OAKLAND ATHLETICS (41-50) VS. MINNESOTA TWINS (49-40)

ABOUT THE A'S: Won two of three at Cleveland last weekend in the final series before the All-Star Break...are 7-9 over the last 16 games but are 27-20 (.565) since bottoming out at a season-high 16 games under .500 (14-30) at the conclusion of play on May 22...have the best record in the American League and third best in the majors dating back to May 23...are 41-50 (.451) overall, which is the worst record in the AL

and fifth worst in the majors...trail first place Los Angeles in the AL West by 8½ games, which is the closest the A's have been to first place since May 12 when they were eight games behind Houston...have been in sole possession of last place in the West for 65 of the last 66 days...the 65 days alone in last are second most by an A's team over the last 17 years (162 in 2009)...for the season, have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, seven days in fourth, two days tied for fourth and 65 days in fifth.

AT THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's were 41-50 (.451) at the All-Star Break, which was the 10th worst record in Oakland history at the break...it was the worst since the 2011 club was 39-53 (.424)...2011 also marked the last time the A's were in last place at the break (were 12 back that year)... the pitching staff had 12 shutouts, which was second most in Oakland history at the break (13 in 1972)...the offense had 23 triples, which was also second most (26 in 1974).

PITCHING: The A's lead the American League in ERA (3.37), shutouts (12), opponents slugging percentage (.355) and fewest extra base hits (208), rank second in opponents batting average (.236), on-base percentage (.299) and fewest home runs (72) and have issued the fourth most walks (254).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer in 23 of the last 47 games and are 22-15 with a 2.48 ERA (83 er in 301.0 ip) over that span, which dates back to May 23...have a 3.01 ERA for the season, which is second lowest in the majors (St. Louis, 2.84)...the last time A's starters had an ERA under 3.16 was in 1974 (2.98)...have yielded just three home runs in the last 15 games (93.2 innings) and 37 for the season, which is second fewest in the majors (Pittsburgh, 36)...also rank second in the majors with 558.1 innings pitched (Mets, 558.2).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .229 (119-for-519) with 49 runs scored over the past 16 games (3.1 runs per game)...have scored two runs or fewer eight times over that stretch...for the season, rank third in the American League in doubles (158), triples (23) and fewest strikeouts (610) and fourth in fewest home runs (74)...have been successful in 51-of-64 (79.7%) stolen base attempts, which is the best mark in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just three errors in their last eight games but have 82 for the season, which is 13 more than any other team (Milwaukee and Texas, 69)...the errors have led to 44 unearned runs, which is second most in the majors (San Diego, 47).

RUN DIFFERENTIAL: The A's have out-scored the opposition 390-346 for a run differential of +44...that is fourth best in the American League and seventh best in the majors...are 27-17 (.614) in games decided by three runs or more, which is the third best record in the majors...however, are 14-33 (.298) in games decided by two runs or fewer, which is the worst mark in the majors.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 8-22 (.267) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the majors...the worst record in one-run games in Oakland history is 16-26 (.381) in 1980 and the worst in Athletics history is .256 in 1916 (11-32)...are 1-6 (.143) in extra inning games, which is also the worst record in the majors...are 3-11 in games decided in the last at bat...the wins are the fewest in the majors and the losses are tied for second most in the American League...have one walk-off win, which is tied for the fewest in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin post All-Star Break play with a six-game homestand against Minnesota (three games) and Toronto (three games)... went 3-3 on their final road trip before the break against New York (1-2) and Cleveland (2-1)...are 18-26 (.409) at home compared to 23-24 (.489) on the road...have the second worst home record in the American League

(Texas, 16-26)...have finished the season with a home winning percentage under .429 once in Oakland history and that was in 1979 (31-50, .383)

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 5-17 (.227) when the opponent starts a lefthanded pitcher compared to 36-33 (.521) when they start a right-hander... the mark against lefties is the worst in the majors...are batting .240 (195for-811) against lefties compared to .262 (608-for-2325) off righties...the average against lefties is fourth lowest in the American League and the mark against righties is fourth highest.

THIS AND THAT: The A's will play each of their first 22 games after the All-Star Break in California...20 of those games will be in the Bay Area as the A's have a three-game series at San Francisco July 24-26...also travel to Los Angeles July 28-29 for a two-game series against the Dodgers...have one remaining trip to the Eastern time zone (Aug. 11-17 to Toronto and Baltimore) and one to the Central time zone (Sept. 11-20 to Texas, Chicago and Houston)...are 3-11 (.214) on Friday's, which is the worst record in the majors...are 7-2 (.778) on Monday's, which is second best (Mets, 8-1)...are the only team in the majors without a rain delay...are 6-5 in July after going 15-12 in June...had finished with a losing record in each of the previous four months from August 2014-May June 2015 (42-66, .389)... are batting .329 (28-for-85) with the bases loaded with four home runs and 74 RBI...lead the American League in RBI with the bases loaded, are tied for the lead in in grand slams and rank third in batting...A's pinch hitters are 11-for-58 (.190) and have the fourth lowest batting average in the AL... however, lead the ÁL in pinch walks (12).

