## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (42-51) VS. MINNESOTA TWINS (50-41)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have split the first two games after the All-Star Break and are now 8-10 over the last 18 games...are 28-21 (.571) since bottoming out at a season-high 16 games under .500 (14-30) at the conclusion of play on May 22...have the second best record in the American League and fourth best in the majors dating back to May 23...are 42-51 (.452) overall, which is the worst record in the AL and fifth worst in the majors...this marks the first time the A's have the

worst record in the AL after the All-Star Break since the end of the 1997 season...have been in sole possession of last place in the West for 67 of the last 68 days...for the season, have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, seven days in fourth, two days tied for fourth and 67 days in fifth...the 67 days alone in last are second most by an A's team over the last 17 years (162 in 2009).

**LEFT AND RIGHT:** The A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher in three consecutive games starting today...are 5-17 (.227) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 36-34 (.514) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is the worst in the majors (Colorado, 5-14)...are batting .240 (197-for-822) against lefties compared to .261 (621-for-2382) off righties...the average against lefties is fourth lowest in the American League and the mark against righties is fourth highest.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer in 24 of the last 49 games and are 22-16 with a 2.55 ERA (89 er in 314.1 ip) over that span, which dates back to May 23...have a 3.03 ERA for the season, which is second lowest in the majors (St. Louis, 2.80)...the last time A's starters had an ERA under 3.16 was in 1974 (2.98)...lead the majors with 572.2 innings pitched and have allowed 39 home runs, which is second fewest (Pittsburgh, 37).

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 2.95 ERA (38 er in 116.0 ip) in July and have a 3.37 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and sixth lowest in the majors...also lead the AL in shutouts (12), opponents slugging percentage (.354), opponents on-base percentage (.298) and fewest extra base hits (212) and rank second in opponents batting average (.236) and fewest home runs (74).

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .228 (134-for-587) with 52 runs scored over the last 18 games (2.9 runs per game)...have scored two runs or fewer in nine of those 18 games...for the season, rank third in the American League in triples (23) and fewest strikeouts (617), tied for third in doubles (159) and fourth in fewest home runs (75)...have been successful in 54-of-67 (80.6%) stolen base attempts, which is the best mark in the majors.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed three errors in two games since the All-Star Break and now have 85 for the season, which is 12 more than any other team (Milwaukee, 73)...the 85 errors are one more than the season total from 2006 when the A's set the club record for fewest errors in a season...the errors have led to 44 unearned runs, which is second most in the majors (San Diego, 48).

**RUN DIFFERENTIAL:** The A's have out-scored the opposition 393-353 for a run differential of +40...that is fourth best in the American League and seventh best in the majors...are 27-18 (.600) in games decided by three runs or more, which is the fifth best record in the majors...however, are 15-33 (.313) in games decided by two runs or fewer, which is second worst in the majors (Toronto, 13-30, .302).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's had their second walk-off win of the season last night...averaged 10.7 walk-off wins per season over the previous three years...are now 9-22 (.290) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the majors...the worst record in one-run games in Oakland history is 16-26 (.381) in 1980 and the worst in Athletics history is .256 in 1916 (11-32)...improved to 2-6 (.250) in extra inning games with the win last night, which is tied for the second worst record in the majors...are 4-11 in games decided in the last at bat...the wins are tied with New York (AL) for the fewest in the majors and the losses are tied for second most in the American League.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 1-1 on this six-game homestand against Minnesota (1-1) and Toronto (three games)...went 3-3 on their final road trip before the break against New York (1-2) and Cleveland (2-1)...are 19-27 (.413) at home compared to 23-24 (.489) on the road...have the second worst home record in the American League (Texas, 16-26)...have finished the season with a home winning percentage under .429 once in Oakland history and that was in 1979 (31-50, .383).

THIS AND THAT: The win last night was Bob Melvin's 367th as manager of the A's...needs one more to tie Ken Macha for third most in Oakland history...only Tony La Russa (798) and Art Howe (600) have more...the A's will play each of their first 22 games after the All-Star Break in California...20 of those games will be in the Bay Area as the A's have a threegame series at San Francisco July 24-26...also travel to Los Angeles July 28-29 for a two-game series against the Dodgers...have one remaining trip to the Eastern time zone (Aug. 11-17 to Toronto and Baltimore) and one to the Central time zone (Sept. 11-20 to Texas, Chicago and Houston)...are the only team in the majors without a rain delay...are 7-6 in July after going 15-12 in June...had finished with a losing record in each of the previous four months from August 2014-May June 2015 (42-66, .389).

AT THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's were 41-50 (.451) at the All-Star Break, which was the 10th worst record in Oakland history at the break...it was the worst since the 2011 club was 39-53 (.424)...2011 also marked the last time the A's were in last place at the break (were 12 back that year)... the pitching staff had 12 shutouts, which was second most in Oakland history at the break (13 in 1972)...the offense had 23 triples, which was also second most (26 in 1974).

