ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three of the last four MLB BEST RECORDS, games, four of the last six and 13 of the last 20... are now 24-16 (.600) since bottoming out at a season-high 16 games under .500 (14-30) at the conclusion of play on May 22...have the best record in the American League and third best in the majors dating back to May 23...are 38-46 (.452) overall, which is the worst record in the AL and fifth worst in the majors...have been in sole possession of last

place in the AL West for 57 of the last 58 days...for the season, the A's have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, seven days in fourth, two days tied for fourth and 57 days in fifth.

PITCHING: The A's tossed their second shutout in the last three games yesterday and now have 11 for the season, which is the most in the American League and tied for second most in the majors...it is the most by an Oakland team before the All-Star Break since the 1973 club also had 11... the best is 13 by the 1972 A's...now have a 2.84 ERA (139 er in 441.0 ip) over the last 50 games (beginning May 12) after logging a 4.17 ERA over the first 34 contests...have a 3.38 ERA overall, which is the lowest in the AL and sixth lowest in the majors...also lead the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.358), rank second in fewest home runs (67) and fourth in opponents batting average (.239) and on-base percentage (.300).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer in five of the last six games (6 er in 39.1 ip, 1.37 ERA) and 21 of the last 40 (68 er in 259.1 ip, 2.36 ERA)...have a 3.00 ERA (172 er in 516.2 ip) for the season, which is second lowest in the majors (St. Louis, 2.83)...lead the majors in innings pitched (516.2) and have yielded the second fewest home runs (36).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .244 (71-for-291) with 30 runs scored in nine games on the homestand (3.3 per game) and are 12-for-71 (.169) with runners in scoring position...hit .306 with 76 runs scored over the previous 11 games (6.9 runs per game) while batting .395 with RISP...for the season, the A's rank second in the American League in doubles (148) and triples (23) and fourth in runs (371), extra base hits (240) and fewest strikeouts (559)...have been successful in 50-of-61 (82.0%) stolen base attempts, which is the best mark in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 20 errors in the last 20 games and have 79 for the season, which is 14 more than any other team (Texas, 65)...the errors have led to 41 unearned runs, which is second most in the majors (San Diego, 45)...are on pace to commit 152 errors and have not made more than 146 in a season since 1983 when they had 157.

RUN DIFFERENTIAL: The A's have out-scored the opposition 371-321 for a run differential of +50...that is second best in the American League West, third best in the AL and sixth best in the majors...are 27-15 (.643) in games decided by three runs or more, which is the third best record in the majors...however, are 11-31 (.262) in games decided by two runs or fewer, which is the worst mark in the majors.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher in three of the four games of this series against Seattle...have a 5-15 (.250) record when the opponent starts a left-hander compared to 33-31 (.516) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second worst in the majors (Colorado, 3-13)...are batting .238 (176-for-740) with 14 home runs against lefties compared to .267 (579-for-2168) with 55 home runs off righties...the average against lefties is fourth lowest in the American League and the mark against righties is third highest.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-5 on this 10-game homestand against Kansas City (0-3), Colorado (2-1) and Seattle (2-1)...it is the A's second longest homestand of the season (11, July 30-Aug. 9)...this homestand concludes a stretch where the A's will play 15 of 18 games at home... are 11-6 over the first 17 games of the stretch...are 12-9 over the last 21 home games after starting the year 6-16...are 18-25 (.419) at home and 20-21 (.488) on the road...have the third worst home record in the American League...have finished the season with a home winning percentage under .429 once in Oakland history and that was in 1979 (31-50, .383)... leave following the game today for the final road trip before the break, a six-game trip to New York (three games) and Cleveland (three games)... went 3-0 on the last road trip to Texas and have a season-best six-game road winning streak...have back-to-back winning road trips after a streak of 11 consecutive road trips with a .500 record or worse...that fell one short of the longest such streak in Oakland history...have a 2.92 ERA (128 er in 394.0 ip) at home compared to 3.90 (152 er in 351.0 ip) on the road.

BEFORE THE BREAK: The A's are 38-46 with seven games remaining before the All-Star Break...have clinched a losing record before the break for the first time since 2009 (39-53)...that was also the last time the A's were in last place at the break as they trailed first place Texas by 12 games...currently have 23 triples, which are second most in Oakland history before the All-Star Break (26 in 1974).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 6-20 (.231) in one-run games...have the worst record, most losses and fewest wins in the majors in one-run games...the worst record in one-run games in Oakland history is 16-26 (.381) in 1980...16 of the A's last 18 losses have been by three runs or fewer...are 2-11 in games decided in the last at bat...the wins are the fewest in the majors and the losses are second most in the American League...are 0-6 in extra inning games and are the only team without an extra inning win...are tied for second in the majors in extra inning losses (Pittsburgh, 7)...have not won an extra inning game since Sept. 21, 2014, an 8-6 win over Philadelphia in 10 innings...have a sixgame extra inning losing streak, which matches the longest such streak by an A's team over the last 20 years (May 18-July 5, 2011 and May 21-July 25, 1999)...have not played an extra inning game since May 11, a streak of 50 consecutive nine-inning games.

