# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (40-50) VS. CLEVELAND INDIANS (42-45)

SUNDAY, JULY 12, 2015 – PROGRESSIVE FIELD – 1:10 P.M. EDT RHP SONNY GRAY (9-3, 2.20) VS. RHP COREY KLUBER (4-9, 3.45) CSNCA – A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped their three-game losing streak last night...have lost five of eight and nine of the past 15 games after winning nine of the previous 11 contests...are 26-20 (.565) since bottoming out at a season-high 16 games under .500 (14-30) at the conclusion of play on May 22...are tied for the best record in the American League and tied for third best in the majors dating back to May 23...are 40-50 (.444) overall, which is the worst record in the AL and fifth worst

in the majors...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West for 64 of the last 65 days...for the season, the A's have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, seven days in fourth, two days tied for fourth and 64 days in fifth.

**BEFORE THE BREAK:** The A's are 40-50 and will have a losing record at the All-Star Break for the first time since 2009 (39-53)...that was also the last time the A's were in last place at the break as they trailed first place Texas by 12 games...currently have 23 triples, which are second most in Oakland history before the All-Star Break (26 in 1974)...the pitching staff has 11 shutouts, which is the most by an Oakland team before the All-Star Break since the 1973 club also had 11...the best is 13 by the 1972 A's.

**ALL-STARS:** The A's had two players named to the American League All-Star team Monday night, both as a result of player balloting...Stephen Vogt received the most player votes among catchers and Sonny Gray placed third among starting pitchers...it will be the first All-Star Game for both players...this marks the A's third consecutive season with multiple players...it is their second consecutive season with at least one position player after 10 consecutive years without one.

**PITCHING:** The A's have a 2.94 ERA (161 er in 493.0 ip) over the last 56 games (beginning May 12) after logging a 4.17 ERA over the first 34 contests...have a 3.41 ERA (302 er in 797.0 ip) overall, which is the lowest in the American League and sixth lowest in the majors...also lead the AL in shutouts (11) and opponents slugging percentage (.357), rank second in opponents on-base percentage (.301) and fewest home runs (72) and third in opponents batting average (.238).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer in six of the last 12 games (21 er in 72.0 ip, 2.63 ERA) and 22 of the last 46 (83 er in 292.0 ip, 2.56 ERA)...have a 3.06 ERA (187 er in 549.1 ip) for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...rank second in the majors in innings pitched (549.1) and have allowed the second fewest home runs (37).

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .233 (114-for-489) with 47 runs scored over the past 15 games (3.1 per game) and are 21-for-104 (.202) with runners in scoring position over that span...hit .306 with 76 runs scored over the previous 11 games (6.9 runs per game) while batting .395 with RISP...for the season, the A's are tied for second in the American League in triples (23), are third in doubles (158) and fewest strikeouts (604), fourth in batting average (.257) and fifth in runs (388)...have been successful in 51-of-64 (79.7%) stolen base attempts, which is the best mark in the majors.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed 82 errors, which is 14 more than any other team (Milwaukee and Texas, 68)...the errors have led to 44 unearned runs, which is second most in the majors (San Diego, 47)... are on pace to commit 148 errors and have not made more than 146 in a season since 1983 when they had 157.

**RUN DIFFERENTIAL:** The A's have out-scored the opposition 388-346 for a run differential of +42...that is second best in the American League West, fourth best in the AL and seventh best in the majors...are 27-17 (.614) in games decided by three runs or more, which is the fifth best record in the majors...however, are 13-33 (.283) in games decided by two runs or fewer, which is the worst mark in the majors.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 8-22 (.267) in one-run games...have the worst record, most losses and fewest wins in the majors in one-run games...the worst record in one-run games in Oakland history is 16-26 (.381) in 1980...18 of the A's last 22 losses have been by three runs or fewer...are 3-11 in games decided in the last at bat...the wins are the fewest in the majors and the losses are tied for second most in the American League...won Tuesday night against New York (AL) in 10 innings, 4-3, to snap their six-game extra inning losing streak...it matched the longest such streak by an A's team over the last 20 years (May 18-July 5, 2011 and May 21-July 25, 1999)...it was their first extra inning win since

Sept. 21, 2014, an 8-6 win over Philadelphia in 10 innings...it was their first extra inning game since May 11, snapping a streak of 51 consecutive nine-inning games...were the only team without an extra inning win and are now 1-6 in extra inning games...are tied for second in the majors in extra inning losses (Pittsburgh, 7).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-3 on their six-game road trip to New York (1-2) and Cleveland (1-1), their final trip before the All-Star Break...had their season-best seven-game road winning streak snapped Wednesday night, which was their second longest road winning streak over the last 10 years...had a 12-game road winning streak from Aug. 24 to Sept. 12, 2012...will finish the road trip at a .500 record or worse after back-to-back winning road trips...the winning road trips snapped a streak of 11 consecutive trips with a .500 record or worse, which fell one short of the longest such streak in Oakland history...are 22-24 (.478) on the road compared to 18-26 (.409) at home...have the second worst home record in the American League (Texas, 16-25)...have finished the season with a home winning percentage under .429 once in Oakland history and that was in 1979 (31-50, .383)...went 4-6 on the last homestand against Kansas City (0-3), Colorado (2-1) and Seattle (2-2)...are 12-10 over the last 22 home games after starting the year 6-16...have a 2.90 ERA (130 er in 403.0 ip) at home compared to 3.93 (172 er in 394.0 ip) on the road.