**ALL-STARS:** The A's had two players named to the American League All-Star team, both as a result of player balloting...Stephen Vogt received the most player votes among catchers and Sonny Gray placed third among starting pitchers...it was the first All-Star Game for both players...Gray was not active as he started the Sunday before the game and Vogt struck out in his only at bat while catching three innings.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Crisp, Doolittle, Hahn, Ladendorf, Parker, Thompson, Venditte)...Crisp, Doolittle, Ladendorf, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...have had at least six players on the DL all year...have used the DL a total of 18 times, which matches the season total from last year...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. TWINS: The A's have lost the season series for the first time since 2010 (3-6) as they are 2-4 entering the final game today...are 1-1 in Oakland and 1-3 in Minnesota...are 23-14 (.622) against the Twins dating back to the start of the 2011 season...have won 10 of the last 12 games in the Coliseum...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 292-295 against Minnesota...that includes 162-128 in Oakland and 130-167 in Minnesota...are 13-12 at Target Field...are 349-364 all-time against the Twins and have a 996-1000 record against the Twins/Senators.

## TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Burns leads Major League rookies in hits (85), stolen bases (19) and multiple hit games (26)...Brett Lawrie has a 10-game hitting streak against Minnesota (14-for-40, .350) and is a .329 (28-for-85) career hitter against the Twins, which is his best mark against any AL team...is batting .561 (23-for-41) when putting the first pitch in play...Josh Reddick leads the majors in two-out RBI (33)...Stephen Vogt had his first regular season walk-off hit last night and leads the majors with 23 RBI in the seventh inning or later...Ben Zobrist has not committed an error in 27 games at second base and has a 56-game errorless streak as a second baseman dating back to June 19, 2014.

## THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1992** Carney Lansford ties an Oakland record with three doubles in the A's 6-2 win against Detroit...he adds a single to finish the day a perfect 4 for 4...in **1999** Buddy Groom ties an Oakland record by pitching in his sixth consecutive game...he retires the only batter he faces in the A's 10-5 win over Colorado...in **2002** Cory Lidle tosses a one-hitter in the A's 10-0 win over Texas...it is his first of two one-hitters in 2002.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Chavez (4-9, 3.40 ERA)

THREE-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-3 with a 5.82 ERA (11 er in 17.0 ip) and .306 (22-for-72) opponents batting average over his last three starts for his second three-game losing streak of the season...now has nine losses for the season, which is tied for fourth in the American League...the losses are also a career-high (had eight last year) and second most by an A's pitcher before the All-Star Break over the last 17 years (Joe Blanton, 12 in 2008)...has a .308 winning percentage, which is tied for third lowest

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 2-4 with a 5.27 ERA (24 er in 41.0 ip) and .299 (50-for-180) opponents batting average over his last seven starts after going 2-5 with a 2.38 ERA and .221 opponents average over his first eight starts...is 4-9 with a 3.64 ERA (38 er in 94.0 ip) in his 15 starting assignments...began the season in the bullpen and did not allow a run in his four relief appearances (6.2 ip)...his first start came April 23 when Jesse Hahn missed a start due to a blister...remained in the rotation following the option of Kendall Graveman to Nashville April 26...is now 12-17 with a 3.82 ERA (97 er in 228.1 ip) in 38 career starts, 9-15 with a 5.02 ERA in 204 relief appearances.

RUN SUPPORT: Has the fifth lowest run support in the American League (3.22)...has received no run support in four of his 15 starts and has received two runs or fewer in 10 starts.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 3-3 with a 2.76 ERA (18 er in 58.2 ip) in 11 games at night compared to 1-6 with a 4.29 ERA (20 er in 42.0 ip) in eight games during the day...has the seventh lowest night ERA in the American League but leads the majors in day losses...the day losses match the most by an A's pitcher over the last 17 years...the last A's pitcher to lose more than six games during the day is Tom Candiotti in 1998 (8)

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: Is 1-2 with a 1.47 ERA (5 er in 30.2 ip) in five games against American League Central teams compared to 3-7 with a 4.24 ERA (33 er in 70.0 ip) in 14 games against all other teams

INNING BY INNING: Has a 1.50 ERA (5 er in 30.0 ip) in the first and second innings, a 4.95 ERA (31 er in 56.1 ip) in the third through sixth innings  $\,$ and a 1.26 ERA (2 er in 14.1 ip) from the seventh inning on.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has a .210 (30-for-143) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .280 after that (67-for-239)...the opponents number seven hitter is batting .045 (2-for-45), which is the lowest mark in the majors....has walked two batters or fewer in 12 of his 15 starts...has vielded seven of his eight home runs to lefties...five have come with runners on base...has allowed five home runs in his last six starts and 36.0 innings after surrendering three over his first 13 games and 64.2 innings

