THE TWINS: The Twins began the post-All-Star break portion of their schedule with a win and a loss to the A's...today, they continue their six-game seven-day road trip with the third of three in Oakland...the Twins will enjoy an off-day tomorrow, then play three at Los Angeles-AL from Tuesday-Thursday...the Twins are 31-16 at home compared to 19-25 on the road.

A'S EVEN SERIES WITH WALK-OFF: The Twins lost to the A's last night by a score of 3-2 in 10 innings, suffering their fourth walk-off loss this season...Phil Hughes was the starter but did not factor into the decision, allowing one run on six hits in 7.0 innings pitched...Glen Perkins snapped his save streak at 28 games, allowing a run in the ninth inning...the offense recorded six hits, two coming from both Brian Dozier and Joe Mauer...the Twins scored their only runs in the ninth inning to tie the game only to lose in the bottom of the 10th.

MILESTONE MAUER: Joe Mauer has 732 career RBI and is within one of tying Rod Carew (733) for eighth on the Twins all-time list...additionally, he has 326 career doubles and is within three of tying Tony Oliva (329) for second on the Twins all-time list; Kirby Puckett is the club's all-time doubles leader with 414.

MILESTONE HUNTER: Torii Hunter has 1,299 career hits as a Twin, needing one hit to reach 1,300...additionally, he has 345 career home runs, needing five to reach 350 and 491 doubles, needing nine to reach 500...he currently ranks seventh on the Twins all-time list in home runs with 206, one away from tying Kirby Puckett (207) for sixth...below are the Twins top seven:

LAST NINE: The Twins have gone 7-2 in their last nine games, out-scoring opponents 50-27 in those nine and out-hitting them 83-77...in that span, pitchers have posted a 2.85 ERA (82.0 IP, 26 ER) with 16 walks and 59 strikeouts...starters have posted a 3.12 ERA (57.2 IP, 20 ER) while relievers have posted a 2.22 ERA (24.1 IP, 6 ER).

TORII, ALL ABOUT THOSE A'S: Torii Hunter is hitting .357 (40-for-112) with five doubles, one triple, 10 home runs, 27 RBI and 19 runs scored in his last 28 games against the A's...in that same span he has 13 multi-hit games and seven multi-RBI games...among actives against Oakland, he ranks fourth in home runs (28), RBI (91), games (170) and at-bats (629).

SERIES-LY SPEAKING: The Twins are seeking their 16th series win today, going 15-12-12...they have won each of their last two series', a three-game series win over Baltimore July 6-8 and a four-game series win over Detroit July 9-12...their last series win over Oakland came in a three-game sweep at Target Field May 28-30, 2012...their last series win at O.co Coliseum came in a two-game sweep May 18-19, 2011.

 • Twins hitting coach Tom Brunansky was born in Covina and makes his off-season home in Poway...Twins bullpen coach Eddie Guardado was born in Stockton and makes his off-season home in Tustin.

TWINS MINOR LEAGUE PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Single-A Ft. Myers left-handed pitcher Mat Batts is the Twins minor league Player of the Week...Batts made one start for the Miracle on Friday at Brevard County, allowing one run on five hits in 7.0 innings pitched with no walks and five strikeouts, earning the win...he has combined to go 7-4, 1.89 ERA (95.0 IP, 20 ER) with 19 walks and 93 strikeouts in 16 starts between Low-A Cedar Rapids and High-A Ft. Myers...the Winston-Salem, North Carolina native was drafted by the Twins in the 17th round of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of North Carolina.

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 1982, the Twins overcame two homers by Robin Yount to beat the Brewers, 6-4...Tom Brunansky hits his second inside-the-park homer of the year (the other came on May 28th), but this one is a grand slam off Jerry Augustine...the inside-the-park slam marked the first in Twins history.

THE SKIPPER

Paul Molitor was named Twins Manager November 4, 2014 becoming the 13th Manager in club history and just the third since 1986 (Tom Kelly, Ron Gardenhire)...2015 marks his 15th minor league and major league professional coaching season...inducted into baseball HOF in 2004 and one of just six players in MLB history with 3,000 hits and 500 stolen bases...ranks ninth on baseball's all-time hit list amassing 3,319 in 21-year career from 1978-98...1974 graduate of Cretin High School in St. Paul, attended University of Minnesota from 1975-77 and played for Twins from 1996-98.

LAST TIME OUT: Earned his fifth win of the season in the Twins 5-3 victory July 8 against Baltimore after allowing one run on five hits with two walks and five strikeouts in 7.0 innings...the outing marked his sixth consecutive quality start, and third consecutive start allowing one-or-fewer runs...the only earned run came in the top of the fourth after Steve Pearce hit a lead-off triple and later scored on a ground ball by J.J. Hardy.

