ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost four of the past six games and eight of the past 13 after winning nine of the previous 11...are 25-19 (.568) since bottoming out at a season-high 16 games under .500 (14-30) at the conclusion of play on May 22...are tied for the best record in the American League and tied for third best in the majors dating back to May 23...are 39-49 (.443) overall, which is the worst record in the AL and fifth worst in the majors...have been in sole possession of

last place in the AL West for 62 of the last 63 days...for the season, the A's have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, seven days in fourth, two days tied for fourth and 62 days in fifth.

BEFORE THE BREAK: The A's are 39-49 and will have a losing record at the All-Star Break for the first time since 2009 (39-53)...that was also the last time the A's were in last place at the break as they trailed first place Texas by 12 games...currently have 23 triples, which are second most in Oakland history before the All-Star Break (26 in 1974)...the pitching staff has 11 shutouts, which is the most by an Oakland team before the All-Star Break since the 1973 club also had 11...the best is 13 by the 1972 A's.

ALL-STARS: The A's had two players named to the American League All-Star team Monday night, both as a result of player balloting...Stephen Vogt received the most player votes among catchers and Sonny Gray placed third among starting pitchers...it will be the first All-Star Game for both players...this marks the A's third consecutive season with multiple players...it is their second consecutive season with at least one position player after 10 consecutive years without one.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed three runs or fewer in seven of the last 10 games (25 er in 89.0 ip, 2.53 ERA)...now have a 2.87 ERA (152 er in 476.0 ip) over the last 54 games (beginning May 12) after logging a 4.17 ERA over the first 34 contests...have a 3.38 ERA (293 er in 780.0 ip) overall, which is the lowest in the American League and sixth lowest in the majors...also lead the AL in shutouts (11), opponents batting average (.238) and opponents slugging percentage (.357) and rank second in opponents on-base percentage (.300) and fewest home runs (71).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer in six of the last 10 games (15 er in 60.0 ip, 2.25 ERA) and 22 of the last 44 (77 er in 280.0 ip, 2.48 ERA)...have a 3.03 ERA (181 er in 537.1 ip) for the season, which is second lowest in the majors (St. Louis, 2.77)...lead the majors in innings pitched (537.1) and have allowed the second fewest home runs (37).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .233 (99-for-425) with 41 runs scored over the past 13 games (3.2 per game) and are 18-for-92 (.196) with runners in scoring position over that span...hit .306 with 76 runs scored over the previous 11 games (6.9 runs per game) while batting .395 with RISP...for the season, the A's rank second in the American League in triples (23), third in doubles (152) and fewest strikeouts (587), fourth in batting average (.257) and fifth in runs (382)...have been successful in 51-of-62 (82.3%) stolen base attempts, which is the best mark in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 82 errors, which is 16 more than any other team (Milwaukee and Texas, 66)...the errors have led to 44 unearned runs, which is second most in the majors (San Diego, 46)... are on pace to commit 151 errors and have not made more than 146 in a season since 1983 when they had 157.

RUN DIFFERENTIAL: The A's have out-scored the opposition 382-337 for a run differential of +45...that is second best in the American League West, fourth best in the AL and seventh best in the majors...are 27-15 (.643) in games decided by three runs or more, which is the third best record in the majors...however, are 12-33 (.267) in games decided by two runs or fewer, which is the worst mark in the majors.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 7-22 (.241) in one-run games...have the worst record, most losses and fewest wins in the majors in one-run games...the worst record in one-run games in Oakland history is 16-26 (.381) in 1980...18 of the A's last 21 losses have been by three runs or fewer...won Tuesday night in 10 innings, 4-3, to snap their six-game extra inning losing streak...it matched the longest such streak by

an A's team over the last 20 years (May 18-July 5, 2011 and May 21-July 25, 1999)...it was their first extra inning win since Sept. 21, 2014, an 8-6 win over Philadelphia in 10 innings...it was their first extra inning game since May 11, snapping a streak of 51 consecutive nine-inning games... were the only team without an extra inning win and are now 1-6 in extra inning games...are tied for second in the majors in extra inning losses (Pittsburgh, 7)...are 3-11 in games decided in the last at bat.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-2 on their six-game road trip to New York (1-2) and Cleveland (three games), their final trip before the All-Star Break...have lost the past two road games to snap their season-best seven-game road winning streak, which was their second longest road winning streak over the last 10 years...had a 12-game road winning streak from Aug. 24 to Sept. 12, 2012...have back-to-back winning road trips after a streak of 11 consecutive road trips with a .500 record or worse...that fell one short of the longest such streak in Oakland history...are 21-23 (.477) on the road compared to 18-26 (.409) at home...have the second worst home record in the American League...have finished the season with a home winning percentage under .429 once in Oakland history and that was in 1979 (31-50, .383)...went 4-6 on the last homestand against Kansas City (0-3), Colorado (2-1) and Seattle (2-2)...are 12-10 over the last 22 home games after starting the year 6-16...have a 2.90 ERA (130 er in 403.0 ip) at home compared to 3.89 (163 er in 377.0 ip) on the road.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 5-17 (.227) when the opponent starts a left-hander compared to 34-32 (.515) when they start a right-hander...are batting .239 (193-for-806) with 17 home runs against lefties compared to .264 (590-for-2236) with 56 home runs off righties...the average against lefties is fourth lowest in the American League and the mark against righties is third highest.

