OAKLAND ATHLETICS (43-51) VS. TORONTO BLUE JAYS (47-47)

ABOUT THE A'S: Won two of three from Minnesota in the first series after the All-Star Break play and have won four of the last five games... moved into sole possession of fourth place in the American League West on the off day yesterday, marking the first time the A's have not held at least a share of last in the West since May 6 (tied for third)...are now 29-21 (.580) since bottoming out at a season-high 16 games under .500 (14-30) at the conclusion of play on May 22...have the second best record in the AL and fourth best in the majors dating back to May 23...are 43-51 (.457) overall, which is the third worst record in the AL...have been in sole possession of last place in the West for 67 of the last 70 days...for the season, have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, eight days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 67 days in fifth...the 67 days alone in last are second most by an A's team over the last 17 years (162 in 2009).

LEFT AND RIGHT: Today marks the second of three consecutive games in which the A's opponent will start a left-handed pitcher...defeated Tommy Milone on Sunday and are now 6-17 (.261) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 36-34 (.514) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is the worst in the majors (Colorado: 5-14, .263)...are batting .242 (202-for-836) against lefties compared to .261 (628-for-2407) off righties...the average against righties is third highest in the American League.

THE LONG BALL: The A's hit a season-high five home runs Sunday after homering just twice over the previous six games...snapped a streak of 152 consecutive games with three home runs or fewer...had not hit more than three home runs in a game since July 26, 2014 at Texas (4) and last hit five on May 26, 2014 against Detroit...A's starting pitchers have allowed just five home runs over the last 18 games and 114.0 innings (0.39 per nine innings) and have surrendered 39 for the season, which is tied with Pittsburgh for the fewest in the majors...the pitching staff as a whole has allowed just 74 home runs, which is the fewest in the American League and fourth fewest in the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's scored 14 runs on Sunday against Minnesota, which were their most runs against an American League opponent since Sept. 11, 2013 at Minnesota (18)...had scored just 13 runs over the previous six games...are now batting .233 (146-for-626) with 66 runs scored over the last 19 games (3.5 runs per game) and have scored two runs or fewer nine times over that stretch...for the season, rank third in the American League in triples (23) and fewest strikeouts (623) and tied for fourth in doubles (161)...have been successful in 54-of-67 (80.6%) stolen base attempts, which is the best mark in the majors.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer in 25 of the last 50 games and are 23-16 with a 2.50 ERA (89 er in 320.1 ip) over that span, which dates back to May 23...have a 3.00 ERA for the season, which is second lowest in the majors (St. Louis, 2.78)...the last time A's starters had an ERA under 3.16 was in 1974 (2.98)...rank second in the majors in innings pitched (578.2).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 2.81 ERA (39 er in 125.0 ip) in July and have a 3.35 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and sixth lowest in the majors...also lead the AL in shutouts (12), opponents batting average (.235), slugging percentage (.354) and on-base percentage (.298) and have yielded the fewest extra base hits (215).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed three errors in three games since the All-Star Break and have 85 for the season, which is 12 more than any other team (Milwaukee, 73)...the 85 errors are one more than the season total from 2006 when the A's set the club record for fewest errors in a season...the errors have led to 44 unearned runs, which is second most in the majors (San Diego, 48).

RUN DIFFERENTIAL: The A's have out-scored the opposition 407-354 for a run differential of +53...that is fourth best in the American League and seventh best in the majors...are 28-18 (.609) in games decided by three runs or more, which is the second best record in the AL (Toronto, 34-17)...however, are 15-33 (.313) in games decided by two runs or fewer, which is second worst in the majors (Toronto, 13-30, .302).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-1 on this six-game homestand against Minnesota (2-1) and Toronto (three games)...start their first post-break road trip on Friday, a five-game trip to San Francisco (three games) and Los Angeles-NL (two games)...went 3-3 on their final road trip before the break against New York (1-2) and Cleveland (2-1)...are 20-27 (.426) at home compared to 23-24 (.489) on the road...are tied for the third worst home record in the American League...have finished the season with a home winning percentage under .429 once in Oakland history and that was in 1979 (31-50, .383).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's had their second walk-off win of the season Saturday night...averaged 10.7 walk-off wins per season over the previous three years...are 9-22 (.290) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the majors behind Toronto (10-19)...the worst record in one-run games in Oakland history is 16-26 (.381) in 1980 and the worst in Athletics history is .256 in 1916 (11-32)...improved to 2-6 (.250) in extra inning games with the win Saturday night, which is tied for the second worst record in the majors...are 4-11 in games decided in the last at bat...the wins are the fewest in the majors and the losses are tied for second most in the American League.

