OAKLAND ATHLETICS (34-43) VS. KANSAS CITY ROYALS (43-28)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two straight after a season-high five-game winning streak...are now 9-4 (.692) over the last 13 games and 20-13 (.606) since bottoming out at a season-high 16 games under .500 (14-30) at the conclusion of play on May 22...have the second best record in the American League (Toronto, 21-11) and fourth best in the majors dating back to May 23...are 34-43 (.442) overall, which is the third worst record in the AL...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West for 50 of the last 51 days...the exception was Thursday when they snapped a streak of 48 consecutive days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for first, seven days in fourth, two days tied for fourth and 50 days in fifth.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's lost 3-2 yesterday to fall to 6-19 (.240) in one-run games...have the worst record, most losses and fewest wins in the majors in one-run games...the worst record in one-run games in Oakland history is 16-26 (.381) in 1980...14 of the A's last 15 losses have been by three runs or fewer...are 2-11 in games decided in the last at bat...the wins are tied with the Yankees for the fewest in the majors and the losses are second most in the American League... are 0-6 in extra inning games and are the only team without an extra inning win...rank second in the majors in extra inning losses (Pittsburgh, 7)... have not won an extra inning game since Sept. 21, 2014, an 8-6 win over Philadelphia in 10 innings...have a six-game extra inning losing streak, which matches the longest such streak by an A's team over the last 20 years (May 18-July 5, 2011 and May 21-July 25, 1999)...have not played an extra inning game since May 11, a streak of 43 consecutive nine-inning games.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 17-9 with a 2.48 ERA (59 er in 214.1 ip) over the last 33 games (beginning May 23) and have allowed one run or fewer 16 times over that stretch...have a 3.11 ERA (163 er in 471.2 ip) for the season, which is second lowest in the American League (Tampa Bay, 3.05) and third lowest in the majors (St. Louis, 2.91)...lead the majors in innings pitched (471.2) and are tied for second in fewest home runs (34).

PITCHING: The A's have a 2.90 ERA (122 er in 378.0 ip) over the last 43 games (beginning May 12) after logging a 4.17 ERA over the first 34 contests...have a 3.47 ERA overall, which ranks second in the American League (Tampa Bay, 3.24)...lead the AL in shutouts (9) and rank second in opponents slugging percentage (.361) and fewest home runs (61).

OFFENSE: The A's have been held to two runs on four hits in each of the last two games (8-for-61, .131) after batting .306 and averaging 6.9 runs per game over their previous 11 contests...are 0-for-12 with runners in scoring position over the last two games after going 51-for-129 (.395) over the previous 11...for the season, the A's are tied for second in the American League in triples (19), rank third in runs (345), tied for third in walks (244) and fourth in doubles (134) and fewest strikeouts (513)...have been successful in 47-of-57 (82.5%) stolen base attempts, which is the best mark in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 14 errors in the last 13 games and have 73 for the season, which is 12 more than any other team (Texas, 61)...the errors have led to 40 unearned runs, which is the most in the majors (San Diego, 38).

RUN DIFFERENTIAL: The A's have out-scored the opposition 345-303 for a run differential of +42...that is second best in the American League West, tied for fourth best in the AL and tied for seventh best in the majors...are 24-14 (.632) in games decided by three runs or more, which is the fourth best record in the majors...however, are 10-29 (.256) in games decided by two runs or fewer, which is the worst mark in the majors...have 10 wins by seven or more runs, which is tied with Toronto for the most in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-2 on this 10-game homestand against Kansas City (0-2), Colorado (three games) and Seattle (four games)...it is the A's second longest homestand of the season (11, July 30-Aug. 9)...this homestand concludes a stretch where the A's will play 15 of 18 games at home...are 7-3 over the first 10 games of the stretch...are 8-6 over the last 14 home games after starting the year 6-16...are 14-22 (.389) at home and 20-21 (.488) on the road...have the second worst home record in the ma-

