ABOUT THE A'S: Have split the first two games after the All-Star Break and are now 8-10 over the last 18 games...are 28-21 (.571) since bot-toming out at a season-high 16 games under .500 (14-30) at the conclusion of play on May 22...have the second best record in the Ameri-can League and fourth best in the majors dating back to May 23...are 42-51 (.452) overall, which is the worst record in the AL and fifth worst in the majors...this marks the first time the A's have the worst record in the AL after the All-Star Break since the end of the 1997 season...have been in sole possession of last place in the West for 67 of the last 68 days...for the season, have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, seven days in fourth, two days tied for fourth and 67 days in fifth...the 67 days alone in last are sec-ond most by an A's team over the last 17 years (162 in 2009).

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher in three consecutive games starting today...are 5-17 (.227) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 36-34 (.514) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is the worst in the majors (Colorado, 5-14)...are batting .240 (197-for-822) against lefties compared to .261 (621-for-2382) off righties...the average against lefties is fourth low-est in the American League and the mark against righties is fourth highest.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer in 24 of the last 49 games and are 22-16 with a 2.55 ERA (89 er in 314.1 ip) over that span, which dates back to May 23...have a 3.03 ERA for the season, which is second lowest in the majors (St. Louis, 2.80)...the last time A's starters had an ERA under 3.16 was in 1974 (2.98)...lead the majors with 572.2 innings pitched and have allowed 39 home runs, which is second fewest (Pittsburgh, 37).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 2.95 ERA (38 er in 116.0 ip) in July and have a 3.37 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and sixth lowest in the majors...also lead the AL in shutouts (12), opponents slugging percentage (.354), opponents on-base percentage (.298) and fewest extra base hits (212) and rank second in opponents bat-ting average (.236) and fewest home runs (74).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .228 (134-for-587) with 52 runs scored over the last 18 games (2.9 runs per game)...have scored two runs or fewer in nine of those 18 games...for the season, rank third in the American League in triples (23) and fewest strikeouts (617), tied for third in doubles (159) and fourth in fewest home runs (75)...have been successful in 54-of-67 (80.6%) stolen base attempts, which is the best mark in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed three errors in two games since the All-Star Break and now have 85 for the season, which is 12 more than any other team (Milwaukee, 73)...the 85 errors are one more than the season total from 2006 when the A's set the club record for fewest errors in a season...the errors have led to 44 unearned runs, which is second most in the majors (San Diego, 48).

RUN DIFFERENTIAL: The A's have out-scored the opposition 393-353 for a run differential of +40...that is fourth best in the American League and seventh best in the majors...are 27-18 (.600) in games decided by three runs or more, which is the fifth best record in the majors...however, are 15-33 (.313) in games decided by two runs or fewer, which is second worst in the majors (Toronto, 13-30, .302).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's had their second walk-off win of the season last night...averaged 10.7 walk-off wins per season over the previous three years...are now 9-22 (.290) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the majors...the worst record in one-run games in Oakland history is 16-26 (.381) in 1980 and the worst in Ath-letics history is .256 in 1916 (11-32)...improved to 2-6 (.250) in extra inning games with the win last night, which is tied for the second worst record in the majors...are 4-11 in games decided in the last at bat...the wins are tied with New York (AL) for the fewest in the majors and the losses are tied for second most in the American League.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-1 on this six-game homestand against Minnesota (1-1) and Toronto (three games)...went 3-3 on their final road trip before the break against New York (1-2) and Cleveland (2-1)...are 19-27 (.413) at home compared to 23-24 (.489) on the road...have the second worst home record in the American League (Texas, 16-26)...have finished the season with a home winning percentage under .429 once in Oakland history and that was in 1979 (31-50, .383).

THIS AND THAT: The win last night was Bob Melvin's 367th as manager of the A's...needs one more to tie Ken Macha for third most in Oakland history...only Tony La Russa (798) and Art Howe (600) have more...the A's will play each of their first 22 games after the All-Star Break in Califor-nia...20 of those games will be in the Bay Area as the A's have a three-game series at San Francisco July 24-26...also travel to Los Angeles July 28-29 for a two-game series against the Dodgers...have one remaining trip to the Eastern time zone (Aug. 11-17 to Toronto and Baltimore) and one to the Central time zone (Sept. 11-20 to Texas, Chicago and Houston)...are the only team in the majors without a rain delay...are 7-6 in July after going 15-12 in June...had finished with a losing record in each of the previous four months from August 2014-May June 2015 (42-66, .389).