AGAINST AL WEST OPPONENTS: This will be Milone's 34th career start against an AL West opponent, his most starts against any division...he is 12-11, 4.05 ERA (195.1 IP, 88 ER) with 40 walks and 152 strikeouts against them...he has made one start against the AL West this season, June 12 at Texas...he did not factor into the decision after allowing two runs on three hits with one walk and a season-high eight strikeouts in 7.0 innings pitched.

A LITTLE HELP FROM MY FRIENDS: Milone has received an average of 5.54 runs support in his 11 starts this season, the highest of the rotation...he has received two-or-more runs of support in nine of his 11 starts...the Twins have won six of his 11 starts this season, out-scoring opponents 43-15 in those six wins...they lost by just one run in his only loss...Minnesota batters have hit 12 total home runs in the 11 games in which Milone has started this season.

JOYFUL JUNE: Milone finished the month of June with a 2.03 ERA (31.0 IP, 7 ER), the eighth best in the American League and 11th best in all of baseball...he went 2-0 with seven walks and 22 strikeouts...it marked the best ERA of any month of his career (minimum 3 starts)...in four April starts, he went 2-1 with a 4.76 ERA (22.2 IP, 12 ER) with 11 walks and 13 strikeouts (did not pitch with the Twins in May).

LAST LONG AND PROSPER: Milone has made seven quality starts this year, including in each of his last six starts...the Twins have gone 5-3 in his eight career quality starts, out-scoring opponents 38-22 in that time...in his last six starts, since June 12, Milone has posted a 1.69 ERA, the second best in the American League and sixth best in the majors.

THE DAY MAN: This will be Milone's sixth day start of the season...he is 3-0, 1.74 ERA (31.0 IP, 6 ER) in five day starts compared to 2-1, 3.79 ERA (35.2 IP, 15 ER) in six night starts...his 1.74 day-time ERA is the fifth best by a starter in the American League (min. 5 starts)...five of his home runs surrendered this season have been at night, as opposed to three in the day.

TOUGH 'EM ALL: Milone hasn't given up a home run since the seventh inning on June 12 when Elvis Andrus went deep in Texas, a span of five starts and 34.0 innings...he has surrendered a home run in five of his 11 major league starts this season, and in 50 of his 97 career appearances...the eight long balls he has given up this season are the third most by a Twins starting pitcher.

FIRST HALF RECAP: Milone began the season on the club's Opening Day roster as the fourth starter in the rotation...he made four starts in April, posting a record of 2-1 with a 4.76 ERA (22.2 IP, 12 ER), before being optioned to Triple-A Rochester on May 1...he started his Triple-A season with 31.2 straight scoreless innings, the longest such stretch by a Red Wings pitcher in a single season since Francisco Liriano from June 25-July 17, 2008 (26.2 IP)...he was named the International League Pitcher of the Week in back-to-back weeks (May 11-17 and May 18-24)...he was recalled June 4 after the Twins placed Ricky Nolasco on the 15-day disabled list...he made seven starts after being recalled, going 3-0, 1.84 ERA (44.0 IP, 9 ER), and made six consecutive quality starts going into the break...more notes on his first half:

- He finished the first half with the Twins best ERA among starting pitchers (2.84).
- While at Triple-A Rochester, he led the International League with 47 strikeouts in May, 10 more than the next closest pitcher...had the lowest WHIP (0.72) and second lowest batting average against (.182) in May among qualified pitchers...he pitched his first career complete game shutout while tying a career-high with 13 strikeouts May 19 vs. Durham.

TUESDAY'S STARTER - KYLE GIBSON (8-6; 2.85 ERA, 23-22; 4.24 ERA)

Gibson will be making his 19th start of the season in Tuesday's series opener against the Angels...he last started the Twins final game before the break, July 12 against Detroit, earning the win after allowing one run (unearned) on four hits with two walks and six strikeouts in 7.0 innings...he currently owns a four-game winning streak, the longest of his career...this will be his fourth career start against Los Angeles-AL...he is 0-1 against them with a 7.80 ERA (15.0 IP, 13 ER), three home runs allowed, five walks and six strikeouts...he did not factor into the decision in his last start against them, September 4, 2014, after allowing four runs on seven hits with two walks and one strikeout in 7.0 innings...this will be Gibson's 15th career start against an AL West opponent...he is 6-3 against them with a 3.59 ERA (82.2 IP, 33 ER).

- Named *Baseball America* Triple-A All-Star Team following 2011 season after going 12-6, 3.22 ERA in 24 starts for Syracuse.
- Named the Nationals' Minor League Pitcher of the Year with Double-A Harrisburg in 2010...led the Eastern League in strikeouts (155).
- In three seasons at USC, went 16-17 with a 4.78 ERA...with his Major League debut, he became the 100th former Trojan to play in the big leagues, the most among all universities/colleges.
- Earned all-state, All-CIF and All-Foothill League honors in 2004 and 2005.
