By winning his 5th straight start yesterday, **Taijuan Walker** joined teammate Felix Hernandez (April 18-May 10) and Minnesota's Ricky Nolasco (May 2-25) as only A.L. pitchers to do so this season...Seattle's record for most consecutive starts won is 7 by Jamie Moyer 5/6-6/8/2003 & Scott Bankhead (June 18-July 20, 1989).

Nelson Cruz is hitting .450 (9x20) with 4 runs, 1 double, 2 home runs and 5 RBI in his last 5 games against Oakland...in his first game against the A's this season was 0-for-4.

VS. THE ATHLETICS

The Mariners and Athletics meet for the 7th of 19 games this season... Seattle went 10-9 vs. the A's last season, including a 4-5 mark at Safeco Field...26-18 over last 44 games vs. the A's...33-30 in last 63 games.

TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue a 9-game, 11-day road trip with the first of four games against Oakland (4 G)...began the trip with 3 games against Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and 2 games against San Diego (2-0)...following this trip, will conclude the first half of the season with a 7-game homestand against Detroit (3 G) and Los Angeles-AL (4 G) before the All-Star Break...tonight's game will be televised in the Mariners TV market on **ROOT SPORTS** and broadcast on **710 ESPN Seattle** and the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...are 9-8 in the last 17, but have dropped 19 of last 35 games...17-23 at Safeco Field, including 5-13 in last 18 games...season-high 4-game winning streak May 8-12...31-36 record vs. AL teams, and 5-6 in Interleague play...9-13-4 in series played, including 9 rubber games (2-7).

- **AL West** - 18-14 vs. the AL West (LAA: 4-5, HOU: 4-9, OAK: 5-1, TEX: 5-1).
- **No Free Passes** - Mariners are 30-17 when issuing 3 or fewer walks; 6-25 when allowing 4+ BB.
- **Day Game Blues** - Mariners have dropped 10 of last 12 day games (10-13 overall).
- **Close Games** - Lead MLB with 46 of 78 games decided by 2 or fewer runs (15-13 in 1-run games).
- **Extra Innings** - Mariners lead the American League with 10 extra-inning games (4-6).
- **Back On Track** - **Fernando Rodney** has allowed 3 hits over his last 8 relief appearances...during this stretch, since June 11, Rodney has allowed 4 walks and struck out 5 in 7.2 scoreless innings.
- **June Bloom** - **Austin Jackson** hit .304 (28x92) w/11 R, 10 XBH, 8 RBI, 6 BB in 24G in June.

PITCHING SCORELESS STREAK...Seattle has tossed back-to-back shutouts and haven't allowed a run in 18.0 consecutive innings...the last Mariners scoreless inning streak of 20+ innings was July 6-8, 2014 (at CWS & vs. MIN)...the Mariners record is 31 consecutive scoreless innings from the 3rd inning on July 7, 1991 through the 6th inning on July 13, 1991.

STRAIGHT A'S...after losing the first meeting between the teams, Seattle has won 5 straight games against Oakland...it is the 5th time in club history to win five straight against Oakland (last: 6, May 27, 2009)...the record for most consecutive wins against the A's is 7 (Sept. 26, 2008-May 1, 2009)... Seattle is 26-18 vs. Oakland since the start of 2013 including 14-9 at the O.co Coliseum.

ZERO-ZILCH-ZIP...the Mariners pitching staff tossed back-to-back shutouts (vs. San Diego) during this last series...it is the 18th time in club history (last: Sept. 24-25, 2013) to complete consecutive shutouts...Seattle has never tossed 3 straight shutouts but Pittsburgh (June 14-16, 2015) & San Francisco (May 19-21 & May 3-5, 2015) have both done it this season.

POWER UP...Seattle has hit 13 home runs in the last 10 games (since June 20)...had hit just 13 home runs in the previous 24 games (May 26-June 19)...Seattle ranks 6th in the American League with 81 home runs this season.

BACK ON TRACK...Seattle starters have posted a 2.76 ERA (31 ER, 101.0 IP) with 93 strikeouts in 15 starts since June 15 including 5 starts of 6.0+ innings and zero runs allowed...this followed a 4-game stretch June 11-14 where the starts posted a 15.00 ERA (20 ER, 12.0 IP) and tossed 3.1 innings or less in 3 of those four outings.

THE MAGIC NUMBER...Seattle has scored 5+ runs in each of the last two games, both wins... Seattle has won 12 consecutive games in which they've scored 5+ runs...began the season 4-5 in games where they scored 5+ runs.