AT THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's were 41-50 (.451) at the All-Star Break, which was the 10th worst record in Oakland history at the break...it was the worst since the 2011 club was 39-53 (.424)...2011 also marked the last time the A's were in last place at the break (were 12 back that year)...the pitching staff had 12 shutouts, which was second most in Oakland his-tory at the break (13 in 1972)...the offense had 23 triples, which was also second most (26 in 1974).

ALL-STARS: The A's had two players named to the American League All-Star team, both as a result of player balloting...Stephen Vogt received the most player votes among catchers and Sonny Gray placed third among starting pitchers...it was the first All-Star Game for both players...Gray was not active as he started the Sunday before the game and Vogt struck out in his only at bat while catching three innings.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Crisp, Doolittle, Hahn, Ladendorf, Parker, Thompson, Venditte)...Crisp, Doolittle, Ladendorf, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...have had at least six players on the DL all year...have used the DL a total of 18 times, which matches the season total from last year...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. TWINS: The A's have lost the season series for the first time since 2010 (3-6) as they are 2-4 entering the final game today...are 1-1 in Oak-land and 1-3 in Minnesota...are 23-14 (.622) against the Twins dating back to the start of the 2011 season...have won 10 of the last 12 games in the Coliseum...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 292-295 against Minnesota...that includes 162-128 in Oakland and 130-167 in Minneso-ta...are 13-12 at Target Field...are 349-364 all-time against the Twins and have a 996-1000 record against the Twins/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Burns leads Major League rookies in hits (85), stolen bases (19) and multiple hit games (26)...**Brett Lawrie** has a 10-game hitting streak against Minnesota (14-for-40, .350) and is a .329 (28-for-85) career hit-ter against the Twins, which is his best mark against any AL team...is batting .561 (23-for-41) when putting the first pitch in play...**Josh Red-dick** leads the majors in two-out RBI (33)...**Stephen Vogt** had his first regular season walk-off hit last night and leads the majors with 23 RBI in the seventh inning or later...**Ben Zobrist** has not committed an error in 27 games at second base and has a 56-game errorless streak as a second baseman dating back to June 19, 2014.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1992** Carney Lansford ties an Oakland record with three doubles in the A's 6-2 win against Detroit...he adds a single to finish the day a per-fect 4 for 4...in **1999** Buddy Groom ties an Oakland record by pitching in his sixth consecutive game...he retires the only batter he faces in the A's 10-5 win over Colorado...in **2002** Cory Lidle tosses a one-hitter in the A's 10-0 win over Texas...it is his first of two one-hitters in 2002.

Saves/Opportunities: 19-for-32 (59.4%)

- The A's bullpen has allowed one earned run or fewer in 18 of its past 22 games and has a 2.59 ERA (17 er in 59.0 ip) over that span.
- Has a 3.38 ERA (45 er in 119.2 ip) over its past 46 games (beginning May 23) after logging a 4.82 ERA in its first 44 games...has a 4.14 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the AL (Texas, 4.38).
- Has nine wins and 17 losses...the wins are third fewest in the majors and the losses are tied for fifth most.
- Has allowed the most first batter RBI in the majors (40) and the second most first batter home runs (12).
- Has the second fewest saves in the AL (19), the second lowest save percentage (59.4%) and is tied for the second most blown saves (13).
- Has allowed the fourth most home runs in the AL (35).
- The A's are 5-31 when the bullpen allows two runs or more, 35-19 when it allows one run or fewer (three complete games).

56 LHP FERNANDO ABAD

Inherited Runners/Scored: 31/10
First Hitters: 9-30, 2 bb, hbp

- Has not allowed a run in 11 of his past 13 games (2 er in 12.0 ip, 1.50 ERA)...has a 2.93 ERA (5 er in 15.1 ip) over his past 22 games after posting a 7.04 ERA in his first 11 contests.
- Has allowed a .152 (5-for-33) batting average to right-handed hitters compared to .283 (15-for-53) with 10 extra base hits (.679 slugging percentage) against left-handers.
- Has allowed 20 hits, 12 of which are for extra bases (five doubles, one triple, six home runs)...has the fourth highest opponents slugging percentage among American League relievers (.523).
- Is tied for the most first batter home runs in the majors (4) and is second in first batter RBI (12).
- Has not allowed a run in seven games and 5.2 innings in his career against the Twins (2 h, 1 bb, 4 so).

