...allowed a career-high six runs on a career-high 10 hits in 5.0 innings...the A's scored four times in the first inning but he allowed four runs in the second...Oakland scored a run in the sixth to take a 5-4 lead but he put runners on second and third to start the bottom of the sixth...was relieved by Alvarez who allowed both runs to score plus two of his own...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 7-2 loss at Seattle **May 9**...yielded a career-high tying six runs for the second consecutive start...had a no decision in the A's 7-6 loss to Chicago (AL) **May 15** in Oakland...faced eight batters in the first inning but allowed just two runs on a bases loaded walk to LaRoche and a Gillaspie RBI single...left with a 6-2 lead and runners on first and second with one out in the seventh...the bullpen allowed both runs to score and the White Sox scored five unearned runs in the inning (Scribner blown save)...extended his losing streak to three games in the A's 6-1 loss at Houston **May 20**...the score was tied 1-1 entering the bottom of the sixth but he allowed a two-out two-run home run to Carter...tossed his first career complete game, a four-hit shutout against Detroit **May 25** in Oakland...walked just one batter while striking out five...tossed a career-high 112 pitches...allowed only one base runner to advance into scoring position...was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-3 loss to New York (AL) **May 30** in Oakland...had a 3-2 lead when he surrendered a two-run home run to Beltran in the sixth for the loss...was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-5 win at Detroit **June 4**...shutout the Tigers on one hit and one walk over the first five innings and had a 6-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the sixth inning...had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win over Texas **June 10** in Oakland...tossed 3.2 innings, which matched his shortest career outing as a starter (June 3, 2014 vs. Pittsburgh)...hit three batters, which tied the Oakland single game record (ninth time, first since Barry Zito on April 15, 2005)...was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-1 victory at San Diego **June 15**...had a 3-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the third inning on a Venable RBI double.

LAST START: He extended his winning streak to three games in the A's 4-1 win over Los Angeles (AL) last Saturday in Oakland...walked a career-high tying four batters...shutout the Angels on two hits and two walks over the first five innings and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Aybar in the sixth...that was the only run he would allow in 7.2 innings and the A's scored three times in the bottom of the sixth for the win.

LHP Scott Kazmir (4-4, 2.70 ERA): Is 2-1 with a 1.93 ERA and .210 opponents batting average over his last five starts...is 3-1 with a 1.27 ERA and .162 opponents batting average in six starts in Oakland compared to 1-3 with a 4.20 ERA and .280 opponents average in seven starts on the road...has the lowest home ERA in the majors and the second lowest opponents batting average...has a .257 opponents batting average with the bases empty compared to .177 with runners on base...opponents are 1-for-25 (.040) with runners in scoring position and two outs this year and 6-for-87 (.069) over the last two years...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 6-5 A's win over Los Angeles (AL) last Sunday in Oakland (7.1 ip, 6 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 6 so)...is 4-7 with a 4.91 ERA in 18 career starts against the Royals...including a no decision in his only start this year, a 4-2 A's loss at Kansas City on April 19 (7.1 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 5 so).

- The A's bullpen has allowed just one earned run in 12.0 innings (0.75 ERA) over its last five contests after allowing eight earned runs in 11.0 innings (6.55 ERA) over its previous four games.
- Has a 4.38 ERA for the season, which is the highest in the American League and second highest in the majors (Colorado, 4.63).
- Has six wins and 16 losses...the wins are tied for the fewest in the majors and the losses are tied for the most.
- Is tied for the AL lead in blown saves (12), tied for the second fewest saves (15) and has the second lowest save percentage (55.6%).
- Is tied for third in the AL in home runs allowed (27).
- Has allowed the most first batter RBI in the majors (35) and is tied for the second most home runs (9).
- The A's are 4-27 when the bullpen allows two runs or more, 29-13 when it allows one run or fewer (two complete games).