jors (Milwaukee, 14-26)...have finished the season with a home winning percentage under .429 once in Oakland history and that was in 1979 (31-50, .383)...went 3-0 on the last road trip to Texas and have a season-best six-game road winning streak...have back-to-back winning road trips after a streak of 11 consecutive road trips with a .500 record or worse...that fell one short of the longest such streak in Oakland history...are batting .266 (331-for-1243) at home compared to .252 (361-for-1435) on the road... have a 3.02 ERA (111 er in 331.0 ip) at home compared to 3.90 (152 er in 351.0 ip) on the road.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's are 22-25 (.468) in night games compared to 12-18 (.400) during the day...have won 11 of their last 16 day games after losing 13 of the first 14...have the second worst record in day games in the American League (Los Angeles, 7-13...are batting .266 (443-for-1666) at night compared to .246 (249-for-1012) during the day...have the third best night batting average in the AL.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 4-13 (.235) when the opponent starts a lefthander pitcher compared to 30-30 (.500) when they start a right-hander... the mark against lefties is second worst in the majors (Colorado, 3-11)... are batting .240 (156-for-649) against lefties compared to .264 (536-for-2029) with 52 of their 65 home runs off righties...the mark against righties is third highest in the American League.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 14-10 in June and have clinched a winning record for the month...it snaps a four-month streak with a losing record and is the A's first winning month since last July when they went 15-10... have used 18 relievers, which is already their most since 2012 when they also had 18...have used 22 pitchers overall, which matches the season total from last year.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have six players on the disabled list (Crisp, Doolittle, Ladendorf, Parker, Thompson, Venditte)...Crisp, Doolittle, Ladendorf, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...have had at least six players on the DL all year...have used the DL a total of 17 times...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ROYALS: The A's have lost the season series as they are 1-4 entering the final game today...with a loss today, the A's would finish with their worst mark ever against the Royals...the current low is 2-5 (.286) last year...lost two of three in Kansas City in April and have dropped the first two games of this series...have not been swept by the Royals since Sept. 2-4, 2008 and have not been swept in Oakland since July 28-30, 2008...have now lost each of the last two season series and three of the last four...are 12-15 against Kansas City over the last four years...all-time, the A's are 308-258 against the Royals...that breaks down to 169-113 in Oakland and 139-145 in Kansas City.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Burns has a 15-game hitting streak (25-for-69, .362), which matches the longest hitting streak by an Athletic over the last five years...it is the longest by a Major League rookie this year and is fourth longest in Oakland history by a rookie...has now hit safely in 27 of his last 28 games...leads ML rookies in stolen bases (15) and hits (68) and is tied for the lead in multiple hit games (20)...Brett Lawrie hit .229 in April, .295 in May and is currently batting .329 (27-for-82) in June...Josh Reddick has 43 RBI as an outfielder, which is second most among American League outfielders...Stephen Vogt is 17-for-41 (.415) with four doubles, two home runs, 13 RBI and four three-hit games over his last 11 contests...leads ML catchers in home runs (13), slugging percentage (.593) and on-base percentage (.384) and ranks second in batting average (.305) and RBI (47)...Ben Zobrist had the go-ahead RBI in the seventh inning Thursday and 13 of his 27 RBI have given the A's the lead.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1952** Bobby Shantz tosses a two-hit shutout and Gus Zernial homers twice and drives in five runs in the A's 12-0 win at New York...in **1994** Bobby Witt pitches a two-hit shutout to defeat the California Angels 3-0, setting a club record for fewest hits in consecutive complete games...in his previous start, he tossed a one-hitter against Kansas City.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Chavez (4-6, 2.90 ERA)

RECENTLY: Has picked up the win in each of his last two starts (6 er in 12.0 ip, 4.50 ERA), which matches the longest winning streak of his career (sixth time)...is now 2-1 with a 4.88 ERA (13 er in 24.0 ip) over his last four starts after going 2-5 with a 2.38 ERA over his first eight starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks seventh in the American League in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.54), ninth in opponents on-base percentage (.290) and 10th in ERA (2.90) and opponents slugging percentage (.339).

RUN SUPPORT: Has received 19 runs of support in his last three starts (19.0 ip, 9.00 RSA) after getting just 10 runs of support over his first nine starts (58.0 ip, 1.40 ERA)...has received no run support in four of his 12 starts and has received two runs or fewer in eight starts...his season RSA of 3.12 (29 rs in 83.2 ip) ranks fifth lowest in the American League.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-2 with a 1.75 ERA (7 er in 36.0 ip) in seven games at home compared to 2-4 with a 3.78 ERA (20 er in 47.2 ip) in nine games on the road...has the third lowest home ERA in the American League...has surrendered four of his five home runs on the road.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 3-4 with a 1.65 ERA (9 er in 49.0 ip) in seven starts on four days rest compared to 1-2 with a 5.79 ERA (18 er in 28.0 ip) in five starts on five days rest or more... has the third lowest ERA in the American League when starting on four days rest.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 4-6 with a 3.16 ERA (27 er in 77.0 ip) in his 12 starting assignments...began the season in the bullpen and did not allow a run in his four relief appearances (6.2 ip)...his first start came April 23 when Jesse Hahn missed a start due to a blister...remained in the rotation following the option of Kendall Graveman to Nashville April 26...is now 12-14 with a 3.66 ERA (86 er in 211.1 ip) in 35 career starts, 9-15 with a 5.02 ERA in 204 relief appearances.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has issued 16 of his 21 walks to right-handed hitters...has yielded four of his five home runs to lefties...has walked just four of the 85 batters he has faced leading off an inning...the opponents number seven hitter is batting .056 (2-for-36), which is the lowest mark in the majors...has walked two batters or fewer in 10 of his 12 starts.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 1.50 ERA (4 er in 24.0 ip) in the first and second innings, a 4.50 ERA (18 er in 36.0 ip) in the third through fifth innings and a 1.90 ERA (5 er in 23.2 ip) from the sixth inning on.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 1-3 with a 4.68 ERA (17 er in 32.2 ip) in eight games against American League West competition compared to 3-3 with a 1.76 ERA (10 er in 51.0 ip) in eight games against everyone else.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 3-2 with a 2.41 ERA (14 er in 52.1 ip) in 10 games at night compared to 1-4 with a 3.73 ERA (13 er in 31.1 ip) in six games during the day...has the fourth lowest night ERA in the American League.