- His blown save last night was his first since June 7 at Boston.
- Has not allowed a run in 10 of his past 12 games (2 er in 13.1 ip, 1.35 ERA).
- Has a .173 opponents batting average, including .101 (7-for-69) against lefties and .243 (17-for-70) against righties.
- Has a 1.00 ERA (2 er in 18.0 ip) in 17 games at night compared to a 4.12 ERA (9 er in 19.2 ip) in 19 games during the day.
- Has a win, save and blown save in four games in his career against the Twins (4.1 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 4 so).
- Has pitched in 407 games since 2010, which is the most in the majors (Belisle, STL and Gregerson, HOU 398).

Last Year: *Was named to his second National League All-Star team...went 7-4 with a save and a 2.18 ERA in 75 relief appearances...it was his fifth consecutive season with 70 or more games pitched...tied for fourth in the NL in games pitched.*

- Was reinstated from the 15-day DL June 18 and has a 5.68 ERA (4 er in 6.1 ip) in eight games since then.
- Is tied for second among American League relievers in grounded into double plays (7) and tied for fourth in most home runs allowed (6).
- Is 1-1 with a 5.59 ERA (6 er in 9.2 ip) in 10 appearances in his career against Minnesota.
- Was on the disabled list from May 22 to June 17 with a fractured right thumb.
- Began the year with Boston and was designated for assignment May 8...was traded to Oakland the next day for a player to be named later or cash.

Last Year: *Spent the entire season with the Red Sox and was 2-4 with a 3.37 ERA, eight saves and one blown save in 64 relief appearances...it was his fourth consecutive season with 60 or more appearances.*

- Has allowed a .171 (6-for-35) batting average and no extra base hits to left-handed hitters compared to .432 (16-for-37) with seven extra base hits (.676 slugging percentage) against right-handers.

- Has faced Minnesota two times in his career (1.1 ip, 1 so).
- Has not allowed a home run to a left-handed hitter since Aug. 14, 2011 against Chicago-NL (Carlos Pena).
- Was on the disabled list May 2 to June 1 with a left shoulder strain.

- Began the year with the A's and was 2-3 with a 6.29 ERA in 23 relief appearances...was optioned to Nashville June 5.
- Has allowed four home runs in 25.1 innings...prior to this year, yielded just four homers in 117 games and 138.0 innings in his career.
- Has walked the first batter he has faced just three times in 141 career appearances.
- Did not allow a run over his last six games and 11.0 innings with Nashville...his complete stats with the Sounds:

- Has a 1.56 ERA (3 er in 17.1 ip) in 20 relief appearances since he was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list June 3.
- Was 2-3 with a 4.40 ERA in eight games, all starts, before he was placed on the DL...in two seasons with the A's, is 1-1 with a 1.59 ERA (6 er in 34.0 ip) in 29 relief appearances, 6-6 with a 3.40 ERA in 18 starts.
- Has made two career appearances against the Twins, both this year (5.1 ip, 3 h, 6 r, 4 er, 5 bb, 3 so).
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list May 20 retroactive to May 19 with a sprained left AC joint and was reinstated June 3.

Last Year: *Combined for a 5-4 record and a 2.35 ERA in 20 games, 10 starts, with the A's...missed 24 games from June 17 to July 12 while on the disabled list...went 3-1 with a 3.69 ERA eight games, all starts, with Triple-A Sacramento.*

- Has not allowed an earned run in 15 of his past 18 games and has a 1.50 ERA (3 er in 18.0 ip) over that span (beginning May 27).
- Has not allowed a home run in two seasons and 34 games pitched with the A's (36.0 ip).
- Has made two career appearances against Minnesota, both this year (3.0 ip, 1 h, 6 so).
- Was selected from Triple-A Nashville May 7 after logging a 2.81 ERA in 10 relief appearances with the Sounds...held opponents to a .143 batting average, including .120 against right-handed hitters.

Last Year: *Spent most of the season with Triple-A Sacramento where he was 3-0 with a 1.97 ERA in 38 relief appearances...also went 1-0 with a 1.00 ERA in seven games over two stints with Oakland.*

58 RHP EVAN SCRIBNER

- Has allowed a career-high tying two home runs in each of his past two games and has now yielded 11 on the season, which is the most in the majors among relievers...the home runs are tied for eighth most in Oakland history among relievers and are the most by an A's reliever since 2004 (13, Justin Duchscherer).
- Has all four of his blown saves, both of his losses and a 5.79 ERA (18 er in 28.0 ip) over his last 26 contests (beginning May 8)...compiled a 1.10 ERA over his first 14 games
- Leads American League relievers in strikeout-to-walk ratio (11.75) and fewest walks per nine innings (0.81), is tied for fourth in innings (44.1) and is 10th in strikeouts (47)...is tied for the lead in blown saves (4).
- First batters faced are 16-for-40 (.400) with four home runs and 13 RBI...the RBI are the most in the majors, the home runs are tied for the most and the batting average is tied for third highest.
- Has faced Minnesota seven times in his career (6.0 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 5 so, 3.00 ERA).