WINS AND LOSSES: The A's are 24-27 (.471) in night games compared to 14-19 (.424) during the day...have won 13 of their last 19 day games after losing 13 of the first 14...have the fourth worst record in day games in the American League (Los Angeles, 8-14)...finished June with a 15-12 record to snap a four-month streak with a losing record...it was the A's first winning month since last July when they went 15-10.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have six players on the disabled list (Crisp, Doolittle, Ladendorf, Parker, Thompson, Venditte)...Crisp, Doolittle, Ladendorf, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...have had at least six players on the DL all year...have used the DL a total of 17 times...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013.

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's are 3-6 against the Mariners but have outscored Seattle 42-37...four of the six losses have been by one run...12 of the A's 16 losses over the last two years have been by two runs or fewer.... are 3-3 in Oakland this year and were swept in a three-game series in Seattle in May...have lost each of the previous two season series and three of the previous four...are 41-44 against the Mariners dating back to 2011...all-time, the A's are 324-251 (.563) against Seattle, which is the second best mark by any team against the Mariners to Boston's .574 (min. 20 games)...are 179-110 in Oakland, 144-140 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Burns leads Major League rookies in hits (77), stolen bases (17) and multiple hit games (24)...the stolen bases are second most by an A's rookie over the last 28 years (Weeks, 22 in 2011)...**Josh Reddick** leads the majors with 32 two-out RBI...**Stephen Vogt** leads Major League catchers in batting average (.311), slugging percentage (.580) and on-base percentage (.386) and is tied for the lead in home runs (13).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1989 Mark McGwire connects off Charlie Leibrandt for his 100th career homer, a three-run shot in the third inning of the A's 12-9, 11-inning loss to Kansas City...in 1993 Rickey Henderson becomes just the second player in Major League history to lead off both games of a doubleheader with a homer...Boston's Harry Hopper was the first on May 30 1913 vs. Washington...prior to the game, Rollie Fingers has his number 34 retired...in 1994 Rickey Henderson becomes Oakland's all-time leader in games played when he plays in his 1411th game as an Athletic...in 1996 the A's set an Oakland record and tie a franchise record by scoring 13 runs in the first inning of a 16-8 win over California...Matt Stairs tied a ML record by driving in six runs in the inning.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (0-1, 2.87 ERA)

BRIEFLY: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville last Tuesday for his second stint with the A's this year...started that day against Colorado and took the loss, despite allowing just one run on five hits and no walks in 5.0 innings... it was his first start as an Athletic and the sixth of his career...was called up for the first time April 23 and logged a 3.38 ERA and .135 opponents batting average in five relief appearances...however, walked nine batters in 10.2 innings and was optioned back to Nashville May 11.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 1-2 with a 3.48 ERA (13 er in 33.2 ip) and .278 (37-for-133) opponents batting average in six career starts compared to 0-0 with a 3.86 ERA (5 er in 11.2 ip) and .167 (7-for-42) opponents average in six career relief appearances...has 12 walks in 33.2 innings as a starter, 10 in 11.2 innings in relief...has made of his six appearance with the A's this year in relief and starting in five of his six games with Chicago (AL) last year.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His .179 opponents batting average includes a .115 (3-for-26) mark against left-handed hitters compared to .233 (7-for-30) against right-handers...has issued eight of his nine walks to lefties for a .343 on-base percentage...opponents are 2-for-17 (.118) with runners in scoring position.

IN RELIEF: Yielded at least one run in three of his five outings and walked two batters or more four times...allowed 1-of-2 (50.0%) inherited runners to score...first batters faced were 0-for-3 with a walk and hit by pitch... tossed 4.1 innings in his first outing April 25 against Houston, which is the longest outing by an A's reliever this year.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss to Colorado last Tuesday in Oakland...retired each of the first 10 batters he faced before allowing back-to-back singles to Tulowitzki and Arenado in the fourth inning...allowed his only run in the fifth inning on a RBI single by Blackmon... was relieved by Rodriguez to start the sixth inning with the A's trailing 1-0.

BASSITT vs. SEATTLE: Has made one career appearance and it came in relief earlier this year on May 9 at Seattle (1.1 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 0 so)...entered the game to start the seventh inning with the A's trailing 6-1... walked the first batter before retiring the next three...then loaded the bases in the eighth inning on a single, walk and hit by pitch...was relieved by Abad who allowed one of the runs to score.

WITH NASHVILLE: Was 2-6 with a 3.71 ERA and .216 opponents batting average in 12 games, including nine starts, in his Triple-A debut with Nashville...allowed just one home run in 63.0 innings and that came to the third batter he faced in his first start...has a 62.0-inning, 253-batters faced Triple-A homerless streak...struck out 64 batters in 63.0 innings and issued 18 walks (2.57 per nine innings) for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.56... went 1-5 with a 3.83 ERA in nine games following his May 11 option... including 0-3 with a 4.30 ERA over his final four starts.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His .216 opponents batting average included a .213 (29-for-136) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .221 (21-for-95) against lefties...opponents hit .184 with the bases empty, .267 with runners on...allowed a .280 batting average with runners in scoring position.

