**THE TWINS:** The Twins completed the first half with a record of 49-40, going 6-1 on their seven-game homestand, sweeping the Orioles in three games and winning three of four against the Tigers...tonight, they begin a six-game seven-day road trip with stops in Oakland, tonight thru Sunday, followed by an off-day Monday, then a visit to Los Angeles-AL, Tuesday-Thursday...the Twins are 31-16 at home compared to 18-24 on the road.

**TWINS PLAY ROLE IN ASG:** Brian Dozier and Glen Perkins each played in the 86th All-Star Game in Cincinnati on Tuesday...Dozier, who was replacing Jose Bautista on the AL Roster, entered as a pinch hitter for Jason Kipnis in the top of the eighth inning...he hit a 1-2 pitch for a solo home run off Mark Melancon, then played the rest of the game at second base...Perkins entered the game in the ninth with a 6-2 lead...he allowed a triple to Ryan Braun, who scored on a Brandon Crawford sacrifice fly...he then retired Kris Bryant and Joe Panik, throwing nine pitches, securing the AL 6-3 victory.

- Dozier became the 16th player to ever homer in their first All-Star Game at-bat.
- He became the third Twins to homer in an All-Star Game, joining Kirby Puckett (1993) and Harmon Killebrew (1961, '65, '71).

\* - The 49 wins pre-ASG are the most since 2008 when they had 53 (in 95 games)...it is their fourth highest win-total pre-ASG since 1993.

**TWINS AND A'S:** The Twins last played the A's from May 4-7 at Target Field, winning the series opener, losing game two, and winning the final two...they out-scored the A's 28-14...the Twins hit .267 (35-for-131) with eight doubles, one triple and four home runs; they hit .342 (13-for-38) with runners in scoring position...pitchers posted an ERA of 3.50 (36.0 IP, 14 ER) with eight walks and 23 strikeouts.

**NOT SO ATHLETIC:** The Twins last played at Oakland August 7-10 of last season, losing the first three and winning the finale, which snapped a nine-game losing streak at O.Co Coliseum that dated back to August 21, 2012...the Twins last series win in this stadium came in two games May 18-19, 2011...they have lost four straight series at the Coliseum since.

**TORII, ALL ABOUT THOSE A'S:** Torii Hunter is hitting .356 (37-for-104) with five doubles, one triple, 10 home runs, 27 RBI and 18 runs scored in his last 26 games against the A's...in that same span he has 12 multi-hit games and seven multi-RBI games...among actives against Oakland, he ranks fourth in home runs (28), RBI (91), games (168) and at-bats (621).

**CALI CONNECTIONS:** Twins on the 25-man roster with California connections: Casey Fien - born in Santa Rosa, J.R. Graham - born in Livermore, Aaron Hicks - born in San Pedro, Phil Hughes - born in Mission Viejo, Tommy Milone - born in Saugus and attended USC, Trevor Plouffe - born in West Hills, Kurt Suzuki attended Cal State Fullerton.

- Kurt Suzuki was drafted by Oakland in the second round of the 2004 First-Year Player Draft...he played for A's from 2007-13, hitting .255 (653-for-2563) with 136 doubles, 59 home runs and 309 RBI in 718 games...he has hit just .161 (5-for-31) in eight career games against his former team...he ranks fifth on the A's franchise list in games caught (684).
- Tommy Milone pitched for the A's from 2012-14, going 31-22, 3.84 ERA (442.2 IP, 189 ER) in 75 games (73 starts) for the A's...he was traded from Washington to Oakland in December of 2011, along with A.J. Cole, Derek Norris and Brad Peacock, in exchange for Robert Gilliam and Gio Gonzalez...he was traded to Minnesota last July in exchange for Sam Fuld.

**PERKINS CLOSING TIME:** Glen Perkins leads the AL in saves (28), trailing Mark Melancon for MLB-lead...he has converted 28 straight save opportunities, the longest save streak in club history...he has 116 career saves, needing one save to pass Eddie Guardado and move into sole possession of third on the Twins all-time list; he trails Joe Nathan (260) and Rick Aguilera (254)...he needs two saves to become the fourth closer in club history to reach 30 saves in three-plus consecutive seasons, joining Jeff Reardon (3 straight, 1987-89), Aguilera (4 straight, 1990-93) and Nathan (6 straight, 2004-09).

