# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (39-47) VS. NEW YORK YANKEES (44-39)

WEDNESDAY, JULY 8, 2015 – YANKEE STADIUM – 7:05 P.M. EDT LHP SCOTT KAZMIR (5-5, 2.56) VS. LHP CC SABATHIA (3-8, 5.59) CSNCA – A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won four of the last six games and are now 14-8 over the last 22 games...are 25-17 (.595) since bottoming out at a season-high 16 games under .500 (14-30) at the conclusion of play on May 22...are tied for the best record in the American League and tied for third best in the majors dating back to May 23...are 39-47 (.453) overall, which is the worst record in the AL and tied for fifth worst in the ma-

jors...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West for 60 of the last 61 days...for the season, the A's have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, seven days in fourth, two days tied for fourth and 60 days in fifth.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's won last night in 10 innings, 4-3, to snap their six-game extra inning losing streak...it matched the longest such streak by an A's team over the last 20 years (May 18-July 5, 2011 and May 21-July 25, 1999)...it was their first extra inning win since Sept. 21, 2014, an 8-6 win over Philadelphia in 10 innings... it was their first extra inning game since May 11, snapping a streak of 51 consecutive nine-inning games...were the only team without an extra inning win and are now 1-6 in extra inning games...are tied for second in the majors in extra inning losses (Pittsburgh, 7)...are 7-21 (.250) in one-run games...have the worst record, most losses and fewest wins in the majors in one-run games...the worst record in one-run games in Oakland history is 16-26 (.381) in 1980...17 of the A's last 19 losses have been by three runs or fewer...are 3-11 in games decided in the last at bat...the wins are the fewest in the majors and the losses are second most in the American League

**ALL-STARS:** The A's had two players named to the American League All-Star team Monday night, both as a result of player balloting...Stephen Vogt received the most player votes among catchers and Sonny Gray placed third among starting pitchers...it will be the first All-Star Game for both players...this marks the A's third consecutive season with multiple players...it is their second consecutive season with at least one position player after 10 consecutive years without one.

**PITCHING:** The A's have allowed two runs or fewer in six of the last eight games (17 er in 73.0 ip, 2.10 ERA)...now have a 2.82 ERA (144 er in 460.0 ip) over the last 52 games (beginning May 12) after logging a 4.17 ERA over the first 34 contests...have a 3.36 ERA overall, which is the lowest in the American League and fifth lowest in the majors...also lead the AL in shutouts (11), opponents on-base percentage (.299) and opponents slugging percentage (.354) and rank second in opponents batting average (.237) and fewest home runs (67).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer in five of the last eight games (11 er in 52.0 ip, 1.90 ERA) and 21 of the last 42 (73 er in 272.0 ip, 2.42 ERA)...have a 3.01 ERA (177 er in 529.1 ip) for the season, which is second lowest in the majors (St. Louis, 2.76)... lead the majors in innings pitched (529.1) and rank second in fewest home runs (36).

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .242 (87-for-359) with 35 runs scored over the past 11 games (3.2 per game) and are 14-for-79 (.177) with runners in scoring position over that span...hit .306 with 76 runs scored over the previous 11 games (6.9 runs per game) while batting .395 with RISP...for the season, the A's rank second in the American League in triples (23), third in fewest strikeouts (575), fourth in batting average (.259) and doubles (149) and fifth in runs (376)...have been successful in 51-of-62 (82.3%) stolen base attempts, which is the best mark in the majors.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed 80 errors, which is 14 more than any other team (Texas, 66)...the errors have led to 41 unearned runs, which is second most in the majors (San Diego, 46)...are on pace to commit 151 errors and have not made more than 146 in a season since 1983 when they had 157.

