OAKLAND ATHLETICS (34-44) VS. COLORADO ROCKIES (33-42)

ABOUT THE A'S: Were swept by the Royals in a three-game series over the weekend after going into the series with a season-high five-game winning streak...have been swept five times this year, including three times at home...are now 20-14 (.588) since bottoming out at a season-high 16 games under .500 (14-30) at the conclusion of play on May 22...have the third best record in the American League and fifth best in the majors dating back to May 23...are 34-44 (.436) overall, which is the second worst record in the AL (Chicago, 32-42)...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West for 51 of the last 52 days...the exception was last Thursday when they snapped a streak of 48 consecutive days in sole possession of last...for the season, the A's have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, seven days in fourth, two days tied for fourth and 51 days in fifth.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 3-1 in interleague play, which is the second best record in the majors (Houston, 8-1)...swept a two-game series in San Diego June 15-16 and split two games with the Padres in Oakland June 17-18...the four interleague games are the fewest in the majors (Arizona, Colorado and Texas have six each)...have won 18 of their last 23 interleague games in the Coliseum...in addition to this three-game series with the Rockies, the A's will also host Los Angeles (Aug. 18-19) and San Francisco (Sept. 25-27) and play at San Francisco (July 24-26), Los Angeles (July 28-29) and Arizona (Aug. 28-30)...went 13-7 against the National League last year and have the fifth best all-time interleague record with a mark of 183-145 (.558)...have finished with a winning record against the NL in each of the previous three seasons and 11 of 18 overall.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 17-10 with a 2.54 ERA (62 er in 220.0 ip) over the last 34 games (beginning May 23) and have allowed one run or fewer 16 times over that stretch...have a 3.13 ERA (166 er in 477.1 ip) for the season, which is second lowest in the American League (Tampa Bay, 3.11) and third lowest in the majors (St. Louis, 2.89)...rank second in majors in innings pitched (477.1) and fewest home runs (34).

PITCHING: The A's have a 2.95 ERA (127 er in 387.0 ip) over the last 44 games (beginning May 12) after logging a 4.17 ERA over the first 34 contests...have a 3.49 ERA overall, which ranks third in the American League...lead the AL in shutouts (9) and opponents slugging percentage (.360) and have yielded the second fewest home runs (62).

OFFENSE: The A's scored seven runs in the three-game series against Kansas City after averaging 6.9 runs per game over their previous 11 contests...hit .196 (19-for-97) against the Royals and went 1-for-18 with runners in scoring position after batting .306, including .395 with RISP, over the previous 11 games...have gone a season-high four consecutive games without a home run...for the season, the A's are tied for second in the AL in triples (19), tied for third in runs (348) and rank fourth in doubles (137), walks (245) and fewest strikeouts (523)...have been successful in 47-of-57 (82.5%) stolen base attempts, which is the best mark in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 16 errors in the last 14 games and have 75 for the season, which is 14 more than any other team (Texas, 61)...the errors have led to 40 unearned runs, which is the most in the majors (San Diego, 39).

RUN DIFFERENTIAL: The A's have out-scored the opposition 348-308 for a run differential of +40...that is second best in the American League West, fifth best in the AL and eighth best in the majors...are 24-14 (.632) in games decided by three runs or more, which is tied for the fourth best record in the majors...however, are 10-30 (.250) in games decided by two runs or fewer, which is the worst mark in the majors...have 10 wins by seven or more runs, which is tied with Toronto for the most in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-3 on this 10-game homestand against Kansas City (0-3), Colorado (three games) and Seattle (four games)...it is the A's second longest homestand of the season (11, July 30-Aug. 9)...this homestand concludes a stretch where the A's will play 15 of 18 games at home...are 7-4 over the first 11 games of the stretch...are 8-7 over the last 15 home games after starting the year 6-16...are 14-23 (.378) at home