MONTH BY MONTH: Is 2-1 with a 4.88 ERA (13 er in 24.0 ip) in four starts in June...went 2-3 with a 1.93 ERA in six starts in May...tied for sixth in the American League in losses in May but had the fourth lowest ERA...went 0-2 with a 2.55 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in six games, including two starts, this April...is 2-2 with a 2.10 ERA in 12 games, eight starts, in April over the last two years...has a 2.68 career ERA in April, which is his best for any month of the season.

IN RELIEF: Stranded his only inherited runner in his four relief appearances and first batters faced were 1-for-4 (.250)...recorded the save in his final relief appearance April 18 at Kansas City, tossing 3.2 scoreless innings...has two career saves, both at Kansas City and both at least 3.2 innings...struck out six, which matched the most by an A's pitcher in a game in which he recorded the save...the only other time it happened since the save became an official stat in 1969 was by Rollie Fingers on Sept. 1, 1972 against Detroit.

THE LAST THREE YEARS: Is 14-18 with a 3.39 ERA (108 er in 287.0 ip) in 83 games, including 33 starts, over the last three years...started his career by going 7-11 with a 5.99 ERA in 156 games, including two starts, over his first five years from 2008-12

2015 START-BY-START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-0 loss at Los Angeles (AL) *April* 23...tossed six innings and allowed just one hit, a a two-run home run by Calhoun in the third inning...it was the Angels only hit of the game...Tropeano, Salas, Smith and Street combined to shutout the A's on eight hits...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 6-5 loss to Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland *April* 30...left after five innings trailing 4-0... was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 win at Minnesota *May* 5...it was his first win since July 23, 2014...allowed his only run in the eighth inning on a

Dozier RBI single...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-3 loss at Seattle May 10...had a 1-0 when Seager had a RBI double and Ackley added a two-run double in the fourth...had a no decision in the A's 4-3 loss to Chicago (AL) May 16 in Oakland...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed his only runs in the third inning on a two-run single by Garcia...was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-0 loss at Tampa Bay May 21...DeJesus had a RBI double in the fourth and a solo home run in the seventh...Colome and four Rays relievers combined to shutout the A's on six hits and two walks...was the losing pitcher in the A's 1-0 loss to Detroit May 26 in Oakland...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings and allowed just five hits...the only run came in the first inning and it was unearned ... retired 12 straight at one point ... Price and three relievers combined to shutout the A's on seven hits...combined with Clippard on an eight-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win over New York in Oakland on May 31...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings for the second consecutive start and allowed seven of the hits...also tossed a career-high 110 pitches. was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss at Boston June 6...allowed a career-high tying 10 hits in 5.0 innings...surrendered a two-run home run to Ramirez in the first inning to snap his scoreless streak at a career-high 15.0 innings...had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss at Los Angeles (AL) June 12...left with a 4-3 lead...was relieved by Scribner to start the eighth and he allowed solo home runs to Trout and Calhoun for the blown save and loss...was the winning pitcher in the A's 16-2 win over San Diego June 17 in Oakland...struck out a career-high 11 batters, which tied the Oakland record for strikeouts in an interleague game (fifth time, last: Rich Harden, June 26, 2008 vs. Philadelphia).

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-6 win at Texas last Tuesday...allowed a run in the second inning when Andrus doubled, went to third on a ground out and scored on a passed ball...the A's scored single runs in the third and fifth innings to take a 2-1 lead but he allowed four runs in the bottom of the fifth on a two-run home run by Odor, a sacrifice fly by Beltre and an Andrus RBI single...the A's then scored four times in the sixth for the win.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Kendall Graveman (4-4, 3.86 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville May 23 for his second stint with the A's this year and is 3-2 with a 2.31 ERA and .253 opponents batting average in seven starts since his return...the ERA is tied for eighth lowest in the American League over that span...has tossed seven or more innings and allowed two runs or fewer in each of his last four starts but is just 1-2 over that span (1.86 ERA)... picked up his fourth win of the season in his last start, which is tied for third among AL rookies...opponents are batting .204 with runners in scoring position...was the winning pitcher in his last start, an 8-2 A's win at Texas last Wednesday (7.0 ip, 8 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 4 so)...has never faced Colorado in his career...made his first interleague appearance June 18 of this year against San Diego and took the loss in a 3-1 decision (7.0 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 6 so).

- The A's bullpen has not allowed a run over its past four games and 10.0 innings and has yielded just one earned run in 17.0 innings (0.53 ERA) over its last seven games.
- Has a 4.28 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League (Texas, 4.42) and fourth highest in the majors.
- Has six wins and 16 losses...the wins are tied for the fewest in the maiors and the losses are tied for second most.
- Is tied for the AL lead in blown saves (12), has the second fewest saves (15) and the second lowest save percentage (55.6%).
- Is fourth in the AL in home runs allowed (27).
- Has allowed the most first batter RBI in the majors (35) and is tied for the third most home runs (9).
- The A's are 4-27 when the bullpen allows two runs or more, 29-15 when it allows one run or fewer (two complete games).