ALL-STARS: The A's had two players named to the American League All-Star team, both as a result of player balloting...Stephen Vogt received the most player votes among catchers and Sonny Gray placed third among starting pitchers...it was the first All-Star Game for both players...Gray was not active as he started the Sunday before the game and Vogt struck out in his only at bat while catching three innings.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Crisp, Doolittle, Hahn, Ladendorf, Parker, Thompson, Venditte)...Crisp, Doolittle, Ladendorf, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...have had at least six players on the DL all year...have used the DL a total of 18 times, which matches the season total from last year...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. TWINS: The A's are 1-3 against the Twins after losing three of four at Minnesota in May...with one more loss, will lose the season series for the first time since 2010 (3-6)...are 22-13 against the Twins dating back to the start of the 2011 season...have won nine of the last 10 games in the Coliseum...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 291-294 against Minnesota...that includes 161-127 in Oakland and 130-167 in Minnesota...are 13-12 at Target Field...are 348-363 all-time against the Twins and have a 995-999 record against the Twins/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Burns leads Major League rookies in hits (82) and stolen bases (17) and is tied for the lead in multiple hit games (25)...Tyler Clippard has not allowed a run in 10 of his past 11 games (1 er in 12.2 ip, 0.71 ERA) and is a perfect 8-for-8 in save opportunities over that span...Brett Lawrie has an eight-game hitting streak against Minnesota (12-for-32, .375) and is a .338 (26-for-77) career hitter against the Twins, which is his best mark against any AL team...is batting .575 (23-for-40) when putting the first pitch in play...Josh Reddick has 51 RBI, which are his most ever before the All-Star Break...leads the majors in two-out RBI (33)... Eric Sogard has a 41-game errorless streak as a second baseman and leads American League second baseman with a .994 fielding percentage...Ben Zobrist has not committed an error in 26 games at second base and has a 55-game errorless streak as a second baseman dating back to June 19, 2014.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1934** Bob Johnson, Jimmie Foxx and Pinky Higgins hit consecutive home runs in the fourth inning but the A's lose to St. Louis, 7-4...in **1969** Sal Bando is a perfect 5 for 5 in an 8-2 A's win at Seattle against the Pilots...he would duplicate the feat later in the season on September 30, also against Seattle...in **1974** Sal Bando singles in the A's 2-0 win at Baltimore for the 1000th hit of his major league career.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (10-3, 2.04 ERA)

EARNED RUN AVERAGE: Has a 2.04 ERA, which is second lowest in the majors to the Dodgers' Zack Greinke (1.39)...it is fourth lowest in Oakland history before the All-Star Break...in the designated hitter era, only Justin Duchscherer (1.82 in 2008) had a lower ERA at the All-Star Break...has allowed one earned run or fewer in 10 of his 18 starts...now has a 2.70 ERA in his career, which is the lowest in Oakland history among pitchers with 400 or more innings pitched (Eckersley, 2.74).

AMONG THE LEADERS: In addition to leading the American League in ERA, he also has the lowest opponents batting average (.198) and slugging percentage (.261)...ranks second in opponents on-base percentage (.251), tied

for third in wins (10), fourth in winning percentage (.769), fifth in innings pitched (123.2) and 10th in strikeouts (108)...has allowed just five home runs in 123.2 innings and his average of 0.36 home runs per nine innings is the lowest mark in the AL and third lowest in the majors...also ranks fourth in the AL in wild pitches (9) and fewest pitches per inning (14.7), tied for fourth in shutouts (1) and opponents reaching base on an error (6), tied for fifth in games started (18), tied for sixth in complete games (1) and eighth in highest run support (5.97).

ALL-STAR: Was named to his first American League All-Star team but pitched on the Sunday before the game and elected not to be active in the game...placed third in player voting among starting pitchers.

THREE-GAME WINNING STREAK: Is 3-0 with a 2.78 ERA (11 er in 35.2 ip) and .203 (27-for-133) opponents batting average over his last five starts...also has a four-game winning streak (April 6-May 3) and a three-game winning streak (May 24-June 3) this year.

STARTING CONSECUTIVE GAMES: Started the A's final game before the All-Star Break and is scheduled to become the seventh pitcher in Oakland history to start consecutive team games...is the first to do it since Dave Stewart in 1991, who also did it around the All-Star Break...the others are Vida Blue (1974), Ken Holtzman (1975), Pete Broberg (1978), Steve McCatty (1980) and Rick Langford (1981)...Blue and Holtzman did it around the All-Star Break, Langford did it around the strike, and Broberg and McCatty started on consecutive days.

IN JULY: Is 1-0 with a 1.69 ERA (3 er in 16.0 ip) in two starts in July...is now 6-0 with a 1.15 ERA (7 er in 55.0 ip) in nine career appearances in the month of July.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Was 10-3 with a 2.04 ERA and 108 strikeouts in 18 starts before the All-Star Break...went 10-3 with a 2.79 ERA and 108 strikeouts in 19 starts before the break last year...is 20-6 with a 2.40 ERA in 38 career appearances before the break compared to 9-10 with a 3.19 ERA (55 er in 155.1 ip) in 25 games after the break.