THIS AND THAT: The win Sunday was Bob Melvin's 368th as manager of the A's, which ties him with Ken Macha for third most in Oakland history...only Tony La Russa (798) and Art Howe (600) have more...Josh Reddick hit the A's fifth grand slam of the season Sunday, which is tied with San Francisco for the most in the majors...the A's will play each of their first 22 games after the All-Star Break in California...20 of those games will be in the Bay Area as the A's have a three-game series at San Francisco July 24-26...also travel to Los Angeles July 28-29 for a two-game series against the Dodgers...have one remaining trip to the Eastern time zone (Aug. 11-17 to Toronto and Baltimore) and one to the Central time zone (Sept. 11-20 to Texas, Chicago and Houston)...are the only team in the majors without a rain delay.

ALL-STARS AND THE BREAK: The A's had two players named to the American League All-Star team (Sonny Gray and Stephen Vogt)...it was the first All-Star team for both players...the A's were 41-50 (.451) at the All-Star Break, which was the 10th worst record in Oakland history at the break...it was the worst since the 2011 club was 39-53 (.424)...2011 also marked the last time the A's were in last place at the break (were 12 back that year).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Crisp, Doolittle, Hahn, Ladendorf, Parker, Thompson, Venditte)...Crisp, Doolittle, Ladendorf, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...have had at least six players on the DL all year...have used the DL a total of 18 times, which matches the season total from last year...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. BLUE JAYS: This is the first meeting between the A's and Blue Jays...the only other team the A's have yet to play this year is Baltimore...the A's won the season series last year, 4-3...swept a four-game series in Oakland and were swept in a three-game series at Toronto...out-scored the Blue Jays 19-15 in the seven games...have won each of the previous three season series (13-10) but are 24-25 against the Blue Jays dating back to 2009...the A's are 211-182 all-time against Toronto...that includes 104-93 in Oakland, 107-87 in Toronto and 0-2 in Las Vegas.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Burns leads Major League rookies in hits (86), stolen bases (19) and multiple hit games (26)...**Eric Sogard** has a 43-game errorless streak as a second baseman and leads American League second baseman with a .994 fielding percentage...**Ben Zobrist** has not committed an error in 28 games at second base and has a 28-game errorless streak as a second baseman dating back to June 19, 2014.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1945** the A's and Tigers play to a 1-1 tie in a 24 inning game...in **1971** Sal Bando hits a two-run home run in the bottom of the ninth inning and adds the game winning sacrifice fly in the 12th inning as the A's defeat Cleveland, 4-3...in **1996** the A's hit five home runs in an 11-8 win at Texas...Terry Steinbach has two of those homers, his first of back-to-back two-homer games.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (6-5, 3.38 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville May 23 for his second stint with the A's this year and is 5-3 with a 2.17 ERA (16 er in 66.1 ip) and .248 (62-for-250) opponents batting average in 10 starts since his return...the ERA is eighth lowest in the American League over that span...was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 1-2 with an 8.27 ERA and .348 opponents batting average in four starts before he was optioned to Nashville April 26...walked nine batters in 16.1 innings during his first stint (4.96 per nine innings) and has 18 in 66.1 innings during his current stint (2.44 per nine innings).

STREAKS SNAPPED: Allowed four runs in 5.2 innings for the loss in his last start July 10 at Cleveland...the loss snapped the first three-game winning streak of his career (2 er in 21.0 ip, 0.86 ERA)...yielded a RBI double to Gomes in the fourth to snap his scoreless streak at a career and A's season high 19.0 innings...the game ended a six-game streak where he tossed seven or more innings while allowing two runs or fewer in each start...that was the longest such streak by a rookie pitcher in Oakland history...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, it matches the longest streak by any rookie over the last 20 years (Francisco Liriano, MIN 2006)...it tied for third longest by any pitcher in Oakland history and was the longest since Justin Duchscherer had an eight-game streak from June 11-July 20, 2008...went 3-2 with a 1.26 ERA during the streak...began the streak with a no decision and two losses to become just the second A's pitcher since at least 1914 to toss seven or more innings and allow two runs or fewer in three consecutive starts (June 7-18) without earning a win in any of the starts...the other was Orlando Pena for the Kansas City A's (May 5-15, 1963).

