## COLORADO ROCKIES (33-43) at OAKLAND ATHLETICS (35-44) LHP Jorge De La Rosa (4-3, 5.15) vs. RHP Chris Bassitt (0-0, 3.38) Game #77 / Road #38 • Tuesday, June 30, 2015

### EAST BAY

- The Colorado Rockies continue their 10-day, 10-game road trip to play Oakland (0-1) and Arizona (4) ... went 1-2 in San Francisco over the weekend ... last Thursday, Colorado completed an eight-game, nine-day homestand 4-4.
- The Rockies dropped the past three games, last night in the three-game series opener here in Oakland and the last two of the San Francisco set after winning Friday at AT&T Park.
- The Rockies are 2-3 in their last five and 5-5 in their past 10 ... are 11-17 in June, including losing 13 of the past 19 since June 10 ... since the season-long 11-game losing streak ended May 14, Colorado is 22-24.
- Rockies are 26-41 since the 7-2 start, which tied for the franchise's best-ever after nine games.
- Began on the road at 6-0 for the first time ever ... won 21 games on the road all of last season ... are 17-22 at home, 16-21 on the road.

### K ZONE

- Lefty Jorge De La Rosa enters Tuesday's start at Oakland five strikeouts shy of 1,000 for his Major League career and one K away from 800 as a Colorado Rockies.

### STREAKING

- Colorado's Nolan Arenado (16) and Troy Tulowitzki (13) have the two longest active hitting streaks in Major League Baseball.

### PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- Rockies third baseman Nolan Arenado was named the National League Player of the Week Monday.
- Over six games since last Tuesday, he batted .391 (9-for-23) with 10 runs, one double, seven homers and 14 RBI ... he logged three multi-homer games during the week ... he had an on-base percentage of .440 and slugged to a 1.348 clip.

### TULO BEING TULO

- Troy Tulowitzki's June batting average ranks first in the National League, second in the Majors (.387; 36-for-93).
- Since May 29, Tulowitzki's .406 average (41-for-101) is first in the Majors ... has hit safely in 25 of his past 26 games that span, raising his average from .266 to .322 (82-for-255) ... batting average this season ranks fifth in the National League.
- Has a career-long 13-game hitting streak (.392; 20-for-51) ... also reached base in a career-high 28 consecutive games.

### WHITE SHOES

- The Rockies are playing Oakland for the first time since being swept in three games at Coors Field June

### 20TH & BLAKE

- In coordination with AEG Live, Coors Field will host to three-time Grammy winner and multi-Platinum artist Zac Brown Band, July 3 ... Big Head Todd And The Monsters will also perform ... rockies.com/zacbrownband.
- Fireworks, presented by Coca-Cola & King Soopers, will be fired off Friday, July 10th after the game vs. Atlanta.
- Sunday, July 12 is Movie Night at Coors Field with The Rookie airing on the videoboard after the game.

12-14 in 2012 ... all-time, Colorado is 12-14 vs the Athletics, 8-6 in Denver, 4-8 here in Oakland.

- Prior to this series, had not made the trek across the Bay Bridge to play the A's since 2009, when the Rockies snapped a seven-game losing streak at the Coliseum by sweeping a three-game series (June 26-28) ... Colorado was 1-7 over its first eight games here in the East Bay.
- The two clubs played each year from 1997 through 2001 ... played again in 2006, 2009 and 2012.

### JUNIOR CIRCUIT

- The Rockies are 125-160 all-time in Interleague play, 82-62 at Coors Field, 43-98 on the road.
- Colorado has not won a road Interleague game since May 7, 2014 at Texas, a streak of 14 consecutive defeats vs. the American League away from home ... that Interleague streak is the second-longest skid all-time ... the Los Angeles Dodgers hold the record at 15 consecutive road losses to the AL from June 14, 2005-June 28, 2006.

### CONNECTED

- Rockies manager Walt Weiss made his Major League debut with the Oakland Athletics on July 12, 1987 ... played parts of six seasons with Oakland from 1987 through 1992 ... played in the postseason in 1988, 1989, 1990 and 1992 for the A's ... drafted by Oakland in 1985 (11th overall selection) ... American League Rookie of the Year in 1988.
- Colorado coach Rene Lachemann made his debut for the Kansas City A's in 1965, was with KC again in 1966 and played in 19 games for Oakland in 1968 ... later was on the A's coaching staff.
- Carlos Gonzalez made his Big League debut for Oakland on May 30, 2008, playing in 85 games that season prior to the November trade.

### AMAZING ARENADO

- Nolan Arenado leads the Majors in RBI with 68 ... 24 homers are tied for third in MLB.
- Is batting .371 (23-for-62) over his season-high 16-game hitting streak, longest active string in the NL ... has nine homers and 21 RBI during the streak.
- This month, is batting .306 (33-for-108) with 12 homers and 33 RBI ... leads the Majors in June RBI and homers are tied for first.
- Batting .298 (42-for-141) with 15 homers and 37 RBI on the road; .287 (41-for-143) with nine home runs and 31 RBI at home.

### CARGO GETTIN' GOIN'

- Carlos Gonzalez is batting .305 (32-for-105) since May 27 ... hitting .292 in June (26-for-89) with six homers and 15 RBI ... this month, homers are tied for eighth in the NL, while RBI are tied for 12th.
- Recorded a career-high tying five hits in Friday's game (fourth time, last: May 6, 2014 vs. Texas) at San Francisco ... that was the most single-game hits by a Colorado Rockies ever against the Giants ... also, just the fourth visiting player to log five hits in a game at AT&T and only the sixth opponent to have five or more hits in San Francisco.