Last Year: *Spent most of the season with Triple-A Sacramento where he was 4-1 with 16 saves and a 3.06 ERA in 40 relief appearances...also went 1-0 with a 4.63 ERA in 13 games over four stints with Oakland.*

1 BILLY BURNS

- Is 4-for-25 (.160) over his last six games but is batting .304 for the season, which ranks eighth in the American League...also ranks second in the AL in stolen bases (19), fourth in stolen base percentage (86.4%) and tied for seventh in triples (5).
- Leads Major League rookies in hits (85), stolen bases (19) and multiple hit games (26)...is tied for the lead among AL rookies in triples (5), ranks second in runs (39) and total bases (112) and tied for fourth in doubles (11) and extra base hits (18)...the five triples are tied for fourth most in Oakland history by a rookie...the 19 stolen bases are second best by an A's rookie over the last 28 years (Weeks 22, in 2011)...needs one more steal to become the eighth rookie in Oakland history with 20 or more stolen bases.
- Is batting .359 (46-for-128) at home compared to .257 (39-for-152) on the road...has the third best home batting average in the AL.
- Has 24 infield hits, which is second most in the majors (Gordon, MIA 32).
- Has not committed an error and his 141 total chances are fourth most among AL outfielders with no errors.
- Is batting .483 (29-for-60) with five doubles, three triples and two home runs (.767 slugging percentage) when putting the first pitch in play.

Last Year: Went 1-for-6 (.167) in 13 games over two stints with Oakland in his Major League debut...combined to hit .237 with one home run and 28 RBI in 119 games with Midland and Sacramento...tied for fourth in the minors in steals (54).

16 BILLY BUTLER

Current Streak: 1 game (2 for 4)
Minnesota Series: 2-8, r, hr, rbi
Last Road Trip: 4-17, 2 r, 3 2b, hr, 5 rbi, bb, 5 so, hbp, sf, gidp

- Homered for the third time in his last 14 games last night and has 10 RBI over that span...had just two home runs and 20 RBI over his previous 56 contests
- Batted .249 before the All-Star Break, which matched the lowest mark of his career at the break (2008)...is a .281 career hitter with 62 home runs and 333 RBI in 706 games before the break compared to .305 (632-for-2073) with 73 home runs and 337 RBI in 546 games after the break.
- Hit .287 in April, .241 in May, .237 in June and is currently batting .214 (9-for-42) in July.
- Is tied for fourth in the American League in grounded into double plays (13).

Last Year: Batted .271 with nine home runs and 66 RBI in 151 games in his eighth and final season with Kansas City...the batting average was a career-low as was his .323 on-base percentage and .379 slugging percentage.

20 MARK CANHA

Current Streak: 1 game (1 for 3)
Minnesota Series: 1-4, so
Last Road Trip: 4-13, r, 2 2b, 2 rbi, bb, 3 so

- Is 1-for-7 over his last three games after hitting safely in a career-high tying six consecutive games (also April 8-13)...batted .381 (8-for-21) with six RBI during his hitting streak.
- Is tied for the lead among American League rookies in RBI (33), tied for second in home runs (8), tied for third in walks (16), ranks fourth in total bases (87), tied for fourth in extra base hits (18) and fifth in runs (29).
- Is hitting .295 (41-for-139) with 17 of his 18 extra base hits against right-handed pitching compared to .153 (11-for-72) with a double against left-handers...is slugging .540 against righties, .167 against lefties.
- Struck out as a pinch hitter Friday night and is now 0-for-10 with six strikeouts and a RBI as a pinch hitter...is tied for the AL lead in pinch strikeouts.

Last Year: Spent the entire season at Triple-A New Orleans in the Miami farm system where he batted a career-high .303 with 20 home runs and 82 RBI in 127 games...added 57 walks for a career-high .384 on-base percentage.

4 COCO CRISP

Current Streak: 0 for 12

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list May 23 retroactive to May 20 with a cervical strain...was transferred to the 60-day DL June 5.
- This is his second stint on the DL as he began the season on the DL after undergoing surgery on his right elbow...was reinstated May 6.

Last Year: Batted .246 in 126 games but added a career-high 66 walks for a .336 on-base percentage...stole 19 bases, his 12th consecutive season with 10 or more steals...is one of four in MLB with 10 or more steals in each of the previous 12 seasons.