WINS AND LOSSES: The A's are 25-28 (.472) in night games compared to 14-21 (.400) during the day...have won 13 of their last 21 day games after losing 13 of the first 14...have the second worst record in day games in the American League (Los Angeles, 8-14)...finished June with a 15-12 record to snap a four-month streak with a losing record...it was the A's first winning month since last July when they went 15-10.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have six players on the disabled list (Crisp, Doolittle, Ladendorf, Parker, Thompson, Venditte)...Crisp, Doolittle, Ladendorf, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...have had at least six players on the DL all year...have used the DL a total of 17 times...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. INDIANS: The A's won the season series last year, 4-2...swept the Indians in three games in Cleveland after losing two of three in Oakland to start the season...have won and lost the season series two times over the past four years and are 16-14 against Cleveland since 2011...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 264-229 against the Indians...that breaks down to 139-101 in Oakland and 125-128 in Cleveland...including 40-59 at Progressive Field...all-time, the A's are 899-1022 against the Indians.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Burns leads Major League rookies in batting average (.313), hits (81), multiple hit games (25) and stolen bases (17)...**Brett Lawrie** is batting .575 (23-for-40) when putting the first pitch in play, .346 (27-for-78) with runners in scoring position and .314 (48-for-153) on the road...**Drew Pomeranz** has not allowed a run in his past eight games and 9.0 innings (5 h, 4 bb, 8 so)...**Stephen Vogt** leads ML catchers in batting average (.307) and slugging percentage (.564), is second in on-base percentage (.380) and RBI (48) and tied for third in home runs (13).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1901** Harry Davis becomes the first player in American League history to hit for the cycle...**1932** Jimmie Foxx ties the American League record for most total bases in a game with 16....he hits three home runs and adds a double and two singles in the A's 18-17, 18 inning win at Cleveland...in **1990** five Oakland A's play in the All-Star Game at Wrigley Field...Bob Welch starts the game and pitches two innings and Dennis Eckersley pitches a scoreless ninth to save the American League's 2-0 victory.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (6-4, 3.16 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville May 23 for his second stint with the A's this year and is 5-2 with a 1.78 ERA (12 er in 60.2 ip) and .243 (55-for-226) opponents batting average in nine starts since his return...the ERA is fifth lowest in the American League over that span... was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 1-2 with an 8.27 ERA and .348 opponents batting average in four starts before he was optioned to Nashville April 26...walked nine batters in 16.1 innings during his first stint (4.96 per nine innings) and 15 in 60.2 innings during his current stint (2.23 per nine innings).

SEVEN INNINGS OR MORE, TWO RUNS OR FEWER: Has tossed seven or more innings and allowed two runs or fewer in each of his last six starts, which is the longest such streak by a rookie pitcher in Oakland history... according to the Elias Sports Bureau, it matches the longest streak by any rookie over the last 20 years (Francisco Liriano, MIN 2006)...it is tied for third longest by any pitcher in Oakland history...only Justin Duchscherer (8, June 11-July 20, 2008) and Jim Nash (7, May 11-June 13, 1968) have longer streaks...is 3-2 with a 1.26 ERA (6 er in 43.0 ip) during the streak... began the streak with a no decision and two losses to become just the second A's pitcher since at least 1914 to toss seven or more innings and allow two runs or fewer in three consecutive starts (June 7-18) without earning a win in any of the starts...the other was Orlando Pena for the Kansas City A's (May 5-15, 1963).

WINNING STREAK AND SCORELESS STREAK: Has won each of his last three starts for the first three-game winning streak of his career (2 er in 21.0 ip, 0.86 ERA)...has not allowed a run in his last two starts and has a career and A's season-high 16.0-inning scoreless streak dating back to June 24 at Texas.

ROOKIE LEADERS: Picked up his sixth win of the season in his last start, which is tied for the lead among American League rookies...also ranks third in innings pitched (77.0), tied for third in starts (13) and tied for sixth in strikeouts (45)...has one of six complete games by an AL rookie.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-1 with a 1.91 ERA (9 er in 43.1 ip) in seven starts on the road compared to 2-3 with a 4.67 ERA (18 er in 34.2 ip) in six starts at home...has surrendered six home runs in 34.2 innings in Oakland, two in 42.1 innings on the road.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 4-1 with a 2.36 ERA (11 er in 42.0 ip) in seven starts at night compared to 2-3 with a 4.11 ERA (16 er in 35.0 ip) in six starts during the day...has allowed six home runs in 35.0 innings during the day, two in 42.0 innings at night.