**RUN DIFFERENTIAL:** The A's have out-scored the opposition 376-326 for a run differential of +50...that is second best in the American League West, fourth best in the AL and seventh best in the majors...are 27-15 (.643) in games decided by three runs or more, which is the third best record in the

majors...however, are 11-32 (.256) in games decided by two runs or fewer, which is the worst mark in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-0 on their six-game road trip to New York (1-0) and Cleveland (three games), their final trip before the All-Star Break...went 3-0 on the last road trip to Texas and have a season-best seven-game road winning streak, which is the A's second longest road-winning streak over the last 10 years...had a 12-game road winning streak from Aug. 24 to Sept. 12, 2012...have back-to-back winning road trips after a streak of 11 consecutive road trips with a .500 record or worse...that fell one short of the longest such streak in Oakland history...are 21-21 (.500) on the road compared to 18-26 (.409) at home...have the third worst home record in the American League...have finished the season with a home winning percentage under .429 once in Oakland history and that was in 1979 (31-50, .383)...went 4-6 on the last homestand against Kansas City (0-3), Colorado (2-1) and Seattle (2-2)...are 12-10 over the last 22 home games after starting the year 6-16...have a 2.90 ERA (130 er in 403.0 ip) at home compared to 3.86 (155 er in 361.0 ip) on the road.

**LEFT AND RIGHT:** The A's are 5-16 (.238) when the opponent starts a left-hander compared to 34-31 (.523) when they start a right-hander...are batting .237 (183-for-771) with 16 home runs against lefties compared to .267 (588-for-2205) with 56 home runs off righties...the average against lefties is fourth lowest in the American League and the mark against righties is third highest.

**BEFORE THE BREAK:** The A's are 39-47 and will have a losing record at the All-Star Break for the first time since 2009 (39-53)...that was also the last time the A's were in last place at the break as they trailed first place Texas by 12 games...currently have 23 triples, which are second most in Oakland history before the All-Star Break (26 in 1974)...the pitching staff has 11 shutouts, which is the most by an Oakland team before the All-Star Break since the 1973 club also had 11...the best is 13 by the 1972 A's.

WINS AND LOSSES: The A's are 25-27 (.481) in night games compared to 14-20 (.412) during the day...have won 13 of their last 20 day games after losing 13 of the first 14...have the second worst record in day games in the American League (Los Angeles, 8-14)...finished June with a 15-12 record to snap a four-month streak with a losing record...it was the A's first winning month since last July when they went 15-10.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have six players on the disabled list (Crisp, Doolittle, Ladendorf, Parker, Thompson, Venditte)...Crisp, Doolittle, Ladendorf, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...have had at least six players on the DL all year...have used the DL a total of 17 times...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. YANKEES: The A's have clinched their third consecutive season series win as they lead 4-1 with two games to play...won last night in New York after taking three of four in Oakland at the end of May...are 13-4 against the Yankees since the start of the 2013 season...have won 18 of their last 24 games against New York, including six of the last eight at Yankee Stadium...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 239-270 against the Yankees...that includes 132-123 in Oakland and 107-147 in New York...are 10-16 at Yankee Stadium...all-time, the A's are 780-1136 against the Yankees/Orioles.

# TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Billy Burns** leads Major League rookies in hits (79) and stolen bases (17) and is tied for the lead in multiple hit games (24)...**Stephen Vogt** leads ML catchers in batting average (.313) and slugging percentage (.576), is second in on-base percentage (.384) and RBI (48) and tied for second in home runs (13).

## THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1935 Jimmie Foxx homers and drives in three runs in a 4-1 American League victory in the third All-Star game at Cleveland...in 1955 Joe De-Maestri is a perfect 6 for 6 in an 11-8, 11 inning loss to Detroit...in 1993 Troy Neel homers twice and drives in seven runs but the A's lose 11-9 to Boston...in 2013 Grant Balfour records his 41<sup>st</sup> consecutive save in the A's 2-1 win at Pittsburgh to break Dennis Eckersley's club record for consecutive saves.