**ARCIA IL POW:** Triple-A Rochester outfielder Oswaldo Arcia recently was named International League Player of the Week...in seven games for the Red Wings, Arcia hit .333 (8-for-24) and led the International League with four home runs, 10 RBI, six extra-base hits, and 22 total bases.

**ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY:** In 1990, the Twins became the first team in baseball history to turn two triple plays in the same game...both were started on grounders to third baseman Gary Gaetti...the Twins lost to the Red Sox at Fenway Park, 1-0.

### THE SKIPPER

Paul Molitor was named Twins Manager November 4, 2014 becoming the 13th Manager in club history and just the third since 1986 (Tom Kelly, Ron Gardenhire)...2015 marks his 15th minor league and major league professional coaching season...inducted into baseball HOF in 2004 and one of just six players in MLB history with 3,000 hits and 500 stolen bases...ranks ninth on baseball's all-time hit list amassing 3,319 in 21-year career from 1978-98...1974 graduate of Cretin High School in St. Paul, attended University of Minnesota from 1975-77 and played for Twins from 1996-98.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Did not factor into the decision in the Twins 8-6 comeback victory July 10 against Detroit...he allowed six runs on eight hits with three walks and five strikeouts in 4.0 innings pitched, his shortest start since tossing 3.1 innings September 4, 2013 as a member of the Kansas City Royals.

- All six runs allowed were scored on three home runs: a pair of homers by J.D. Martinez in the third and fourth innings, and a three-run shot by Yoenis Cespedes in the fourth...since the start of 2014, Santana has only allowed three home runs in an outing one other time (8/18/14 at PIT)...it tied Kyle Gibson for the most allowed in a game by a Twins pitcher this season (June 5 vs. MIL).

**DAZZLING DEBUT:** In his season and Twins debut, July 5 at Kansas City, Santana went 8.0 innings and allowed two runs on three hits with three walks and eight strikeouts, not factoring into the decision of the 3-2 Twins defeat...he gave up a two-out RBI single to Drew Butera in the third inning and a solo homer to Alex Gordon in the fifth...the Royals won the game on an Eric Hosmer walk-off double in the ninth, scoring Lorenzo Cain from first base...here are more notes from his start:

- His eight strikeouts matched the second most in a Twins debut since 1961, tying him with Boof Bonser's eight on May 21, 2006, trailing only Camilo Pascual's 12 on April 14, 1961.
- Santana went 8.0 innings just twice in 31 starts with Atlanta last season, and one of those starts was in his Braves debut when he also allowed three hits, but didn't allow a run April 9 in Atlanta's 4-3 win over New York-NL.

**AGAINST THE ATHLETICS:** This will be Santana's 27th career start against Oakland, his third most against any club in the majors (Seattle - 31, Texas - 29)...he is 14-6 with a 2.12 ERA (178.1 IP, 42 ER) against them with 61 walks, 140 strikeouts and 11 home runs...he last faced them July 6, 2013 as a member of the Kansas City Royals...he did not factor into the decision after allowing three runs on seven hits with two walks and five strikeouts in 7.0 innings pitched...23 of his 26 career starts against the Athletics have been quality starts.

- Billy Butler's five career home runs off Santana are his personal best against any active pitcher in the majors...it is tied for the second most off Santana by an active player (Cano - 6).

**AGAINST AL WEST OPPONENTS:** Santana has made 88 career starts and 90 career appearances against AL West opponents...he is 40-26 against them with a 3.96 ERA (564.0 IP, 248 ER) with 180 walks and 410 strikeouts...he has not faced an AL West opponent since September 25, 2013 (Seattle) as a member of the Kansas City Royals, after spending last season in the National League with the Braves.