and 20-21 (.488) on the road...have the second worst home record in the majors (Milwaukee, 15-26)...the Oakland record for worst home record is 31-50 (.383) in 1979...went 3-0 on the last road trip to Texas and have a season-best six-game road winning streak...have back-to-back winning road trips after a streak of 11 consecutive road trips with a .500 record or worse...that fell one short of the longest such streak in Oakland history...are batting .267 (342-for-1279) at home compared to .252 (361-for-1435) on the road...have a 3.07 ERA (116 er in 340.0 ip) at home compared to 3.90 (152 er in 351.0 ip) on the road.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 6-19 (.240) in one-run games...have the worst record, most losses and fewest wins in the majors in one-run games...the worst record in one-run games in Oakland history is 16-26 (.381) in 1980...15 of the A's last 16 losses have been by three runs or fewer...are 2-11 in games decided in the last at bat...the wins are tied with the Yankees for the fewest in the majors and the losses are second most in the American League...are 0-6 in extra inning games and are the only team without an extra inning win...are tied for second in the majors in extra inning losses (Pittsburgh, 7)...have not won an extra inning game since Sept. 21, 2014, an 8-6 win over Philadelphia in 10 innings...have a six-game extra inning losing streak, which matches the longest such streak by an A's team over the last 20 years (May 18-July 5, 2011 and May 21-July 25, 1999)...have not played an extra inning game since May 11, a streak of 44 consecutive nine-inning games.

WINS AND LOSSES: The A's are 14-11 in June and have clinched a winning record for the month...it snaps a four-month streak with a losing record and is the A's first winning month since last July when they went 15-10...are 4-13 (.235) when the opponent starts a left-hander pitcher compared to 30-31 (.492) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second worst in the majors (Colorado, 3-12)...are 22-25 (.468) in night games compared to 12-19 (.387) during the day...have won 11 of their last 17 day games after losing 13 of the first 14...have the second worst record in day games in the American League (Los Angeles, 8-13).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have six players on the disabled list (Crisp, Doolittle, Ladendorf, Parker, Thompson, Venditte)...Crisp, Doolittle, Ladendorf, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...have had at least six players on the DL all year...have used the DL a total of 17 times...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ROCKIES: The A's lead the all-time series 13-12...that includes 7-4 in Oakland and 6-8 in Denver...last met in 2012 when the A's swept a three-game series at Colorado, June 12-14...this is the Rockies first appearance in Oakland since 2009 when they swept a three-game series, June 26-28...the A's have won three of their eight season series with the Rockies, all 3-0 sweeps.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Burns has a 16-game hitting streak, which is the longest active streak in the majors and is one short of the Oakland record for longest hitting streak by a rookie...is batting .365 (27-for-74) with 13 runs scored and eight multiple hit games during the streak and has now hit safely in 28 of his last 29 games...leads ML rookies in hits (70), stolen bases (15) and multiple hit games (21)...**Josh Reddick** has 44 RBI as an outfielder, which is second most among American League outfielders...**Stephen Vogt** leads ML catchers in home runs (13), batting average (.308), slugging percentage (.588) and on-base percentage (.384) and ranks second in RBI (47)...**Ben Zobrist** had the go-ahead RBI in the third inning yesterday and 14 of his 29 RBI have given the A's the lead.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1925** Bill Lamar extends his hitting streak to an Athletics franchise record 29 consecutive games...in **1990** Dave Stewart pitches the fifth no-hitter in Oakland history in the A's 5-0 win at Toronto...after walking the first two hitters he faced, Stewart retired 25 in a row before a two-out walk in the ninth...in **1996** the A's hit three home runs at California, giving Oakland 18 home runs in their last four games, which ties the American League record...in **2003** Eric Byrnes becomes the fifth player in Oakland history to hit for the cycle and ties an Oakland record with five hits in a 5-2 win at San Francisco.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (4-4, 3.86 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville May 23 for his second stint with the A's this year and is 3-2 with a 2.31 ERA (12 er in 46.2 ip) and .253 (45-for-178) opponents batting average in seven starts since his return...the ERA is tied for sixth lowest in the American League over that span...was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 1-2 with an 8.27 ERA and .348 opponents batting average in four starts before he was optioned to Nashville April 26...went 2-1 with a 1.85 ERA in four starts with the Sounds.

