ABOUT THE A'S: Split a four-game series with Seattle to close out the last homestand and are now 13-8 over the last 21 games...are 24-17 (.585) since bottoming out at a season-high 16 games under .500 (14-30) at the conclusion of play on May 22...are tied for the best record in the AL and tied for third best in the majors dating back to May 23...are 38-47 (.447) overall, which is the worst record in the AL and fifth worst in the majors...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West for 59 of the last 60 days...for the season, the A's have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, seven days in fourth, two days tied for fourth and 59 days in fifth.

ALL-STARS: The A's had two players named to the American League All-Star team yesterday, both as a result of player balloting...Stephen Vogt received the most player votes among catchers and Sonny Gray placed third among starting pitchers...it will be the first All-Star Game for both players...this marks the A's third consecutive season with multiple players...it is their second consecutive season with at least one position player after 10 consecutive years without one.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed two runs or fewer in six of the last seven games (14 er in 63.0 ip, 2.00 ERA)...now have a 2.82 ERA (141 er in 450.0 ip) over the last 51 games (beginning May 12) after logging a 4.17 ERA over the first 34 contests...have a 3.37 ERA overall, which is the lowest in the American League and sixth lowest in the majors...also lead the AL in shutouts (11) and opponents slugging percentage (.356), rank second in opponents batting average (.238) and fewest home runs (67) and third in opponents on-base percentage (.299).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer in five of the last seven games (8 er in 45.0 ip, 1.60 ERA) and 21 of the last 41 (70 er in 265.0 ip, 2.38 ERA)...have a 3.00 ERA (174 er in 522.1 ip) for the season, which is second lowest in the majors (St. Louis, 2.75)...rank second in the majors in innings pitched (522.1) and fewest home runs (36).

OFFENSE: The A's batted .245 (79-for-323) with 31 runs scored in 10 games on the last homestand (3.1 per game) and went 12-for-74 (.162) with runners in scoring position...hit .306 with 76 runs scored over the previous 11 games (6.9 runs per game) while batting .395 with RISP...for the season, the A's rank second in the American League in triples (23), third in fewest strikeouts (564), fourth in batting average (.260) and doubles (149) and tied for fourth in runs (372)...have been successful in 50-of-61 (82.0%) stolen base attempts, which is the best mark in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 79 errors, which is 14 more than any other team (Texas, 65)...the errors have led to 41 unearned runs, which is second most in the majors (San Diego, 46)...are on pace to commit 151 errors and have not made more than 146 in a season since 1983 when they had 157.

RUN DIFFERENTIAL: The A's have out-scored the opposition 372-323 for a run differential of +49...that is second best in the American League West, tied for third best in the AL and tied for sixth best in the majors...are 27-15 (.643) in games decided by three runs or more, which is the third best record in the majors...however, are 11-32 (.256) in games decided by two runs or fewer, which is the worst mark in the majors.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's lost 2-1 on Sunday and are now 6-21 (.222) in one-run games...have the worst record, most losses and fewest wins in the majors in one-run games...the worst record in one-run games in Oakland history is 16-26 (.381) in 1980...17 of the A's last 19 losses have been by three runs or fewer...are 2-11 in games decided in the last at bat...the wins are the fewest in the majors and the losses are second most in the American League...are 0-6 in extra inning games and are the only team without an extra inning win...are tied for second in the majors in extra inning losses (Pittsburgh, 7)...have not won an extra inning game since Sept. 21, 2014, an 8-6 win over Philadelphia in 10 innings...have a six-game extra inning losing streak, which matches the longest such streak by an A's team over the last 20 years (May 18-July 5, 2011 and May 21-July 25, 1999)...have not played an extra inning game since May 11, a streak of 51 consecutive nine-inning games.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin their final trip before the All-Star Break tonight, a six-game trip to New York (three games) and Cleveland (three games)...went 3-0 on the last road trip to Texas and have a season-best six-game road winning streak, which matches the A's second longest road winning streak over the last 10 years...had a 12-game road winning streak from Aug. 24 to Sept. 12, 2012...have back-to-back winning road trips after a streak of 11 consecutive road trips with a .500 record or worse...that fell one short of the longest such streak in Oakland history...are 20-21 (.488) on the road compared to 18-26 (.409) at home...have the third worst home record in the American League...have finished the season with a home winning percentage under .429 once in Oakland history and that was in 1979 (31-50, .383)...went 4-6 on the last homestand against Kansas City (0-3), Colorado (2-1) and Seattle (2-2)...are 12-10 over the last 22 home games after starting the year 6-16...have a 2.90 ERA (130 er in 403.0 ip) at home compared to 3.90 (152 er in 351.0 ip) on the road.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's faced a left-handed starting pitcher in three of the previous four games and lost two of those games against lefties...are now 5-16 (.238) when the opponent starts a left-hander compared to 33-31 (.516) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second worst in the majors (Colorado, 3-13)...are batting .238 (182-for-764) with 15 home runs against lefties compared to .267 (581-for-2176) with 55 home runs off righties...the average against lefties is fourth lowest in the American League and the mark against righties is third highest.