ROOKIE LEADERS: Is tied for the lead among American League rookies in wins (6), ranks third in innings pitched (82.2) and starts (14) and fifth in strikeouts (51)...has one of six complete games by an AL rookie.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 4-2 with a 2.83 ERA (15 er in 47.2 ip) in eight starts at night compared to 2-3 with a 4.11 ERA (16 er in 35.0 ip) in six starts during the day...has allowed six home runs in 35.0 innings during the day, two in 47.2 innings at night.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are batting .185 (12-for-65) with runners in scoring position...has allowed a .269 (43-for-160) batting average against both left-handed hitters and right-handed hitters...however, has issued 18 of his 27 walks to lefties...has yielded a .417 (15-for-36) batting average to the opponents number three hitter and a .421 (16-for-38) mark to the five hitter.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-2 with a 2.44 ERA (13 er in 48.0 ip) in eight starts on the road compared to 2-3 with a 4.67 ERA (18 er in 34.2 ip) in six starts at home...has surrendered six home runs in 34.2 innings in Oakland, two in 48.0 innings on the road.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on 10 days rest today...is 4-2 with a 2.72 ERA (15 er in 49.2 ip) in eight starts on four days rest compared to 2-3 with a 4.36 ERA (16 er in 33.0 ip) in six starts on five days rest or more.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 8-6 (.571) in his starting assignments...has allowed two runs or fewer in eight of his 14 starts and walked two batters or fewer 10 times...has received two runs of support or fewer in seven of his 14 starts and is 1-5 in those games...is 5-0 in seven starts with support of three or more runs.

MONTH BY MONTH: Is 1-1 with a 2.84 ERA (4 er in 12.2 ip) in two starts in July after going 3-2 with a 1.93 ERA in six starts in the month of June...ranked fifth in the American League in June ERA...was 1-0 with a 2.31 ERA in two starts in May...compiled a 1-2 record and an 8.27 ERA in four starts in April.

2015 HIGHLIGHTS: Was the losing pitcher in his first Major League start, a 10-1 A's loss to Texas **April 9** in Oakland...allowed the first two home runs of his career...surrendered just five home runs in 207.0 minor league innings...yielded eight runs in 3.1 innings to become the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to allow eight or more runs in his A's debut (last: Clayton Mortensen, 8 on Aug. 8, 2009 at Kansas City)...picked up the first win of his career **April 14** at Houston when he combined with O'Flaherty, Otero, Abad and Clippard on an eight-hit shutout...tossed 5.1 innings and allowed four of the hits...took the loss **April 25** against Houston to fall to 1-2 with an 8.27 ERA in four starts...was optioned to Nashville the next day...was recalled **May 23** and combined with Scribner and Clippard on a six-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win that day at Tampa Bay **May 23**...tossed six innings and allowed three of the hits...had a no decision in the A's 7-4 loss at Boston **June 7**...left the game with a 4-1 lead but the bullpen allowed six runs in the eighth inning, with Clippard getting the blown save and loss...tossed his first career complete game in his ninth ML start, an eight-hitter in the A's 1-0 loss at Los Angeles (AL) **June 13**...did not walk a batter and struck out

a career-high seven...tossed a career-high 111 pitches...allowed the only run of the game on a two-out home run to Pujols in the first inning...Wilson, Smith and Street combined to shutout the A's on two hits and four walks...became the 37th pitcher in Oakland history to lose a 1-0 complete game, the third in the last 10 years (Scott Kazmir, Sept. 11, 2014 at Chicago-AL; Brandon McCarthy, April 21, 2011 at Seattle)...also took the loss in his next start **June 18** against San Diego for the first and only losing streak of his career...tossed a career-high tying 111 pitches in 7.0 shutout innings for the win **June 29** against Colorado...combined with Pomeranz and Clippard on a six-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Seattle **July 4** in Oakland...tossed seven of the innings and allowed five of the hits.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss at Cleveland July 10...did not allow a run over the first three innings to extended his scoreless streak to a career-high 19.0 innings...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a RBI double to Gomes in the fourth...loaded the bases with two outs in the sixth and was relieved by Pomeranz with the score still tied at 1-1...Pomeranz allowed all three runs to score on two walks and a single.

- Has a 3.38 ERA (46 er in 122.2 ip) over its past 47 games (beginning May 23) after logging a 4.82 ERA in its first 44 games...has a 4.12 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the AL (Texas, 4.43).
- Has nine wins and 17 losses...the wins are third fewest in the majors and the losses are tied for sixth most.
- Has allowed the most first batter RBI in the majors (40) and the second most first batter home runs (12).