THIS AND THAT: Went 2-2 with a 2.15 ERA and .195 opponents batting average in seven games at home compared to 0-4 with a 6.04 ERA

and .245 opponents average in five games on the road...was 1-1 with a 3.00 ERA in his three relief appearances and 1-5 with a 3.88 ERA in nine starts...allowed 1-of-2 (50.0%) inherited runners to score...the Sounds were 4-5 (.444) in his starting assignments...tossed more than six innings in just two of his starts.

2015 NASHVILLE HIGHLIGHTS: Allowed a season-high five runs on a season-high six hits for the loss in his first start April 9 at Colorado Springs...his first win came in his third appearance of the season, a relief outing against Colorado Springs when he tossed 4.2 scoreless innings... that ran his record to 1-1 with a 3.38 ERA before his April 23 promotion to Oakland...return to Nashville May 11 and pitched in relief in each of his first two outings...including May 19 against New Orleans when he tossed 4.1 scoreless innings and allowed just one hit...returned to the starting rotation for good May 24...picked up his second and final win of the season May 29 against Las Vegas, allowing a run on four hits in 5.2 innings...struck out a season-high 11 batters in 6.0 innings June 3 against Salt Lake...allowed just one unearned run in that game but had a no decision in the Sounds 5-1 win...then walked a season-high four batters in his next start June 8 at New Orleans, a six-inning complete game...allowed three runs and took the loss in a 3-1 decision...tossed a season-high 7.0 innings June 20 against Omaha but took the loss in a 5-3 decision...logged 5.0 scoreless innings in his final start, a no decision in a 3-2 win over Oklahoma City June 26

CAREER: Was originally drafted by the Chicago White Sox in the 16th round of the 2015 First-Year Player Draft...made his Major League debut last year, going 1-1 with a 3.94 ERA in six games, including five starts... was traded to the A's with Josh Phegley, Rangel Ravelo and Marcus Semien for Jeff Samardzija and Michael Ynoa, December 9.

MINOR LEAGUE CAREER: Compiled a 22-10 record, five saves and a 2.97 ERA in 96 games, including 44 starts, in four seasons in the White Sox farm system...did not pitch above Double-A with Chicago...is now 24-16 with five saves and a 3.09 ERA (131 er in 381.0 ip) in 108 career minor league appearances, including 53 starts...has allowed just 21 home runs, an average of 0.50 per nine innings.

RHP Sonny Gray (9-3, 2.09 ERA): Is scheduled to make his first start since June 25 as he missed his turn in the rotation due to gastroenteritis caused by salmonella...ranks second in the American League with a 2.09 ERA...that is third lowest by an Oakland starter at the end of June over the last 25 years (Duchscherer, 1.91 in 2008; Haren, 1.91 in 2007)...is 6-1 with a 1.88 ERA in nine starts on the road...is tied for the Major League lead in road wins and ranks fourth in the AL in road ERA...has allowed 15 of his 17 extra base hits with the bases empty...leads Major League pitchers with 21 putouts, which are the most by an A's pitcher since Chad Gaudin had 22 in 2007...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 6-3 A's win at Texas June 25 (6.0 ip, 9 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 7 so)...is 1-1 with a 3.21 ERA in two career starts against New York, both in Oakland...including a win in his only start this year, a 6-2 A's win on May 29 (8.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 5 so).

- The A's bullpen has allowed one run or fewer in 12 of its past 14 games (9 er in 35.0 ip, 2.31 ERA).
- Has a 3.48 ERA (37 er in 95.2 ip) over its past 38 games (beginning May 23) after logging a 4.82 ERA in its first 44 games...has a 4.26 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League (Texas, 4.38).
- Has six wins and 16 losses...the wins are tied for the fewest in the majors and the losses are tied for fourth most.
- Has allowed the most first batter RBI in the majors (38) and is tied for the most home runs (11).
- Is tied for the AL lead in blown saves (12), has the second fewest saves (17) and second lowest save percentage (58.6%). Has allowed the fourth most home runs in the AL (31).
- The A's are 4-29 when the bullpen allows two runs or more, 33-16 when it allows one run or fewer (two complete games).

- Has not allowed a run in 15 of his past 18 games (4 er in 11.2 ip, 3.09 ERA) after posting a 7.04 ERA in his first 11 contests.
- Has allowed 18 hits, 11 of which are for extra bases (five doubles, one triple, five home runs)...has the fourth highest opponents slugging percentage among American League relievers (.548).
- Is tied for second in the AL in most inherited runners scored (10) and is third in inherited runners (31).
- First batters faced are 9-for-26 (.346) with four home runs and 12 RBI... the home runs and RBI are tied for the most in the majors.
- Has allowed a .172 (5-for-29) batting average to right-handed hitters compared to .295 (13-for-44) with nine extra base hits (.705 slugging percentage) against left-handers.
- Has a loss in four games against the Mariners (3.1 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 4 so, 2.70 ERA).

- Tossed 1.1 innings Wednesday afternoon and earned the save...it was his fourth career save of four outs or more, all this season.