**LEFT AND RIGHT:** The A's are 5-17 (.227) when the opponent starts a left-hander compared to 35-33 (.515) when they start a right-hander...are batting .240 (194-for-807) with 17 home runs against lefties compared to .263 (604-for-2299) with 56 home runs off righties...the average against lefties is fifth lowest in the American League and the mark against righties is fourth highest.

WINS AND LOSSES: The A's are 26-29 (.473) in night games compared to 14-21 (.400) during the day...have won 13 of their last 21 day games after losing 13 of the first 14...have the second worst record in day games in the American League (Los Angeles, 8-14)...finished June with a 15-12 record to snap a four-month streak with a losing record...it was the A's first winning month since last July when they went 15-10.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Crisp, Doolittle, Hahn, Ladendorf, Parker, Thompson, Venditte)...Crisp, Doolittle, Ladendorf, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...have had at least six players on the DL all year...have used the DL a total of 18 times...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. INDIANS: The A's have split the first two games of this series... won the season series last year, 4-2...swept the Indians in three games in Cleveland after losing two of three in Oakland to start the season...have won and lost the season series two times over the past four years and are 17-15 against Cleveland since 2011...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 265-230 against the Indians...that breaks down to 139-101 in Oakland and 126-129 in Cleveland...including 41-60 at Progressive Field... all-time, the A's are 900-1023 against the Indians.

# TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Burns leads Major League rookies in batting average (.306), hits (82) and stolen bases (17)...Tyler Clippard has not allowed a run in 10 of his past 11 games (1 er in 12.2 ip, 0.71 ERA) and is a perfect 8-for-8 in save opportunities over that span...Brett Lawrie is batting .575 (23-for-40) when putting the first pitch in play, .346 (27-for-78) with runners in scoring position and .308 (48-for-156) on the road...Josh Reddick is a .354 (17-for-48) career hitter with four home runs and 14 RBI in 12 games at Progressive Field...Stephen Vogt leads Major League catchers in batting average (.311) and slugging percentage (.568), is second in on-base percentage (.382) and RBI (48) and tied for third in home runs (13).

# THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1913 A's starter Carroll "Boardwalk" Brown walks 15 batters in 7 2/3 innings but the A's defeat Detroit 16-9...in 1972 A's catcher and future pitching coach Dave Duncan is a perfect 5 for 5 in the A's 7-6 loss to Boston...in 1988 Terry Steinbach is named All-Star Game MVP after driving in both of the American League's runs with a home run and a sacrifice fly in a 2-1 win.

# **TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (9-3, 2.20 ERA)**

AMONG THE LEADERS: Has the lowest ERA (2.20) and opponents slugging percentage in the American League (.273), ranks third in opponents batting average (.207), fourth in on-base percentage (.260) and winning percentage (.750) and is tied for fifth in wins (9)...has allowed just five home runs in 114.2 innings and his average of 0.39 home runs per nine innings is the lowest mark in the AL and third lowest in the majors...ranks fourth in the AL in wild pitches (9) and sixth in fewest pitches per inning (14.9) and highest run support (6.28).

**ALL-STAR:** Was named to his first American League All-Star team last Monday...placed third in player voting among starting pitchers.

**LAST THREE STARTS:** Is 1-0 with a 5.21 ERA (11 er in 19.0 ip) and .263 (20-for-76) opponents batting average over his last three starts after going 4-1 with a 1.04 ERA and .184 opponents average over his previous five starts.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 6-1 with a 1.44 ERA (11 er in 68.2 ip) in 10 starts on four days rest compared to 3-2 with a 3.33 ERA (17 er in 46.0 ip) in seven starts on five days rest or more...has the second lowest ERA on four days rest in the majors (Greinke, LAD 0.90).

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is 4-1 with a 1.13 ERA (5 er in 39.2 ip) in six starts during the day compared to 5-2 with a 2.76 ERA (23 er in 75.0 ip) in 11 starts at night...has the lowest day ERA in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 6-1 with a 2.10 ERA (15 er in 64.1 ip) in 10 starts on the road compared to 3-2 with a 2.32 ERA (13 er in 50.1 ip) in seven starts at home...is tied for the American League lead in road wins and ranks third in ERA...posted a 2.51 ERA on the road last year, which was fourth lowest in Oakland history and the lowest since Mike Torrez logged a 2.50 ERA in 1976.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed 15 of his 17 extra base hits with the bases empty...opponents are batting .211 (32-for-152) with one double and one home run (.237 slugging percentage) with runners on base...the slugging percentage is the lowest in the American League among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title and the batting average is fourth lowest...has yielded a .137 (30-for-219) batting average with two strikes, which is fourth lowest among AL qualifiers...opponents are batting .218 (24-for-110) with a .265 on-base percentage when leading off an inning...the on-base percentage ranks eighth and the batting average is ninth...has surrendered four of his five home runs to left-handed hitters.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** Leads Major League pitchers with 22 putouts, which match the most by an A's pitcher over the last 13 years...the last with more is Tim Hudson with 26 in 2002...ranks second in the AL in total chances (38) and tied for sixth in assists (16).