# **TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Scott Kazmir (5-5, 2.56 ERA)**

**LAST FIVE STARTS:** Is 3-1 with a 1.53 ERA (6 er in 35.1 ip) and .172 (21-for-122) opponents batting average over his last five starts...has tossed 8.0 shutout innings and allowed two hits over fewer twice over that stretch...had just two such games over the first 251 starts of his career.

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Ranks sixth in the American League in ERA (2.56) and opponents slugging percentage (.325), eighth in batting average (.216) and ninth in on-base percentage (.285)...has allowed just seven home runs in 98.1 innings for an average of 0.64 per nine innings, which ranks seventh lowest in the AL...is tied for second in balks (2).

WITH RUNNERS ON BASE: Has allowed a .244 (51-for-209) batting average with the bases empty compared to .176 (26-for-148) with runners on base...the mark with runners on base is the lowest among American League pitchers with enough innings to qualify for the ERA title...has yielded a .176 (12-for-68) average with runners in scoring position, which ranks fourth among AL qualifiers...opponents are 1-for-28 (.036) with RISP and two outs this year and are now 6-for-90 (.067) off him with RISP and two outs over the last two years...five of the seven home runs he has allowed this year have come with the bases empty.

**MONTH BY MONTH:** Tossed 8.0 shutout innings in his first start of July for the win and is now 6-0 with a 1.52 ERA (10 er in 59.1 ip) over his last nine July starts dating back to July 13, 2013...has not lost in July since July 10, 2010 at Oakland...went 2-2 with a 2.53 ERA in five starts this June after going 0-3 with a 4.65 ERA and .269 opponents batting average in six starts in May...was 2-0 with a 0.99 ERA and .158 opponents average in four starts in April...posted the fourth lowest April ERA in the American League...in two seasons with the A's, he is 6-0 with a 1.64 ERA in 10 starts in April, 2-5 with a 3.67 ERA in 11 starts in May and 5-3 with a 2.84 ERA in 11 starts in June.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has held the opponents two, three and four hitters to a combined .174 (21-for-121) batting average...has issued 29 of his 33 walks to right-handed hitters...has allowed six of his seven home runs at night...five have been hit by right-handed hitters...has allowed a .291 (41-for-141) batting average and six of his seven home runs with no outs... opponents are hitting .231 (27-for-117) with one out and .091 (9-for-99) with two outs...has yielded a .316 (30-for-95) average and four of his six home runs to batters leading off an inning.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 4-2 with a 1.40 ERA (9 er in 57.2 ip) and .165 (33-for-200) opponents batting average in nine starts in Oakland compared to 1-3 with a 4.20 ERA (19 er in 40.2 ip) and .280 (44-for-157) opponents average in seven starts on the road...has the lowest home opponents batting average in the American League and the second lowest ERA...has not allowed a run in five of his nine home starts...has allowed all seven of his home runs on the road.

**THE WEST AND THE REST:** Is 5-0 with a 0.91 ERA (5 er in 49.1 ip) in seven starts against American League West opponents compared to 0-5 with a 4.22 ERA (23 er in 49.0 ip) in nine starts against everyone else.

THIS AND THAT: Has not allowed an earned run in the first inning and has a 0.28 ERA (1 er in 32.0 ip) over the first two innings of a game...has a 3.66 ERA (27 er in 66.1 ip) from the third inning on...has three starts this year with seven or more runs of support and nine starts with two runs or fewer...went 2-0 with a 0.99 ERA and .158 opponents average over his first four starts, 0-4 with a 4.79 ERA and .293 opponents average over his next seven starts and is 3-1 with a 1.53 ERA (6 er in 35.1 ip) and .172 (21-for-122) opponents batting average over his last five starts...the A's are 7-9 (.438) in his starting assignments.