THIS AND THAT: Opponents are batting .190 (11-for-58) with runners in scoring position...has yielded a .455 (15-for-33) batting average to the opponents number three hitter and a .400 (14-for-35) mark to the five hitter... all other spots in the order are hitting .219 (50-for-228)...the A's are 8-5 (.615) in his starting assignments...has allowed two runs or fewer in eight of his 13 starts and walked two batters or fewer 10 times...has received one run of support or fewer in five of his 13 starts.

MONTH BY MONTH: Tossed 7.0 shutout innings for the win in his first start in July...went 3-2 with a 1.93 ERA in six starts in the month of June... ranked fifth in the American League in June ERA...was 1-0 with a 2.31 ERA in two starts in May...compiled a 1-2 record and an 8.27 ERA in four starts in April.

GO THE DISTANCE: Tossed his first career complete game is his ninth Major League start June 13 at Los Angeles (AL), but took the loss...is the 37th pitcher in Oakland history to toss a complete game and lose 1-0... is the third to do it in the last 10 years (Scott Kazmir, Sept. 11, 2014 at Chicago-AL; Brandon McCarthy, April 21, 2011 at Seattle).

2015 START-BY-START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-1 loss to Texas April 9 in Oakland, his first Major League start...allowed three runs in the first, a two-run home run to Moreland in the third and a three-run home run to Choo in the fourth...the two home runs were the first of his career...surrendered just five home runs in 207.0 minor league innings. yielded eight runs in 3.1 innings to become the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to allow eight or more runs in his A's debut (last: Clayton Mortensen, 8 on Aug. 8, 2009 at Kansas City)...combined with O'Flaherty, Otero, Abad and Clippard on an eight-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win at Houston April 14...it was his first Major League win...tossed 5.1 innings and allowed four of the hits...had a no decision in the A's 6-3 win at Los Angeles April 20... had a 5-3 lead when he walked the first two batters in the fourth inning... was relieved by Otero who stranded both runners and tossed 4.0 scoreless innings for the win...was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-3 loss to Houston on April 25 in Oakland...allowed a three-run home run to Altuve in the third...was relieved by Bassitt with runners on first and third and two outs in the sixth...Bassitt allowed one of the runners to score on a wild pitch...

combined with Scribner and Clippard on a six-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win at Tampa Bay May 23...tossed six innings and allowed three of the hits...had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win over New York (AL) May 28 in Oakland...was relieved by Abad with two outs in the sixth inning and the A's trailing 3-1...Oakland scored twice in the bottom of the sixth to get him off the hook...was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-3 win at Detroit June 2... allowed three runs, all in the fourth inning...one run scored on a wild pitch and he allowed a two-run single to Castellanos...the A's scored five runs in the seventh to take the lead...Scribner tossed a scoreless seventh and eighth and Clippard a scoreless ninth to earn him the win...had a no decision in the A's 7-4 loss at Boston June 7...shutout the Red Sox on five hits and two walks over the first seven innings...had a 4-0 lead and had retired 13 straight before Castillo led off the eighth inning with a home run...the bullpen allowed six more runs in the eighth inning with Clippard getting the blown save and loss...tossed his first career complete game, an eighthitter in the A's 1-0 loss at Los Angeles (AL) June 13...did not walk a batter and struck out a career-high seven...tossed a career-high 111 pitches. allowed the only run of the game on a two-out home run to Pujols in the first inning...Wilson, Smith and Street combined to shutout the A's on two hits and four walks...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 3-1 loss to San Diego June 18 in Oakland...it marks the first losing streak of his career... did not allow a hit until Kemp hit a solo home run with two outs in the fourth inning...yielded a lead-off home run to Norris in the sixth and those were the only runs he would allow in seven innings...Kennedy and three Padres relievers combined to shutout the A's on five hits and a walk...was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-2 win at Texas June 24...the A's scored five times in the first inning and three in the second and he blanked the Rangers on two hits over the first four innings...allowed his only runs in the fifth inning on a two-run double by Corporan...was relieved by Mujica after putting runners on first and second to start the eighth innings...won his second consecutive start in the A's 7-1 win over Colorado June 29 in Oakland... tossed a career-high tying 111 pitches in 7.0 shutout innings...allowed just five hits while walking three...however, allowed only one base runner to advance into scoring position and that was with two outs in the sixth inning on back-to-back singles by Tulowitzki and Arenado.

RHP Chris Bassitt (0-2, 2.95 ERA): Is scheduled to join the A's for his third stint this year...was recalled from Nashville June 30 for his second stint and made two starts in Sonny Gray's spot in the rotation...was 0-2 despite allowing just three runs for a 2.53 ERA before he was optioned July 7...walked just one batter in 10.2 innings during his second stint after going 0-0 with a 3.38 ERA and nine walks in five relief appearances and 10.2 innings during his first stint...has a .195 opponents batting average, including .167 against left-handed hitters and .229 against right-handed hitters...has not faced the Indians in his career...is 2-6 with a 3.71 ERA and .216 opponents batting average in 12 games, including nine starts, in his Triple-A debut with Nashville...has allowed just one home run in 63.0 innings and that came to the third batter he faced in his first start.