### CLUTCH CITY

- Nolan Arenado (.448; 30-for-67) ranks first in the National League (second in MLB) in batting average with runners in scoring position ... Troy Tulowitzki (.400; 24-for-60) and DJ LeMahieu (.349; 22-for-63) rank tied for sixth and tied for 16th, respectively, when batting with RISP.

### ON THE ROAD

- Rockies pitchers have posted a 3.96 ERA (179.2 IP, 79 ER) in their past 21 road games in a 9-12 stretch ... relievers have notched a 2.90 ERA (62.0 IP, 20 ER) over that same span.

### TOUR DE SCHEMMEL

- Rockies and 850 KOA broadcaster Jerry Schemmel completed the Race Across America, a 3,000-mile race from Oceanside, Calif., to Annapolis, Md., early Sunday morning ... he finished at 7:14 a.m. EDT, having covered 3,004 miles over the course of seven days, 14 hours, and 55 minutes.
- He and his teammate, Brad Cooper, were raising funds for Building Hope International, a Denver based charity, to help build an orphanage in Haiti ... teamenduringhope.org.

**DE LA ROSA AT A GLANCE**

- Will make his 12th start, his fourth on the road ... Rockies have won six of his past seven starts (4-1, 3.46).
- Enters tonight's game with 995 career strikeouts, 799 as a member of the Rockies.
- Became the Rockies all-time wins leader June 14, notching his 73rd win in a Rockies uniform by beating the Miami Marlins ... became Rockies' career franchise leader in strikeouts (788), surpassing Ublado Jimenez (773, 2006-2011) on May 21.
- 34-year-old veteran southpaw hampered by left groin strain in Spring Training and since late May limited by cut on left middle finger.
- Made the 200th start of his career June 14 vs. the Marlins ... has a career starting record of 84-68 with a 4.58 ERA (1116.1 IP, 568 ER).
- Since his first season with Colorado in 2008, fashioned a 73-48 record and 4.26 ERA (916.0 IP, 434 ER) with the Rockies in 167 games, 161 starts with 384 walks and 799 strikeouts ... 73-48 with a 4.27 ERA (907.0 IP, 430 ER) as a Colorado starter ... allowed 48 homers in Denver, 47 on the road since '08.
- Is 47-16 with a 4.22 ERA (477.1 IP, 224 ER) in 87 games, 83 starts at Coors Field as a member of the Rockies.
- Was 15-23 with a 5.85 ERA (274.0 IP, 178 ER) in (97 games, 41 starts) from 2004-2007 with Milwaukee (2004-2006) and Kansas City (2006-07).

**HUNTING FOR WHITE ELEPHANT**

- Will be making his fourth career start against the Athletics, his first since June 27, 2009.
- Is 1-1 with a 4.70 ERA (15.1 IP, 8 ER) lifetime against the A's.
- Has made one career start at the O.co Coliseum, June 29, 2009 (W, 6.0 IP, 5 H, 2 ER, 2 BB, 5 SO).

**LAST TIME OUT**

- Received no decision in the 6-4 Rockies win over Arizona at Coors Field ... pitched 5.0 innings for the second consecutive start while allowing one run on four hits with three walks and three strikeouts ... exited the game in the sixth inning with a cut on his left middle finger.
- Was his first start of the season against Arizona, his 21st career start and 25th career appearance.
- Is now 8-8 with a 2.94 ERA (125.2 IP, 41 ER) against Arizona in his career.

**CLIMBING THE ROCKIES**

- Colorado's career leader at home (1993-2015) in wins (47), winning percentage (.746) and strikeouts (427).

**HIP HIP JORGE**

- Earned his first win of the season on May 16 at the Los Angeles Dodgers, going 7.1 shutout innings, allowing only two hits and no walks while striking out three ... left the game with left groin tightness.
- According to the Elias Sports Bureau's "Elias Says" he's the third pitcher in franchise history to throw at least seven innings without allowing a run or a walk and no more than two hits in a game ... other Rockies pitchers to accomplish this are Jeff Francis in 2006 (9 IP, 2 H) and Jason Marquis in 2009 (9 IP, 2 H).

**2015**

- Won in Miami June 14 to become the Rockies all-time wins leader (73) ... was his third straight quality start and fifth consecutive start the Rockies won.
- Beat St. Louis June 9 at home, 4-3, allowing three hits and two runs with eight strikeouts over seven innings.
- In his first start since May 21 due to the finger injury, beat the Dodgers June 2 in game one of a doubleheader, 6-3 ... allowed three runs on four hits, four walks and six strikeouts.
- Got a no-decision a 7-3 Rockies win vs. Philadelphia May 21, allowing six hits and three runs ... walked three and fanned five ... touched for solo homer (Howard) in the fifth inning.
- Took the loss May 2 at San Diego ... went five innings, surrendering three runs on five hits and three walks ... struck out nine Padres, the 10th time in his career he has struck out nine batters.
- Had a no-decision on a 5-4 loss April 25 vs. San Francisco ... allowed a fourth-inning, two-out solo homer (Susac) ... left a 2-2 game after five innings ... Rockies lost in 11 innings.
- Reinstated from the disabled list on April 20 and made his first start of the year against the Padres, allowing a career-high tying nine runs in two innings in the 14-3 loss in Denver.
- Began the season on the disabled list due to a left groin strain.