29 CAREER WINS: Has 29 wins in 63 career games...the only pitchers in Oakland history to win their 30th game in fewer than 66 career games are Tim Hudson (52nd game), Barry Zito (61st) and Mark Mulder (61st).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Had five putouts in his last start and now has 27 for the season, which are the most in the majors among pitchers...needs one more to tie the Oakland single season record for putouts by a pitcher set by Rick Langford in 1980 and matched by Mike Moore in 1991...also ranks second in the AL among pitchers in total chances (44) and tied for sixth in assists (17)

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 7-1 with a 1.27 ERA (11 er in 77.2 ip) in 11 starts on four days rest compared to 3-2 with a 3.33 ERA (17 er in 46.0 ip) in seven starts on five days rest or more...has the second lowest ERA on four days rest in the majors (Gre-inke, LAD 0.90).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed 15 of his 17 extra base hits with the bases empty...opponents are batting .204 (32-for-157) with one double and one home run (.229 slugging percentage) with runners on base...the slugging percentage is the lowest in the American League among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title and the batting average is fifth lowest...has yielded a .129 (30-for-232) batting average with two strikes, which is third lowest among AL qualifiers...opponents are batting .203 (24-for-118) with a .254 on-base percentage when leading off an inning...the batting average and on-base percentage rank fifth in the AL...has surrendered four of his five home runs to left-handed hitters.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 5-1 with a 0.92 ERA (5 er in 48.2 ip) in seven starts during the day compared to 5-2 with a 2.76 ERA (23 er in 75.0 ip) in 11 starts at night...has the lowest day ERA in the majors and is tied for the American League lead in day wins.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 7-1 with a 1.84 ERA (15 er in 73.1 ip) in 11 starts on the road compared to 3-2 with a 2.32 ERA (13 er in 50.1 ip) in seven starts at home...leads the majors in road wins and ranks third in the AL in road ERA...has a five-game winning streak on the road and has a 1.27 ERA (6 er in 42.2 ip) over that six-start stretch, which began May 24...posted a 2.51 ERA on the road last year, which was fourth lowest in Oakland history and the lowest since Mike Torrez logged a 2.50 ERA in 1976.

THIS AND THAT: The A's bullpen has blown a save in three of his starts (April 11, May 8, June 19)...is 4-1 in nine starts following an A's loss...has tossed at least seven innings in 10 of his 18 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 13 times and walked two batters or fewer 14 times...the A's are 11-7 (.611) in his starting assignments and are 35-26 (.574) when he starts in his career...is 26-1 in 36 career starts with three runs of support or more... went 3-0 with a 1.98 ERA in five starts in April and 3-2 with a 1.67 ERA in six starts in May, marking the second and third time in his career he finished a month with an ERA under 2.00 (also 1.03 in July, 2014)...finished May with 41 strikeouts, which tied for third most in Oakland history in May and fell three short of the record of 44 (Chuck Dobson in 1968, Vida Blue in 1971)...it was his first month with 40 or more strikeouts.

LAST START: He tossed a two-hit, 2-0 shutout at Cleveland last Sunday in the final game before the All-Star Break...it was his third career complete game, all of which have been shutouts...it was his second two-hitter... retired each of the first 10 batters before Lindor singled with one out in the fourth...also walked Murphy to start the fifth and allowed a two-out single to Urshela in the eight...only Murphy got as far as second base.

LHP Scott Kazmir (5-5, 2.49 ERA): Is 3-1 with a 1.41 ERA and .173 opponents batting average over his last six starts...is 4-2 with a 1.40 ERA and .165 opponents batting average in nine starts in Oakland...has the lowest home opponents batting average in the American League and the second lowest ERA...has allowed a .176 (27-for-153) opponents batting average with runners on base, which is the lowest among AL pitchers with enough innings to qualify for the ERA title...opponents are 1-for-28 (.036) with RISP and two outs this year and are now 6-for-90 (.067) off him with RISP and two outs over the last two years...had a no decision in his last start, a 5-4 A's loss at New York (AL) July 8 (3.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 bb, 4 so)...is 7-5 with a 3.80 ERA in 14 career starts against Minnesota...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, a 13-0 A's loss at Minnesota May 6 (6.0 ip, 7 h, 6 r, 6 er, 2 bb, 4 so)

- Has a 3.44 ERA (44 er in 115.0 ip) over its past 44 games (beginning May 23) after logging a 4.82 ERA in its first 44 games...has a 4.18 ERA
- for the season, which is second highest in the AL (Texas, 4.35). Has eight wins and 17 losses...the wins are third fewest in the majors and the losses are tied for fourth most.
- Has allowed the most first batter RBI in the majors (40) and the second most first batter home runs (12).
- Has the second fewest saves in the AL (19), the second lowest save percentage (61.3%) and is tied for the second most blown saves (12).
- Has allowed the fourth most home runs in the AL (35) The A's are 5-31 when the bullpen allows two runs or more, 34-18 when it allows one run or fewer (three complete games).