MILLER TIME...**Brad Miller** is hitting .391 (9x23) with 3 runs, 2 doubles, 1 home run and 3 RBI over his last 6 games...over the last 12 road games, is hitting .359 (14x39) with 5 runs, 3 doubles, 2 home runs, 5 RBI, 4 walks and a .419 on-base percentage...in his first 23 road games of the season, he hit .113 (8x71) with 3 runs, 1 double, 1 triple and 3 RBI

ROAD RECORD TURNAROUND...**Seattle** is 12-7 (.632) on the road since May 22, the 2nd-best road record in the American League and 4th in the Majors in that span...trail just Tampa Bay (11-4, .733), Oakland (11-6, .647) and Pittsburgh (11-6, .647)...began the season 7-12 on the road including a 2-8 stretch April 30-May 21.

MATCH-UP TO WATCH...**Franklin Gutierrez** and **Scott Kazmir** have not faced each other since 2010, but Gutierrez is hitting .389 (7x18) with 3 home runs and 5 RBI in his career against the left-hander...**Robinson Canó** is hitting .231 against Kazmir, but 3 of his 9 hits have been home runs.

A.L. ROOKIE OF THE MONTH?...**Mike Montgomery** put together an award worthy first month in the Majors...he finished June with a 3-2 record and a 1.62 ERA (8 ER, 44.1 IP) in his 6 starts...he tossed 2 complete-game shutouts and allowed 2 earned runs or fewer in 5 of his 6 starts...his 1.62 ERA ranked 5th in the Majors during June (amongst all pitchers, not just rookies).

20 BEFORE THE BREAK...**Nelson Cruz** has 20 home runs on the season, making it the 18th time in club history that someone has hit 20 home runs before the break (last: **Raul Ibanez**, 24 in 2013)...other Mariners who have done it include: **Ken Griffey Jr.** (6x), **Alex Rodriguez** (2x), **Bret Boone** (2x), **Ibanez** (2x), **Jay Buhner** (2x), **Edgar Martinez** (2x) and **Russell Branyan** (1x).

AS YOU KNOW...Seattle starters have not allowed a run in any of the last 3 starts: **Felix Hernandez** (6.0 IP Sunday), **Mike Montgomery** (9.0 IP Tuesday) & **Taijuan Walker** (6.0 IP Wednesday)...**AND YOU MAY KNOW**...that in that span, they are 2-0 with just 3 hits allowed and 22 strikeouts...**BUT DID YOU KNOW?**...that this 21.0 inning scoreless streak is the longest single-season scoreless streaks by starters since a 25.0 inning streak May 19-22, 2011?...the club record is held by the 2001 Mariners who had a stretch of 38.2 consecutive scoreless innings by starts Sept. 8-20, 2001.

ABOUT ELIAS...

- Pronounced: Roenis (roh-EN-ees) Elias (ehl-LEE-us)
- 26-year-old left-hander is making his 13th start of the season tonight, his 42nd career MLB start and his 3rd start vs. the Athletics.
- Has spent entire career in the Mariners organization after signing as a minor league free agent on May 3, 2011.
- Defected from Cuba to Mexico in late 2010 after playing with Guantanamo in Serie Nacional.
- Owns a career MiL record of 25-19, 3.76 ERA (145 ER, 347.1 IP) in 63 games/60 starts over 5 seasons.
- Made his US professional debut in 2011 with the AZL Mariners...also appeared in games with Pulaski and Clinton during his rookie campaign.
- Is 1 of 6 Cuban-born pitchers (23 overall players) to pitch in the Major Leagues this season, joining Odrisamer Despaigne-SD, Raisel Iglesias-CIN, Aroldis Chapman-CIN, Dalier Hinojosa-BOS and Roberto Osuna-TOR.

LAST START...L#5 in Mariners 8-2 loss vs. KC on June 24...tossed 3.0 perfect innings before allowing 7 runs in the 4th...allowed 7 runs for just 3rd time in his career, matching a career-high with 7 **earned** runs...recorded 2 outs in the 4th before being removed with team trailing 6-0.

ROUGH STRETCH...is 1-2 with a 10.29 ERA over his last 3 starts (since 6/14)...went 2-3, 6.11 ERA in 5 starts in June, after going 2-2, 3.07 ERA in his first 7 starts of the season...allowed career-high-tying 7 ER in 2 of his last 3 starts.

NIGHT OWL...owns a 4-4 record with a 3.57 ERA (25 ER, 63.0 IP) in 10 starts in night games...compares to a 0-1 record with a 9.00 ERA (9 ER, 9.0 IP) in 2 starts in day games (was 4-0, 2.23 in 6 day games last season).

WHERE IT ALL STARTED...Elias made his Major League debut April 3, 2014 vs. the A's at O.co Coliseum, making the jump from Double-A...recorded a no-decision allowing 2 hits and 1 run in 5.0 innings.