2015 HIGHLIGHTS: Combined with Otero and Alvarez on a three-hit shutout in the A's 10-0 win over Texas April 8...tossed seven innings and allowed just one hit while striking out 10...it was his 23rd career 10-strikeout game, his second with the A's...became just the fifth pitcher in Oakland history to strikeout 10 while allowing one hit or fewer, the first since Barry Zito on Aug. 4, 2001 vs. Detroit (10 so, 1 h)...retired each of the first nine batters *April 13* at Houston to extend his season-opening scoreless streak to 10.0 innings...struck out eight to become the only A's pitcher on an Opening Day roster since at least 1914 to strike out eight or more batters in each of his first two starts of the season...had a no decision in the A's 4-2 loss at Kansas City April 19...left with a 2-1 lead but the bullpen blew the save...it was the first of three times the bullpen blew a save in his start (May 11 vs. Boston, June 16 at San Diego)...tossed 7.0 shutout innings April 24 against Houston, giving him a season-opening stretch where he pitched six or more innings and allowed two runs or fewer in each of his first four starts...that matched the longest such streak by an A's pitcher on the Opening Day roster since at least 1914 (fifth time, last: Jesse Chavez, 2014)...made the 250th appearances of his career May 22 at Tampa Bay and took the loss, extending his losing streak to three games...then made

**KAZMIR'S CAREER HIGHS** 

the 250th start of his career <code>May 27</code> against Detroit...did not allow a run or hit but tossed a season-low 3.0 innings before leaving the game with tightness in his left shoulder...missed a turn in the rotation...combined with Scribner on a one-hit shutout in the A's 7-0 win over Texas <code>June 11</code> in Oakland...tossed eight of the innings and allowed the one hit on a one-out single by Andrus in the fifth inning...it was his first win since April 13 and it snapped a four-game losing streak...compiled a 4.85 ERA and .299 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned six starts from May 6 to June 5...tossed six innings or fewer in all six starts during the streak, which is the longest by an Athletic this year.

**LAST START:** He combined with Mujica on a two-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win over Seattle last Thursday in Oakland...tossed eight of the innings and allowed both of the hits...retired each of the first 13 batters before Gutierrez doubled with out in the fifth...set down the next eight before Guetierrez singled to lead off the eighth...Gutierrez was erased on a double play and he hit the next batter (Morrison) before Zunino hit into a fielders choice.

#### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jesse Chavez (4-8, 3.20 ERA): Is 2-3 with a 5.00 ERA and .297 opponents batting average over his last six starts after going 2-5 with a 2.38 ERA and .221 opponents average over his first eight starts...was charged with his eighth loss of the season in his last start, which is tied for fourth in the American League...it matches his career high from last year and it matches the second highest pre All-Star Break total by an Athletic over the last 17 years (Blanton, 12 in 2008)...has the seventh lowest run support in the AL (3.20)...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 9-5 A's loss to Seattle last Friday in Oakland (6.1 ip, 9 h, 4 r, 4 er, 4 so)...is 4-0 with a 1.63 ERA in five career appearances, including three starts, against New York...does not have more than two wins against any other team...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year, a 10-5 A's win in Oakland May 31 (8.0 ip, 7 h, 6 so).

- The A's bullpen has allowed one run or fewer in 14 of its past 16 games and has a 1.96 ERA (9 er in 41.1 ip) over that span (beginning June 20).
- Has a 3.26 ERA (37 er in 102.0 ip) over its past 40 games (beginning May 23) after logging a 4.82 ERA in its first 44 games...has a 4.14 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League (Texas, 4.34).
- Has seven wins and 16 losses...the wins are tied for the fewest in the majors and the losses are tied for fifth most.
- Has allowed the most first batter RBI in the majors (38) and is tied for the most home runs (11).
- Is tied for the AL lead in blown saves (12), has the second fewest saves (18) and second lowest save percentage (60.0%). Has allowed the fourth most home runs in the AL (31).
- The A's are 4-29 when the bullpen allows two runs or more, 34-17 when it allows one run or fewer (two complete games).