**AMERICAN LEAGUE DOMINATION:** Santana spent eight seasons in the American League with the Los Angeles Angels and the Kansas City Royals from 2005-2013 before moving to the National League in 2014 with the Braves...in those eight seasons, Santana ranked in the top five for several pitching categories...below are his numbers and ranks in the AL from 2005-13:

**WITH TRIPLE-A ROCHESTER:** Santana made three rehab starts with Rochester...he won each start, and had a 1.74 ERA (20.2 IP, 4 ER) with four walks and 11 strikeouts...here is a closer look at each of his outings:

**DENIED IN JULY:** Santana had a season-best four wins in July last season...in fact, from 2010-14, a total of 24 July starts, Santana went 12-6 with a 3.51 ERA (159.0 IP, 62 ER), 43 walks, 121 strikeouts, and a .234 opponents average.

**2014 RECAP:** In his only season in the National League, Santana went 14-10 with a 3.95 ERA (196.0 IP, 86 ER) for the Braves...tied for the club lead with 14 wins (Julio Teheran), the fourth time in his career he's reached that plateau...the durable right-hander fell four innings shy of 200.0, a total he's reached five other times in his career...started 31 games, the fifth consecutive season he's made at least 30 starts.

- Earned the win in his NL debut after tossing 8.0 shutout innings with no walks and six strikeouts against the Mets April 9...had a 1.95 ERA (27.2 IP, 6 ER) in four April starts, his best mark of any month last season.
- Recorded 10-plus strikeouts in consecutive starts -- July 23 vs. Miami and July 28 vs. San Diego -- for the first time in his career.
- Finished season with a 6.51 ERA (27.2 IP, 20 ER) in five September starts, the worst September ERA of his career.
- Went 10-4, 3.75 ERA (103.1 IP, 43 ER) in 16 home starts, tied for second most home wins in NL and third most in baseball (Greinke, Hernandez, Kluber, Peralta, Weaver).

**TOMORROW'S STARTER - PHIL HUGHES, RHP [SEASON: 8-6, 4.32 ERA ; CAREER: 80-66, 4.32 ERA]**

Hughes will be making his team-leading 19th start of year Saturday evening...in his last start, July 11 against Detroit, he earned the win after allowing four runs on eight hits with no walks and three strikeouts in 5.0 innings...it was marked just the third time in 18 starts that he did not pitch 6.0-or-more innings...this will be Hughes' 11th career start against the Athletics and 14th career outing...he last faced them May 4, earning the win after allowing five runs on nine hits in 6.0 innings...three of the runs allowed came on a pair of homers from Stephen Vogt and Mark Canha...Hughes is 5-2 with a 4.52 ERA (61.2 IP, 31 ER) with six home runs, 28 walks and 52 strikeouts in his career...this will be his fourth start against an AL West opponent this season, with starts against Seattle, Oakland and Texas...he is 1-1 in those games with a 4.50 ERA (20.0 IP, 10 ER).

**CAREER NOTES**

- Signed a four-year contract with the Twins December 13, 2014.
- Signed as a free agent with the Atlanta Braves March 12, 2014, spending his only season in the National League...his 14 wins tied for the team-lead with Julio Teheran.
- In his nine years in the American League from 2005-13, he ranked fourth in the AL in starts (265), fifth in innings (1686.2) and strikeouts (1328), and tied for fifth in wins (105)
- Recorded his 100th career win, June 8, 2013 vs. Houston, in his only season in Kansas City.
- Traded to Kansas City October 31, 2011...left the Angels organization in the club's all-time top 10 in wins (7th, 96), innings (6th, 1,475.2) and strikeouts (6th, 1,167).
- Pitched no-hitter July 27, 2011 at Cleveland, allowing an unearned run and a walk with 10 strikeouts, marking the eighth individual no-hitter in Angels history
- In 2010, set career-highs in wins (17) and innings (222.2), while recording the second-best ERA of his career (3.92).
- Selected to his only career All-Star Game in 2008...gave up a run in 1.0 inning (5th) in the AL's 4-3, 15-inning win at New York-AL...finished year second in AL in strikeouts (214), fourth in innings pitched (219.0) and tied seventh in wins (16).
- Started Game 5 of 2005 ALDS at Yankee Stadium in his rookie season...recorded the win after allowing three runs on five hits in 5.1 innings...became sixth rookie to win decisive postseason series game.
- Signed by the Anaheim Angels as an undrafted free agent September 2, 2000.