MONTH BY MONTH: Went 3-1 with a 2.67 ERA in five starts in June after going 3-2 with a 1.67 ERA and 41 strikeouts in six starts in May...the strikeouts tied for third most in Oakland history in May and fell three short of the record of 44 (Chuck Dobson in 1968, Vida Blue in 1971)...it was his first month with 40 or more strikeouts...was 3-0 with a 1.98 ERA in five starts in April...has now finished a month with an ERA under 2.00 three times in his career (also 1.03 in July, 2014).

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's bullpen has blown a save in three of his starts (April 11, May 8, June 19)...is 4-1 in nine starts following an A's loss...has tossed at least seven innings in nine of his 17 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 12 times, one earned run or fewer nine times and walked two batters or fewer 13 times...the A's are 10-7 (.588) in his starting assignments and are 34-26 (.567) in his career...is 26-1 in 36 career starts with three runs of support or more.

2015 HIGHLIGHTS: Combined with Evan Scribner on a one-hit shutout in the A's 8-0 win over Texas on Opening Day *April* 6...became the first A's pitcher to start consecutive openers since Barry Zito in 2005 and 2006... allowed a lead off home run to Ackley in the third inning *Aprill* 11 against Seattle...that snapped a 20.0-inning scoreless streak dating back to Sept. 23, 2014, which is a new career high...allowed a career-high 11 hits in 6.0 innings in a 6-4 loss at Kansas City *April* 17...had a streak of five consecutive games with a wild pitch from April 22 to May 13, which is the longest such streak in Oakland history...it was the longest by an A's pitcher since Stu Flythe also had a five-game streak from July 1 to 31, 1936...struck out 10 while walking a career-high seven batters in 6.2 shutout innings in a 7-1 win at Texas *May* 3...it began a streak of three consecutive starts with nine

or more strikeouts through May 13...that matched the longest such streak by an A's pitcher over the last 44 years...made his 50th career start *May* 8 at Seattle and had a no decision in a 4-3, 11-inning loss...was charged with his first loss *May* 13 against Boston after starting the season 4-0 for the first time in his career...it snapped a five-game winning streak dating back to Sept. 28, 2014...posted a 1.40 ERA and .194 opponents batting average during that streak, which spanned eight starts.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-3, 10-inning win at New York on Tuesday...it was his first start since June 25 as he missed a turn in the rotation due to gastroenteritis caused by salmonella...the A's scored a run in the first inning but he allowed two runs in the bottom of the first on RBI singles by McCann and Jones...the A's tied the game with a run in the third but he allowed a RBI single to Gregorius in the fourth...the A's tied the game in the sixth inning and he left after seven innings with the scored tied 3-3

- The A's bullpen has allowed one earned run or fewer in 16 of its past 20 games and has a 2.65 ERA (16 er in 54.1 ip) over that span.
- Has a 3.44 ERA (44 er in 115.0 ip) over its past 44 games (beginning May 23) after logging a 4.82 ERA in its first 44 games...has a 4.18 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League (Texas, 4.37).
- Has eight wins and 17 losses...the wins are third fewest in the majors and the losses are tied for fourth most
- Has allowed the most first batter RBI in the majors (40) and is tied for the most home runs (12).
- Has the second fewest saves in the AL (19), the second lowest save percentage (61.3%) and is tied for the second most blown saves (12).
- Has allowed the fourth most home runs in the AL (35).
- The A's are 5-31 when the bullpen allows two runs or more, 34-18 when it allows one run or fewer (two complete games).

- Has not allowed a run in 10 of his past 12 games (2 er in 11.0 ip, 1.64 ERA)...has a 3.14 ERA (5 er in 14.1 ip) over his past 21 games after posting a 7.04 ERA in his first 11 contests.
- Has allowed 19 hits, 12 of which are for extra bases (five doubles, one triple, six home runs)...has the fifth highest opponents slugging percent-
- age among American League relievers (.530).

   Has allowed a .161 (5-for-31) batting average to right-handed hitters compared to .269 (14-for-52) with 10 extra base hits (.673 slugging percentage) against left-handers.
- First batters faced are 9-for-29 (.310) with four home runs and 12 RBI... the home runs are tied for the most in the majors and the RBI are second most.
- Is tied for third in the AL in inherited runners (31) and most inherited runners scored (10).
- Has a loss in seven games in his career against Cleveland (6.0 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 6 so, 3.00 ERA).

- Has a .168 opponents batting average, which breaks down to .088 (6for-68) against lefties and .246 (17-for-69) against righties.
- Is tied for the American League lead in walks among relievers (18).
- Has not allowed a run in three games and 3.0 innings in his career against the Indians (2 h, 1 bb, 3 so).

  Has a 0.52 ERA (1 er in 17.1 ip) in 16 games at night compared to a 4.12
- ERA (9 er in 19.2 ip) in 19 games during the day.