BEFORE THE BREAK: The A's are 38-47 and will have a losing record at the All-Star Break for the first time since 2009 (39-53)...that was also the last time the A's were in last place at the break as they trailed first place Texas by 12 games...currently have 23 triples, which are second most in Oakland history before the All-Star Break (26 in 1974)...the pitching staff has 11 shutouts, which is the most by an Oakland team before the All-Star Break since the 1973 club also had 11...the best is 13 by the 1972 A's.

WINS AND LOSSES: The A's are 24-27 (.471) in night games compared to 14-20 (.412) during the day...have won 13 of their last 20 day games after losing 13 of the first 14...have the second worst record in day games in the American League (Los Angeles, 8-14)...finished June with a 15-12 record to snap a four-month streak with a losing record...it was the A's first winning month since last July when they went 15-10.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have six players on the disabled list (Crisp, Doolittle, Ladendorf, Parker, Thompson, Venditte)...Crisp, Doolittle, Ladendorf, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...have had at least six players on the DL all year...have used the DL a total of 17 times...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. YANKEES: The A's lead the season series 3-1 after winning three of four in Oakland at the end of May...won the season series last year 4-2 and need one more win to clinch their third consecutive season series win...are 12-4 against the Yankees since the start of the 2013 season...have won 17 of their last 23 games against New York, including five of the last seven at Yankee Stadium...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 238-270 against the Yankees...that includes 132-123 in Oakland and 106-147 in New York...are 9-16 (.360) at Yankee Stadium...all-time, the A's are 779-1136 against the Yankees/Orioles.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Burns leads Major League rookies in hits (78), stolen bases (17) and multiple hit games (24)...**Josh Reddick** leads the majors with 32 two-out RBI...**Stephen Vogt** leads ML catchers in batting average (.309), slugging percentage (.577) and on-base percentage (.384), is tied for the lead in home runs (13) and ranks second in RBI (47).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1986** the A's defeat Boston 6-4 in Tony La Russa's first game as A's manager...Dave Stewart picks up his first of 116 wins as an Oakland Athletic and Jose Canseco hits his 20th homer...in **1994** the A's use a club record eight pitchers in a 6-4, nine inning win at Baltimore...four of them face one hitter each and Bob Welch, Dave Leiper, Bill Taylor and Ed Vosberg all pitch in the seventh inning...in **2002** the A's defeat Kansas City 3-2, their Oakland record setting seventh consecutive one-run game.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (9-3, 2.09 ERA)

AMONG THE LEADERS: Leads the American League in ERA (2.09) and opponents slugging percentage (.276), ranks second in opponents batting average (.205), fourth in opponents on-base percentage (.257), tied for fourth in wins (9) and fifth in winning percentage (.750)...has allowed just five home runs in 107.2 innings and his average of 0.42 home runs per nine innings is the second lowest mark in the AL...ranks fourth in wild pitches (8) and fifth in fewest pitches per inning (14.8) and highest run support (6.44).

ALL-STAR: Was named to his first American League All-Star team yesterday...placed third in player voting among starting pitchers.

EARNED RUN AVERAGE: Has a 2.09 ERA, which is third lowest by an Oakland starter at the end of June over the last 25 years...the only pitchers with a lower ERA to start July over that span are Justin Duchschere in 2008 (1.91) and Dan Haren in 2007 (1.91).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 6-1 with a 1.88 ERA (12 er in 57.1 ip) in nine starts on the road compared to 3-2 with a 2.32 ERA (13 er in 50.1 ip) in seven starts at home...is tied for the American League lead in road wins and ranks fourth in ERA...posted a 2.51 ERA on the road last year, which was fourth lowest in Oakland history and the lowest since Mike Torrez logged a 2.50 ERA in 1976.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on 11 days rest today...missed a turn in the rotation due to gastroenteritis caused by salmonella...is 6-1 with a 1.44 ERA (11 er in 68.2 ip) in 10 starts on four days rest compared to 3-2 with a 3.23 ERA (14 er in 39.0 ip) in six starts on five days rest or more...has the second lowest ERA on four days rest in the majors (Greinke, LAD 1.03).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed 15 of his 17 extra base hits with the bases empty...opponents are batting .200 (28-for-140) with one double and one home run (.229 slugging percentage) with runners on base...the slugging percentage is the lowest in the American League among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title and the batting average is fifth lowest...has yielded a .136 (28-for-206) batting average with two strikes, which is fifth lowest among AL qualifiers...has surrendered four of his five home runs to left-handed hitters...has yielded a .354 (17-for-48) opponents batting average to the opponents clean-up hitter compared to .184 (64-for-347) against all other spots in the order...the eight hitter is 3-for-40 (.075), which is the lowest mark in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Leads Major League pitchers with 21 putouts, which are the most by an A's pitcher since Chad Gaudin had 22 in 2007...ranks second in the AL in total chances (36) and tied for sixth in assists (15).