LAST FOUR STARTS: Has tossed seven or more innings and allowed two runs or fewer in each of his last four starts but is just 1-2 over that span (6 er in 29.0 ip, 1.86 ERA)...the bullpen blew the save in the no decision and the A's lost 1-0 and 3-1 in his two losses before he picked up the win in his last start...is just the second A's pitcher since at least 1914 to toss seven or more innings and allow two runs or fewer in three consecutive starts (June 7-18) without earning a win in any of the starts...the other was Orlando Pena for the Kansas City A's (May 5-15, 1963).

ROOKIE LEADERS: Picked up his fourth win of the season in his last start, which is tied for third among American League rookies...also ranks fourth in innings pitched (63.0) and tied for seventh in strikeouts (41)...has one of four complete games by an AL rookie.

INTERLEAGUE: Is scheduled to make his second career interleague appearance...the first was a start against San Diego earlier this year on July 18, a loss in a 3-1 decision (2 er in 7.0 ip, 2.57 ERA).

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 3-1 with a 2.83 ERA (11 er in 35.0 ip) in six starts at night compared to 1-3 with a 5.14 ERA (16 er in 28.0 ip) in five starts during the day...has allowed six home runs in 28.0 innings during the day, two in 35.0 innings at night.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-1 with a 1.91 ERA (9 er in 43.1 ip) and .255 (41-for-161) opponents batting average in seven starts on the road compared to 0-3 with a 7.84 ERA (18 er in 20.2 ip) and .322 (28-for-87) opponents average in four starts at home...has surrendered six home runs in 20.2 innings in Oakland, two in 42.1 innings on the road.

GO THE DISTANCE: Tossed his first career complete game is his ninth Major League start June 13 at Los Angeles (AL), but took the loss...is the 37th pitcher in Oakland history to toss a complete game and lose 1-0...is the third to do it in the last 10 years (Scott Kazmir, Sept. 11, 2014 at Chicago-AL; Brandon McCarthy, April 21, 2011 at Seattle).

THIS AND THAT: Has received one run of support or fewer in five of his 11 starts...opponents are batting .204 (11-for-54) with runners in scoring position...has yielded a .467 (14-for-30) batting average to the opponents number five hitter and a .414 (12-for-29) mark to the three hitter...all other spots in the order are hitting .228 (43-for-189)...the A's are 6-5 (.545) in his starting assignments...has allowed two runs or fewer in six of his 11 starts and walked two batters or fewer nine times.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-1 loss to Texas April 9 in Oakland, his first Major League start...allowed three runs in the first, a two-run home run to Moreland in the third and a three-run home run to Choo in the fourth...the two home runs were the first of his career...surrendered just five home runs in 207.0 minor league innings...yielded eight runs in 3.1 innings to become the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to allow eight or more runs in his A's debut (last: Clayton Mortensen, 8 on Aug. 8, 2009 at Kansas City).

SECOND START: He combined with O'Flaherty, Otero, Abad and Clippard on an eight-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win at Houston April 14...it was his first Major League win...tossed 5.1 innings and allowed four of the hits...allowed four runners into scoring position and retired the side in order just once (fifth inning).

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-3 win at Los Angeles April 20...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed two in the bottom of the first on a two-run single by Freese...the A's then scored three runs in the third to take a 4-2 lead but he allowed a Pujols RBI single in the bottom of the third...had a 5-3 lead when he walked the first two batters in the fourth inning...was relieved by Otero who stranded both runners and tossed 4.0 scoreless innings for the win.

FOURTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-3 loss to Houston on April 25 in Oakland...allowed a RBI double to Lowrie in the first inning and a three-run home run to Altuve in the third...also yielded a RBI single to Lowrie in the fifth and was relieved by Bassitt with runners on first and third and two outs in the sixth...Bassitt allowed one of the runners to score on a wild pitch.