VS. THE A.L. WEST...is 4-5 with a 3.92 ERA (36 ER, 82.2 IP) with 70 strikeouts in 15 career starts against the AL West...has allowed 2 runs or fewer in 5 of his last 8 starts against the AL West...allowed 2 runs or fewer in 9 of his 15 career starts against the West...is 3-2, 4.46 ERA (21 ER, 42.1 IP) in 8 road starts vs AL West.

NOT BAD, KID...has a 3.45 ERA (47 ER, 122.2 IP) with 104 strikeouts over his last 22 starts (since July 21, 2014)...his ERA in that span (min. 20 GS) is 16th in the American League...**Felix Hernandez** (2.73) ranks 4th.

WHEN THE GOING GETS TOUGH...opposing hitters are batting .250 (25x100) with runners on base, but a .222 mark (10x45) with runners in scoring position and a .130 BAA (3x23) with RISP & 2 outs.

QUITE THE STREAK...allowed 4 runs on May 30, snapping a streak of 16 consecutive starts allowing 3 runs or less...streak was 3rd-longest in club history behind Erik Bedard (20, June 8, 2008-July 25, 2009) & Felix Hernandez (18, May 18-Aug. 22, 2014)...has allowed 3 or fewer earned runs in 3 of 5 starts since the streak ended.

TACOMA RECAP...Elias was 2-0 with an 8.04 ERA (14 ER, 15.2 IP) in 3 starts with AAA Tacoma...has tossed at least 5.0 innings in each of his 3 AAA starts...recorded the win in last start with the Rainiers on April 20 vs. El Paso, allowing 4 runs on 7 hits with 2 walks and 4 strikeouts over 5.0 innings.

LOOKING FOR SOME HELP HERE...despite posting a 3.45 ERA over his last 22 MLB starts (dating to July 21, 2014), Elias has not received much run support...has received support of 2 runs or fewer in 17 of last 22 starts including 7 starts receiving no run support...so far in 2015, has received 22 total runs of support in his 12 starts, receiving more than 2 runs in just 2 starts: 4 at BAL, May 20 & 5 vs. HOU June 19...has a 2.75 run support average.

DOUBLE TROUBLE...has been a master of inducing the groundball double play in his career, recording 31 GIDP in his 41 career starts...ranks 2nd on the team with 8 GIDP this season, trailing **Felix Hernandez** (12 GIDP)...induced 23 double plays in 2014, T8th in the Major Leagues...joined John Halama (25 in 1999) as the only rookies in franchise history to induce at least 20 double plays.

2014 SEASON IN REVIEW...

- **The Totals** - Went 10-12, 3.85 ERA (70 ER, 163.2 IP) in 29 starts.
- **Shut Down** - Shut down for the season after leaving start Sept. 16 at LAA with a strained flexor bundle in his left elbow.
- **10 Win Rookies** - Became 7th rookie pitcher in club history to record 10+ wins in a season, first since John Halama (11) and Freddy Garcia (17) in 1999.
- **Rookie Mariners Rankings** - Among Mariners rookie pitchers all-time, ranked 4th in strikeouts (143), 6th in starts (29), 7th in wins (10), 8th in innings (163.2).
- **MLB Rookie Rankings** - One of 7 MLB rookies to record 10 or more wins in 2014...also ranked among AL rookie leaders in starts, innings and strikeouts.
- **10 K's in the Bronx** - Struck out career-high 10 batters May 1 at NYY...became the 2nd opposing rookie pitcher to strike out 10 or more in his Yankee Stadium debut in the past 45 seasons (also: Matt Moore, 9/22/11, 11 K).
- **Shutout** - Tossed 3-hit shutout June 1 vs. Detroit...first Mariners rookie pitcher to throw a shutout since Freddy Garcia on Aug. 24, 1999 vs. Detroit.
- **MLB Debut** - Made his MLB debut April 3 at Oakland (5.0,2,1,1,2,4)...had a no-hitter through 4.2 innings...became the 6th starting pitcher in Mariners history to allow 1 or fewer runs in a MLB debut.
- **What A Jump** - Elias was the Mariners 4th starting pitcher since 1993 to jump from Double-A to a starting spot in the Major League rotation, joining Brandon Maurer in 2013, Mike Hampton and John Cummings, who both did it out of Class A back in 1993...Mark Langston also made the jump from Double-A in 1984 after previously pitching in AA Chattanooga.

Elias is making his 3rd career start against Oakland...is 1-0, 3.18 ERA (4ER, 11.1 IP) in 2 previous starts vs. Athletics, both in 2014 and at O.co Coliseum...allowed 1 run on 2 hits over 5 IP in MLB debut on April 3, 2014, receiving a no-decision in Mariners 3-2, 12-inning loss (5.0,2,1,1,3,3)...earned win in Mariners 8-3 victory at OAK on May 6, 2014 (6.1,5,3,3,3,6,HR)...here is how Elias has fared vs. current A's hitters:
