OAKLAND NOTES

- The **Oakland Athletics** snapped their three-game losing streak...hit three home runs, which ties a season high (eight times, last: June 12 at Los Angeles-AL)...are now 10-5 over their last 15 games...are 15-11 in June...improved to 4-1 in interleague play...are to 14-12 all-time against the Rockies...have out-scored the opposition 355-309 for a run differential of +46...are 1-3 on this 10-game homestand against Kansas City (0-3), Colorado (1-0), and Seattle (four games).
- A's** starting pitchers are 18-10 with a 2.46 ERA (62 er in 227.0 ip) over the last 35 games (beginning May 23) and have allowed one run or fewer 17 times over that stretch...have a 3.08 ERA (166 er in 484.1 ip) for the season.
- The **Athletics** have committed 17 errors in the last 15 games and have 76 for the season.
- Kendall Graveman** is 4-2 with a 2.01 ERA (12 er in 53.2 ip) and a .248 (50-for-202) opponents batting average in eight starts since his return from Triple-A Nashville on May 23...has tossed seven or more innings and allowed two runs or fewer in each of his last five starts and is 2-2 over that span (6 er in 36.0 ip, 1.50 ERA).
- Billy Burns** (0-for-4) snapped his 16-game hitting streak, which was a career high and one game short of the Oakland record for longest hitting streak by a rookie...hit .365 (27-for-74) with 13 runs scored and eight multiple hit games during the streak.
- Billy Butler** (3-for-4, 3 r, 2b, hr, 2 rbi) is 9-for-16 (.563) with six runs, two home runs and five RBI in five interleague games this year...has a .311 (120-for-386) career average against the National League with 16 home runs and 59 RBI in 122 games...recorded his 18th multiple hit game of the season.
- Ike Davis** (2-for-4, r, 2b, hr, 2 rbi) hit his first home run since May 7 at Minnesota...had his sixth multiple hit game of the year.
- Stephen Vogt** (2-for-4, r) is 21-for-50 (.420) with four doubles, two home runs, 13 RBI and four three-hit games over his last 13 contests...is batting .342 (39-for-114) in 37 games at home...recorded his 20th multiple hit game of the season.

COLORADO NOTES

- The **Colorado Rockies** lost their third straight game...are 22-24 since snapping their season-long 11-game losing streak on May 14...are 11-17 in June...are 17-24 on the road...are 1-3 on this 10-game road trip to San Francisco (1-2), Oakland (0-1), and Arizona (four games).
- David Hale** made his first career appearance against the A's...is 0-2 with a 6.23 ERA (9 er in 13 ip) in two road starts compared to 2-1 with a 5.83 ERA (19 er in 29.1 ip) in five starts at home...is 0-3 with a 10.32 ERA (13 er in 11.1 ip) in eight career interleague appearances.
- Nolan Arenado** (1-for-4) extended his hitting streak to 16 games (23-for-62, .371) with a sixth-inning single...it is now the longest active hitting streak in the majors...is batting .306 (33-for-108) with 12 home runs and 33 RBI in June...is batting .298 (42-for-141) with 15 homers and 37 RBI on the road compared to .287 (41-for-143) with nine home runs and 31 RBI at home.
- Charlie Blackmon** (1-for-5, r, hr, rbi, k) has hit safely in 15 of his past 17 games (20-for-62, .323)...is batting .309 in June (34-for-110).
- Troy Tulowitzki** (3-for-3, bb) has now reached base in a career-best 28 consecutive games (previous: 27, July 14-August 10, 2011)...it is the third-longest on-base streak in the majors this year...extended his hitting streak to 13 games (20-for-51, .392) with a fourth-inning single...the hitting streak is a career high...is batting .406 (41-for-101) since May 29...put together his 23rd multiple hit contest of the season and his fourth game with three hits or more.