FIFTH START: He combined with Scribner and Clippard on a six-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win at Tampa Bay last Saturday...tossed six innings and allowed three of the hits...retired 12 of the first 13 batters he faced...allowed only two runners to advance into scoring position.

SIXTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win over New York (AL) May 28 in Oakland...allowed a solo home run to McCann in the second inning, a RBI single to McCann in the fourth and a sacrifice fly to Rodriguez in the fifth...was relieved by Abad with two outs in the sixth inning and the A's trailing 3-1...Oakland scored twice in the bottom of the sixth to get him off the hook and twice in the seventh for the win.

SEVENTH START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-3 win at Detroit June 2...allowed three runs, all in the fourth inning...one run scored on a wild pitch and he allowed a two-run single to Castellanos...the A's scored five runs in the seventh to take the lead...Scribner tossed a scoreless seventh and eighth and Clippard a scoreless ninth to earn him the win.

EIGHTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-4 loss at Boston last Sunday...shutout the Red Sox on five hits and two walks over the first seven innings...had a 4-0 lead and had retired 13 straight before Castillo led off the eighth inning with a home run...the bullpen allowed six more runs in the eighth inning with Clippard getting the blown save and loss.

NINTH START: He tossed his first career complete game, an eight-hitter in the A's 1-0 loss at Los Angeles (AL) June 13...did not walk a batter and struck out a career-high seven...tossed a career-high 111 pitches...allowed the only run of the game on a two-out home run to Pujols in the first inning...Wilson, Smith and Street combined to shutout the A's on two hits and four walks.

TENTH START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 3-1 loss to San Diego June 18 in Oakland...it marks the first losing streak of his career...did not allow a hit until Kemp hit a solo home run with two outs in the fourth inning...yielded a lead-off home run to Norris in the sixth and those were the only runs he would allow in seven innings...Kennedy and three Padres relievers combined to shutout the A's on five hits and a walk.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-2 win at Texas last Wednesday...the A's scored five times in the first inning and three in the second and he blanked the Rangers on two hits over the first four innings...allowed his only runs in the fifth inning on a two-run double by Corporan...was relieved by Mujica after putting runners on first and second to start the eighth innings.

RHP Sonny Gray (9-3, 2.09 ERA): Leads the American League in ERA (2.09) and is tied for second in wins (9)...over the last 25 years, only three qualifying Oakland pitchers have gone into the month of July with an ERA under 2.50: Justin Duchscherer in 2008 (1.91), Dan Haren in 2007 (1.91) and Gio Gonzalez in 2011 (2.381)...is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 6-1 with a 1.44 ERA in 10 starts on four days rest and has the second lowest ERA on four days rest in the majors (Greinke, LAD 1.03)...leads Major League pitchers with 21 putouts, which are the most by an A's pitcher since Chad Gaudin had 22 in 2007...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 6-3 A's win at Texas last Thursday (6.0 ip, 9 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 7 so)...has never faced the Rockies in his career...is making his first interleague start of the season today and is 1-1 with a 4.44 ERA in five career interleague appearances, including four starts.

- The A's bullpen allowed two runs yesterday afternoon after yielding a total of two runs over its previous seven games (1 er in 17.0 ip, 0.53 ERA).
- Has a 4.30 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League (Texas, 4.38) and fourth highest in the majors.
- Has six wins and 16 losses...the wins are tied for the fewest in the majors and the losses are tied for second most.
- Has allowed the most first batter RBI in the majors (35) and is tied for the third most home runs (9).
- Is tied for the AL lead in blown saves (12), has the second fewest saves (15) and the second lowest save percentage (55.6%).
- Has allowed 43-of-133 (32.3%) of inherited runners to score, which is the fifth highest percentage in the AL.
- The A's are 4-28 when the bullpen allows two runs or more, 29-15 when it allows one run or fewer (two complete games).

- Is tied for second in the majors in inherited runners (31) and tied for third in most inherited runners scored (10).
- First batters faced are 9-for-26 (.346) with four home runs and 12 RBI...the RBI are the most in the majors and the homers are tied for the most.