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 4-1 with a 1.13 ERA (5 er in 39.2 ip) in six starts during the day compared to 5-2 with a 2.65 ERA (20 er in 68.0 ip) in 10 starts at night...has the lowest day ERA in the American League and third lowest in the majors.

MONTH BY MONTH: Went 3-1 with a 2.67 ERA in five starts in June after going 3-2 with a 1.67 ERA and 41 strikeouts in six starts in May...the strikeouts tied for third most in Oakland history in May and fell three short of the record of 44 (Chuck Dobson in 1968, Vida Blue in 1971)...it was his first month with 40 or more strikeouts...was 3-0 with a 1.98 ERA in five starts in April...has now finished a month with an ERA under 2.00 three times in his career (also 1.03 in July, 2014).

THIS AND THAT: The A's bullpen has blown a save in three of his starts (April 11, May 8, June 19)...is 4-1 in eight starts following an A's loss...has tossed at least seven innings in eight of his 16 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 12 times, one earned run or fewer nine times and walked two batters or fewer 13 times...the A's are 9-7 (.563) in his starting assignments and are 33-26 (.559) in his career...is 26-1 in 35 career starts with three runs of support or more.

2015 HIGHLIGHTS: Combined with Evan Scribner on a one-hit shutout in the A's 8-0 win over Texas on Opening Day **April 6**...became the first A's pitcher to start consecutive openers since Barry Zito in 2005 and 2006...allowed a lead off home run to Ackley in the third inning **April 11** against Seattle...that snapped a 20.0-inning scoreless streak dating back to Sept. 23, 2014, which is a new career high...allowed a career-high 11 hits in 6.0 innings in a 6-4 loss at Kansas City **April 17**...had a streak of five consecutive games with a wild pitch from April 22 to May 13, which is the longest such streak in Oakland history...it was the longest by an A's pitcher since Stu Flythe also had a five-game streak from July 1 to 31, 1936...struck out 10 while walking a career-high seven batters in 6.2 shutout innings in a 7-1 win at Texas **May 3**...it began a streak of three consecutive starts with nine or more strikeouts through May 13...that matched the longest such streak by an A's pitcher over the last 44 years...made his 50th career start **May 8** at Seattle and had a no decision in a 4-3, 11-inning loss...was charged with his first loss **May 13** against Boston after starting the season 4-0 for

the first time in his career...it snapped a five-game winning streak dating back to Sept. 28, 2014...posted a 1.40 ERA and .194 opponents batting average during that streak, which spanned eight starts.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-3 victory at Texas June 25...blanked the Rangers on three hits and a walk over the first three innings before allowing a Moreland leadoff home run and a Chirinos RBI single in the fourth...the A's tied the game with two runs in the fifth but he allowed a RBI single to Moreland in the bottom of the fifth...the A's then scored once in the sixth and three times in the seventh to take the lead for good.

LHP Scott Kazmir (5-5, 2.56 ERA): Is 3-1 with a 1.53 ERA (6 er in 35.1 ip) and .172 (21-for-122) opponents batting average over his last five starts...has tossed 8.0 shutout innings and allowed two hits over fewer twice over that stretch...had just two such games over the first 251 starts of his career...ranks seventh in the American League in ERA (2.56)...has allowed a .176 batting average with runners on base...opponents are 1-for-28 (.036) with runners in scoring position and two outs this year and are now 6-for-90 (.067) off him with RISP and two outs over the last two years...tossed 8.0 shutout innings in his first start of July for the win and is now 6-0 with a 1.52 ERA over his last nine July starts dating back to July 13, 2013...combined with Mujica on a two-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win over Seattle last Thursday in Oakland (8.0 ip, 2 h, 7 so)...is 8-7 with a 3.28 ERA in 20 career appearances, including 19 starts, against New York.

- Has a 3.36 ERA (37 er in 99.0 ip) over its past 39 games (beginning May 23) after logging a 4.82 ERA in its first 44 games...has a 4.20 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League (Texas, 4.36).
- Has six wins and 16 losses...the wins are tied for the fewest in the majors and the losses are tied for fifth most.
- Has allowed the most first batter RBI in the majors (38) and is tied for the most home runs (11).
- Is tied for the AL lead in blown saves (12), has the second fewest saves (17) and second lowest save percentage (58.6%).
- Has allowed the fourth most home runs in the AL (31).

- Has not allowed a run in 15 of his past 18 games (4 er in 11.2 ip, 3.09 ERA) after posting a 7.04 ERA in his first 11 contests.
- Has allowed 18 hits, 11 of which are for extra bases (five doubles, one triple, five home runs)...has the fourth highest opponents slugging percentage among American League relievers (.548).
- Is third in the AL in inherited runners (31) and tied for third in most inherited runners scored (10).
- First batters faced are 9-for-26 (.346) with four home runs and 12 RBI...the home runs and RBI are tied for the most in the majors.