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-4 with a 2.63 ERA (14 er in 48.0 ip) in nine games at home compared to 2-5 with a 4.10 ERA (24 er in 52.2 ip) in 10 games on the road...over the last two seasons, he is 7-6 with a 2.65 ERA (34 er in 115.1 ip) in 24 games at home compared to 5-11 with a 4.11 ERA (60 er in 131.1 ip) in 27 contests on the road.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on nine days rest today...is 3-6 with a 2.36 ERA (16 er in 61.0 ip) in nine starts on four days rest compared to 1-3 with a 6.00 ERA (22 er in 33.0 ip) in six starts on five days rest or more... has the third lowest ERA in the American League when starting on four

THE LAST THREE YEARS: Is 14-21 with a 3.52 ERA (119 er in 304.0 ip) in 86 games, including 36 starts, over the last three years...started his career by going 7-11 with a 5.99 ERA in 156 games, including two starts, over his first five years from 2008-12

2015 HIGHLIGHTS: Recorded the save in his final relief appearance April 18 at Kansas City, tossing 3.2 scoreless innings...has two career saves, both at Kansas City and both at least 3.2 innings...struck out six, which matched the most by an A's pitcher in a game in which he recorded the save...the only other time it happened since the save became an official stat in 1969 was by Rollie Fingers on Sept. 1, 1972 against Detroit...took the loss in his first start, a 2-0 decision at Los Angeles (AL) April 23... tossed six innings and allowed just one hit, a a two-run home run by Calhoun in the third inning...it was the Angels only hit of the game...Tropeano, Salas, Smith and Street combined to shutout the A's on eight hits...went 0-2 with a 2.55 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in six games, including two starts, in April...is 2-2 with a 2.10 ERA in 12 games, eight starts, in April over the last two years...has a 2.68 career ERA in April, which is his best for any month of the season...picked up his first win since July 23, 2014 in the A's 2-1 victory at Minnesota May 5...was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-0 loss at Tampa Bay May 21...Colome and four Rays relievers combined to shutout the A's on six hits and two walks...was the losing pitcher in the A's 1-0 loss to Detroit May 26 in Oakland...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings and allowed just five hits...Price and three relievers combined to shutout the A's on seven hits...combined with Clippard on an eight-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win over New York in Oakland on May 31...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings for the second consecutive start and allowed seven of the hits...also tossed a career-high 110 pitches.. finished May with a 2-3 record and a 1.93 ERA in six starts...tied for sixth in the American League in losses in May but had the fourth lowest ERA... was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss at Boston June 6...allowed a career-high tying 10 hits in 5.0 innings...surrendered a two-run home run to Ramirez in the first inning to snap his scoreless streak at a career-high 15.0 innings...had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss at Los Angeles (AL) June 12...left with a 4-3 lead...was relieved by Scribner to start the eighth and he allowed solo home runs to Trout and Calhoun for the blown save and loss...was the winning pitcher in the A's 16-2 win over San Diego June 17 in Oakland...struck out a career-high 11 batters, which tied the Oakland record for strikeouts in an interleague game (fifth time, last: Rich Harden, June 26, 2008 vs. Philadelphia).

LAST START: He extended his losing streak to three games in the A's 6-2 loss at New York (AL) on July 9...allowed a solo home run to Gardner in the bottom of the first but the A's came back with two runs in the second inning...allowed the tying run to score on a Teixeira RBI single in the third and then yielded a two-run single to Ellsbury in the fourth for the loss.

RHP Kendall Graveman (6-5, 3.38 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville May 23 for his second stint with the A's this year and is 5-3 with a 2.17 ERA in 10 starts since his return...the ERA is eighth lowest in the American League over that span...for the season, is tied for the lead among AL rookies in wins (6), ranks third in innings pitched (82.2) and starts (14) and fifth in strikeouts (51)...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 5-1 A's loss at Cleveland July 10 (5.2 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 6 so)... the loss snapped the first three-game winning streak of his career and it ended his scoreless streak at a career-high 19.0 innings...has never faced the Blue Jays in his career...made his Major League debut with Toronto last year and compiled a 3.86 ERA in five September relief appearances. was traded to Oakland along with Brett Lawrie, Sean Nolin and Franklin Barretto for Josh Donaldson, Nov. 28, 2014.

- The A's bullpen has allowed one earned run or fewer in 18 of its past 22 games and has a 2.59 ERA (17 er in 59.0 ip) over that span.
- Has a 3.38 ERA (45 er in 119.2 ip) over its past 46 games (beginning May 23) after logging a 4.82 ERA in its first 44 games...has a 4.14 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the AL (Texas, 4.38).
- Has nine wins and 17 losses...the wins are third fewest in the majors and the losses are tied for fifth most.
- Has allowed the most first batter RBI in the majors (40) and the second most first batter home runs (12).
- Has the second fewest saves in the AL (19), the second lowest save percentage (59.4%) and is tied for the second most blown saves (13).
- Has allowed the fourth most home runs in the AL (35)
- The A's are 5-31 when the bullpen allows two runs or more, 35-19 when it allows one run or fewer (three complete games).
